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# IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

Please read all of the safety and operating instructions before operating this appliance. Adhere to all warnings on the appliance and in the instruction manual. Follow all the safety and operating instructions. These safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.

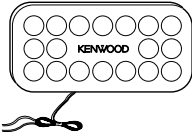
- 1. Power sources** – The appliance should be connected to a power supply only of the type described in the instruction manual or as marked on the appliance. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your appliance dealer or local power company. For appliances intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the instruction manual.
- 2. Power-cord protection** – Power-supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, pay particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the appliance.
- 3. CAUTION – Polarization** – This appliance may be equipped with a polarized alternating-current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.
- 4. Ventilation** – Slots and openings in the cabinet are provided for ventilation and to ensure reliable operation of the appliance and to protect it from overheating, and these openings must not be blocked or covered. The appliance should be situated so that its location or position does not interfere with its proper ventilation.  
To maintain good ventilation, do not put records or a table-cloth on the appliance. Place the appliance at least 10 cm away from the walls.  
Do not use the appliance on a bed, sofa, rug or similar surface that may block the ventilation openings. This appliance should not be placed in a built-in installation such as a bookcase or rack unless proper ventilation is provided or the manufacturer's instructions have been adhered to.
- 5. Water and moisture** – The appliance should not be used near water - for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool, etc.
- 6. Temperature** – The appliance may not function properly if used at extremely low, or freezing temperatures. The ideal ambient temperature is above +5°C (41°F).
- 7. Heat** – The appliance should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other appliances (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
- 8. Electric shock** – Care should be taken so that objects do not fall and liquid is not spilled into the enclosure through openings. If a metal object, such as a hair pin or a needle, comes into contact with the inside of this appliance, a dangerous electric shock may result. For families with children, never permit children to put anything, especially metal, inside this appliance.
- 9. Enclosure removal** – Never remove the enclosure. If the internal parts are touched accidentally, a serious electric shock might occur.
- 10. Cleaning** – Unplug this appliance from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use volatile solvents such as alcohol, paint thinner, gasoline, or benzine, etc. to clean the cabinet. Use a clean dry cloth.
- 11. Lightning** – For added protection for this appliance during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the appliance due to lightning and power-line surges.
- 12. Abnormal smell** – If an abnormal smell or smoke is detected, immediately turn the power OFF and unplug the appliance from the wall outlet. Contact your dealer or nearest service center.

- 13. Damage requiring service** – The appliance should be serviced by qualified service personnel when:
- A.** The power-supply cord or the plug has been damaged.
  - B.** Objects have fallen, or liquid has been spilled into the appliance.
  - C.** The appliance has been exposed to rain or water.
  - D.** The appliance does not appear to operate normally by following the instruction manual. Adjust only those controls that are covered by the instruction manual as an improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore the appliance to its normal operation.
  - E.** The appliance has been dropped, or the enclosure damaged.
  - F.** The appliance exhibits a marked change in performance.
- 14. Servicing** – The user should not attempt to service the appliance beyond that described in the instruction manual. All other servicing should be referred to qualified service personnel.
- 15. Power lines** – An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

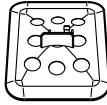

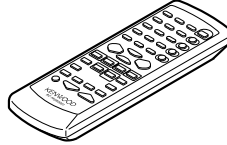

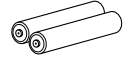

## Unpacking

Unpack the unit carefully and make sure that all accessories are put aside so they will not be lost.

Examine the unit for any possibility of shipping damage. If your unit is damaged or fails to operate, notify your dealer immediately. If your unit was shipped to you directly, notify the shipping company without delay. Only the consignee (the person or company receiving the unit) can file a claim against the carrier for shipping damage.

We recommend that you retain the original carton and packing materials for use should you transport or ship the unit in the future.

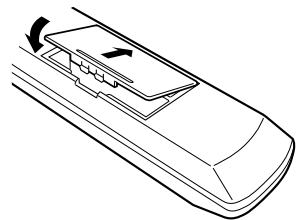
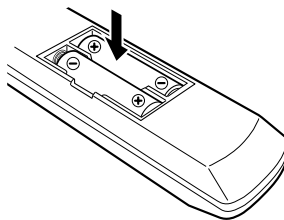
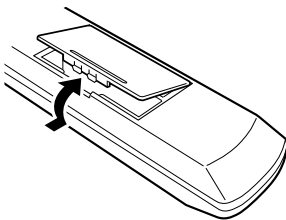

## Loading batteries in the remote control unit

(1) Remove the battery compartment cover of the remote.

(2) Insert two R6/SUM-3/"AA"-size batteries following the polarity indications.

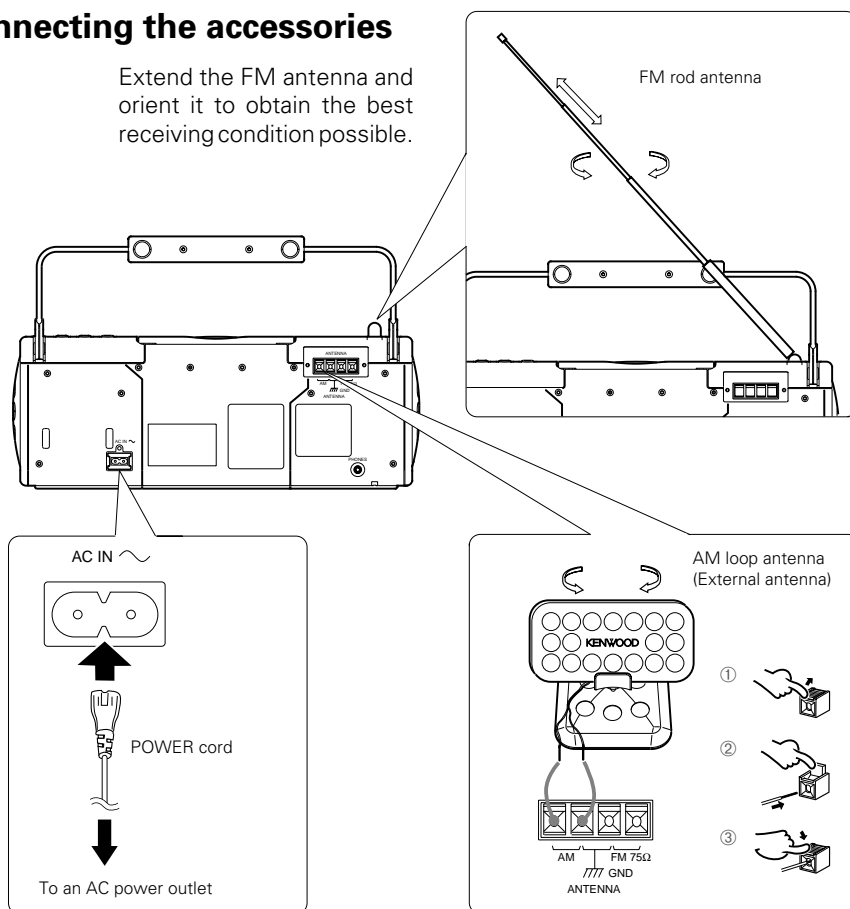
(3) Attach the battery compartment cover.



