Product Feature

Front View



- 1 (IR) Infrared Receiver: Receives IR signals from the remote control.
(Power on/Standby) LED Indicator: Press **POWER** to turn on or off.
Indicator on (Red) Standby mode
Indicator on (Green) Power on mode

The effective range of the IR signal is approx 6 metres and an angle of +/- 30 deg

2 The functions of the buttons are described as below:

MENU: Press to display the TV menu, Press again to exit the menu.

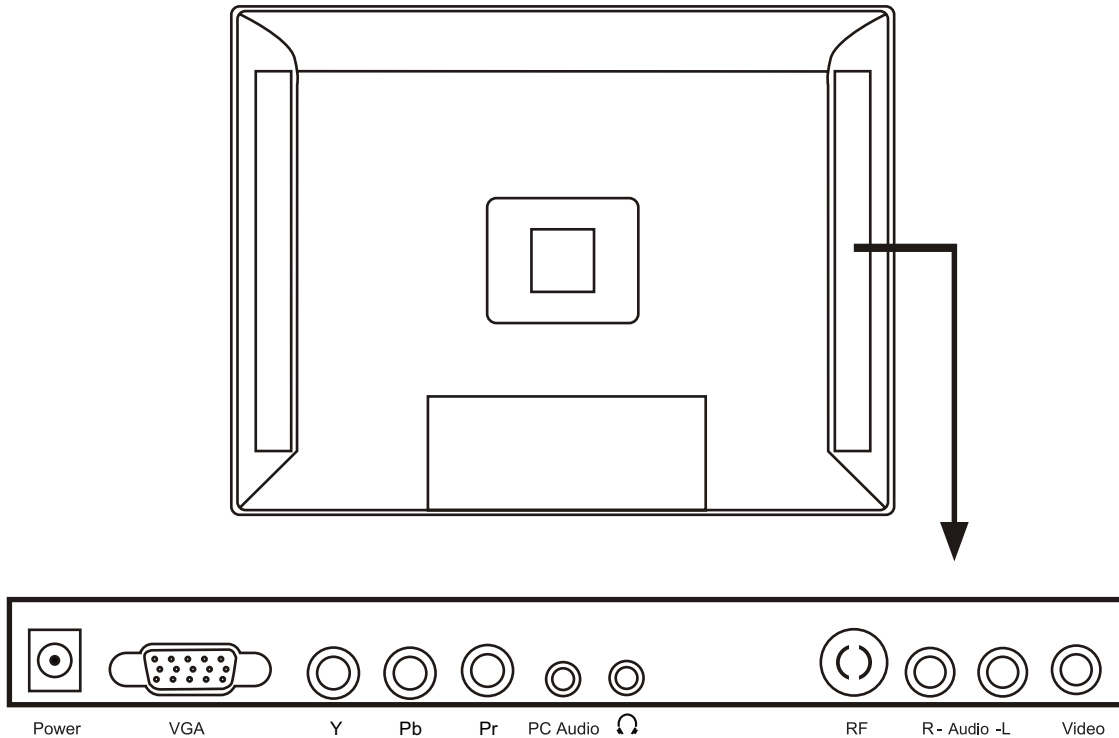
CH-/CH+: Press to scan through channels. When pressing and holding down either button, the user can scan channels quickly.

VOL-/VOL+: Press to adjust the volume.

INPUT: Press to select the source: TV, AV, PC, YCbCr

Power: Turn the TV on or standby

Rear View




Power : Connection to Power adaptor.

VGA : PC Monitor display input. Connect to your PC Mini D15 pin connector.

YCbCr : Component video from a DVD player or other compatible devices.

PC Audio : Audio connection from PC.

 : Connect to headphones

RF : Tuner / Antenna RF input.

