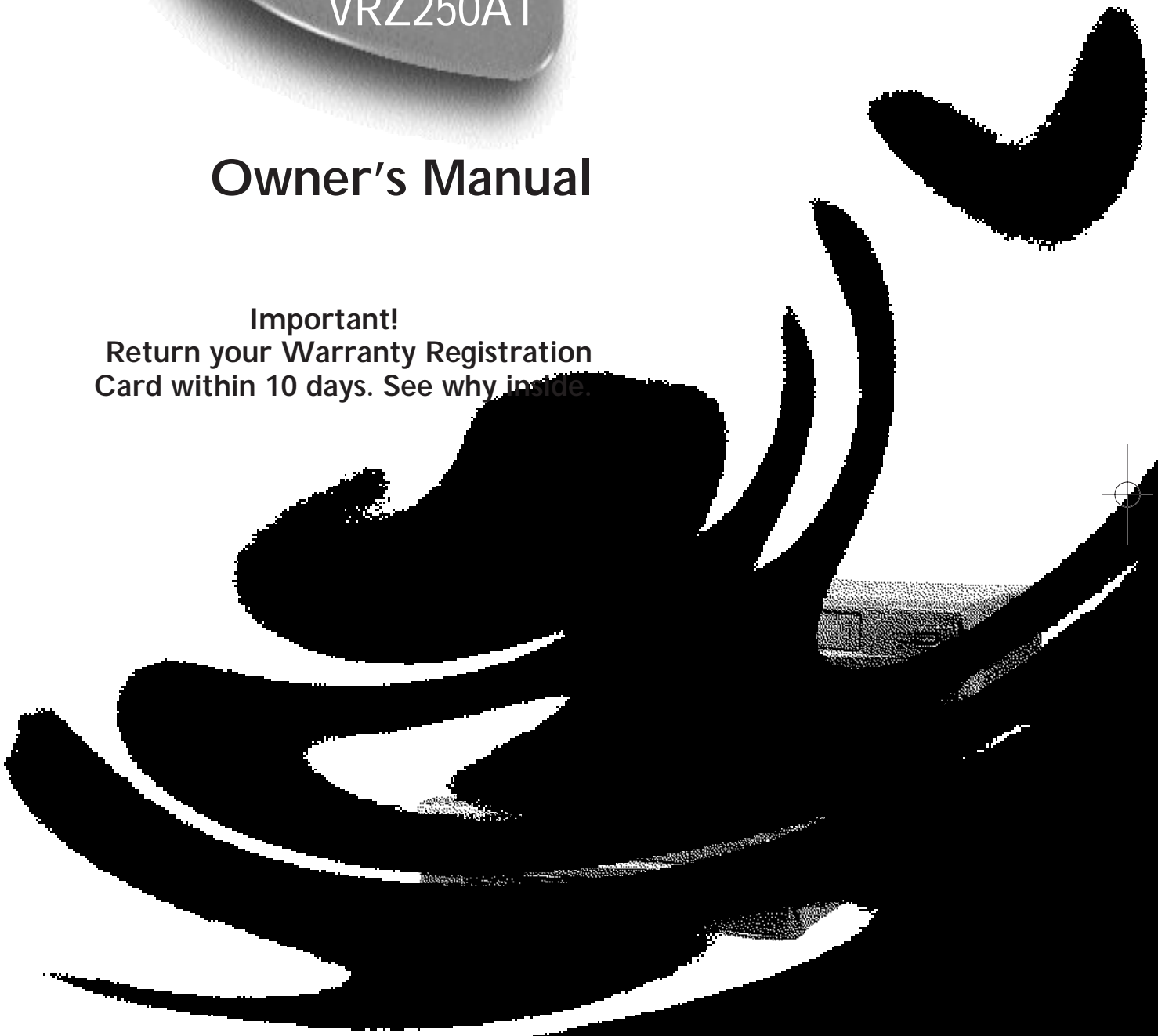

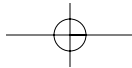

Introduction 3

Welcome to your VCR owner's manual.

This manual describes the VRZ220 and the VRZ250. The VRZ220 is a two-head, monaural (single sound source) system, while the VRZ250 is a four-head, stereo system. The VRZ250 can play tapes in Slow Motion and perform a Time Search; the VRZ220 can not. Otherwise, the two models are exactly the same. In this manual, the VRZ250 is illustrated. (The VRZ220 has single AUDIO IN/OUT Jacks. Also, the VRZ220 remote control does not have the SLOW button and the TIME SEARCH button. Otherwise, the VRZ220 looks exactly like the VRZ250.)

This manual has seven sections: Setting Up Your VCR; Description of Controls; Basic Operations; Recording; Playing; Stereo Features; and Information You May Need. The instructions explain all of the VCR's features, which are listed below. You cannot hurt your VCR by trying the features! So read on – and relax.

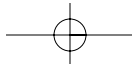
This VCR is equipped with a High Quality (HQ) system and is compatible with existing Video Home System (VHS) equipment. Philips Consumer Electronics Company recommends that you use only video cassette tapes that have been tested and inspected for use in two, four, six, and eight hour VCRs, and which are labeled with the **VHS** mark. The use of tapes that have not been inspected for use in two, four, six, and eight hour VCRs may result in poor picture quality and excessive deposits on the video heads, which may not be covered by the warranty if damage occurs.

Note to the Cable TV System Installer: This reminder is provided to call the Cable TV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the National Electrical Code, which provides guidelines for proper grounding – in particular, specifying that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as possible.

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Helpful Hint

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Setting Up Your VCR

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Before Using Your VCR 5

Removing the Plastic Cover from the Front Panel

A thin, plastic cover may protect the front panel of your VCR. Before using the VCR, lift a corner of the plastic, then peel it off.