- The provided batteries are intended for use in operation checking, and their service life may be short.
- When the remote-controllable distance becomes short, replace both of the batteries with new ones.
- If direct sunlight or the light of a high-frequency fluorescent lamp (inverter type, etc.) is incident to the remote sensor on the main unit front panel, malfunction may occur. In such a case, change the installation position to avoid malfunction.
- When pressing more than one remote control keys successively, press each key securely by leaving an interval of 1 second or more between keys.
- The standard remote-control range is within about 6 meters from the main unit front panel. Be sure to point the remote to remote sensor on the front panel.

## Connecting the accessories

Extend the FM antenna and orient it to obtain the best receiving condition possible.



Plug the power cord to a 220 V AC, 50 Hz wall power outlet.

- When removing the power cord connection, unplug the power plug of the wall outlet first.

### POINT

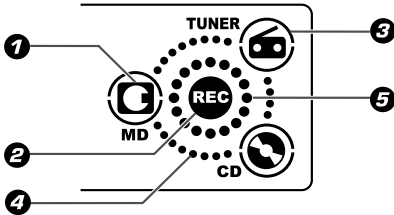
- Be sure to insert each connection cord securely. If a cord is plugged in incompletely, audio may not be output or noise may be generated.
- Before connecting or disconnecting any connection cord, be sure to first unplug the power cord from the wall power outlet.
- Do not install the speakers near a TV set. Otherwise, color irregularities due to magnetism may be observed on the TV screen.
- Be sure to put the unit to the STANDBY more before plugging or unplugging the power cord.

The provided antenna has been designed for indoor use. Place it in a position as apart as possible from a TV and power cords and orient it to obtain the best receiving condition.

### Mode display

The area on the right of the display panel shows the input selection (source) and current operation mode.



- ❶ Source display/CD, MD and TUNER
- ❷ Recording indicator
- ❸ Selected input source display
- ❹ Recording direction display
- The points blink when recording pauses.
- ❺ Volume indicator and Play/Pause mode indicator
- Two points blink to indicate the Pause mode.

#### In regard to demonstration

This unit incorporates a demonstration mode (display only). The demonstration shows the display conditions of various operation modes by switching them sequentially, but the audio does not vary during it.

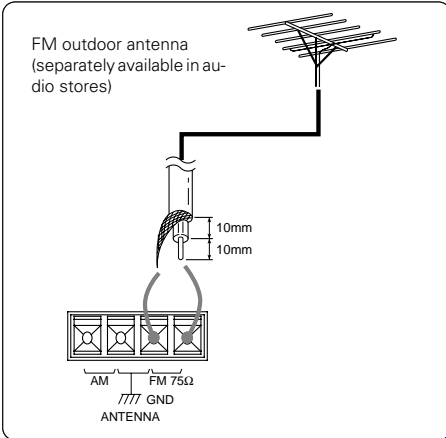
When the power supply fails and restores or the power cord is unplugged and plugged during operation, the unit automatically enters the demonstration mode ("DEMO ON").

**To cancel demonstration mode :** Press the SET/DEMO key while "DEMO ON" is indicated.

**To enter demonstration mode :** Keep on pressing the SET/DEMO key for more than 2 seconds while the unit is ON.

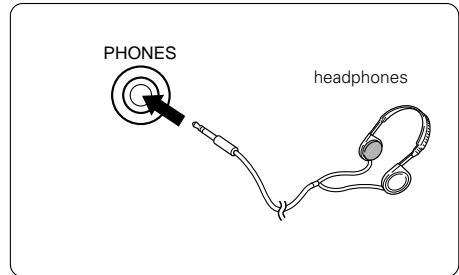


## Connecting other components



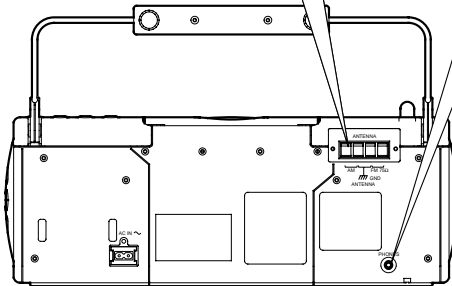
Distribute the antenna lead indoors using a commercially available  $75\Omega$  coaxial cable and connect it to the FM ANTENNA terminals.

- Installation of the outdoor antenna is dangerous work. Have your dealer or antenna installation specialist install it whenever possible.



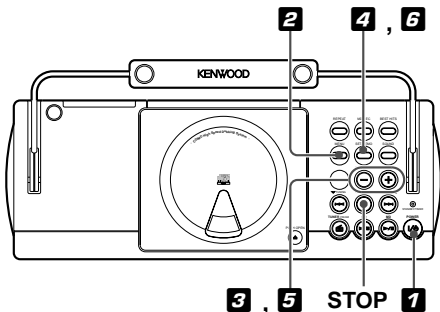
Plug the optional headphones equipped with stereo mini-plugs.

- When listening audio through speakers, unplug the headphones from the PHONES jack.



# Adjusting the present time

To use the timer function, it is required to set the built-in clock of the unit to the correct time. The clock shows the time of day in 12-hour system.



Main unit only

**1** Press the **POWER** key to turn power on.

**2** Press and hold the **MENU** key for more than 3 seconds.



**3** Press the **VOLUME/MULTI CONTROL UP (+)** or **DOWN (-)** key to input the figure of hour.

Example: Adjustment to 8:07am



12 o'clock of day is displayed as "12:00pm" and 12 o'clock of night is displayed as "12:00am".

**4** Press the **SET/DEMO** key.



**5** Press the **VOLUME/MULTI CONTROL UP (+)** or **DOWN (-)** key to input the figure of minute.



**6** Press the **SET/DEMO** key.

## To check the time of day :

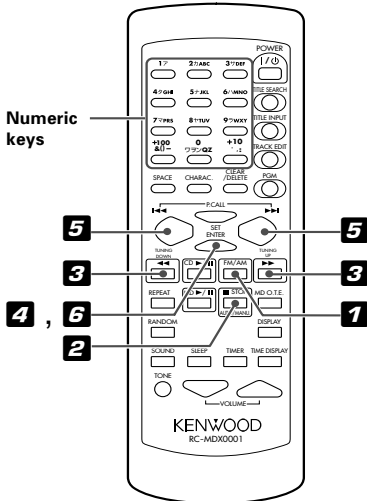
Press the **STOP** key (or the STOP key on the remote) while the unit is in the **STANDBY** mode.

