

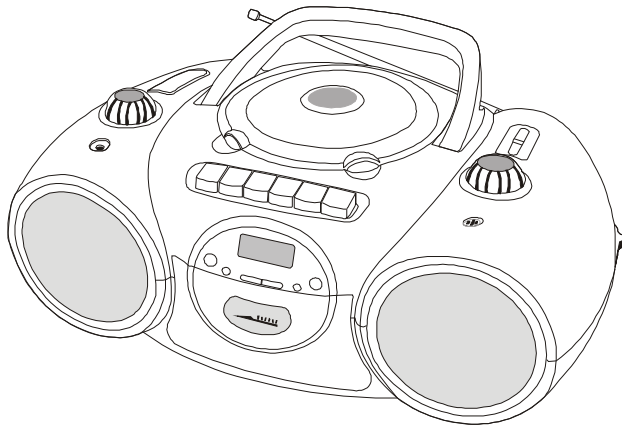

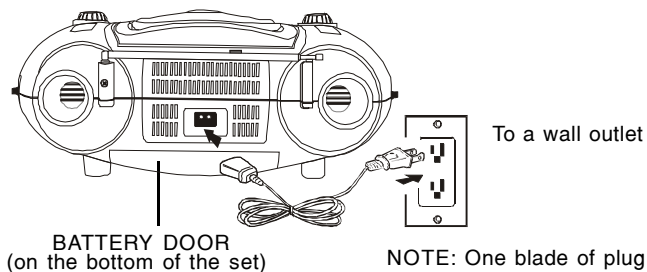
1. Use only the type and size of batteries mentioned in the operating instructions booklet (batteries are not included with this set, please buy the proper batteries).
2. Do not dispose of the batteries into a fire. The cells may explode. Check with local codes for possible special disposal instructions.
3. Do not open or mutilate the batteries. Released electrolyte is corrosive and may cause damage to the eyes or skin. It may be toxic if swallowed.
4. Be careful when handling batteries in order not to short the battery with conducting materials such as rings, bracelets and keys. The battery or conductor may over heat and cause burns.
5. Do not attempt to recharge non-rechargeable batteries. The batteries may leak corrosive electrolyte or explode.

CHOOSING THE POWER SOURCES

You can use the AC power or batteries as a power source.



TIP

- If the plug of the AC power cord does not match your outlet, do not force it. Reverse it and try again. The plug is polarized and only fits one way into the wall outlet.
- Replace the batteries when the POWER lamp dims or when the player stops operating. Replace all the batteries with new ones. Before you replace the batteries, be sure to take out the CD from the player and remember to check the Battery Safety Instructions on Page 3.
- If the CD does not play on batteries, this means the batteries are almost used up. But the radio may continue to play on these weak batteries because it uses less power than the CD player.

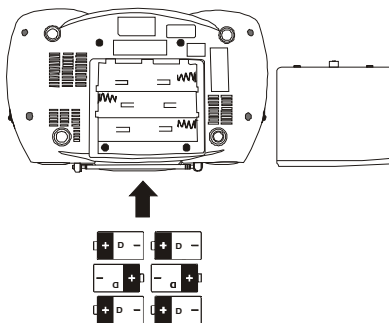
1. Connecting the AC power

Insert one end of the supplied AC power cord into the socket located at the rear of the set, and the other end into the 120V, 60Hz standard household outlet.

2. Using the player on batteries

Insert 6 size "D" batteries (not supplied) into the battery compartment as shown, observe + and - polarities.

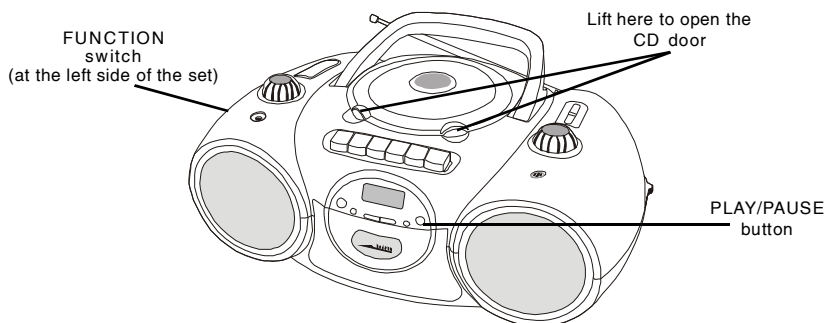
To use the player on batteries, disconnect the AC power cord from both the wall outlet and the back of the player.