Putting Batteries in the Remote Control

1

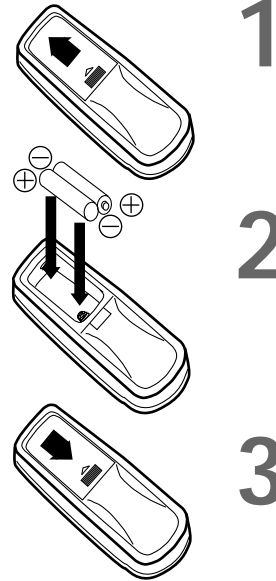
Remove the battery compartment lid on the bottom of the remote control by sliding it in the direction of the arrow.

2

Place two AA batteries inside the battery compartment with their + and - ends aligned as indicated.

3

Replace the battery compartment lid.



Using the Remote Control

- Point the remote control at the VCR's remote sensor (see page 22) when using the remote control to operate the VCR.
- Do not put objects between the remote control and the VCR.

Erasure Prevention

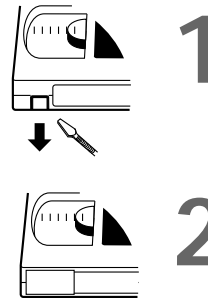
Video cassette tapes have record tabs to ensure that recordings are not accidentally erased.

1

To prevent erasure, break off the tab with a screwdriver.

2

To record again, cover the hole with cellophane tape.

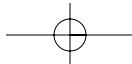


VCR maintenance

- Use only tapes with the **VHS** mark.
- Remove any light adhesive stick-on notes from the video cassette tape before putting the tape in the VCR. Removable labels can jam the VCR.
- Periodic maintenance is required to maintain your VCR's excellent performance. This VCR has an Automatic Head Cleaner. However, the video heads will require replacement eventually. Only an authorized service center should perform this service.

Helpful Hints

- Do not mix alkaline and manganese batteries.
- Do not mix old and new batteries.

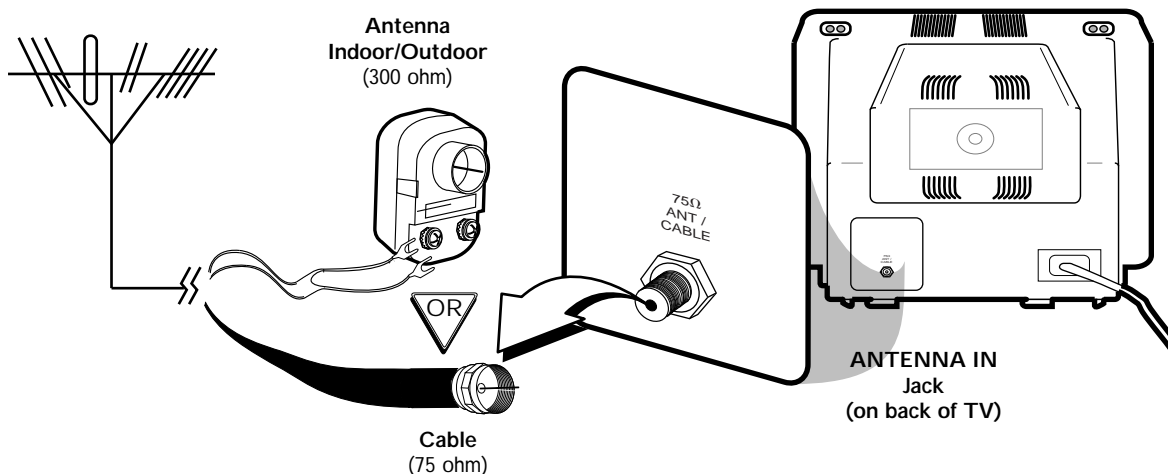


6 Hookups Without a Cable Box / Direct Broadcast System

The basic VCR/TV connection – antenna/cable to VCR to TV – is shown below. If you have a Cable Box or a Direct Broadcast System, please see pages eight-nine. If you have a Stereo TV, please see page 10. After you hook up the VCR, go to page 11 to turn on the VCR. (The VRZ250 is illustrated here. The VRZ220 has single AUDIO IN/OUT Jacks.)

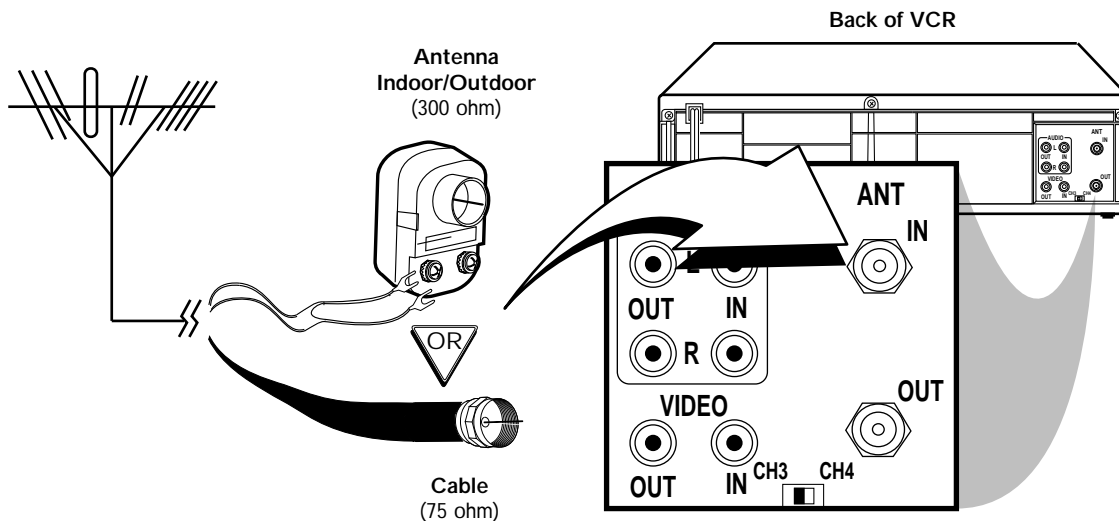

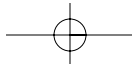
Disconnect the antenna or cable from your TV.