## POINT

- After a power failure or when the power cord is unplugged and plugged again, the time should be adjusted again.
- Accurate time adjustment is possible by pressing the **SET/DEMO** key at the same time as a time announcement indicating the 00 second of the minute.

# Presetting radio stations

Each of the desired stations can be preset individually. Up to 40 stations can be stored in the preset memory.



- 4 Press the ENTER key during reception.



- 5 While "P--" is blinking, press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ key repeatedly to select the desired preset number.

Press and hold the ◀◀ or ▶▶ key to skip unnecessary preset numbers.

The preset number can also be selected by pressing numeric keys.

Examples :

To select preset No. 13 : +10, 3

To select preset No. 20 : +10, +10, 0

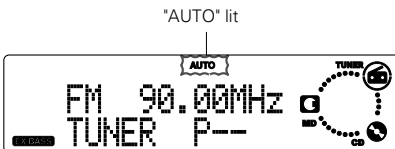
- 6 Press the ENTER key again.

## Remote control only

- 1 Press the FM/AM key so that the "AM" or "FM" band is selected.



- 2 Press the AUTO/MANU. key so that "AUTO" is lit.



- 3 Press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ key to tune in the desired station.

## To preset another station :

Repeat steps 1 to 6.

## To preset a station with weak radio wave :

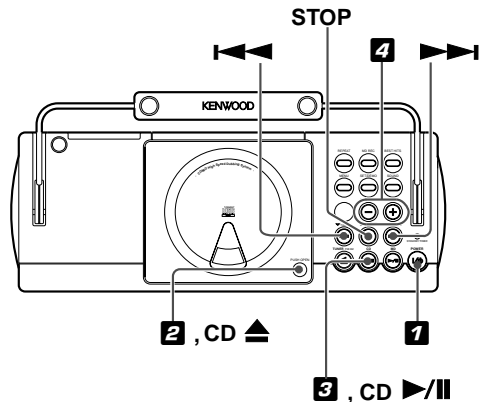
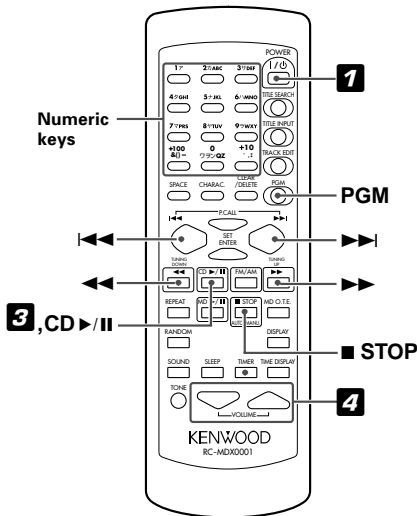
In step 2, select the manual tuning mode by pressing the AUTO/MANU. key so that "AUTO" is not lit.

## POINT.

- When a station is preset in a preset number which stores a previously preset station, the newly preset information overwrites the previously preset information.

# Playback of CD

To play a CD.

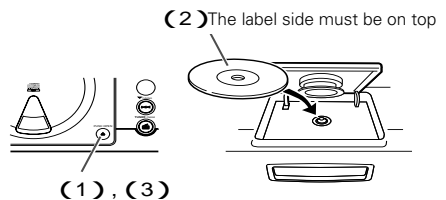


**1** Press the **POWER I/O** key to turn power on.

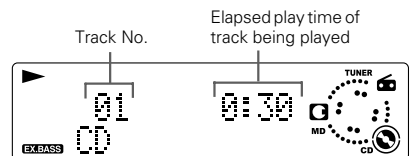
**2** Insert a CD.

The CD should be placed horizontally on the tray. To prevent malfunction, do not place it obliquely.

- (1) Open the CD door by pressing the area marked "PUSH OPEN ▲" of the CD door.
- (2) Place a CD.
- (3) Close the CD door.



**3** Press the **CD >||** key.



**4** Press the **VOLUME/MULTI CONTROL UP (+)** or **DOWN (-)** key or one of the **VOLUME** keys on the remote until the desired listening volume is obtained.

## Key operations of CD

Purpose	Operation
To stop playback	Press the STOP ■ key (or the ■ STOP key on the remote).
To let playback pause	Press the CD ►/   key. Press it again to resume playback.
To skip a track	Press the ►► key to skip to the next track. Press the ◀◀ key to skip to the previous track.
To fast forward audio	Press and hold the ►► key on the remote during playback, and release the key at the position you want to restart normal playback.
To fast reverse audio	Press and hold the ◀◀ key on the remote during playback, and release the key at the position you want to restart normal playback.
To start playback from the desired track	Specify the desired track number using the numeric keys on the remote. Examples : Track No. 10 : +10, 0 Track No. 23 : +10, +10, 3 If "PGM" is lit, turn it off by pressing the PGM key on the remote.

### To take out the CD :

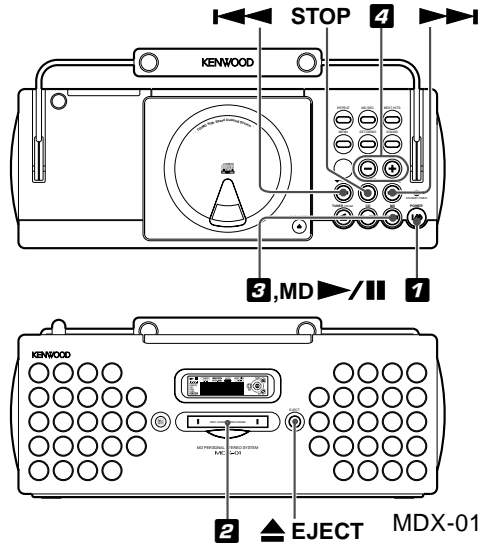
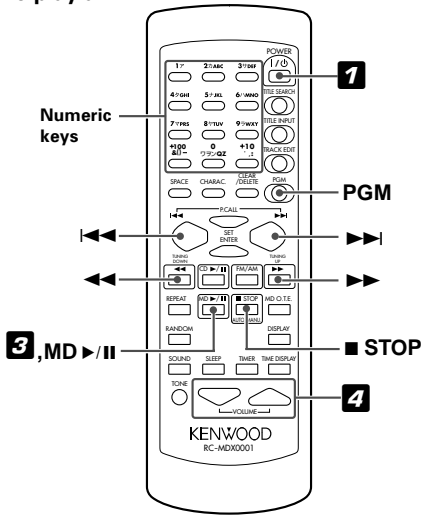
Stop playback and press the area marked "PUSH OPEN ▲" on the CD door to open it.



