#### Controls



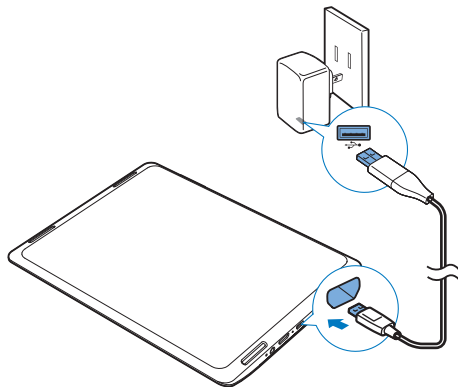
## 3 Get started

### Charge power


**Pi7000** has a built-in battery that can be charged through the USB connector of the supplied USB power adapter.

The first time you use **Pi7000**, charge **Pi7000** for more than eight hours.


- By using the USB cable, connect **Pi7000** to the supplied USB power adapter.



#### Note

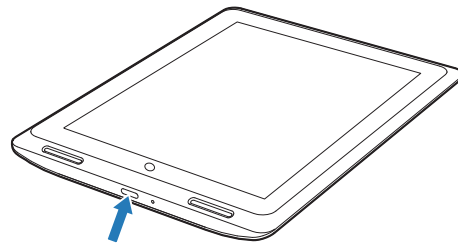
- Rechargeable batteries have a limited number of charge cycles. Battery life and number of charge cycles vary by use and settings.
- When the battery is fully charged,  is displayed.

**To conserve battery power and increase the play time, do the following on the device:**

- Switch off the functions when they are unnecessary, such as Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, and the sync option for Background data (see 'Accounts 41).
- Set the screen-off timer to a low value (go to  > **Screen** > **Timeout**).

### Switch the device on or off





Press and hold the power/ lock button until the device is switched on or off.



## 4 Basics

### Find applications

Navigate on the Home screen to find an application:







- Swipe left/ right to select a page;
- Alternatively, tap  to open the list of applications that are sorted in alphabetical order. Swipe left/ right to scroll through the list;
- Use the navigation buttons  /  to switch between screens. Tap  to go to the applications that you use recently.

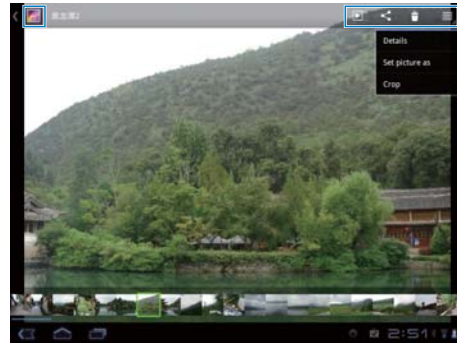

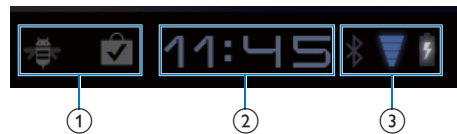



### Select setup options

- To close the pop-up screen, tap on the Home screen.

<b>Airplane mode</b>	Enable or disable the access to Wi-Fi or Bluetooth connection.
<b>Wi-Fi</b>	Select your options for Wi-Fi setup.

<b>Auto-rotate screen</b>	Allow or disallow the rotation of the screen.
<b>Brightness</b>	Drag the slider to select the screen brightness.

#### Lock/ unlock the screen

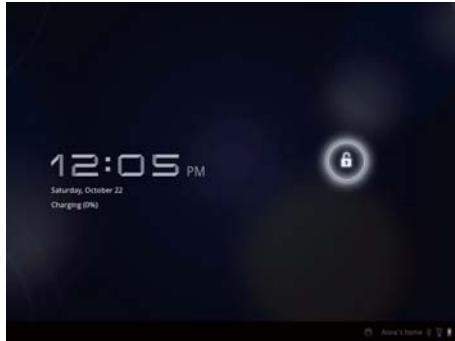

### Add items

#### Add application icons

- 1 Tap to open the list of application icons.
- 2 Tap and hold an icon until the pages are displayed.

  - ↳ The icon is added to the selected page.



### Rearrange items

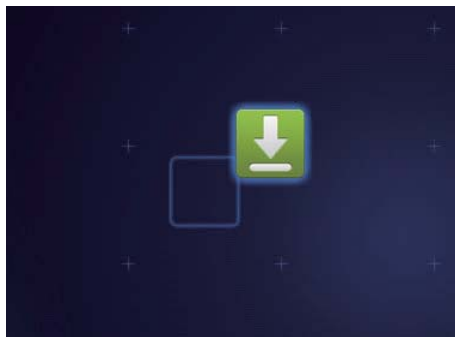

### Relocate items

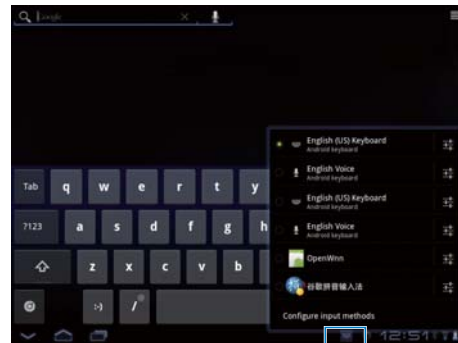

## Enter text





### Switch between upper and lower cases

: The next letter you enter is in upper case.

### Switch between letters and numbers/symbols


- Tap **?123** or **ABC**.



Tip

- On the numeric/symbol keyboard, tap **More** to switch between numbers/symbols and more symbol choices.

### Switch between the two symbols/letters on one key

- Tap  repeatedly.  
↳ On the key, current symbol or letter is highlighted.

### Get more choices for letters and symbols

- Tap and hold a letter or symbol button until the pop-up screen is displayed.



Tip

- The extra choices on one key are available on the keyboards of some languages.

### Select keyboard settings

- On the onscreen keyboard, tap  and select **Android keyboard settings**.