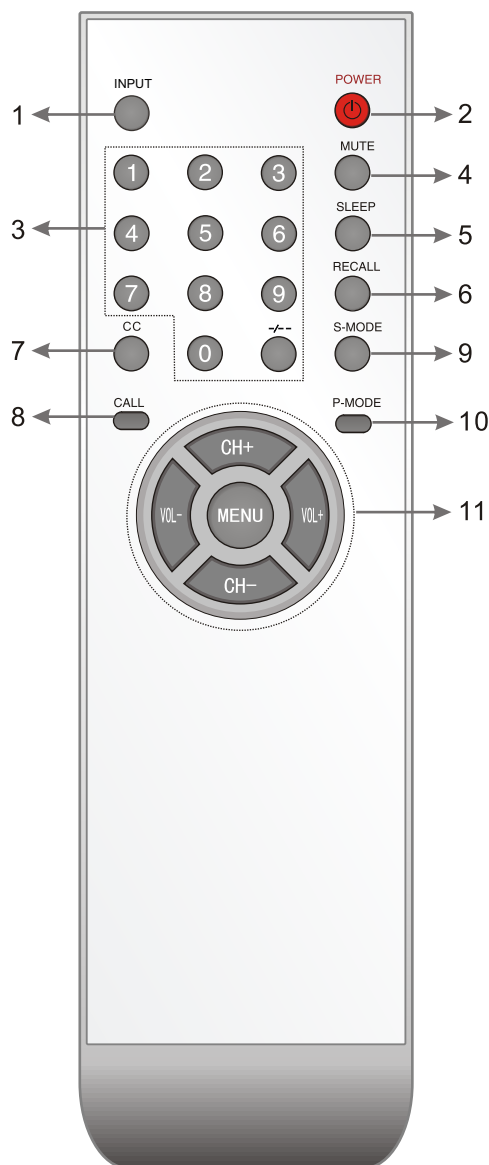
R-AUDIO-L : Right and Left Audio input from other sources such as VCR.

Video : Composite video input from other sources such as a VCR.

Wall Mounting

The TV is provided with mounting holes for a VESA approved wall mounting bracket (NOT SUPPLIED). Remove the Two Posi screws holding the base to the base bracket and lift the base away (do not remove the base mounting bracket). Mount the VESA bracket using 4 x M4x8 Iso metric threaded screws (not supplied). Do not use screws longer than 8 mm, damage will occur to the internal parts. Fit the wall bracket securely following the manufacturers instructions.

Remote Control



- 1. INPUT:** input source select.
- 2. POWER:** turn on or off the TV.
- 3. 0-9,-/--:** choose channel directly.
Number buttons for Teletext
- 4. MUTE:** silence.
- 5. SLEEP:** shutdown timer.
- 6. RECALL:** go back to play the previous channel.
- 7. CC:** shortcut key for caption function
- 8. CALL:** display current mode.
- 9. S-MODE:** select the sound mode: User, Normal, News and Movie.
- 10. P-MODE:** select the picture mode: User, Normal, Soft or Vivid.
- 11. CH+/-:** scan through channels. **Cursor buttons in TV menu.**
VOL+/-: adjust the volume. **Cursor buttons in TV menu.**
MENU: TV system setup menu.

Installing the Remote Control Batteries

Remove the battery cover from the remote control and put 2x AA size batteries (provided) inside the compartment.

Using the Remote Control

To use the remote control, point it towards the sensor located on the front right of the TV set. You can operate all functions using the remote control. Additionally, some functions also have buttons on the TV set (see Page 5).

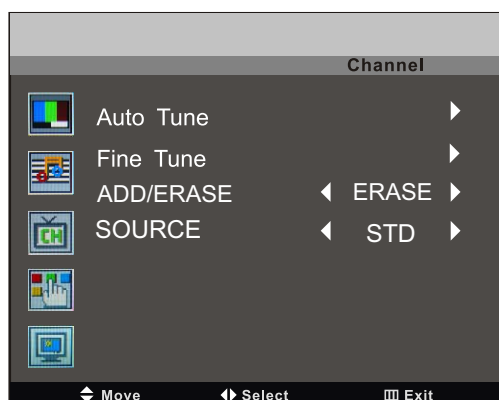
Note: If the TV set is not going to be used for an extended period, remove the batteries from the remote control and unplug the unit.

Selecting TV Mode or Input Source

TV.