- Do not force open or close the CD door, for this will lead to malfunction.
- When a CD has been inserted while the power is OFF, simply pressing the CD ►/|| key in the STANDBY mode turns the power ON and starts playback automatically. (One-touch operation)
- When a CD-TEXT disc is played, the text information recorded in the CD (disc title and track titles) is displayed automatically (see page 20).
- For the types of CDs that can be played on this unit, see "Discs which can be played with this unit" (page 53).

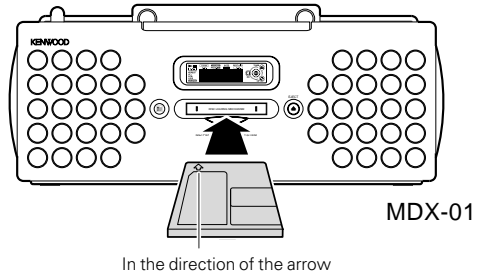
To play a MD.



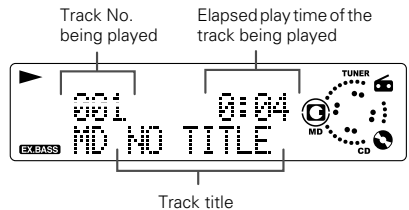
**1** Press the **POWER**  $I/\cup$  key to turn power on.

**2** Insert a MD.

Insert a MD into the insertion slot of the main unit.



**3** Press the **MD**  $\blacktriangleright/\parallel$  key.



**4** Press the **VOLUME/MULTI CONTROL UP (+)** or **DOWN (-)** key or one of the **VOLUME** keys on the remote until the desired listening volume is obtained.

## Key operations of MD

Purpose	Operation
To stop playback	Press the STOP ■ key (or the ■ STOP key on the remote).
To let playback pause	Press the MD ►/   key. Press it again to resume playback.
To skip a track	Press the ►► key to skip to the next track. Press the ◀◀ key to skip to the previous track.
To fast forward audio	Press and hold the ►► key on the remote during playback, and release the key at the position you want to restart normal playback.
To fast reverse audio	Press and hold the ◀◀ key on the remote during playback, and release the key at the position you want to restart normal playback.
To start playback from the desired track	Specify the desired track number using the numeric keys on the remote. Examples : Track No. 10 : +10, 0 Track No. 23 : +10, +10, 3 Track No. 100 : +100, 0 If "PGM" is lit, turn it off by pressing the PGM key on the remote.

### To take out the MD :

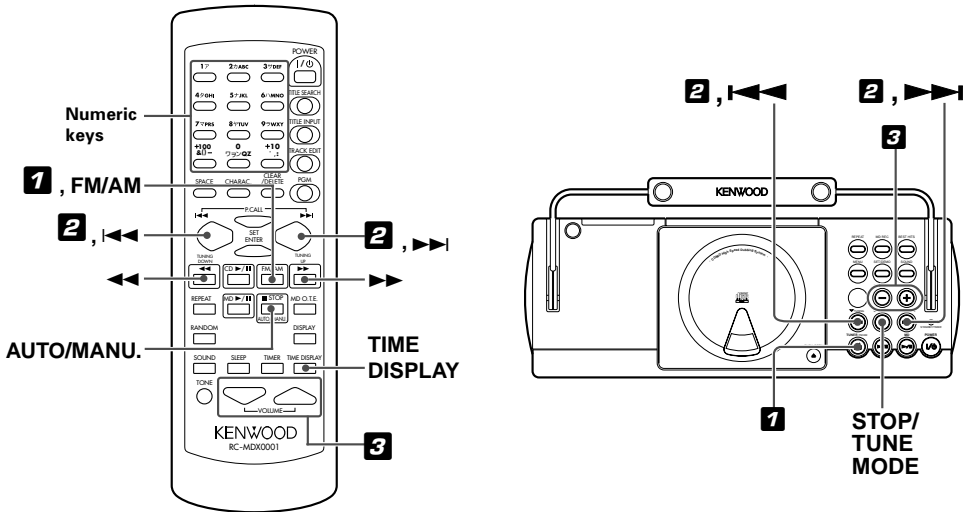
Stop playback and press the EJECT ▲ key.



- The MD cannot be inserted or ejected in the STANDBY mode. Do not force insert an MD in the STANDBY mode, for this will lead to malfunction.
- When a MD has been inserted while the power is OFF, simply pressing the MD ►/|| key in the STANDBY mode turns the power ON and starts playback automatically. (One-touch operation)
- When the MD contains recording of title information, the titles of the disc or tracks recorded in the MD are displayed automatically.
- This unit is capable of playing back a monaurally recorded MD.

# Receiving broadcast stations

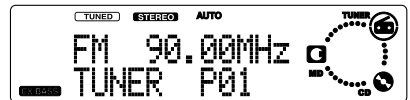
Previously stored (preset) radio stations can be tuned in with a one-touch operation. For the preset procedure, see "Presetting radio stations" (page 11).



**1** Press the TUNER FM/AM key (or the FM/AM key on the remote).

**2** Press the  $\lll$  or  $\ggg$  repeatedly to select the desired station preset number.

Each press of the key switches the preset station in sequence.



**3** Press the VOLUME/MULTI CONTROL UP (+) or DOWN (-) key or one of the VOLUME keys on the remote until the desired listening volume is obtained.



## To tune a radio station using numeric keys :

Input the preset number of the desired station using the numeric keys on the remote.

Examples : Track No. 23 : +10, +10, 3

Track No. 40 : +10, +10, +10, +10, 0

## Receiving non-preset broadcast stations

**A radio station can be tuned either by auto tuning or manual tuning according to the current reception condition.**

(1) Press the STOP ■ /TUNE MODE key of the main unit (or the AUTO/MANU. key on the remote) to select the tuning mode.

When "AUTO" is lit: Indicates the auto mode (stereo reception) which is suitable when the receiving condition is good.

When "AUTO" is not lit: Indicates the manual mode (monaural reception) which is suitable when the receiving condition is poor.

