

# Charge the battery before recording

Turn off the camcorder and attach the battery pack.




### CAUTION

Adjust the strap and fasten.

# **Date/Time Setting**

Open the LCD monitor to turn on the camcorder

### Charging the Battery Pack

- Close the LCD monitor to turn off the camcorder.
- 2 Attach the battery pack, then connect the AC adapter.
  - With the "∆" (arrow) on the battery pack pointing at the correct direction, slide the battery pack until it locks in place.




- The power/charge lamp blinks to indicate charging has started.
- When the lamp goes out, charging is finished.