### Edit text

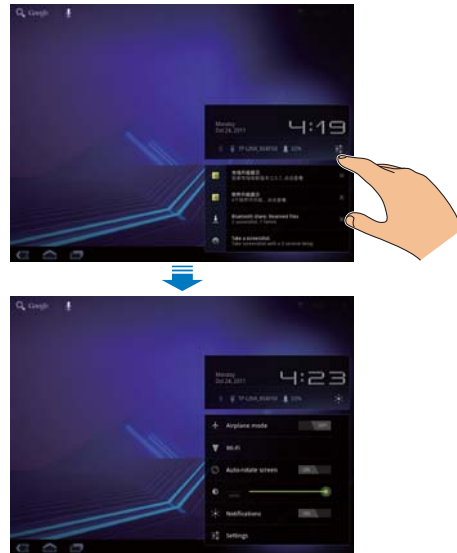
- Connect to the Internet through Wi-Fi;
- Connect to your home Wi-Fi network that connects Philips connected devices, such as DLNA-compatible TVs, audio systems, or media players;
- Connect to a high-definition TV (HDTV) through the HDMI cable (sold separately);
- Connect to Bluetooth devices;
- Connect to a computer through the USB cable;
- Use a Micro SD card (up to 32 GB).

---

### Connect to Wi-Fi

Connect **Pi7000** to a wireless router (Access Point). You can connect **Pi7000** to the network that is built around the router:




- 1 At the base of the screen, start your Wi-Fi setup:
  - ① Tap an icon of setup status.
  - ② Tap  to display a list of setup options.
  - ③ Tap .



- 2 Tap **Wi-Fi** to switch on the Wi-Fi function.
  - ↳ You see a list of Wi-Fi networks in range, and previously connected networks (if the networks are remembered).
  - ↳ The device starts connecting to the previously connected network.
- 3 To switch to another Wi-Fi network, connect **Pi7000** to a network:
  - ① In the list of Wi-Fi networks, tap the selected one.
  - ② On the pop-up screen, enter the password to the network.

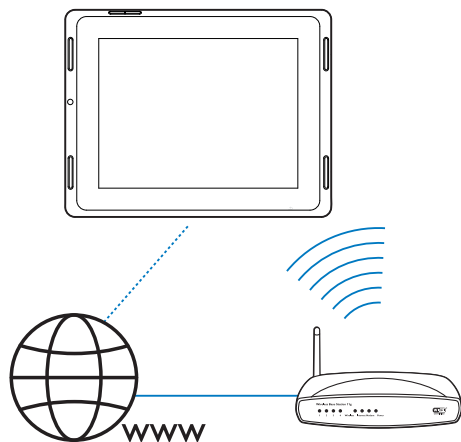


### Note

-  is displayed when Pi7000 is connected to a Wi-Fi network and Google services.
- If MAC address filtering is enabled on your router, add the MAC address of Pi7000 to the list of devices that are allowed to join the network. To find the Wi-Fi MAC address, go to  > **About tablet** > **Status** on the Home screen.
- If you have disabled SSID broadcasting or hidden the Service Set Identifier (SSID) of the router, manually enter the SSID or public name for the network. Go to  > **Wi-Fi settings** > **Add Wi-Fi network**.
- If the DHCP (Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol) is unavailable or disabled on the router, manually enter the IP address of Pi7000.

## Connect to the Internet


Connect Pi7000 to a Wi-Fi network that connects to the Internet.

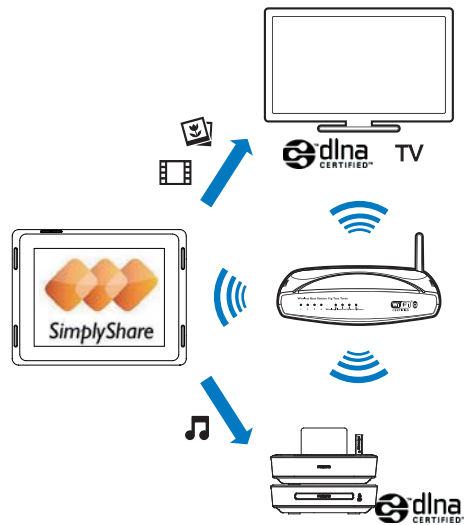


### Note

- Make sure that the router connects to the Internet directly and no dial-up is required on the computer.

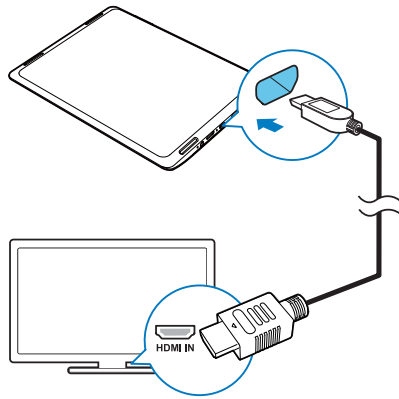
## Join your home network

Connect Pi7000 to your home Wi-Fi network. With  **SimplyShare**, you can stream music, videos, and pictures from Pi7000 to Philips DLNA-compliant devices that are also connected to the network. In this way, you can enjoy the media play through high-definition TVs (HDTVs) or hi-fi audio systems.



## Connect to an HDTV

Connect Pi7000 to a high-definition TV (HDTV). You can watch on the HDTV photos and videos that play on Pi7000 (see 'Play media to an HDTV' on page 27).



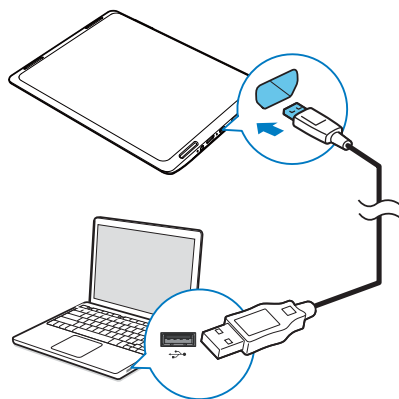
- Connect an HDMI cable (sold separately) to: the **HDMI** socket on **Pi7000**, and the **HDMI** input socket on the TV.

#### Tip

- As a compact audio/video interface, HDMI transmits uncompressed digital data. With the HDMI connection, high-definition video/audio contents can present optimum video and audio quality on an HDTV.

## Connect to your PC

Connect **Pi7000** to a PC through the USB cable.