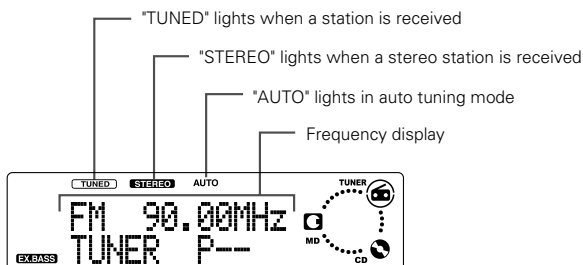
- Usually leave "AUTO" lit (auto tuning mode, stereo reception).

(2) While "AUTO" or "MANUAL" is lit, press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ key of the main unit to start tuning.

Tuning can also be started by pressing the ◀◀ or ▶▶ key on the remote.

Auto tuning: Each press of the key tunes the next station automatically.

Manual tuning: Press and hold the key until the next station is tuned.

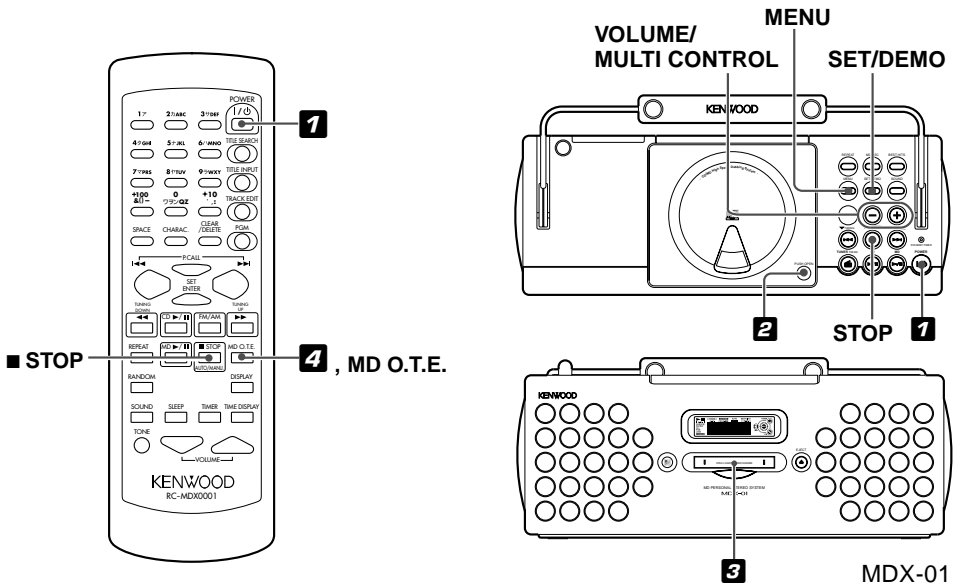


## POINT

- When the unit is in the STANDBY mode, simply pressing the TUNER FM/AM key (or the FM/AM key on the remote) turns the power ON and starts radio play automatically. (One-touch operation)
- Press and hold the ◀◀ or ▶▶ key during tuning to skip unnecessary radio stations.
- Every time the TIME DISPLAY key on the remote is pressed, the display is switched alternately between the frequency display and time of day display.

# Recording CD onto MD (MD O.T.E.)

The MD O.T.E. (One-Touch Edit) function makes it possible to record all tracks in a CD on an MD with a one-touch operation (All-track recording). It is also capable of recording the currently played CD track on an MD with a one-touch operation (Single-track recording).

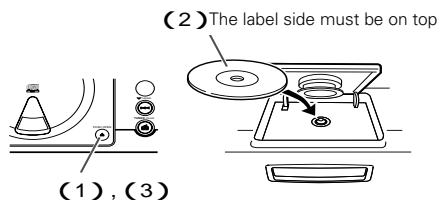


**1** Press the **POWER**  $I/\cup$  key to turn power on.

**2** Insert a CD.

The CD should be placed horizontally on the tray. To prevent malfunction, do not place it obliquely.

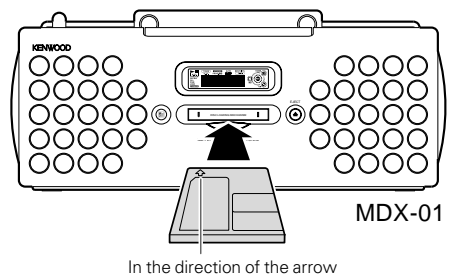
- (1) Open the CD door by pressing the area marked "PUSH OPEN  $\blacktriangle$ " of the CD door.
- (2) Place a CD.
- (3) Close the CD door.



If the CD is already playing, stop it.

**3** Insert a recordable MD.

Insert the MD into the insertion slot of the main unit.



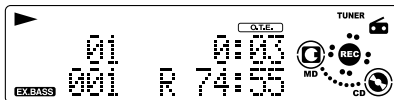
#### 4 Press the MD O.T.E. key on the remote.

If you are operating the main unit :

- Press the keys within intervals of less than 5 seconds.

(1) Press the MENU key.

(2) Press the VOLUME/MULTI CONTROL UP (+) or DOWN (−) key so that "REC MODE ?" is displayed, then press the SET/DEMO key.



(3) Press the VOLUME/MULTI CONTROL UP (+) or DOWN (−) key so that "CD → MD <NORM>" is displayed, then press the SET/DEMO key.

Recording of CD tracks starts from the first track of the CD.

### Recording the CD track being played (Single-track recording)

(1) Play the CD track to be recorded.

(2) Press the MD O.T.E. key on the remote.

If you are operating the main unit :

- Press the keys within intervals of less than 5 seconds.

(1) Press the MENU key.

(2) Press the VOLUME/MULTI CONTROL UP (+) or DOWN (−) key so that "REC MODE ?" is displayed, then press the SET/DEMO key.

(3) Press the VOLUME/MULTI CONTROL UP (+) or DOWN (−) key so that "CD → MD <NORM>" is displayed, then press the SET/DEMO key.

Recording starts after returning to the beginning of the current track.

#### To stop recording in the middle :

Press the STOP ■ key (or the ■ STOP key on the remote). This stops both playback and recording.

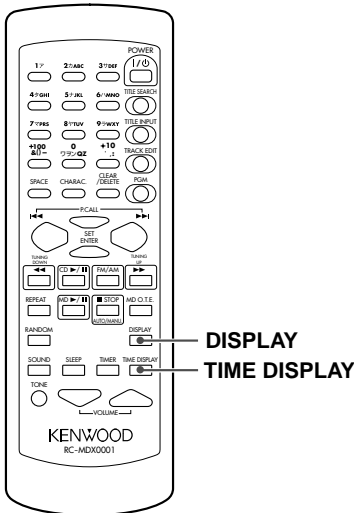


- Be careful not to apply vibration to the unit while "WRITING" is displayed, because the MD recorder is writing recorded and edited data in the MD in this period. Also, to avoid loss of recorded and edited data, do not unplug the power cord before "WRITING" disappears.
- For the types of MDs that can be recorded on this unit, see "Handling of Mini Disc" (page 53).