1. Connect the Power adaptor to the DC input socket and the Aerial lead to the TV Tuner input.
2. To turn ON, press the **POWER** button.
3. Press the **INPUT** button on the TV or the **INPUT** button on the Remote Control, the source menu will display on the screen "see picture right". Use the **CH+/-** buttons to select the source, press **VOL+** button to confirm.
Note: AV/S-Video, YPbPr mode is used when a VCR, DVD or other equipment is connected to the set.
4. Press **MENU** button on the TV or the remote control, the screen will display the OSD menu. Press the **CH+/-** button to select the third menu channel (see picture below) press the **VOL+** button to enter the menu, press the **CH+/-** buttons to select the item "Auto Tune". Press the **VOL+** button, the TV will start to auto search. When Auto Tune is completed the TV will display the first station received.

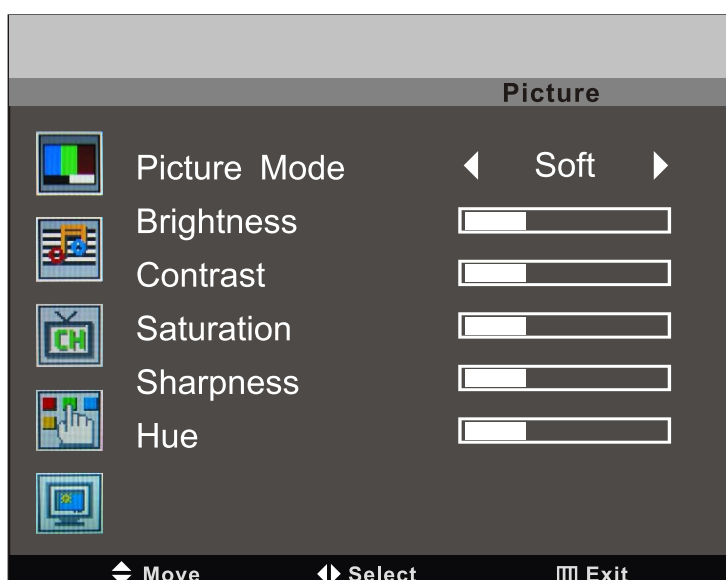
1. Connect the TV to the PC using a 15pin VGA lead and a PC audio socket.
2. Press the **INPUT** button to display the source menu, use the **CH+/-** buttons to select PC and press the **VOL+** button to confirm. The TV will now display the signals from the PC. You may need to adjust the PC to the TV (See page 13).

TV OSD MENUS

Press the **MENU** button on the remote control, the screen will display the OSD menu.
Press the **CH+/-** buttons to select the Main Menu (Picture, Sound, Channel, Function, PC) and press the **VOL+** button to enter.
You can press the **VOL+/-** buttons to select, adjust or enter a sub menu.

Note: Items highlighted in the Menu's can be adjusted. Items "greyed" out are not available.

Picture menu



Picture Mode: select the picture display mode----User, Normal, Soft, Vivid.

You can also use the **P-MODE** button on the remote control to select.

Brightness: adjust the brightness of the picture.

Contrast: adjust the contrast of the picture.

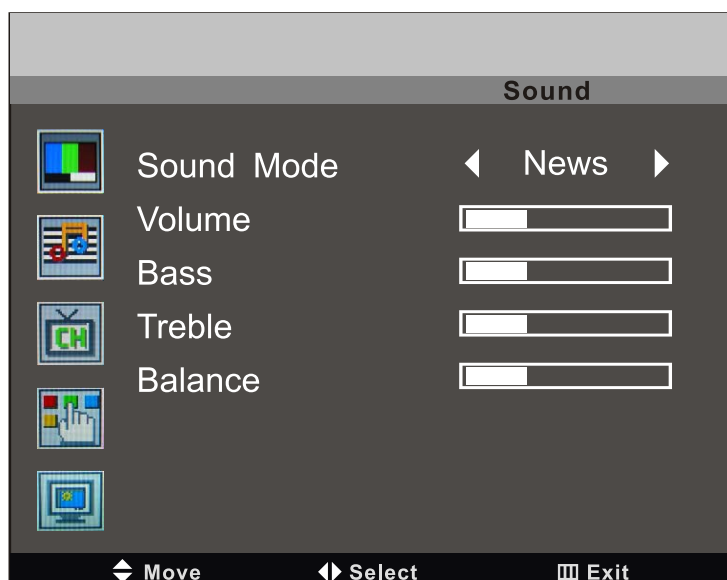
Saturation: adjusts the colour.

Sharpness: adjust the sharpness of the picture.