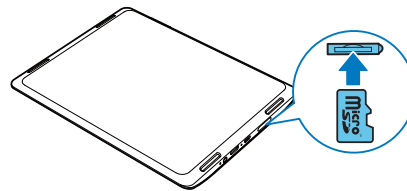


Do the following to transfer applications or media files from your PC to **Pi7000**, the internal memory or SD card:

- In Windows Explorer, drag and drop applications or media files from your PC to **Pi7000**.
- Alternatively, transfer media files to **Pi7000** through media management software, such as **Windows Media Player 11**.

## Use a Micro SD card

Insert a Micro SD card (up to 32 GB) into **Pi7000**. You can expand the memory size of **Pi7000**.



## Connect to Bluetooth

Through Bluetooth, you can do the following wirelessly on **Pi7000**:

- Receive or send files from or to another connected Bluetooth device;
- Listen to audio files through stereo Bluetooth headphones.

## Connect with Bluetooth devices

You can connect **Pi7000** with Bluetooth devices in the following ways:



- Connect another Bluetooth device;
- Get connected by another Bluetooth device.




Tip

- Before the connection, consult the user manual of the Bluetooth device to get its Bluetooth pairing passcode. Or, try 0000 or 1234.

### Connect another Bluetooth devices

- 1 Make sure that the device is discoverable by another Bluetooth device.
  - Consult the user manual of the Bluetooth device for information.
- 2 On **Pi7000**, search for the Bluetooth device:
  - ① From the Home screen, tap  > **Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings**.
  - ② If necessary, tap to switch on **Bluetooth**.
    - ↳ If the function is enabled, the tick box is selected.
    - ↳  is displayed on the status bar.
  - ③ Tap **Find devices nearby**.
    - ↳ The device is displayed under **Found devices** after it is discovered.
- 3 Pair with the device:
  - On **Pi7000**, tap the device, and enter the passcode as prompted;
  - On the device, enter the passcode as prompted.
    - ↳ A message is displayed when the pairing is complete.

### Get connected by another Bluetooth devices

- 1 Make sure that **Pi7000** is discoverable by another Bluetooth device:
  - ① From the Home screen, tap  > **Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings**.
  - ② If necessary, tap to switch on **Bluetooth**.

- ↳ If the function is enabled, the tick box is selected.


### ③ Tap Discoverable.

- ↳ **\*Pi7000** is discoverable for 120 seconds.

- 2 On the Bluetooth device, search for and pair with **Pi7000**.
  - For information about the steps, consult the user manual of the Bluetooth device.




Tip

- \*To change the device name of **Pi7000**, go to  > **Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings**, select **Device name**.

## Send or receive files through Bluetooth



### Send files to another Bluetooth device

- 1 Make sure that
  - you have paired **Pi7000** with the Bluetooth device;
  - on **Pi7000** and Bluetooth device, Bluetooth is on.
- 2 On **Pi7000**, send files through Bluetooth:
  - ① In **Gallery**, play a photo. Tap  > **Bluetooth**.
  - ② Tap the paired device to start sending.
    - ↳ When sending or receiving is in progress,  is displayed at the base of the screen.

- 3 On the Bluetooth device, receive the files:
  - Confirm as prompted.
  - Save the files as prompted.

### Receive files from Bluetooth device


- 1 Make sure that
  - you have paired **Pi7000** with the Bluetooth device;

- on **Pi7000** and Bluetooth device, Bluetooth is on.
- 2** On the Bluetooth device, send files to **Pi7000** through Bluetooth.
- 3** On the **Pi7000**, receive the files:
- At the base of the screen, tap . Confirm as prompted.
    - ↳ You can find the received files in  > **Wireless & networks** > **Show files received**.

---

## Listen to music through stereo Bluetooth headphones

### Connect the stereo Bluetooth headphones

- Follow the steps under "Connect another Bluetooth device" (see 'Connect another Bluetooth devices' on page 20).
  - ↳ After successful connection,  is displayed.
  - ↳ Next time you switch on Bluetooth on the devices, the Bluetooth connection is established automatically.

### Listen to music through the stereo Bluetooth headphones

- Play music on **Pi7000**.
  - ↳ You listen to the music through the connected Bluetooth headphones.

## 6 Applications

With applications, you can access functions, services, and different audio/ video contents on **Pi7000**.

---

### Install applications


On **Pi7000**, you can install applications from




- the HiMarket over the Internet; or
- other sources, such as other online sources, the internal storage of the device, and the Micro SD card that you have inserted into the device.

---

#### HiMarket

##### Install applications from the HiMarket


From the Home screen, go to . You can download and install applications and games.

- 1 In , search for an application as needed:
  - Tap  for search by category;
  - Tap  for keyword search.
- 2 Download the application:
  - Tap the application. Confirm as needed.
    - ↳ When the downloading is complete, installation starts automatically.
    - ↳ Check the status bar to find the status. If necessary, tap the icon to start installation as prompted.

---

#### Other sources

##### Allow the installation from unknown sources


- From the Home screen, go to  > **Applications**. Tap to switch on **Unknown sources**.

##### Download/ transfer the applications

- To download the applications from online sources, follow the onscreen instructions;

- To transfer the application to the internal memory or SD card of the device, use the USB cable to connect the device to your PC.


##### Start installation

- The downloaded applications start installation automatically;
- To find the applications that you transfer to the internal memory or SD card, go to  and download a file management application, such as **ASTRO**. Launch the file management application. Find the application and tap the option to start installation.

---

### Manage applications



You can manage the applications on the device, for example, install/ uninstall applications, stop running applications, or select other options.

- 1 From the Home screen, select  **Settings** > **Applications** > **Manage applications**:
  - In **Downloaded**, find the applications that you have downloaded from the HiMarket or other sources.
  - In **Running**, find the applications that are running on the device.
  - In **All**, find all the applications that you have installed on the device.
- 2 Tap an application.
  - ↳ Options and information are displayed.
- 3 Tap to select an option.

## 7 Music, videos, and pictures

You can use different applications to play media files.