# Displayed information

The display on the main unit shows the time and other information of CD and MD. The brightness of the display can be adjusted.

## Viewing the CD information

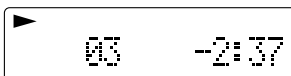


The displayed information switches each time the TIME DISPLAY key on the remote is pressed.

### 1. Elapsed play time of the track being played



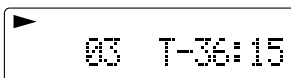
### 2. Remaining play time of the track being played

## POINT

- Only the information of 1 and 2 is displayed during 1-track repeat or random playback.
- When the displayed time reaches 100 minutes or more, the display shows " - - - : - - - ".

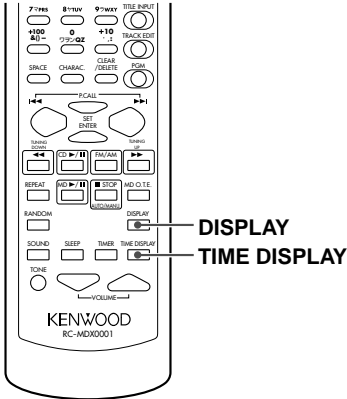
## CD TEXT function

When a CD-TEXT disc is played, the main unit automatically shows the disc titles and track titles recorded in the disc provided that they are composed of alphanumeric characters.

This unit cannot display the text information of certain CD TEXT discs.

Up to 1000 characters can be displayed. "TEXT FULL" is displayed for the information of the 1001st and later characters.

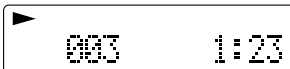

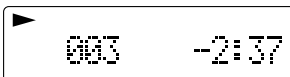

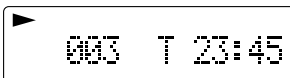

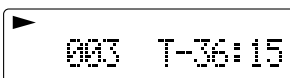

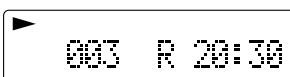

This display returns to remaining recordable time 1 in 8 seconds.

## To view the disc title or track titles :

When the MD contains the recording of the disc title, this unit displays it automatically in stop mode.

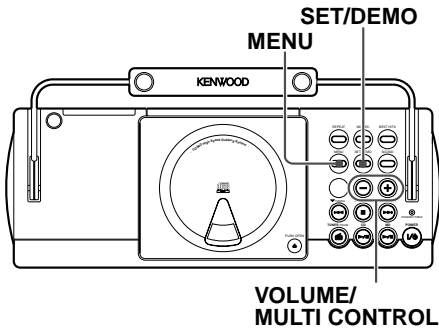
When the MD contains track title information, this unit displays them automatically in playback.

If a title is too long to be shown in a display page, press the DISPLAY key on the remote. This scrolls the displayed characters, you can read the entire information.

## POINT.

- "NO TITLE" is displayed when the MD does not contain title information.
- The displayed CD time information switches when the TIME DISPLAY key is pressed while the elapsed recording time of a track is displayed during recording from a CD onto an MD (see page 20).

# Adjusting the display back light brightness



## Main unit only

- 1** Press the MENU key.
- 2** Press the VOLUME/MULTICONTROL UP (+) or DOWN (-) key so that "BACK LIGHT ?" is displayed, then press the SET/DEMO key.



- 3** Press the VOLUME/MULTICONTROL UP (+) or DOWN (-) key to select the desired brightness, then press the SET/DEMO key.

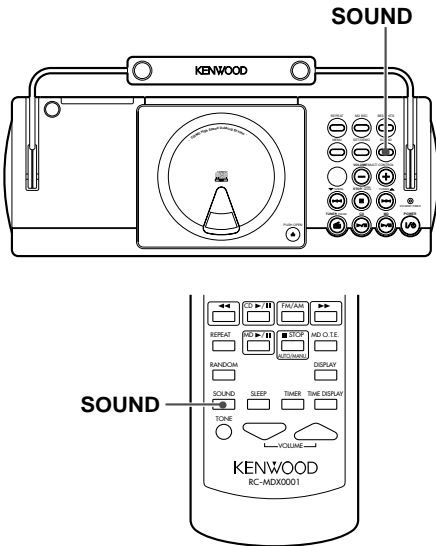
H: Normal brightness  
L: Low brightness

## POINT

- The back light brightness cannot be adjusted while the sleep timer is activated.
- Even when the brightness is set to "L", it may turn high momentarily when a key is pressed.

# Adjusting the tone

## Enhancement of bass and treble (EX.BASS/LOUDNESS)



Press the **SOUND** key repeatedly until the desired tone enhancement is displayed.

"EX. BASS" : Enhances the bass tone regardless of the current volume.

"LOUDNESS" : Enhances both the bass and treble tones according to the current volume. (Effective during low-volume listening)

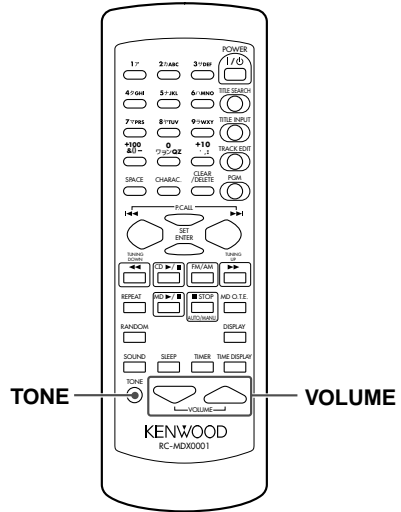
Both indicators off : Bass and treble set using the TONE function.

Display when "EX. BASS" is selected

## Fine adjustment of bass and treble (TONE)



### Remote control only

**1** Press the **TONE** key on the remote repeatedly until "BASS" or "TREBLE" is displayed.

"BASS" : Low frequency level adjustment.

"TREBLE" : High frequency level adjustment.



**2** Adjust the **VOLUME** keys to the desired level.

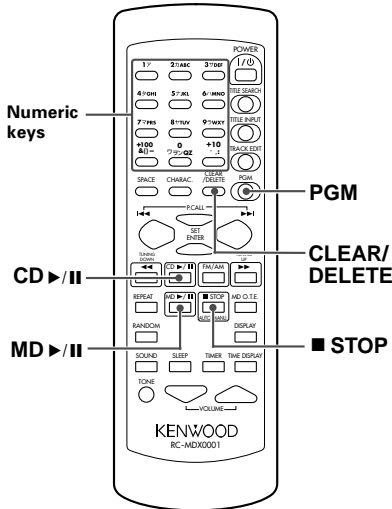
The high or low frequency level can be adjusted in the range between -8 and +8.