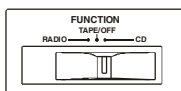

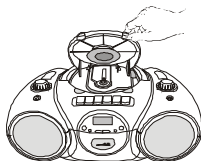

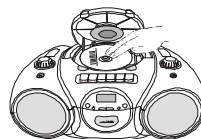
Slide the FUNCTION switch to CD position (power on), the POWER lamp will be on, the display will show 2 dashes "--" flashing, then "00".



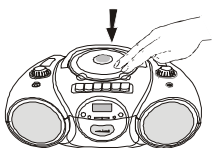

Lift the either side of the CD DOOR to open it and place a CD in the CD compartment. The label side of the CD should face upward.

Close the CD DOOR by pushing it down. The display will show the total tracks of that CD.

Press the CD PLAY/PAUSE button, the PLAY/PAUSE lamp will be steadily on, the player will play all the music tracks once.

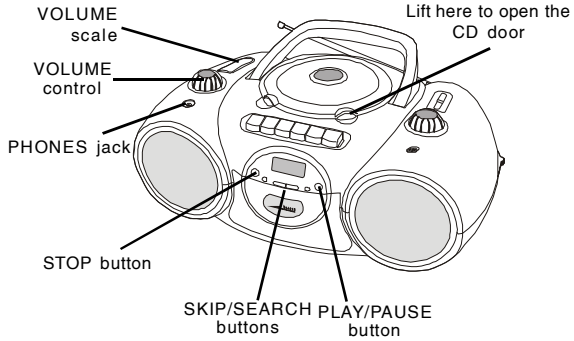
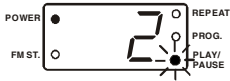

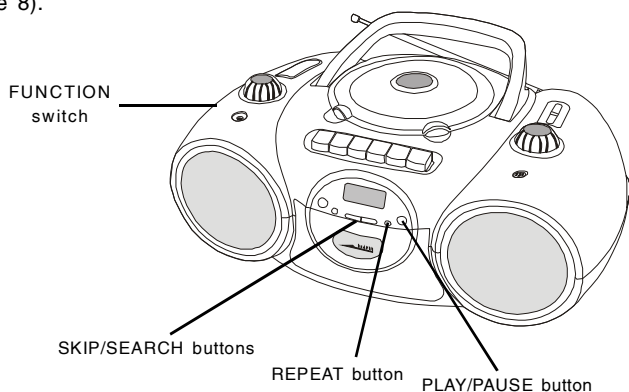
- When CD play is paused, the PLAY/PAUSE lamp will flash and no music will play.
- To resume play, press the PLAY/PAUSE button again, the PLAY/PAUSE lamp will stop flashing and music will play.
- If you bump the set during CD play, the music will stop or skip for a few seconds. This is normal for this type of player.

You can play CD tracks over and over in normal or programmed play mode (refer to page 8).



1. Slide the FUNCTION switch to CD position, the POWER lamp will be steadily on.
2. Select the track by pressing **◀◀** or **▶▶**, and then press **▶▶**.
3. Press the REPEAT button.

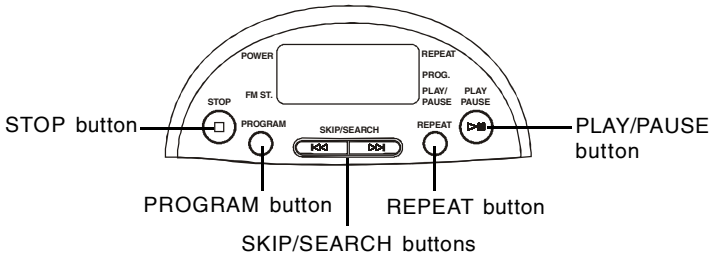

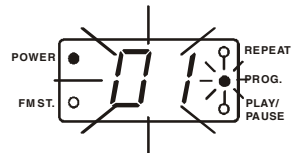


PLAYING CD TRACKS IN PROGRAMMED ORDER

You can make a program of up to 20 tracks in the order you want them to be played.



1. Slide the FUNCTION switch to CD position. Make sure the CD is stopped.
2. Press the PROGRAM button. The letters "01" and the PROG. lamp will flash.
3. Press ►► or ◀◀ to select the track you want to program in the order you want. The track number you selected will be steadily on and the PROG. lamp will flash.
4. Press the PROGRAM button to confirm. The letters "02" and the PROG. lamp will flash.
5. Repeat above steps 3 and 4. You can program up to 20 tracks, then the display will show the tracks number you programmed, and the PROG. lamp will flash.
6. Press ►► to start programmed play. The PROG. lamp will be steadily on.



NOTE:

1. Programming can only be done while in STOP mode.
2. The programmed memory will be lost if the STOP button is pressed twice or the power is shut off, or the CD door is opened.