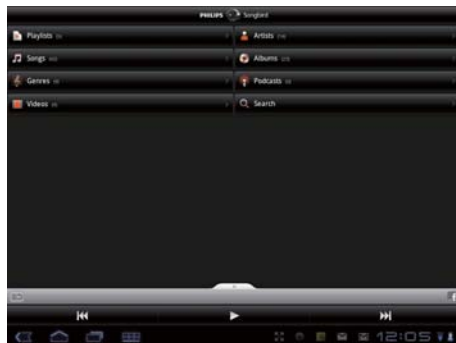
### Play music from Philips Songbird







Go to  **Philips Songbird** to play music and videos that you store on **Pi7000**. With  **Philips Songbird**, you can select Philips sound options for your music play.

### Browse the music library

#### Find music by song information

On the library screen, find music by artist, song title, or album.






- 1 On the library screen, tap , , or  to sort the library as needed.
  - ↳ The music library is sorted by the song information in alphabetical order.
  - ↳ When you sort the library by album, the available album art is displayed.
- 2 On , , or , use **Superscroll** to search for items that start with a selected alphabet:




- ① In the list of items, swipe up/ down.
  - ↳ The slider is displayed.
- ② Press and hold the slider.
  - ↳ In the pop-up text box, current alphabet is displayed.
- ③ To select an alphabet, drag the slider up/ down until you reach the alphabet.
  - ↳ At the top of the list, you see the first item that starts with the alphabet.



#### Tip

- **Superscroll** is available in a long list of items under , , or .

#### Find music by keyword

On the library screen, tap  to enter the keyword in the quick search box.


#### Find music by genre

On the device, you can browse the library by genre, such as pop, rock, and blues. Edit the song information through media management software on a PC, for example, **Windows Media Player 11** and **Philips Songbird**.

- On the library screen, tap the genre button to find a genre as needed.

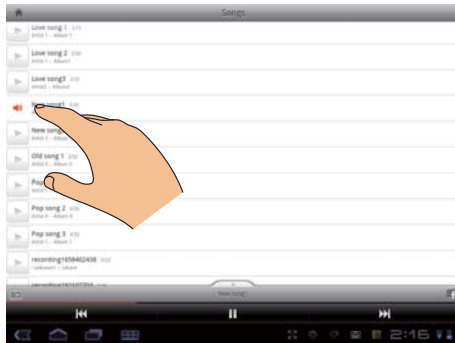
#### Find music by playlist

On the device, you can create a playlist for songs that you want to play together:

- On the library screen, tap  to find a playlist as needed.

## Play music

- 1 In the music library, browse to find music.
- 2 To start play, tap ▶ next to an artist, album, song, genre, or playlist.
  - ↳ You start to play the artist, album, song, genre, or playlist.





## Show or hide the play screen


- Drag ▲ up/ down.




## To select play options on the play screen,


-  Tap to play all songs in current folder in random order.
-  Tap once or more to select repeat options:  
 Repeat all: Tap to repeat all songs in current folder.  
 Repeat one: Tap to repeat current song.

 Tap to pause/resume play.

 Tap to skip songs.

## To switch between screens,

 Tap to return to the list of items.


 Tap to return to the library screen.

## Set the play screen as lock screen


During music play, the screen is locked automatically after a certain time duration. With the play screen set as lock screen, press the power/ lock button and you can select play options on the lock screen.



## To switch off the lock screen,

- In Philips Songbird, tap  > [Settings] and deselect [Lock screen widget].

## Philips sound options

- In Philips Songbird, tap  and select [Settings] > [Philips Sound Options].

[FullSound] Restore the sonic details that music compression loses (such as MP3, WMA).

[Sound Personalization] Drag on the screen to select sound settings.




Tip

- When you select one of **[FullSound]** and **[Sound Personalization]**, you switch off another.

### To select play options on the stereo Bluetooth headphones,

When you listen to music through stereo Bluetooth headphones, you can select play options by using the controls on the Bluetooth headphones.

- In **Philips Songbird**, tap  and select **[Settings]** > **[Headset controls]**.

## Playlists

You can create a playlist for songs that you want to play together.

### Add songs to a playlist

- 1 On the library screen, select an artist, album, song, or genre.
- 2 Tap and hold the artist, album, song, or genre until the pop-up screen is displayed. Tap **[Add to playlist...]**.
- 3 Select or create a playlist.
  - ↳ The selected song, or all the songs under an artist, album, or genre are added to the playlist.

### Rename a playlist

- 1 Select a playlist.
- 2 Tap and hold the playlist until the pop-up screen is displayed. Tap **[Rename]**.
  - ↳ The onscreen keyboard is displayed.
- 3 Edit the name of the playlist.
  - ↳ The playlist is renamed.

### Remove a song from the playlist


- 1 In a playlist, select or play a song.
- 2 Tap and hold the song until the pop-up screen is displayed. Tap **[Remove from playlist]**.
  - ↳ The selected song is removed from the playlist.

### Delete a playlist

- 1 Select a playlist.


- 2 Tap and hold the playlist until the pop-up screen is displayed. Tap **[Delete]**.
  - ↳ The playlist is deleted.

## Play videos from Philips Songbird


With  Philips Songbird, you can select Philips sound options for your video play.

### Browse the videos library


#### Find videos by title

- On the library screen, tap .
  - ↳ The videos library is sorted by the title in alphabetical order.




#### Find videos by keyword

- On the library screen, tap  to enter the keyword in the quick search box.
- Alternatively, tap the search box in the videos library.

## Play videos


- 1 In the videos library, browse to find a video.
- 2 To start play, tap  next to the video.
  - ↳ You start to play the video.