Connect the antenna or cable to the ANT(enna) IN Jack of your VCR.

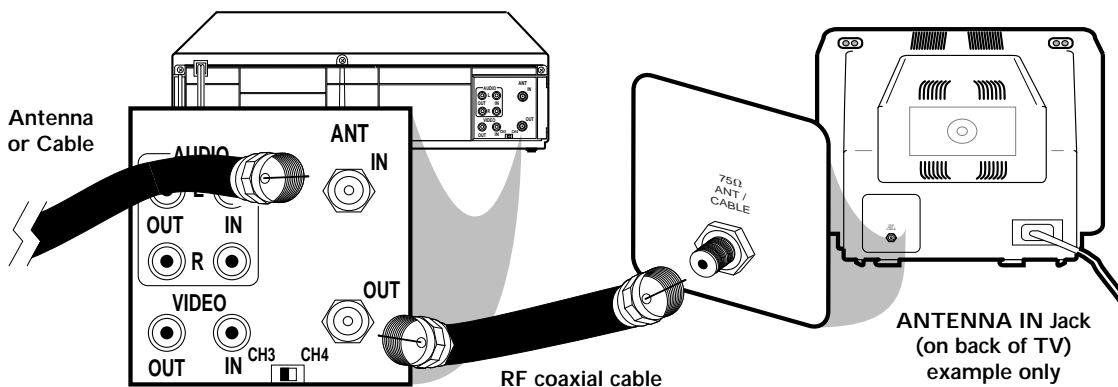

Connect the RF coaxial cable (supplied) to the OUT Jack on the back of the VCR and to the ANTENNA IN Jack on the TV. (You may use either a snap-on type (supplied) or screw-on type of coaxial cable, whichever you prefer.)

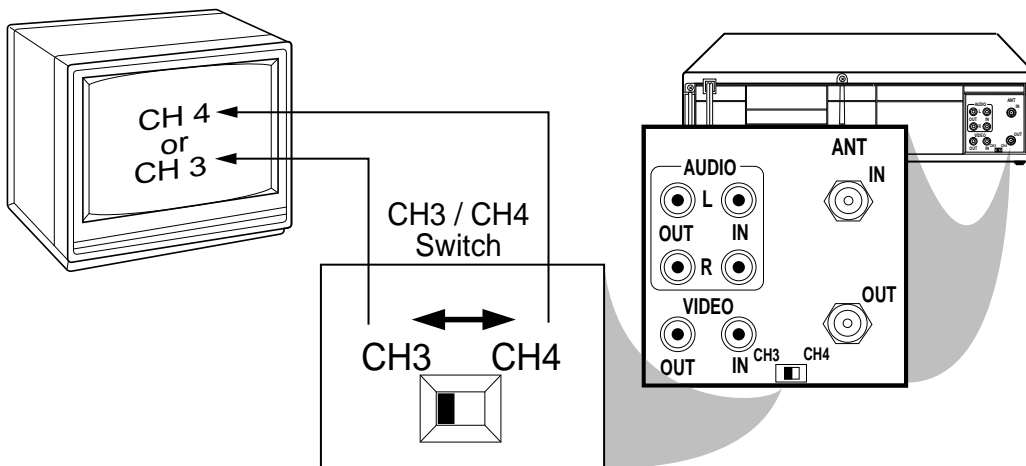

Plug in the TV and the VCR.

5

Set the CH3/CH4 switch on the back of the VCR to CH3 or CH4, whichever channel is not used or least used in your area. Set the TV to the same channel. For example, when playing a tape, if the CH3/CH4 switch is set to CH3, the TV should be on channel 03.



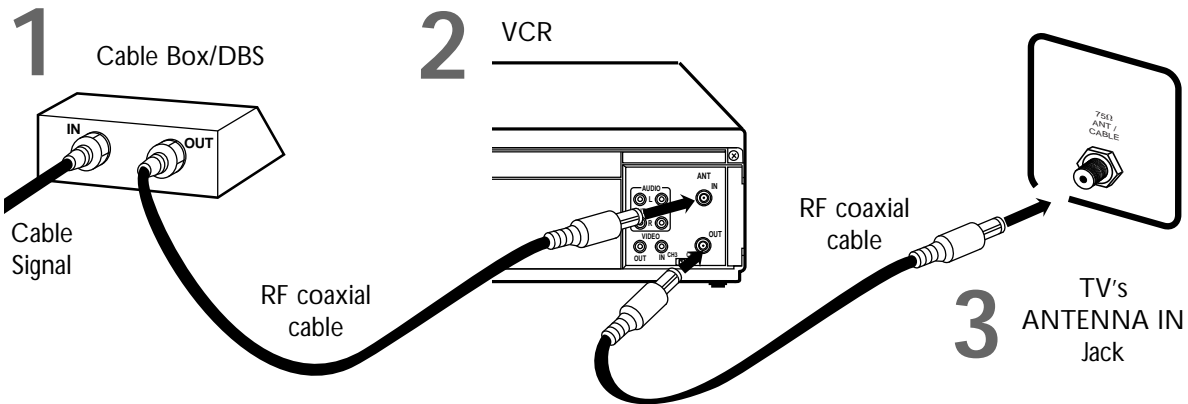

You are ready to turn on the VCR. Please go to page 11 before turning on the VCR.

