# Follow the instruction to install and wire the product.

Hold down again to cancel.

### Random repeat play

All the available tracks/files are played in a random sequence and then repeated the current tracks/files.

### Folder random repeat play (MP3)

The first 10 seconds of each tracks/files is played in sequence.

(2) Band Press [BAND] (1) XM Mode (When a XM receiver is connected.) Press [SRC] to change to BAND SRC the XM mode.