### To select play options on the play screen,

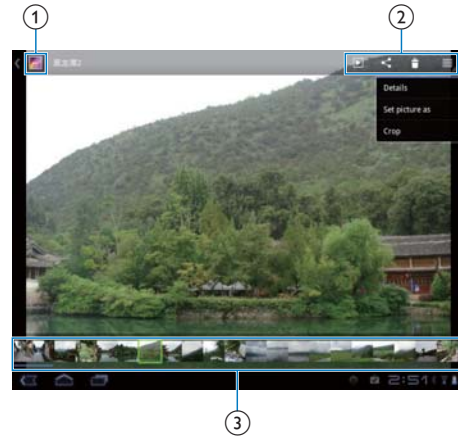

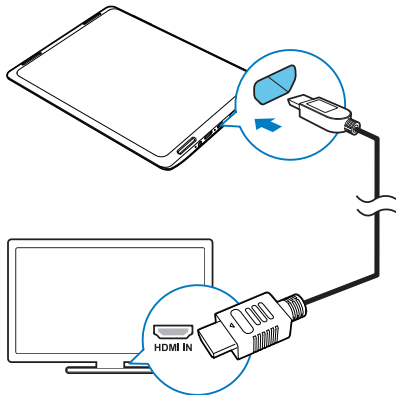

To crop current photo,

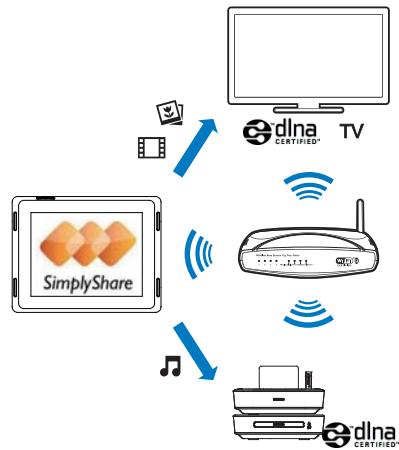
- 1 Select > **Crop**.  
↳ A cropping frame is displayed.
- 2 Within the cropping frame, select an area that you want to keep:
  - Swipe left/ right or up/ down to select the area;
  - To enlarge/ reduce the area in proportion, drag a corner of the frame;
  - To enlarge/ reduce the area as needed, drag the edges of the frame.
- 3 Tap **OK**.  
↳ You save the cropped version.

## Play media to an HDTV

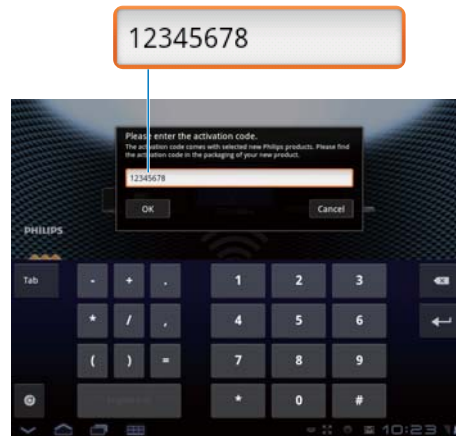


- 1 Make sure that you have connected Pi7000 to an HDTV by using an HDMI cable.
- 2 On the HDTV, switch to the input channel of Pi7000 by pressing the source button repeatedly on the remote control of the TV.
- 3 On Pi7000, play photos or videos.  
↳ You can watch the photo or videos on the TV.

## Share media on your home network



- 1 Make sure that you have connected Pi7000 to the same Wi-Fi network as your Philips DLNA-compliant TVs or hi-fi audio systems (see 'Join your home network' on page 18).
- 2 From the Home screen, go to **SimplyShare**:
  - ① The first time you launch **SimplyShare**, enter the activation code 12345678 as prompted.



- ② Find Pi7000 and the connected devices on the network.
- 3 On Pi7000, find your media libraries:
  - Tap **Pi7000**.
    - ↳ You can find the music, photos, and videos that you store under the following folders on **Pi7000**: **Music**, **Pictures**, and **Video**.
    - ↳ You can also find the photos and videos that you take or record on **Pi7000**.
- 4 Select the device that plays media:
  - Drag **Pi7000** to the device.
    - ↳ The device is selected as player.



- 5 Add media to the shared list:
  - Tap **+** on the media file;
  - Alternatively, tap the **+** twice to add all the subsequent media files.
    - ↳ You play the selected files on the device.




## 8 Search

With the quick search box of Google Search, you can

- search the web; or/ and
- search the device


### Use the quick search box

Go to Google Search from the Home screen.

- 1 On the Home screen, swipe to the quick search box.
  - ↳ To search the web, make sure that you have connected the device to the Internet.
- 2 Start the search:
  - ① On the onscreen keyboard, enter your keyword for search;
  - ② Tap  to start search.

### Select search options



- 1 Tap  > Search settings.
- 2 Tap to select an option:
  - **Searchable items:** Select the items that you can search for on the device.
  - **Google Search:** Select options for the Google Search in the Web.

## 9 Email

On **Pi7000**, you can receive and send email as you do on a computer. Do the following:


- Set up your email accounts on the device.

### Set up your email account

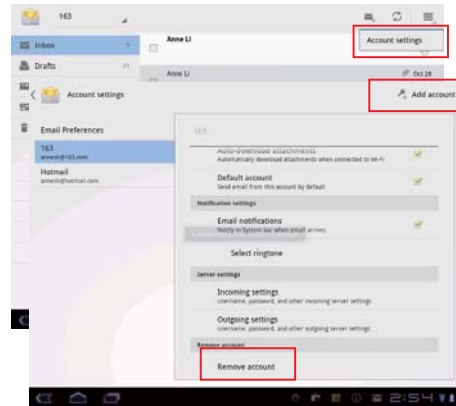
On **Pi7000**, set up your email accounts in the following ways:



- Set up your POP3 or IMAP mail accounts, or
- Set up your Microsoft Exchange account to access your Exchange mailbox at work.

#### Set up your POP3/ IMAP account

- 1 From the Home screen, go to .
- 2 Set up your email account:
  - Enter the information about your account;
  - Select pop3 or IMAP account.
- 3 Follow the onscreen instructions to complete the setup.
  - Consult your email service provider for the setup information, such as the outgoing server, incoming server.


### Select account settings




- 1 On the screen of mail list, tap  > **Account settings**.
  - ↳ A pop-up screen is displayed.
  - If necessary, tap  repeatedly to return to the screen of mail list.

- 2 Select your options for the account.

#### To add an account,

- On  > **Account settings**, tap **Add account**.

#### To remove an account,

- On  > **Account settings**, select **Remove account**.
  - ↳ Current account is removed.


### Check your email messages



You can check your email messages in the following ways:

- Check one combined mailbox;
- Check messages by account;
- Check starred messages;
- Check unread messages.