Hue: adjust the hue of the picture (only used in the mode of NTSC).

Note: when you are in the mode of PC, you can only adjust the brightness and contrast.

Sound menu



Sound Mode: select the sound mode----User, Normal, News, Movie.

You can also use the **S-MODE** button on the remote control to select.

Volume: adjust the volume of the sound.

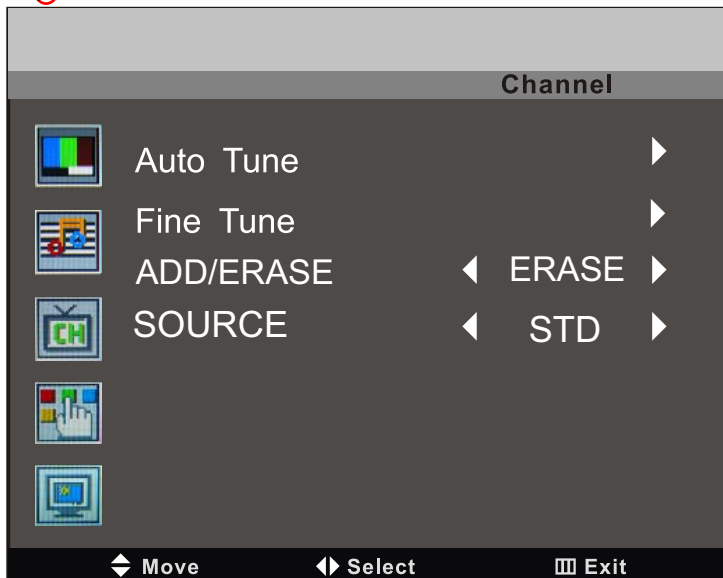
You can also use the **VOL+/-** button on the remote control or TV set to adjust the volume.

Bass: adjust the bass of the sound.

Treble: adjust the treble of the sound.

Balance: adjust the balance of the sound.

Channel Menu (this menu is only used in TV mode)



Auto Tune. Press the **VOL+** button, the TV will start to auto search. When Auto Tune is completed the TV will display the first station received.

Note: when Auto Tune starts, you can press **MENU** to stop it.

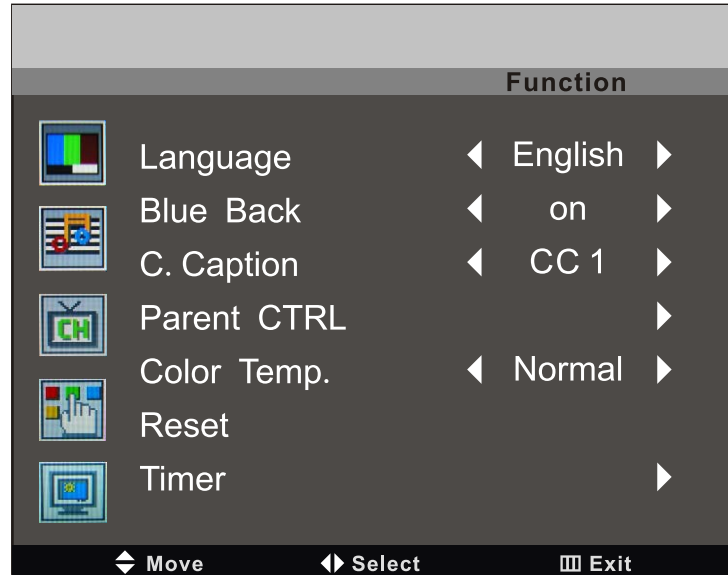


Fine Tune : press the **VOL-** button to tune upwards and press the **VOL+** button to tune downwards.

ADD/ERASE: press the **VOL+** button to select "ADD" or "ERASE".

SOURCE: press the **VOL+** button to select "STD" , "IRC" , "HRC" or "AIR".

Function menu



Language: select the OSD Language.

Blue Back: select On or Off to display the blue background under no signal.

