




Cooling operation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Indoor temperature range: 21 to 32°C The heat-exchanger freezes in the indoor unit if you operate it continuously at 21°C or below and it causes water leakage occasionally. Outside air temperature range: -5 to 43°C
Heating operation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Indoor temperature range: 18 to 30°C Outside air temperature range: -20 to 24°C Operation is occasionally interrupted when the unit heats at 24°C or above (For protection purpose)

REMOTE CONTROL

NOTE:

- Ensure that the button is pressed correctly because pressing of multiple buttons simultaneously will make the setting incorrect.
- The illustrations of the wired remote control is for explanatory purpose only. The appearance may be different during actual operation.
- Do not press the remote control buttons with any sharp objects as this may damage the remote control.
- Buttons marked with * in page 3 are not needed for normal operation. If one of these buttons is pressed by mistake, press the same button once more to cancel the operation.







① "FILTER RESET" Display - Appears after $\approx 1,000$ hours of operation.

② "CHECK" Display - []

③ REMOTE - The OFF/ON button cannot be used
LOCAL - All wired remote control buttons can be used

④ Indicates the unit in Test run, Pre-heat or Defrost mode

⑤ Operation Indicator - Lights up when unit in operation

⑥ TIMER/CLOCK - []

⑦ CHECK button - Press if "CHECK" display is flashing. - []

⑧ ODOUR WASH - Press once to provide odour removing operation. Press more than 3 seconds for odour clear operation. - []

⑨ ECONOMY - Provides Energy Saving by increasing (COOL mode) or decreasing (HEAT mode) the temperature by 0.5°C per 30 minutes to a maximum of 2°C.

⑩ *VENTILATION button - Optional Part

⑪ *TEST RUN button.

⑫ FILTER RESET button - Press to reset "FILTER RESET" display after washing the filter.

Note: * Not needed for normal operation.

DETAILS OF OPERATION MODE

FAN - Air Circulation

Fan operation, to circulate air in the room.

COOL - Cooling

Choose the right temperature to be comfortably cool!

DRY - Dehumidifying

Very gentle cooling and dehumidifying operation.

AUTO - Automatic

Based on the intake & remote control setting temperature, the system automatically chooses : HEAT, FAN and COOL.

HEAT - Heating

Choose the right temperature to be comfortably warm!


WIRED REMOTE CONTROL

- 2 types of Timer can be selected. **Daily or Weekly Timer**

MODE

Press once to change CLOCK or TIMER

Press more than 3 seconds to change Daily or Weekly Timer.



Daily Timer Setting

Press SELECT ①

ON Timer will activate

Select desired time by pressing UP/DOWN ② then press SET ③ to confirm, or press CANCEL ④ if do not want any ON Timer setting.

Then OFF Timer will activate.

Select desired time by pressing UP/DOWN ② then press SET ③ to confirm, or press CANCEL ④ if do not want any OFF Timer setting.

NOTE:

To cancel or revise the current setting you may follow the above step.
TIMER will only start if TIMER display appear.

Timer nearer to current time will be activated first.

Weekly Timer Setting

You may select Single day or whole week setting.

If want to select Single day setting Press UP/DOWN ② to select the day then press SELECT ① If want to select same Timer for the whole week. Press SELECT ① Display will show whole day in a week with triangle mark.(Note : You may deselect some of the day. Press UP/DOWN ② then SET ③ to clear the triangle mark.) Then press SELECT ①

Start to set the 1st Timer. (For Single day or whole week)

Press UP/DOWN ② to select ON or OFF Timer then press SET ③ to confirm.
Press UP/DOWN ② again to select desired time.

If want to select together with temperature, press TEMP UP/DOWN ④, then press SET ③ or Press CANCEL ④ if you do not want to set any Timer.
Repeat the above to set 2nd ~ 6th Timer.

Before Cleaning



Power supply-OFF



Soaps/Household detergents



Benzine/Thinner/Scouring powder

Indoor unit



Wipe gently with dry soft cloth or cloth slightly moistened with water/neutral detergent solution.

Pre-season inspection

Check Ground Wire



Must be connected and in good condition

Check "—" air intake and "--" air outlet



Ensure there is no obstructive item.

"ON" the power supply, 12 hours before operation.



Immediate operation, may cause damage to the unit.

ODOURWASH

Press more than 3 seconds. The unit will automatically perform fan and heating (40°C) operation for 20 minutes. During this operation odours are removed, internal parts are dried & the growth of mold is minimized. (Recommended to open the windows during this operation)

For extended non-operation



Operate to dry internal parts (2-3 hours)

Recommended Inspections

After several seasons and due to operational conditions, the performance may be reduced by dirt or foul odours may occur.

6 Troubleshooting

OK?