#### To check one combined mailbox,

- 1 On the screen of mail list, tap the account name.
  - ↳ A drop-down list of account names is displayed.
  - If necessary, tap  repeatedly to return to the screen of mail list.

- 2 Tap **Combined view**.

- ↳ Different colors are used to mark the messages from different accounts.

#### To check messages from a single account,

- 1 Repeat **Step 1** in "To check one combined mailbox".

- 2 Tap the selected account.
  - ↳ Messages from the account are displayed.

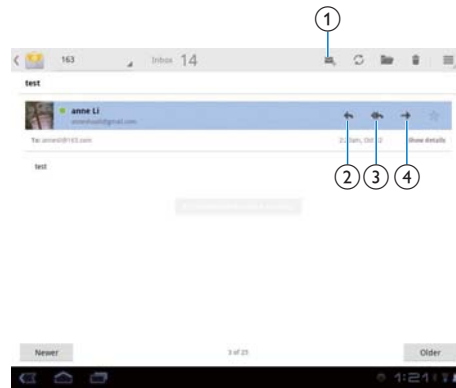
#### To check starred messages,

- Tap the star next to the message.
  - ↳ The message is added to the **Starred** folder.

#### To check unread messages,

- On the screen of mail list, the unread messages are in gray.

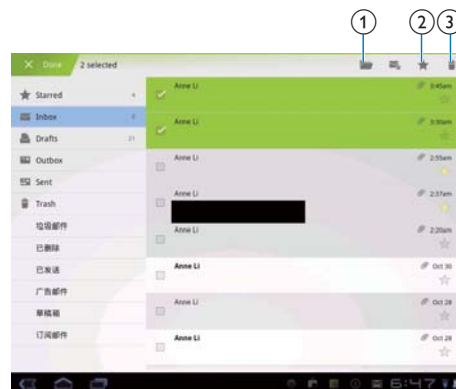
## Compose email messages



When you read a message, tap the icons to do the following:

- 1 **Compose a new message**
- 2 **Reply**
- 3 **Reply all**
- 4 **Forward**

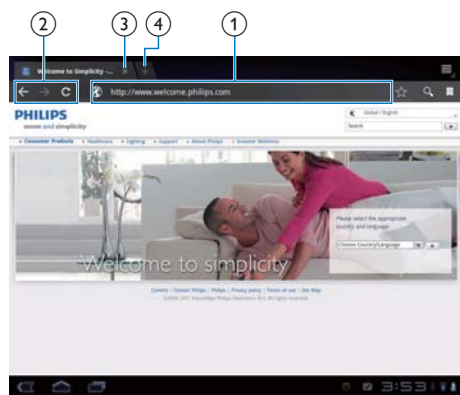
## Organize email messages

  - ③ Delete the messages.

## 10 Browser

With , you can browse Web pages.



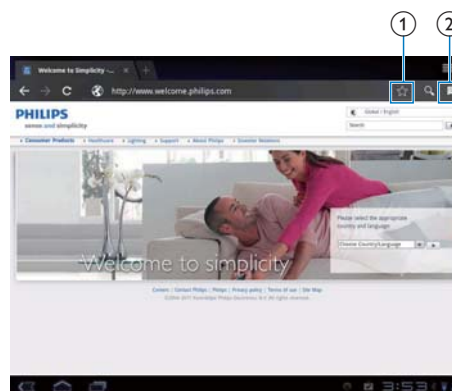
- 1 From the Home screen, tap .
- 2 Tap the icons or text box to do the following:
  - ① Enter the address of web pages. Tap  to start search.
  - ② Tap the icons to search backwards, forward, or refresh the Web page.
  - ③ Close the Web page.
  - ④ Open a new Web page.

To switch between Web pages,

- At the top bar, tap the tab of the selected Web page.

## Add a bookmark

Add a bookmark. You can quickly access a visited Web page.



- ① Add a bookmark to current Web page.
- ② Go to the bookmarked Web pages.



# 11 Tools

## Camera

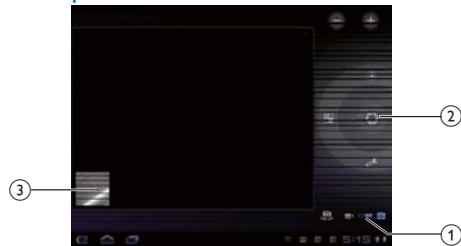
With the 0.3 Mega-pixel lens at the front, you can do the following on **Pi7000**:

- Have video chats with friends over the Internet;
- Shoot yourself by using the camera or video recorder.

### Use the lens for video chat

- 1 From the HiMarket, download the video chat application.
- 2 On the device, launch the application.
- 3 To use the camera lens,
  - Follow the instructions of the application;
  - Point the lens at you or objects.

### Take photos or record videos



- ① Slider
- ② Shutter
- ③ Thumbnail

- 1 From the Home screen, go to .  
↳ The onscreen buttons are displayed.
- 2 Drag the slider to switch between the camera and video recorder.

- 3 To take photos:
  - Point the lens at you or objects;
  - Tap and hold until the green frame is displayed;
  - Release .↳ The photo is taken.

- 4 To record videos:
  - Tap / to start or stop video recording.

### To view photos/ videos in the Gallery,

- Tap the thumbnail .  
↳ You can view the photos/ videos that you have taken or recorded.

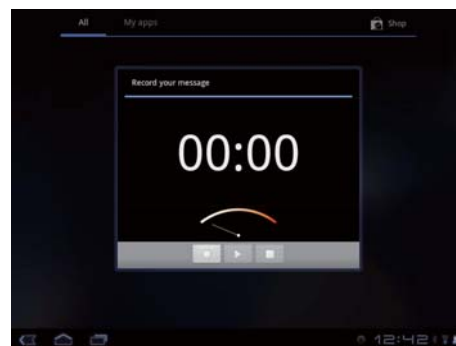
### Select settings

- **White balance**  
Tap to select the option according to current source of lights. You can reduce the effects on colors by lights.
- **Color effect**  
Select the color you want to add to videos or photos.