C.Caption: select the caption mode: CC1,CC2,CC3,CC4,TEXT1,TEXT2,TEXT3,TEXT4,Off

Parent CTRL: press the **VOL+** button, then press the number button "0" four times (password), the OSD menu will display as the right picture. (see page 16 to get definition)

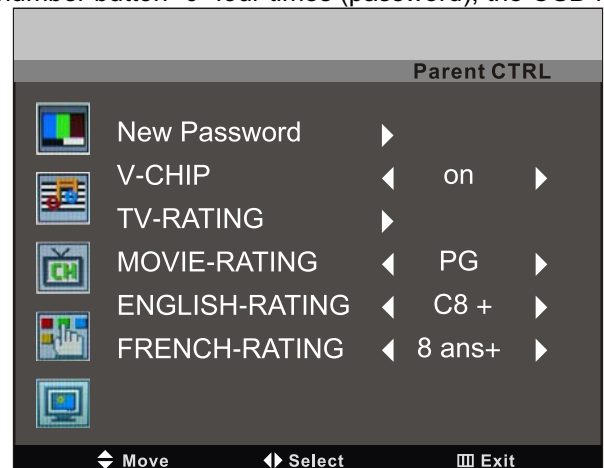
1. New Password: enter the new password.

2. V-CHIP: turn on/off the V-Chip function.

3. TV-RATING: press the **VOL+** button to enter the TV-Rating MENU as below:

Left kry: Block/Unblock



Notice: "ENGLISH RATING" and "FRENCH RATING" are only for Canada.

press the **CH+/CH-/VOL+** button to select, and press the **VOL-** button to change.

4. MOVIE-RATING: change the movie-rating: G,PG,PG-13,R,NC-17,X,NONE.

5. ENGLISH-RATING: change the English-rating: C8+,G,PG,14.+,18.+,EC.

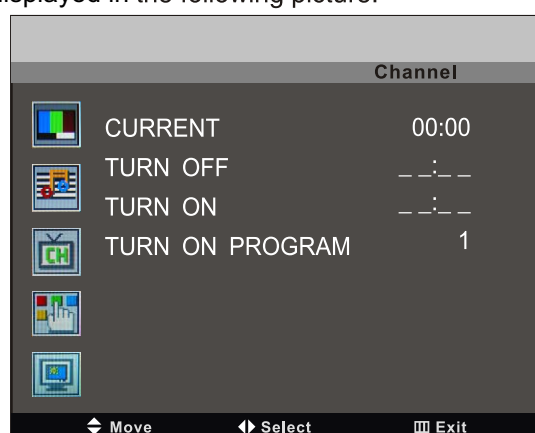
6. FRENCH-RATING: change the French-rating: 8 ans+,13 ans+,16 ans+,18ans+,EG.

Color Temp: adjusting the colour temperature. You may select Cool, Warm, Normal or User. User allows you to set the Red, Green and Blue individually.

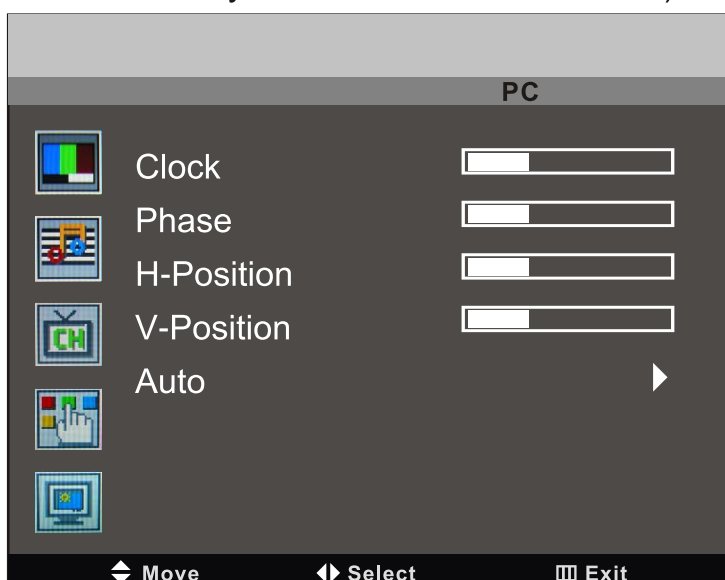
Reset: Select "Reset" and press **VOL+** to reset all analog settings to "Factory Default"

Timer: press the **VOL+** button to enter the timer menu displayed in the following picture.

