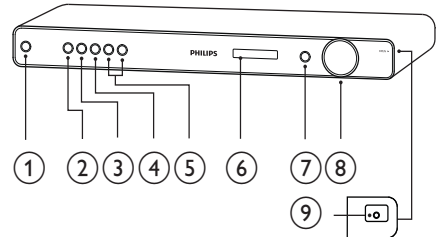

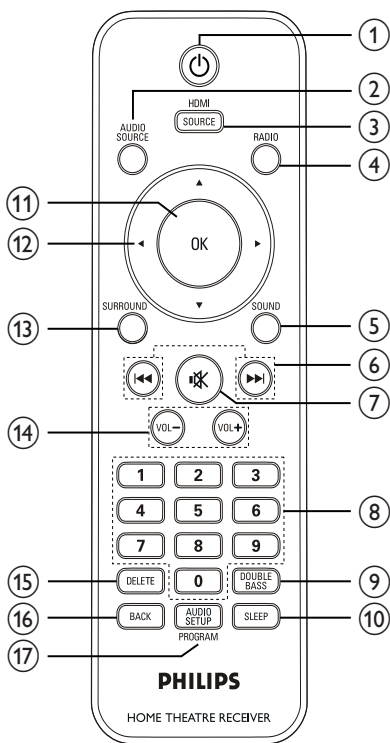

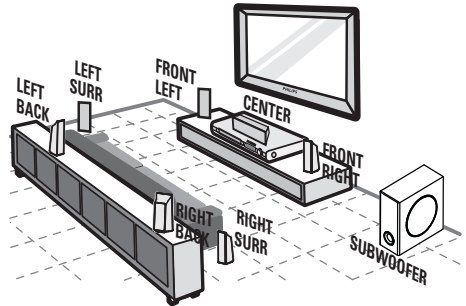

Place the product

4 Get started

Insert the remote control batteries



- 1 On the back of the remote control, slide the battery cover to remove it.
- 2 Insert the 2 supplied batteries (AAA). Be sure the + and - ends of the batteries line up with the markings inside the case.
- 3 Slide the cover back into position.

Note

- Do not mix batteries (old and new or carbon and alkaline, etc.).
- Remove batteries if they are exhausted or if the remote control is not to be used for a long time.

Control a play source

- 1 Press **RADIO**, **AUDIO SOURCE** or **HDMI SOURCE** to select the source you wish to control.

Change speaker settings

Ideally, the distance between listening position and all the speakers should be the same. If not, change the speaker settings based on their distance from the listening position to obtain the best possible surround sound.

Test and set the speaker volume

Main unit

No reaction to the remote control.

- Disconnect this product from the socket for a few minutes, then connect again.
- Point the remote control at the product.
- Insert the batteries correctly.
- Insert new batteries if necessary.

Sound

No sound.

9 Glossary

A

Analogue audio

An electrical signal that directly represents sound. Same as digital audio, which may be an electrical signal, but is an indirect representation of sound. Analogue sound varies, while digital sound has specific numerical values.

D

Dolby Digital

A surround sound system developed by Dolby Laboratories that contains up to six channels of digital audio (front left and right, surround left and right, centre and subwoofer.)

Dolby Digital Pro Logic II

An advanced, matrix decoding technology that expands any two channel audio, such as CDs and stereo encoded videocassettes, video games and TV broadcasts to a five channel full bandwidth (range) playback (Left/Centre/Right/Left Surround/Right Surround), resulting in a surround sound experience.

DTS

Digital Theatre Systems. A surround sound system for providing 5.1 and 7.1 channels of discrete digital audio in consumer electronics products and software content. It is not developed by Dolby Digital.

H

HDMI

High-Definition Multimedia Interface is a high-speed digital interface that can transmit uncompressed high definition video and digital multichannel audio. It delivers high quality picture and sound quality, completely free from noise. HDMI is fully backward-compatible with DVI.

As required by the HDMI standard, connecting to HDMI or DVI products without HDCP (High-bandwidth Digital Content Protection) will result in no Video or Audio output.

M

MP3

A file format with a sound data compression system. MP3 is the abbreviation of Motion Picture Experts Group 1 (or MPEG-1) Audio Layer 3. With the MP3 format, one CD-R or CD-RW can contain about 10 times more data than a regular CD.

Multichannel

Usually DVD is specified to have each sound track constitute one sound field. Multichannel refers to a structure of sound tracks having three or more channels.

S

Stereo

Literally means solid. Usually taken to refer to two channel stereo, though developments in digital audio facilitate multichannel stereo.

Surround

A system that creates realistic, three-dimensional sound fields. It is usually achieved with multiple speakers that are arranged around the listener.

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