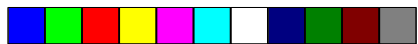

PRECAUTIONS

On Safety

- As the laser beam used in the CD player section may be harmful to the eyes, do not attempt to disassemble the cabinet. Refer servicing to qualified personnel only.
- Should any solid object or liquid fall into the player, unplug the player, and have it checked by qualified personnel before operating it any further.

On Placement

- Do not leave the player in a location near a heat source, or in a place subject to direct sunlight, excessive dust or mechanical shock.
- Do not place the player on an inclined or unstable place.
- Do not place anything within 1 inch of the back of the cabinet. The ventilation holes must not be covered for the player to operate properly and prolong the life of its components.
- If the player is left in a car parked in the sun, be sure to choose a location in the car where the player will not be subjected to the direct rays of the sun.
- Since a strong magnet is used for the speakers, keep personal credit cards using magnetic coding or springwound watches away from the player to prevent possible damage from the magnets.

On Power Sources

- For battery operation, use 6 size "D" batteries. We recommend alkaline batteries for longer life.
- When the batteries will not be used for a few weeks or more, remove them to avoid damage that can be caused by battery leakage or corrosion.

On Operation

- If the player is brought directly from a cold to a warm location, or is placed in a very damp room, moisture may condense on the lens inside the CD player section. Should this occur, the player will not operate properly. In this case, remove the CD and wait about an hour for the moisture to evaporate. If the player has not been used for a long time, set it in playback mode to warm it up for a few minutes before inserting a cassette.
- This CD player is designed to be played on a stable no vibration position. If you bump the set during CD play, the music will stop or skip for a few seconds. This is normal for this type of player.

Notes on CDs

- Before playing, clean the CD with a cleaning cloth. Wipe the CD from the center out.

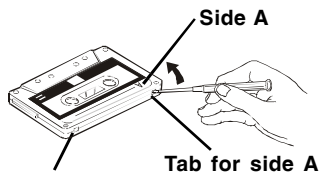


- Do not use solvents such as benzene, thinner, commercially available cleaners or anti-static spray intended for vinyl LPs.
- Do not expose the CD to direct sunlight or heat sources such as hot air ducts, nor leave it in a car parked in direct sunlight as there can be a considerable rise in temperature inside the car.
- Do not stick paper or stickers on the CD, nor scratch the CD.
- After playing, store the CD in its case. If there is a scratch, dirt or fingerprints on the CD, it may cause a tracking error or skipping.



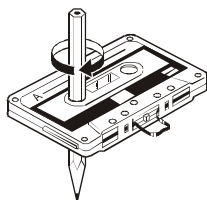
Notes on Cassettes

- Break off the cassette tab from side A or B to prevent accidental recording.



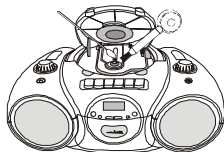
Tab for side B

- To record on a tape with its tab broken off, cover the respective tab hole for side A or B with adhesive tape.
- **Use of a cassette with more than 90 minutes, such as C-120 (120 minutes), is not recommended. The extreme thinness of this tape may damage this set.**
- To reduce the chances of tape jamming or tangling, you should check that there are no loose layers of tape visible through the cassette center window. If any, tighten these loose layers of tape using a pencil before inserting the cassette into the set.



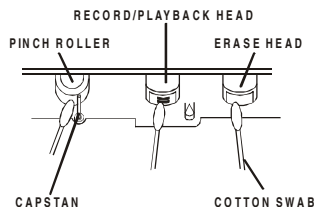
MAINTENANCE Cleaning the Lens

If the lens becomes dirty, it may cause a skipping of sound during CD operation. Clean with a commercially available lens cleaner and blower.



Cleaning the Tape Head

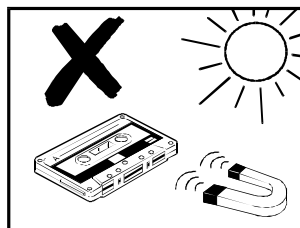
Wipe the tape head, the pinch roller and the capstan with a cleaning swab slightly moistened with cleaning fluid or alcohol after every 10 hours of operation for optimum playback and recording quality. After cleaning, insert a tape when the areas cleaned are completely dry.



NOTE: In order to see and clean the tape head, you may have to press PLAY first.

Notes for Storing Cassette Tape

1. Do not put a tape near a magnetic field, such as a TV, or speaker. Magnetic fields may reduce the tape sensitivity or even erase the recording.
2. Do not store tape for any length of time in a hot, moist or dusty place.



Cleaning the Cabinet

Clean the cabinet, panel and controls with a soft cloth slightly moistened with a mild detergent solution. Do not use any type of abrasive pad, scouring powder, or solvent, such as alcohol or benzene.