You must set the Current Time by pressing the **CH+/-** buttons to select the "HOURS". Press **VOL+** and **CH+/-** to change the time. Press **VOL+** to select "MINUTES" and the **CH+/-** buttons to set the time. To set the "OFF" and "ON" times Select using the **CH+/-** buttons, set the times required as you did for setting the time. If you want the TV to switch to a particular station select "TURN ON PROGRAM" using the **CH+/-** buttons and change using the **VOL+/-** buttons.



PC menu (the menu can only be used in the mode of PC)



Clock: adjust the pixel clock frequency, until the image size is maximized for the screen.

Phase: adjust the phase of the ADC sampling clock relative to the sync signal, until a stable image is obtained.

H/V-Position: adjust the horizontal/vertical position of the screen.

Auto: press the **VOL+** button to setup the parameter of the screen automatically.

Parental Control (page 12)

Press  to enter the sub menu, then use 0-9 to enter the correct password. (default password is 0 0 0 0).

If used, this optional feature can “block” undesirable programming from appearing on the TV. Parental Control offers the user a wide variety of options and settings that restrict or “block” the programming that can appear on the TV. Parental control allows the user the capability of defining which program rating they consider acceptable, to the younger or more sensitive viewers. It can be preset and turned either on or off by the user who specifies the secret 4-number code. The number of hours blocked are specified. General audience and children viewer blocks should both be programmed into the TV’s memory. Viewer ratings are specified for both TV and the motion picture industry; both rating systems should be used for complete coverage.

The ratings are based on the ages of children.

Overview

To insure complete coverage for all TV programs, (movies and regular TV shows) choose a rating for CBRS, from the selections below, and choose ratings from the TV Parental Guidelines Rating System below, using the Age Block option for General Audiences, and for Children. In addition to those, you may wish to add additional restrictions from the Content Block menu. See the Parental Control menu, and submenus example below.

Things to Consider before Setting Up Parental Control

Determine which rating you consider acceptable to the viewer. (For example, if you choose PG, all more restrictive ratings will be automatically blocked; the viewer will not be able to see: 14+ and 18+ rated programming.)

Do you want to block the auxiliary video source entirely? (Blocks the signal sent by the equipment, such as a VCR, connected to the TV Audio/Video input jacks) Or leave unblocked, then choose allowable ratings. Block program “Content” based on individual parameters such as: Strong Dialog, Bad Language, Sex Scenes, Violence Scenes, or Fantasy Violence Scenes; in the Content Blk option.



Select a secret password; in the Set Password option. Use the number keys on the remote. Don’t forget the password, it is the only way you can access the Parental Control menu and change rating selections, or turn Parental Control off.

Do you want Parental Control to be active all the time? If not, you can turn it on or off with the Lock On/Off option.


- * You can set different Parental Control viewing restrictions for general audiences and for children, both can be active at the same time.
- * Simply specifying one content block such as Bad Language, will not automatically block other content in the program from appearing.
- * Even if you choose to leave the Aux inputs unblocked, the ratings you specify will automatically restrict the programming that appears from the video sources.
- * You can not disable Parental Control by disconnecting the TV from power. Block hours will automatically reset to the original block time setting specified if power is disconnected.

Note

The V-Chip will automatically block certain categories that are ‘more restrictive’.
If you block the C8+ category, then G will be automatically blocked.
Similarly, if you block the G category, then all the categories in the ‘young adult’ will be blocked (E, C, and C8+).

Troubleshooting

In some areas the digital terrestrial signal may be weak. It is best to use an antenna that will boost the signal for better viewing of weaker channels.

TV Problems

No power

- Check the power connection
- Pull the plug out, wait for 1 minute, then reconnect the power and open the set

No picture and sound

- Ensure that the TV is plugged in and that the power is on.
- Ensure that the aerial is connected.
- Try a different program.

Poor picture quality

- Check the aerial connections.
- Check that the channel is tuned properly.
- Adjust the picture settings: brightness, colour, sharpness, contrast, and hue.
- Make sure that the TV is not located close to electrical appliances that may emit radio frequency interference.


No colour

- Adjust the colour setting.
- Check that the program is broadcast in colour.
- Check that the channel is tuned properly.

Remote Control does not work

- Check that there are no obstructions between the remote control and the unit.
- Check that the remote control is within range of the unit.
- Check that the battery in the remote control is not weak or exhausted.
