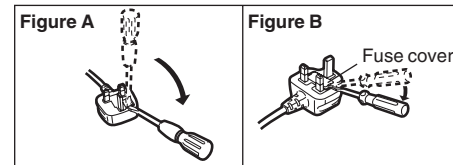

## How to replace the fuse

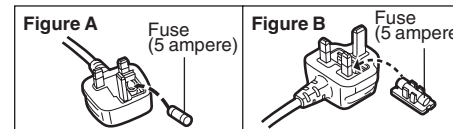
### (For Middle East except United Arab Emirates)

1. Open the fuse cover with a screwdriver.

DVD-Audio, Version 1.0 of DVD-RW, DVD-ROM, CD-ROM, CDV, CD-G, SACD, Photo CD, DVD-RAM that cannot be removed from their cartridge, 2.6-GB and 5.2-GB DVD-RAM, and "Chaoji VCD" available on the market including VCD, DVCD and SVCD that do not conform to IEC62107.

### Handling precautions

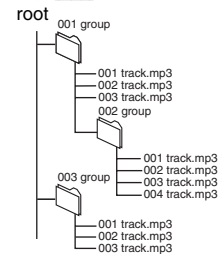

### CD-R/RW

- Discs must conform to ISO9660 level 1 or 2 (except for extended formats).
- This unit is compatible with multi-session but if there are a lot of sessions it takes more time for play to start. Keep the number of sessions to a minimum to avoid this.

## STEP 2 The remote control

### ■ Batteries



- Insert so the poles (+ and -) match those in the remote control.
- Do not use rechargeable type batteries.
- Do not:**
  - mix old and new batteries.
  - use different types at the same time.
  - heat or expose to flame.
  - take apart or short circuit.
  - attempt to recharge alkaline or manganese batteries.
  - use batteries if the covering has been peeled off.

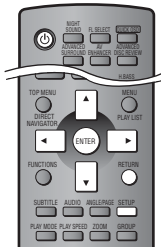
Mishandling of batteries can cause electrolyte leakage which can damage items the fluid contacts and may cause a fire.

Remove if the remote control is not going to be used for a long period of time. Store in a cool, dark place.






### ■ Use

Aim at the remote control sensor (→ page 8), avoiding obstacles, at a maximum range of 7 m directly in front of the unit.

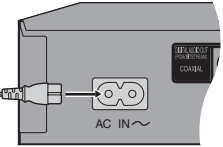

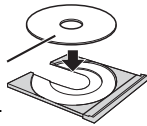

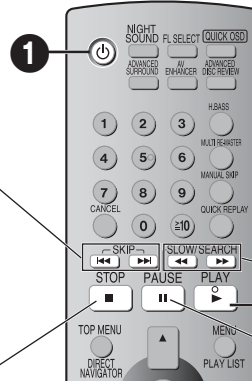


### Skip

- **DVD-VR** Can also skip to the markers.

### Stop

- The position is memorized when "▷" flashes on the display.
- Press **[▶]** (PLAY) to resume. (**Resume play**)
  - Press **[■]** to clear the position.
  - Even after the unit is turned off, the position is memorized (Normal playback only).



### Repeat play

- Select "Repeat" (→ page 12, Repeat play) or "A-B Repeat" (→ page 16, Play Menu).

Press to switch the unit from on to standby mode or vice versa. In standby mode, the unit is still consuming a small amount of power.

### Standby/on indicator (⏻)

When the unit is connected to the AC mains supply, this indicator lights up in standby mode and goes out when the unit is turned on.

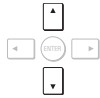

## Glossary

### DivX

DivX is a popular media technology created by DivX, Inc. DivX media files contain highly compressed video with high visual quality that maintains a relatively small file size.

### Film and video

DVD-Videos are recorded using either film or video. This unit can determine which type has been used, then uses the most suitable method of progressive output.

**Film:** Recorded at 25 frames per second (PAL discs) or 24 frames per second (NTSC discs). (NTSC discs recorded at 30 frames per second as well). Generally appropriate for motion picture films.

**Video:** Recorded at 25 frames/50 fields per second (PAL discs) or 30 frames/60 fields per second (NTSC discs). Generally appropriate for TV drama programs or animation.

### MPEG4

A compression system for use on mobile devices or a network, that allows highly efficient recording at a low bit rate.

### Sampling frequency

Sampling is the process of converting the heights of sound wave (analog signal) samples taken at set periods into digits (digital encoding). Sampling frequency is the number of samples taken per second, so larger numbers mean more faithful reproduction of the original sound.

## Safety precautions

### Placement

Set the unit up on an even surface away from direct sunlight, high temperatures, high humidity, and excessive vibration. These conditions can damage the cabinet and other components, thereby shortening the unit's service life. Do not place heavy items on the unit.