8 Hookups With a Cable Box / Direct Broadcast System

There are two ways to connect your Cable Box/DBS to the VCR. With this connection:

- You may view any channel.
- You must select channels at the Cable Box/DBS. Channels cannot be changed at the VCR.
- You may not view a channel other than the one you are recording.
- You may not program channels at the VCR.
- You can only program a timer recording for one channel at a time. Set the TV and the VCR to the Cable Box/DBS output channel (channel 03 or 04), and set your Cable Box/DBS to the channel you want to record. When you enter the channel you want to record in a timer recording, select channel 03 or 04 (the Cable Box/DBS output channel). (This is step 5 on page 29.) Leave the Cable Box/DBS on for a timer recording.



Connections

1

Connect a Cable signal to the IN Jack on the Cable Box/DBS.

2

Use an RF coaxial cable (supplied) to connect the OUT Jack on the Cable Box/DBS to the ANT(enna) IN Jack on the VCR.

3

Use a second RF coaxial cable to connect the OUT Jack on the VCR to the TV's ANTENNA IN Jack.

Recording/Viewing Any Channel

1

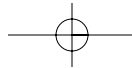
With the VCR on and in VCR position (the VCR/TV light will appear on the display panel), use the **CHANNEL ▲/▼** buttons to set the VCR to the Cable Box/DBS output channel (channel 03 or 04).

Set the TV to the same channel to which you set the VCR.

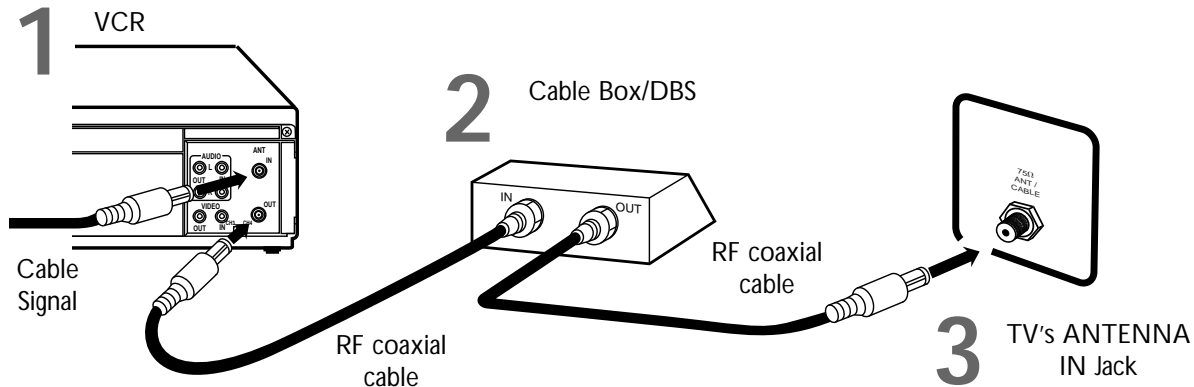
Select the channel you want to view/record at the Cable Box/DBS.



Hookups With a Cable Box / Direct Broadcast System (cont'd) 9

With this connection:

- You may watch one channel while recording another.
- You may not record scrambled channels.



Connections

1

Connect a Cable signal to the VCR's ANT(enna) IN Jack.

2

Use an RF coaxial cable (supplied) to connect the OUT Jack on the VCR to the IN Jack on the Cable Box/DBS.

3

Use a second RF coaxial cable to connect the OUT Jack on the Cable Box/DBS to the ANTENNA IN Jack on the TV.

Recording One Channel/Watching Another

1

Put the Cable Box/DBS on the same channel as the VCR's CH3/CH4 switch. Then, with the VCR in VCR position (the VCR/TV light will appear on the display panel), **use the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons to select the channel you want to record at the VCR. Start the recording.**

Press the VCR/TV button once to put the VCR in TV position. (The VCR/TV light will disappear.)

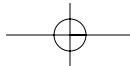
Set the TV to the Cable Box/DBS output channel (03 or 04).

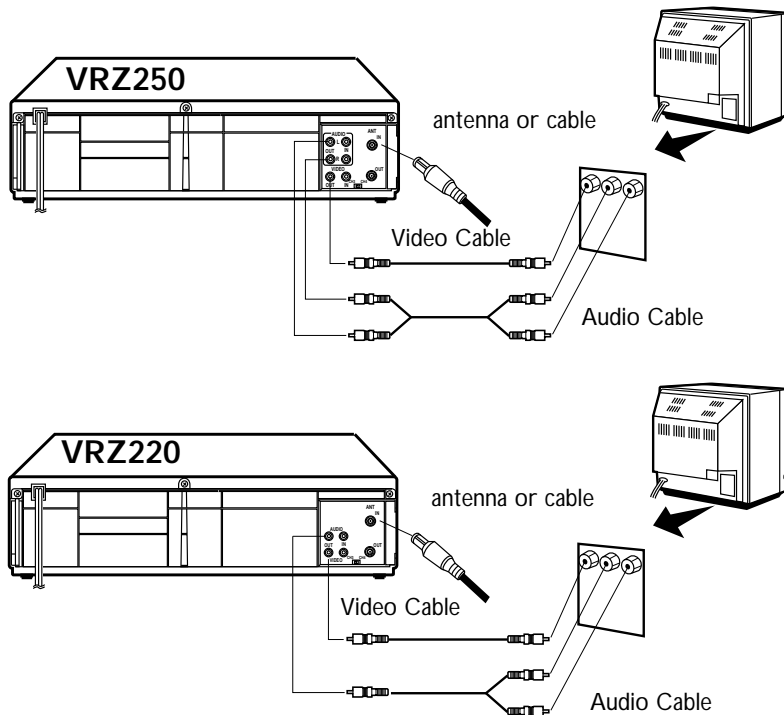
Select the channel you want to watch at the Cable Box/DBS.