- ✓ No problem
- 1 Operation delayed for 3 minutes after successful restart. ► Self protecting procedure.
 - 2 It sounds like water flowing... ► Caused by refrigerant flow inside.
 - 3 Creaking noise during start and stop operation. ► Caused by panel expanding/contracting due to temperature change.
 - 4 Peculiar odour during operation. ► Smell emitted by household items.
 - 5 Mist seems to emerge from the indoor unit. ► Condensation effect due to cooling.
 - 6 Unit switch to FAN operation and air become humid. ► Temperature has reached the setting. Automatically, FAN mode is activated and humidity increases.
 - 7 During DRY operation, air being blown out feels cool. ► It is due to cooling operation with low fan speed. Select COOL, if operating for long period of time to lower the humidity.
 - 8 Operation starts after power resumes. ► Auto restart is in function and operates under previous setting.
 - 9 Outdoor unit emits water/steam. ► Condensed moisture due to cooling.

HEAT PUMP only

- 10 Airflow malfunction when starting operation (PRE HEAT-display). ► In warming up process.
- 11 Operation stops occasionally (DEFROST-display). ► Outdoor unit defrosts up to 12 minutes to complete.
- 12 Operation does not stop after OFF/ON are pressed. ► Discharging heat is in process. Operation stops at 60 seconds.
- 13 Changes in fan speed. ► Temperature has reached the setting. Fan speed resumes after temperature drops.
- 14 Outdoor unit emits noise during heating operation. ► Changes in flow of refrigerant gas when operation stops and starts.
- 15 Outdoor unit emits steam during heating operation. ► Due to the frosted heat exchanger, the defrost operation will begin.



1 No Operation

► Circuit breaker tripped? ► Power supply OK?

2 Cooling/ Heating efficiency low

► Temperature set correctly?

► Windows/doors closed?

► Outdoor unit obstructed?

► Inlet/outlet ventilators obstructed?



TURN OFF - POWER SUPPLY - CALL authorized distributor IN CASE OF...

- Abnormal noise during operation.
- Water/foreign materials gets into Remote Control.
- Water leaks from Indoor unit.
- Switches/buttons do not operate properly.
- Circuit breaker switches off frequently.
- Power cord warms up unusually.

EMERGENCY!**SOS**

Immediately isolate from the mains supply (e.g. if there is a smell of burning).

Installation

Operation

Do NOT stay long in the stream of cold air

Unused for a long time? -> OFF

Uninstalling and disposal of the unit ONLY by dealer/specialist.






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User Manuals Wired Remote Control ENGLISH



Timer/Time Setting Display
This display shows the time operation setting time or the current time. Timer can be selected from daily timer and weekly timer.

Fan Speed Display

This display shows the fan speed setting of Auto, Low, Medium and High.

Operation Selection Display

This display shows operation setting of Auto, Heat, Fan, Cool, Air Dry, Filter indication is also displayed here.

Temperature Setting Display

This display shows the temperature setting for the indoor unit. The temperature can be set within the range of 16°C - 31°C. (For both cooling/heating operations). Settings of economy mode and test run are also displayed here.

OFF/ON Indicator LED

This indicator lights up when the air conditioner is running.

Message Display

ODOUR WASH

- Lights up during odour wash (odour removing) operation and flashes while odour wash (colour clean) is being set.

CHECK

- Flashes up in case of abnormality.

SET

- Lights up when carrying out local setting.

NOT AVAILABLE

- Lights up when the function is not available for operation.

VENT

- Indicates the operation of ventilating equipment (optional).

PRE HEAT

- Lights up during the preheat operation.

DEFROST

- Lights up during the defrost operation.

DEMAND

- Lights up when a demand/request is made from outside.

Operating Location and Priority Display

REMOTE, LOCAL, COMMON

- This display changes when a remote control cable is connected.

REMOTE

- The RUN and STOP functions on the remote control unit cannot be used.

LOCAL

- Air conditioner can be operated with both the remote control unit and a remote controlling device.

COMMON

- Air conditioner can be operated with both the remote control unit and a remote controlling device.

HEAT PRIORITY

- Operation other than heating is not available.

FAN PRIORITY

- Operation other than air circulation operation is not available.

Cool PRIORITY

- Operation other than cooling is not available.

Change the operation mode with a remote control than the remote control unit.

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
Remote Control - Panel

Setting Current Time

This current time needs to be set when you turn on the power for the first time or after a long time has elapsed since the power was last turned on.
The current time becomes the standard time for all the Timer operations.

Set the current time and day accurately.

Example: Current Day is Wednesday and Current Time is 5:00



- OFF/ON button
This button is used to turn on or stop the air conditioner.
- Fan Speed button
This button is used to change fan speed to Auto, Low, Medium and High.
- Operation Mode button
This button is used to change operation mode to "FAN", "COOL", "DRY", "AUTO" and "HEAT".
- Temperature Setting button
This button is used to set the room temperature.
- Filter Reset button
After the filter has been cleaned, press this button to clear the FILTER RESET display.
- Test Run button
This button is used during test run.

