## **OSD Main Menu Screen**

Press the MENU button on the remote to display the main menu screen. Then press the NUMBER button on the remote control for the desired feature displayed on the menu. When you select a feature, turn to the section in this manual and read the accompanying instructions.

### **VCR Status Display**

- l. Press the MENU button.
- Next, press the 2 button to select "VCR SET UP."
- 3. Then, press the 1 button to select "ON SCREEN MODE."
- 4. Now, press the 1, 2, or 3 button to select "ON SCREEN ON," "COUNTER ONLY" or "ON SCREEN OFF."
- "[ON]" appears beside the selection mode.

#### POSITION

ON SCREEN ON: Whenever a function button (Stop, FF, etc.) is pressed, a 5 second VCR Status Display appears.

COUNTER ONLY: Whenever a function button (Stop, FF, etc.) is pressed, a 5 second VCR Status Display appears.

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After 5 seconds, the counter information will remain on the screen. ON SCREEN OFF: In this position, there will be no indication when normal functions are pressed.

Except in the ON SCREEN OFF mode:

- You may display the VCR Status any time by pressing the STATUS button. Status display remains on for 5 seconds.
- Channels (when tuned) are displayed as an overlay for a few seconds.

## **OSD Language Select**

- 1. Press the MENU button.
- 2. Next, press the 2 button to select "VCR SET UP."
- 3. Then, press the 3 button to select "LANGUAGE."
- 4. Now, press the 1 or 2 button to select "ENGLISH" or "SPANISH." All OSD (On-Screen Displays) will appear in the language you select. "[ON]" will appear beside the selection if you choose English and "[SI]" will appear if you choose Spanish.

## **Blank Channel Indication**

If the channel you select has no broadcast, the screen will change to a solid blue field. The screen will remain blue until an active channel is selected.

# ne Touch Recording

To set the VCR (Video Cassette Recorder) to automatically shut off after recording is completed, follow steps 1-below. OTR lets you quickly specify how long you want recording to continue. You don't have to program the timer with this function. You must use your remote control.

#### **Hook Up Your VCR**

 If the reception on all VHF (Very High Frequency) channels is unsatisfactory, you may need to re-tune your TV set.

#### **Clock Adjustment**

- In the Clock Adjustment mode, be sure to enter the first digit and all subsequent entries within 10 seconds of one another. Otherwise, the VCR will automatically leave this mode and the program you were watching will return to the screen. If this happens, press the MENU button and start again.
- Be sure to enter "0" before single-digit numbers.
- The letters indicating the day of the week will appear when you have entered both digits for the year.
- If the digits entered for the month or day do not match the calendar, the entry will be rejected and "?" will appear.
- If you press the MENU button while in the Clock Set mode, the TV screen will return to the program you were watching.