- The "LOUDNESS" or "EX. BASS" mode is canceled if the bass or treble level is adjusted while "LOUDNESS" or "EX. BASS" is lit.

# Playing CD or MD tracks in the desired sequence (PGM)

Use the following procedure to program up to 32 desired tracks in a desired order.

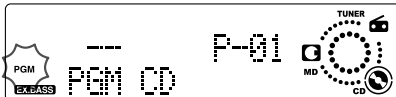


## Remote control only

**1** CD : Press the CD ►/|| key.  
MD : Press the MD ►/|| key.

**2** Press the ■ STOP key.

**3** Press the PGM key.



**4** Select the desired track.

Examples of track number inputs:

Track No. 23: +10, +10, 3

Track No. 40: +10, +10, +10, +10, 0

(Go to step 5 within 8 seconds.)

**5** Press the PGM key.

To select other tracks, repeat steps 4 and 5 for each.

**If you commit a mistake :**

Press the CLEAR/DELETE key to clear the track number and restart selection.

**6** CD : Press the CD ►/|| key.  
MD : Press the MD ►/|| key.

**To stop program playback :**

**To clear a programmed track :**

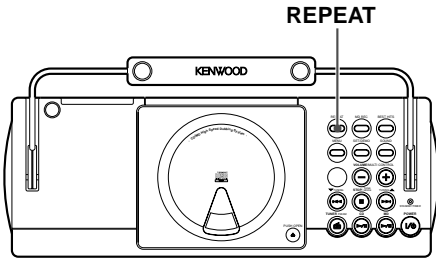

# Repeating a CD or MD (REPEAT)

## Tips for recording CD onto MD

When the MD recorder in record-pause mode, the recording can be started automatically at the same time as the playback of CD is started. (Sync recording)

- (1) Put the CD player in play-pause mode.
- (2) Press the ◀◀ or ▶▶ key for the required number of times to select the CD track to be recorded.
- (3) Press the MD REC key to put the MD recorder in record-pause mode.
- (4) Start playing the CD.

MD recording starts in synchronism.

## Recording on MD (continued)

### Recording and track numbers

**MD track numbers are used to search the beginning of a track or programming tracks.**

- Track numbers are assigned automatically in the following cases:
  - When the CD track changes during digital recording from CD to MD.
  - When audio is input after a no-sound period of more than 2 seconds.
  - When low-level sections have continued during recording of classic music, etc.
  - When the MD REC key is pressed in record-pause mode to resume recording.
- When the TRACK EDIT key on the remote is pressed during editing, a new track number is assigned at that position.
- Unnecessary track numbers can be removed by the following operations:
  - EDIT (page 42) for erasing unnecessary tracks.
  - COMBINE (page 39) for erasing an unnecessary track number by combining two tracks.

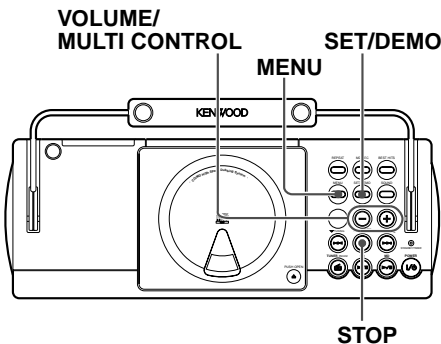
### POINT

- The MD cannot be inserted or ejected while the unit is in the STANDBY mode. Do not force insert an MD in the STANDBY mode, for this will lead to malfunction.
- When recording a CD onto an MD, the digital recording is set automatically.  
When recording a radio broadcast on an MD, the analog recording is set automatically.
- It is convenient to use the MD O.T.E. recording when recording a CD onto an MD (page 18).

The MD records signals in two ways; "digital recording" for directly recording the digital signal output from the CD and "analog recording" for recording an analog signal by converting it to a digital signal.

# High-speed recording of all CD tracks onto an MD

All of the tracks in a CD can be recorded in half the usual period of time.



## Main unit only

### 1 Make preparation for recording.

See steps 1 to 3 in "Recording CD onto MD" (page 18).

### 2 Press the MENU key.

### 3 Press the VOLUME/MULTICONTROL UP (+) or DOWN (−) key so that "REC MODE ?" is displayed, then press the SET/DEMO key.

### 4 Press the VOLUME/MULTICONTROL UP (+) or DOWN (−) key so that "CD → MD <HIGH>" is displayed, then press the SET/DEMO key.

The CD starts to be played at the double speed and the signal is recorded onto the MD also at the double speed.

When all CD tracks have been recording, both the CD and MD stop automatically.

**Perform the operations in steps 2 to 4 within 5 seconds.**

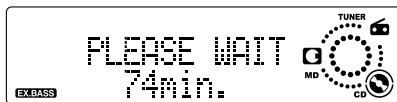

- Be careful not to apply vibration to the unit while "WRITING" is displayed, because the MD recorder is writing recorded and edited data in the MD in this period. Also, to avoid loss of recorded and edited data, do not unplug the power cord before "WRITING" disappears.
- Once high-speed recording of "CD → MD <HIGH>" has been started, it is not permitted to record the same CD by high-speed recording within 74 minutes after the start of previous high-speed recording. It is also prohibited to continue high-speed recording of more than 31 discs within 74 minutes.

If you want to record the same CD again, use the MD O.T.E. recording (page 18).



Time until the high-speed recording of the same CD is permitted

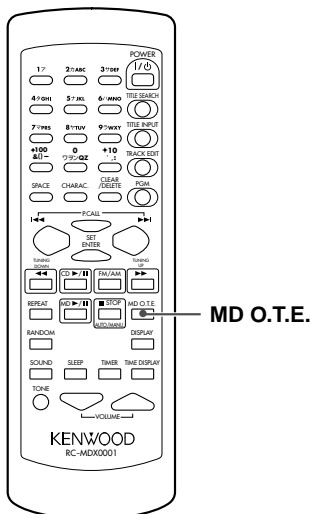

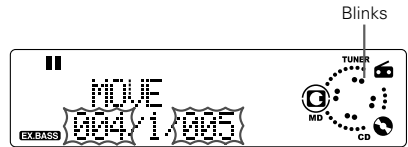

# Waking up to the timer playback

(O.T.T. = Operate easy To use Timer)

The O.T.T. timer makes timer-activated playback easy by simply setting the desired time of the day. The unit is turned off automatically in an hour after the start of timer playback. The O.T.T. timer works only once after setting.