Helpful Hint

- When you play a tape, make sure the Cable Box/DBS is set to the same channel as the CH3/CH4 switch on the VCR. Set the TV to the Cable Box/DBS output channel (03 or 04).



10 Hookups With a Stereo TV



1

Connect the antenna or cable to the ANT(enna) IN Jack on the back of the VCR.

2

Connect a video cable (not supplied) to the yellow VIDEO OUT Jack on the back of the VCR. Then, connect the other end of the video cable to the VIDEO IN Jack on your TV.

3 VRZ250

Connect an audio cable (not supplied) to the red and white AUDIO OUT Jacks on the back of the VCR. Then, connect the other end of the audio cable to the AUDIO IN Jacks on your TV.

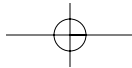
3 VRZ220

Connect an audio cable (not supplied) to the white AUDIO OUT Jack on the back of the VCR. Then, connect the other end of the audio cable to the AUDIO IN Jack on your TV.

If your TV has Right and Left AUDIO IN Jacks, you must use a "Y" splitter audio cable as illustrated to deliver audio to the TV's right and left channels. This hookup will not give you stereo sound. To get stereo sound, use the connections on pages six-seven and select the channel to be viewed at the TV (with the VCR turned off).

4

Turn on your TV, making sure it is in Line Input mode. Please refer to your TV owner's manual for details.



Turning on Your VCR 11

Before turning on your VCR, make sure there are batteries in the remote control and the VCR and TV are connected correctly.

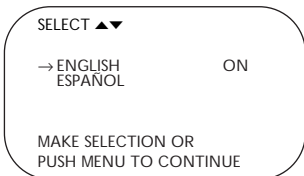
- You can not program channels if you are using a Cable Box or a Direct Broadcast System.

1

Press the **POWER** button. The VCR/TV light and the POWER light will appear on the display panel.

2

Turn on the TV. Set it to the same channel as the **CH3/CH4** switch on the back of the VCR. The display shown below will appear. (If the display does not appear, check your hookups, then follow the steps on page 12 to set up channels and page 17 to select a language.)

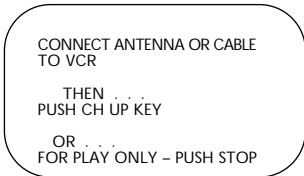

Within 60 seconds, press the **PLAY/▲** button or the **STOP/▼** button to select English or Spanish on-screen displays.

4

Press the **MENU** button. The display shown below will appear.



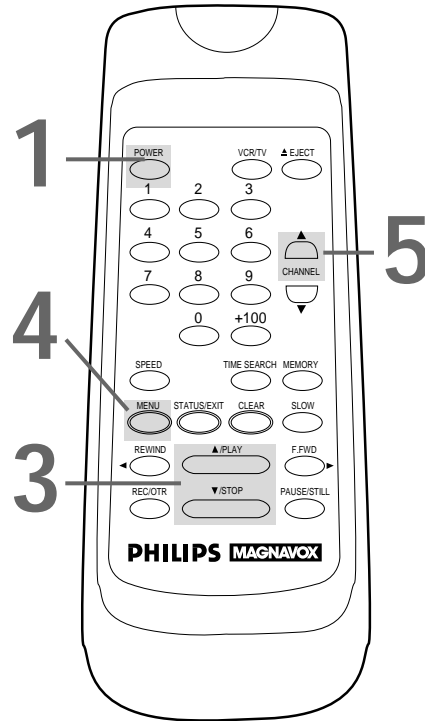

Within 60 seconds, press the **CHANNEL ▲** button to begin automatic channel programming. **AUTO SET PROCEEDING PLEASE WAIT** will appear on-screen. The VCR will memorize all available channels. When all channels are programmed, **CHANNELS ARE SET** will appear on-screen briefly, then TV programming will appear.

Now, when you press the **CHANNEL ▲/▼** buttons, you'll only scan through channels that you receive.

Turn on the TV.



Helpful Hints

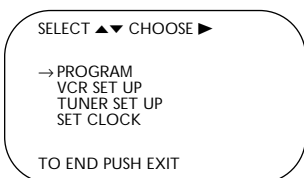
- To skip this feature and play a tape immediately, insert a tape with its record tab removed. Or, to skip step 3, press the **MENU** button. All on-screen displays will be in English. To skip step 5, press the **STOP/▼** button. Channels will not be programmed, and **CHANNELS NOT SET** will appear on-screen.
- If you try to program channels when there is no antenna or cable connected to the VCR, programming will appear to take place, but eventually a **NO TV SIGNALS** message will appear. Connect an antenna or cable to the VCR's **ANT(enna) IN Jack** and try again. You may need to follow the steps on page 12.
- The **TIMER** light on the VCR will blink when the power is restored after a power failure of more than one minute.

12 Automatic Channel Setup

Although your VCR may automatically memorize the channels you receive when you turn it on for the first time, this function lets you set up the channels again.

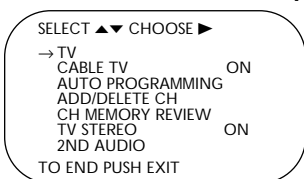

Press the MENU button.



2

Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select TUNER SET UP, then press the F.FWD/► button.