- 1 Turn on the power supply
- 2 Press "SELECT button"



Below displays will appear



3 Select Current Day

To set the current day, press "UP" or "DOWN" button to select current day. (Refer to above step 1, select WED). To confirm the selected day, press "SELECT" button.

4 Select Current Time

To set the current time, press "UP" or "DOWN" button to select current time. (Refer to above step 1, select 8:00). To confirm the selected time, press "SELECT" button.

Note:
- Press "UP" button to increase or "DOWN" button to decrease (interval 1 minute) or hold the button to change the time faster.

If the UP or DOWN button is not pressed for 30 seconds during the day/time setting or if the "SELECT" button is pressed, the setting at that moment is confirmed and setting will end.

Final CLOCK Display



- Timer Setting button Group
 - This button group is used for timer setting. For details, please refer to the descriptions on subsequent pages. Basic functions of each button are as follows:
- CODE - Changes clock and timer display or goes back to the previous display.
- SELECT - Starts timer setting mode.
- UP - Increases the time.
- DOWN - Decreases the time.
- SET - Confirms general settings and timer setting. Resumes all timer settings collectively.
- CANCEL - Cancels settings. Cancels all the timer settings collectively.

How to Select the Timer

Daily Timer Setting

2 types of Time mode can be selected on the remote control.

- Daily Timer

- Weekly Timer

These timers cannot be operated simultaneously.

Select one of these Timers for your convenience.

How to Change the Display




MODE



Press once to change the display from CLOCK to Timer or vice-versa.

Press more than 3 seconds to change the display from Daily Timer to Weekly Timer or vice-versa.



How to Set Daily Timer

- You can set only 'ON' or only 'OFF' or 'ON and OFF' in a day.

Change Display

Press 'MODE' button to change the display to daily timer.

ON-Timer, OFF-Timer and select Time

Press 'SELECT' button. ON-Timer setting will be displayed.

Press 'UP' or 'DOWN' button to select the desired time.

(Example: ON 9:00).

Then press 'SET' button to confirm the selected desired time.

Or press 'CANCEL' button if you do not want any setting of ON-Timer.

Then OFF-Timer setting will be displayed.

Press 'UP' or 'DOWN' button to select the desired time.

(Example: OFF 18:30).

Then press 'SET' button to confirm the selected desired time.

Or press 'CANCEL' button if you do not want any setting for OFF-Timer.

Note:
- The setting time will be activated everyday.
- Timer nearer to the current time will be activated first.

Final Display of Daily Timer:



Note:
The above display is shown if no valid timer setting is made.
If valid timer setting is made,
- 'TIMER' and setting will be displayed.

- If you want to check the current time and day, press 'MODE' button once.
(However, after few seconds, the display will change back to 'TIMER' and the setting.)

ON: ON-Time being selected
The Unit will automatically switch ON at 9:00.


OFF: OFF-Time being selected
The Unit will automatically switch OFF at 18:30.

ON and OFF Timer are selected. On-Timer will be activated first due to 9:00 being nearer to current time.

How to Set Weekly Timer

- You can set the Timer for 1 week (Monday to Sunday) with 6 programs per day.
- On-Timer can be set together w/ your desired temperature. However, this temperature will be used continuously.
- Cannot set 2 programs with same time setting in a day.
- You can set 2 programs with same time setting or individual single/day setting.

Change Display

=Press "MODE button" to change the display to weekly timer.

2 Select Day

(Please refer to next page for example of setting)

You may select Collective or individual day setting.

Collective day setting:

Please "SELECT" button, display will show day select on self.

Press "UP" or "DOWN" button to select the day. Then press "SET" button.

"Triangle mark" to delete from the mark (cancel) or add triangle mark (select).

Repeat these steps if you want to cancel or select many days.

- Individual day setting:

Press "UP" or "DOWN" button to select the day.

Then press "SELECT" button.

3 Select Time

(please refer to next page for example of setting)

For 1st program setting,

Press "UP" or "DOWN" button to select ON or OFF.

Then press "SET" button to confirm.

If you want to set them together with your desired temperature, press "TEMP UP/DOWN" button to select the temperature.

Then press "SET" button to confirm.

Or press "CANCEL" button if you do not want to set every time.

For 2nd ~ 6th program, you may refer to the above steps.

For example, if you want to set:

- A - Monday to Friday: Same time, 1st program ON 9:00 & 2nd program OFF 16:00.
- B - Only Wednesday: Additional 3rd program OFF 12:00 & 4th program ON 13:30.
- C - Only Saturday: 1st program ON 10:00 with 20°C & 2nd program OFF 14:00.
- D - Sunday: Holiday. No need to set any Timer.