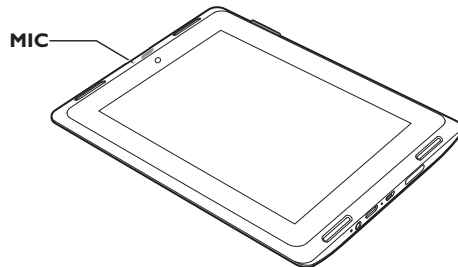
## Sound recorder

With **Sound Recorder**, you can record your voice messages. Send the voice messages through email or Bluetooth as needed.

- 1 From the Home screen, go to .
- ↳ The sound recorder is displayed.



- 2 Make sure that the microphone is close to the sound source to be recorded.



- 3 Do the following to start or stop recording.

● Tap to start recording.

■ Tap to stop recording.

↳ After the message is recorded, a pop-up screen is displayed.

- 4 Tap ▶ to review the recording. Tap **Use this recording** to save the recording file.

↳ You can play the recording in a media player application, such as **Philips Songbird**.

## Calendar

On the device, you can sync the calendar with:

- the calendar of your Microsoft Exchange account.

## Alarm clock

On the device, you can set several alarms.

### Set an alarm

- 1 Make sure that you have set the clock time (see 'Date 42).

- 2 From the Home screen, tap **☰**.

↳ The next alarm is displayed.

- 3 Tap **🕒**.

↳ The set alarms are displayed.



- 4 To set an alarm clock,

- To add an alarm, tap **Add alarm**.
- To change an alarm, tap the preset alarm time.

- 5 Tap **Settings** to select your option. Confirm as prompted.

<b>Time</b>	Set the alarm time.
<b>Repeat</b>	Select how the alarm repeats.
<b>Ringtone</b>	Select the ringtone for the alarm: silence, buzzer; or ringtone.
<b>Label</b>	Add description for the alarm.

### Switch an alarm on or off

- In **☰** > **🕒**, tap the tick box next to the set alarm time.  
↳ If the function is enabled, the tick box is selected.

### Use the alarm

At the set alarm time, the alarm sounds. A pop-up screen is displayed.

- To interrupt the alarm, tap **Snooze**.  
↳ The alarm sounds 10 minutes later.
- To stop the alarm, tap **Dismiss**.  
↳ The alarm repeats at the next set alarm time.

## 12 Use the device in corporate networks

You can use **Pi7000** in corporate networks. Install the secure credentials or security certificates before you access corporate networks.

The access to corporate network may allow you to set up your Microsoft Exchange account and add VPN on the device. With the Microsoft Exchange account, you can access your exchange mailbox at work.

---

### Install secure credentials


Ask your network administrator for secure credentials or security certificates.

**To install the secure credentials,**



- 1 Make sure that you transfer the files of secure credentials from a PC to the SD card that you have mounted onto the device.

#### Note

- On **Pi7000**, make sure that the secure credentials are saved to the root directory of the SD card, instead of under a folder.



- 2 Install the secure credentials:
  - ① From the Home screen, go to  > Location & security > Install from SD card.
  - ② Tap the file to start installation.
  - ③ Set the password and name for the credentials as prompted.

**To apply the secure credentials,**

- 1 Make sure that you have set the password to the credential storage.
  - In , select **Location & security** > **Set password**.
- 2 In , select **Location & security** > **Use secure credentials**.
  - ↳ On the device, you allow the applications to use the secure credentials.

---

### Set up your Microsoft Exchange account

- 1 From the Home screen, go to .
- 2 Set up your email account:
  - Enter the information about your account, and select **Exchange** as the account type.
  - If you have set up other email accounts, select  > **Account settings** on the screen of mail list. Tap **Add account**.
- 3 Follow the onscreen instructions to complete the setup.
  - For the server address, enter the web address for your Outlook web access, for example, owa.company name.com or mail. company name.com/owa.
  - For other setup information, such as domain name, user name, check with your system administrator.

#### Note

- The device can work with Microsoft Exchange 2003 and 2007.


---

## Add VPN


Virtual private network (VPN) allows you to connect to private networks through secure access.

Sometimes, you need VPN access to connect to corporate networks.

### To add VPN on the device



- 1 Ask your network administrator for the configuration information.
- 2 From the Home screen, go to  > **Wireless & networks** > **VPN settings** > **Add VPN**.
- 3 Configure the VPN as prompted.
- 4 Install the secure credentials as needed.

### To connect to the VPN,

- 1 Make sure that you have connected **Pi7000** to the Internet.
- 2 From the Home screen, go to  > **Wireless & networks** > **VPN settings**.  
↳ A list of VPNs is displayed.
- 3 Tap the VPN to start connection.

# 13 Settings

To select your settings,

- 1 At the base of the screen, tap an icon of setup status (see 'Use the notifications and status bar' on page 11). Tap .
  - Alternatively, go to  from the Home screen.
- 2 Swipe up or down to scroll through lists of options.
- 3 Tap an option to select it.

## Wireless & networks

### Airplane mode

In **Wireless & networks > Airplane mode**, disable or enable the access to Wi-Fi or Bluetooth.

Switch on the airplane mode when:

- you need to disable the access to Wi-Fi or Bluetooth for safety purposes, such as on an airplane.

### Wi-Fi settings

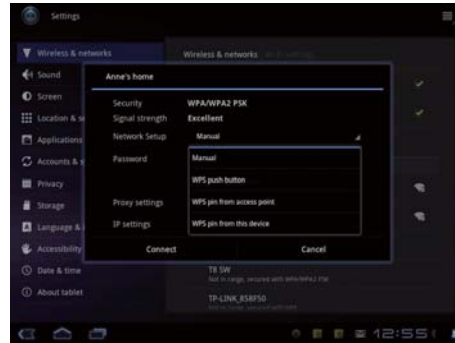
In **Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings**, select your Wi-Fi settings on the device.



#### One-touch Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS)

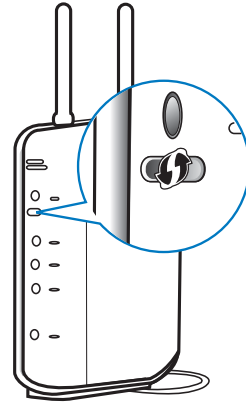
Pi7000 supports Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS). You can quickly and securely connect Pi7000 to a wireless router that also supports the WPS.