Note: TV STEREO and 2ND AUDIO are not available in the TUNER SET UP menu of the VRZ220.

Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select TV (if you have an antenna) or CABLE TV (if you have a cable connection). Then, press the F.FWD/► button. ON will appear beside your choice.

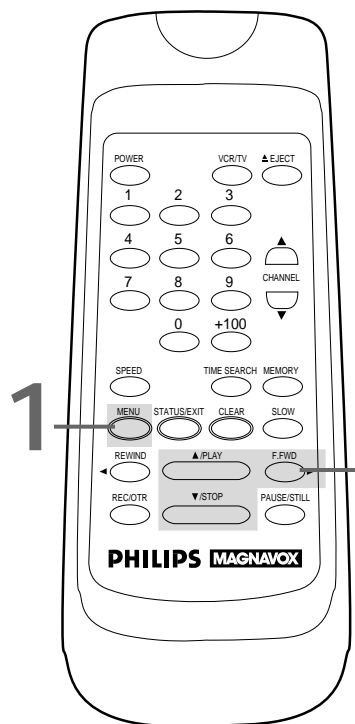

Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select AUTO PROGRAMMING, then press the F.FWD/► button. The VCR will place all the channels you receive into its memory.

5

Wait for a few minutes while the VCR sets up the channels. When this is complete, CHANNELS ARE SET will appear on-screen. Then the programming of the lowest channel number placed in the VCR's memory will appear on-screen. Now when you press the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons, you will scan only through channels you receive.

Helpful Hints

- You can not enter the TUNER SET UP menu when you are in Line Input mode (channel 00). When you select channel 00, A/V IN will appear on-screen briefly.
- You can not program channels if you are using a Cable Box or DBS.

- If all the programmed channels don't fit on the screen, press the F.FWD/► button to see the remaining channels. Then press the REW(ind)/◀ button to return to the first screen of channels.
- If you do not press any buttons within 10 seconds, you will either go to the next screen of channels or you will return to the previous menu.

Setting the Clock 15

Follow the steps below to set your VCR's clock. Make sure:

- The VCR is on and the VCR/TV light appears on the display panel. (If it does not, press the VCR/TV button once.)
- You make each entry within 60 seconds of the previous entry.

Press the **MENU** button.

2

Press the **PLAY/▲** button or the **STOP/▼** button to select **SET CLOCK**, then press the **F.FWD/▶** button.

Press the **PLAY/▲** button or the **STOP/▼** button to select **SET CLOCK**, then press the **F.FWD/▶** button.

4

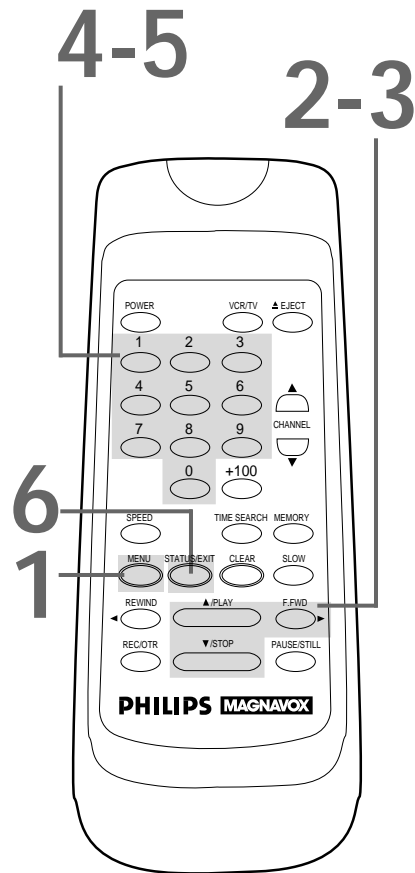
Press two **Number** buttons for the hour(s) and two **Number** buttons for the minute(s). Then press **1** for **AM** or **2** for **PM**. For example, for 2:15 PM, press 02, 15, 2.

5

Press two **Number** buttons for the month, two **Number** buttons for the day, and two **Number** buttons for the year. For example, for July 1, 1998, press 07, 01, 98. The day of the week will appear automatically.

Press the **STATUS/EXIT** button.



Helpful Hints

- Enter a 0 before a single digit number.
- Entries that do not match the VCR's calendar will cause a question mark to appear on-screen.
- To make corrections, press the **CLEAR** button until the space for the number you want to correct is flashing. Then enter the correct number.
- The current time will appear on-screen if you press the **STATUS/EXIT** button. (See page 20 for details.)
- Power failures that last for more than one minute can cause you to lose your clock setting. If this happens, follow the steps on pages 11 and 15.

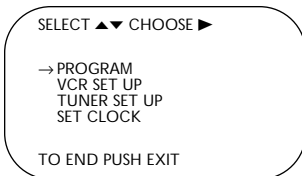
16 Daylight-Saving Time

You may program the VCR so its clock will automatically move forward one hour in April and turn back one hour in October. Daylight-Saving Time is set to ON when you receive your VCR. Turn Daylight-Saving Time ON or OFF by following the steps below. Before you begin:

- Make sure the clock is set.

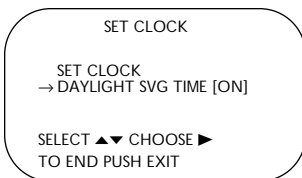

EJECT Button
Press to eject the tape.

VCR/TV Button
Use to select the signal that your TV receives.

VCR Position ●
Use to watch a tape, to watch a program while recording it, or to watch a TV broadcast using the CHANNEL (▲/▼) or Number buttons. If the VCR/TV light appears on the display panel of the VCR, it is in VCR position.