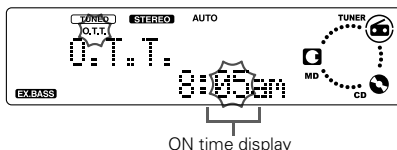

# Operating precautions

## Caution on condensation

Condensation (of dew) may occur inside the unit when there is a great difference in temperature between this unit and the outside.

This unit may not function properly if condensation occurs. In this case, leave the unit for a few hours and restart the operation after the condensation has dried up.

Be specially cautious against condensation in a following circumstance:

When this unit is carried from a place to another across a large difference in temperature, when the humidity in the room where this unit is installed increases, etc.

## Note related to transportation and movement

Before transporting or moving this unit, carry out the following operations.

- (1) Remove the CD or MD from the unit.
- (2) Press the ►/|| key of the MD.
- (3) Wait for some time and verify that the display becomes as shown in the figure.



- (4) Press the ►/|| key of the CD.
- (5) Wait for some time and verify that the display becomes as shown in the figure.



- (6) Wait a few seconds and turn the unit OFF.

## Maintenance of the unit

When the front panel or case becomes dirty, wipe with a soft, dry cloth. Do not use thinner, benzene, alcohol, etc. for these agents may cause discoloration.

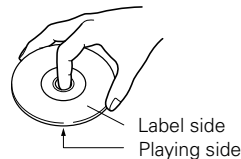
## In regard to contact cleaner

Do not use contact cleaners because it could cause a malfunction. Be specially careful not to use contact cleaners containing oil, for they may deform the plastic component.

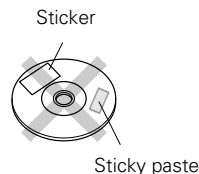
## Handling of discs

### Disc handling precautions

Hold the discs so that you do not touch the playing surface.

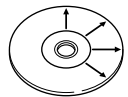


Do not attach paper or tape to either the playing side or the label side of the discs.



## Cleaning

If fingerprints or foreign matter become attached to the disc, lightly wipe the disc with a soft cotton cloth (or similar) from the center of the disc outwards in a radial manner.




## Storage

When a disc is not to be played for a long period of time, remove it from the player and store it in its case.

### Discs which can be played with this unit

CD (12cm, 8 cm) and the audio part of CDV, CD-G and CD-EXTRA.

Use discs that comply with the IEC standard, for example a disc carrying the  marking on the label surface.

### Never play a cracked or warped disc

During playback, the disc rotates at high speed in the player.

Therefore, to avoid danger, never use a cracked or deformed disc or a disc repaired with tape or adhesive agent.



Please do not use discs which are not round because they may cause a malfunction.

### Disc accessories

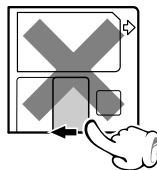
The disc accessories (stabilizer, protection sheet, protection ring, etc.) which are marketed for improving the sound quality or protecting discs as well as the disc cleaner should not be used with this system because they may cause malfunction.

### Handling of Mini Disc

As the Mini Disc is accommodated inside a cartridge, it can be handled without caring about dust or fingerprint. However, stained or soiled cartridge may cause malfunction. To enjoy beautiful sound for extended period of time, take care on the following points.

### Do not touch the disc directly.

Do not touch the disc by opening the shutter with your hand. The cartridge will be damaged if it is forced open.



### Storage position

Do not leave Mini Discs in place where the temperature and/or humidity are extremely high (for example, in a place subject to direct sunlight).

### Dust countermeasure

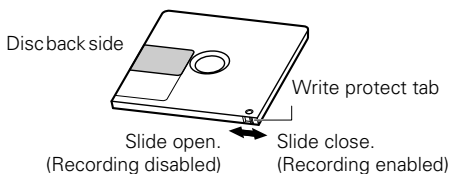
The shutter of the disc cartridge is permanently open while the disc is loaded in the set. Therefore, to prevent dust from penetrating inside the disc, take the disc out of the unit immediately after completion of recording or playback.

### Care

Wipe periodically dust and dirt attached on the cartridge with a dry cloth.

### Write protect tab

To protect recorded contents against accidental erasure, set the write protect tab of the disc open. Return the tab to the original position when you want to record signals on the disc.



### POINT

- When a protected disc is inserted, "PROTECTED" is displayed on the unit.
- When the inserted disc cannot be edited because it is protected or it contains too small number of tracks, "X OOOOO" is displayed on the unit.

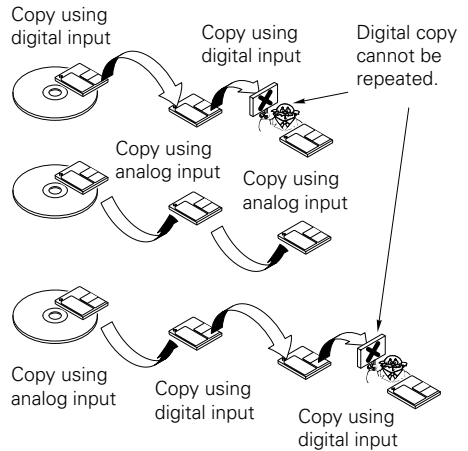

# In case of difficulty

**What seems to be a malfunction is not always so. Before calling for service, check the following table according to the symptom of your trouble.**

## Operation to reset

The microcomputer may fall into malfunction when a cord is unplugged and plugged again while the unit is ON or due to an external cause. In such a case, the microcomputer should be reset as described below:

**Unplug the power cord from the wall outlet and, while holding the REPEAT key depressed, plug the power cord again. This initializes the microcomputer. Note that this clears the previously stored memory.**

Sound is not produced.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>→ Increase the volume level (page 12).</li><li>→ Unplug the headphones if they are connected (page 9).</li></ul>

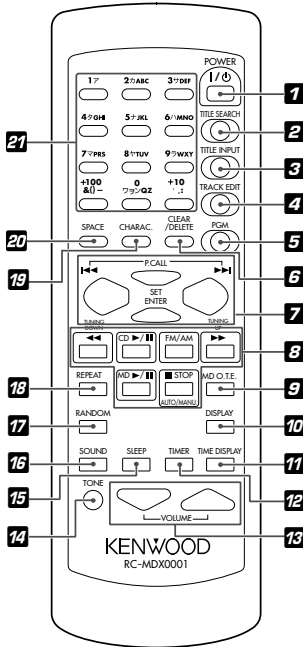
While the standby indicator of the unit is lit, a small amount of current is flowing into the unit's internal circuitry to back up the memory. This condition is referred to as the standby mode of the unit. While the unit is in the standby mode, it can be turned ON from the remote control unit.