- 1 In **Wi-Fi settings**, tap a network that supports the WPS.
  - ↳ A pop-up screen is displayed.
- 2 On Pi7000, start connection through **WPS push button**.
  - ① On the pop-up screen, select **WPS push button** in the drop-down list of **Network Setup**.


- ② Tap **Connect**.



- 3 On the router, add **Pi7000**.
  - Consult the user manual of the router to learn how to add a WPS device to the router. For example: press and hold the WPS push button.
    - ↳  or  is displayed in the status bar when the Wi-Fi connection is completed successfully.



#### Network notification

Switch on **Network notification**. At the base of the screen,  is displayed when an open Wi-Fi network is available.

## Add Wi-Fi network

### Enter SSID manually

SSID (Service Set Identifier) is the name of a router. By the name, the router is recognized by other Wi-Fi devices. If you have hidden the SSID of the router (for example, disable the SSID broadcasting), the router is invisible in the list of available networks. To connect **Pi7000** to the router, enter the SSID of the router manually before you search for available networks on the **Pi7000**.

- 1 In **Wi-Fi settings**, select **Add Wi-Fi network**.
- 2 Enter the SSID of the router:
  - ↳ The **Pi7000** starts searching for the network.
  - ↳ You can find the network in the list of networks.
- 3 Connect **Pi7000** to the network.

## Bluetooth settings

In **Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings**, manage your Bluetooth settings (see 'Connect with Bluetooth devices' on page 19).

## VPN settings

Use VPN settings to access private networks, such as corporate networks (see 'Use the device in corporate networks' on page 36).

## Sound

In **Sound**, select sound settings for your device.

<b>Volume</b>	Drag the slider to select the volume level for media, notifications, and alarms.
<b>Notification ringtone</b>	Set an audio file as ringtone.
<b>Audible selection</b>	Sounds play when you tap on the screen.

<b>Screen lock sounds</b>	Sounds play when you lock/unlock the screen.
---------------------------	--

## Screen

In **Screen**, select your display settings:

<b>Brightness</b>	Drag the slider to change the display brightness.
<b>Auto-rotate screen</b>	Switch on/ off the screen rotation between the landscape and portrait views.
<b>Animation</b>	Select whether to show animation when you open or close screens.
<b>Timeout</b>	After the selected time duration, the screen switches off automatically. To save battery power, select a low value.

## Location & security

### Use wireless networks

- In **Location & security**, switch on or off **Use wireless networks**.
  - ↳ If the function is enabled, the tick box is selected.
  - ↳ You can allow or disallow your \*location information to be used in online location services, such as Maps, or other relevant services and applications.



Tip

- \*The location information is based on the IP address that is assigned to the device in the Wi-Fi network.

---

## Configure lock screen

By default, to unlock the screen of **Pi7000**, press the power/ lock button and then, drag the lock outside the circle.

In **Configure lock screen**, you can set a pattern, pin, or password as the unlock security. To unlock the screen, such unlock security is required.

<b>Off</b>	Switch off the lock.
<b>Not secured</b>	No unlock security is required. To unlock, simply drag the lock outside the circle.
<b>Pattern</b>	Set a pattern as the unlock security.
<b>PIN</b>	Set a PIN that consists of numbers.
<b>Password</b>	Set a password that consists of a combination of numbers, letters, and symbols.

---

## Visible passwords

Your password consists of several characters. To make sure that you have entered the characters correctly, show the characters as you type the password. Switch **Visible passwords** on or off as needed.

- Tap the tick box.
  - ↳ If the function is enabled, the tick box is selected.

---

## Device administrators

Applications in corporate networks require the rights of device administrator, such as the email and calendar under your Microsoft Exchange account.

Before you uninstall such an application, disable the rights of device administrator:

- In **Device administrators**, tap an application.
  - ↳ The rights of device administrator are disabled.

- ↳ You cannot sync data for the application.

---

## Credential storage

In wireless connections, you need the secure credentials when:

- you access a web server that requires login credentials, or you connect to corporate networks.

In **Location & security > Credential storage**, select the following options:

<b>Use secure credentials</b>	Allow the applications to use the secure credentials. Make sure that you have set the password to the credential storage.
<b>Install from SD card</b>	Install the secure credentials from the device.
<b>Set password</b>	Set or change the password to the credential storage.
<b>Clear credentials</b>	Clear all the credentials and the password to the credential storage.

---

## Applications

In **Applications**, manage the applications you installed on **Pi7000**.

---

### Manage applications

In **Manage applications**, manage the applications on the device. You can install/ uninstall applications, or select other options.

- 1 Find the applications:
  - In **Downloaded**, find the applications that you have downloaded from the Market, or other sources.
  - In **Running**, find the applications that are running on the device.
  - In **All**, find all the applications that you have installed on the device.

- 2 Tap an application.  
↳ Options and information are displayed.
- 3 Tap to select an option.

---

### Running services

In **Running services**, check the running services on the device. If necessary, tap to stop a service.



---


### Battery use

In **Battery use**, check the battery use by applications.

---

### Unknown sources

On **Pi7000**, you can install applications that you download from , or from sources other than .

- For the applications from sources other than , tap **Unknown sources** to allow installation on the **Pi7000**.

---

### Accounts & sync

In **Accounts & sync**, select how data are synced in applications.

<b>Background data</b>	Sync data when the applications are not running.
<b>Auto-sync</b>	Sync data automatically as scheduled.
<b>Manage accounts</b>	Select accounts for auto sync or sync in the background. Or, sync the accounts manually.



Tip

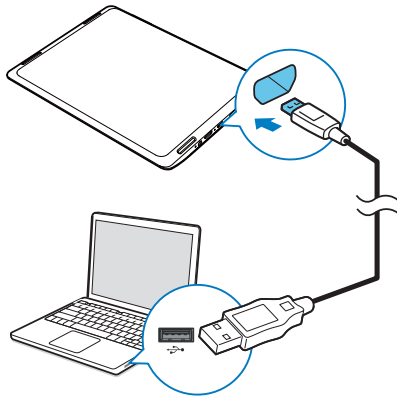