TV Position ●
Use to watch TV or to watch one program while recording another. *Details are on page 26.* If the VCR/TV light doesn't appear on the display panel, the VCR is in TV position.

CLEAR Button
Press to erase incorrect data when programming VCR functions. Also, press to reset the real-time counter. *Details are on page 35.*

STOP/▼ Button
Press to stop the tape. Press to select an item in the on-screen menu.

PAUSE/STILL Button
While recording, press to temporarily stop the recording (pause). Press a second time to resume normal recording. *Details are on page 25.* You can not pause a One-Touch Recording. During playback, press to freeze the picture (still). On the VRZ250, press the PAUSE/STILL button again to resume playback. On the VRZ220, press the PLAY/▲ button to resume playback. On the VRZ220, each press of the PAUSE/STILL button will change the position of the noise lines in the Still picture. *Details are on page 36.*

F.FWD(Fast Forward)▶ Button
When playback is stopped, press to fast forward the tape at high speed. During playback, press to fast forward the tape while the picture stays on-screen. *Details are on page 36.*

Press to change a setting of an on-screen menu item or to advance to the next menu.

SLOW Button (VRZ250 only)
During tape playback, press to view the picture in slow motion. Press again to resume normal playback.

CHANNEL (▲/▼) Buttons
Press to scan up or down through the VCR's channels after the channels have been programmed.

20 On-Screen Status Displays

A status display will appear when you press the STATUS/EXIT button or certain function buttons. The contents of the status display will vary. To choose the status display mode, follow the steps below.

If you select STATUS ON, then select COUNTER ONLY ON:

- Whenever you press the STOP/▼ button or the PLAY/▲ button, the status display will appear for five seconds. After five seconds, only the counter will remain on-screen. You must press the STATUS/EXIT button to remove it.

If you select STATUS ON, then select COUNTER ONLY OFF:

- Whenever you press the STOP/▼ button or the PLAY/▲ button, the status display will appear for five seconds.

If you select STATUS OFF:

- The status display will not appear when you press function buttons. You must press the STATUS/EXIT button to see the status display.

Press the MENU button.

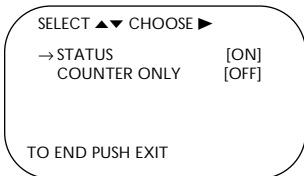
Press the PLAY/▲ button or the STOP/▼ button to select VCR SET UP, then press the F.FWD/▶ button.

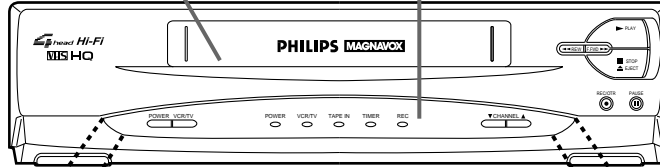

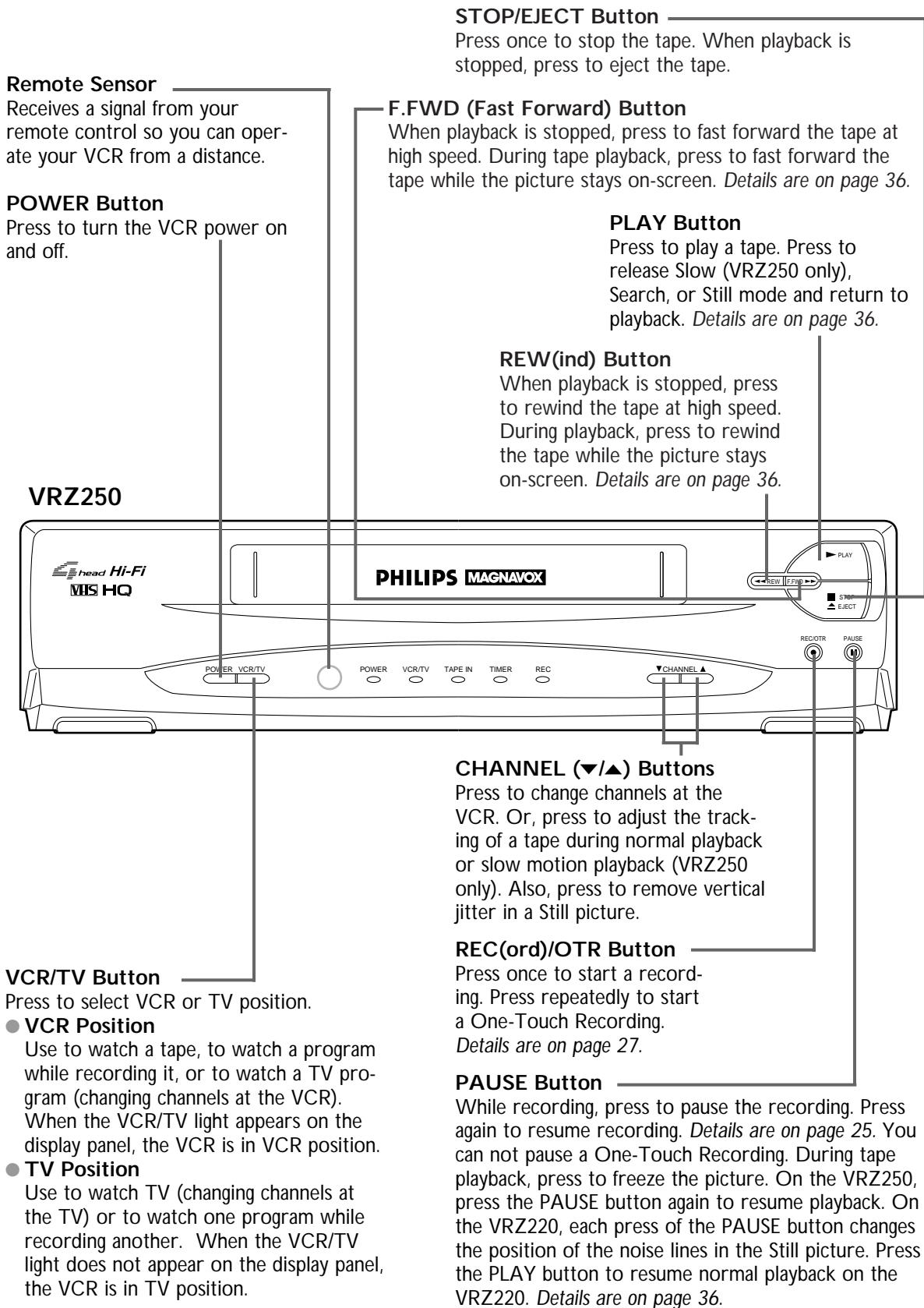
TIMER Light

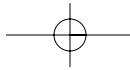

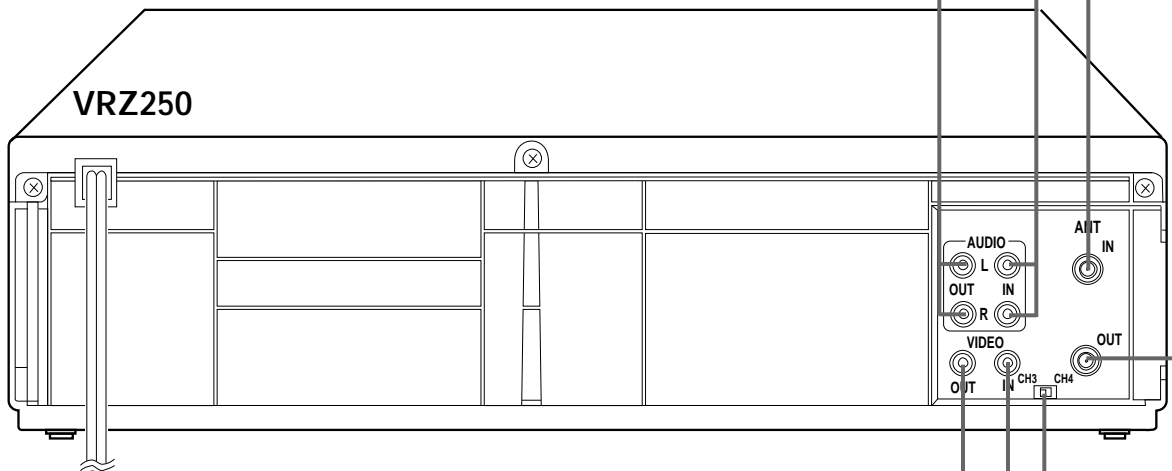

Connect a cable coming from the VIDEO OUT Jack of a camcorder, another VCR, or an audio-visual source (laser disc player, video disc player, etc.) here. *Details are on page 32.*

CH3/CH4 Switch

Set to channel 3 or 4 to use your TV with your VCR. *Details are on pages six-nine.*

OUT Jack

Automatic Operation Features 37

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The following playback features will always operate.

Automatic Playback

When you put a tape in the VCR, the power will come on automatically. If the tape's record tab is missing, playback will begin. If a timer recording is set, the power will not come on automatically when you insert a tape with the record tab intact. If a timer recording is set and the VCR power is off, the VCR will eject the tape if the record tab is missing.

Automatic Rewind, Eject, Off

When a tape is played, fast forwarded, or recorded to its end, the VCR will rewind the tape, stop, eject the tape, and turn itself off. If the real-time counter memory is set, the VCR will only rewind to the point at which the counter is set to zero, then stop. The VCR will not eject the tape automatically or shut itself off.

Tape Eject

A tape can be ejected with the VCR power on or off (but the VCR must be plugged in). If a timer recording is set, a tape can only be ejected with the power on. Make sure you insert a tape and turn off the VCR power for the timer recording.

Automatic Tracking Adjustment

The VCR adjusts tracking automatically to give you the best possible picture quality. With some recordings, however, you may get a better picture using the manual tracking controls (see below).

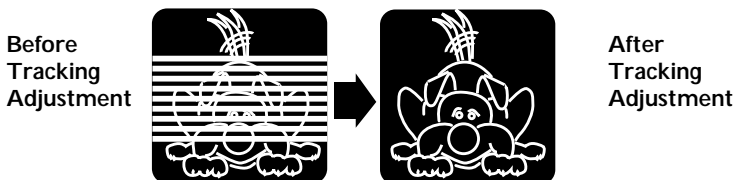

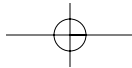
To manually adjust the tracking during playback and slow motion playback (VRZ250 only) press the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons **on the VCR**. (The CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons on the remote control will not adjust tracking.)

Tracking will return to Automatic Tracking Adjustment when you press the STOP/▼ button or insert a tape.

You cannot manually adjust the tracking of a Still picture.

However, you may press the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons on the VCR to remove vertical jitter in a Still picture.





38 Multi-Channel Television Sound System (VRZ250 only)

Your VCR can play recordings broadcast in Hi-Fi (high fidelity) stereo, which produces a crisp, clear sound from two sources. Your VCR also can play tapes recorded in a second audio (usually, that means your program is recorded in a second language). Of course, your VCR will play tapes recorded in monaural (single-source) sound as well.

Your VCR also will record in Hi-Fi stereo or in second audio, so when you play back that tape on the VCR, it will be in stereo or second audio. If you play back the tape on a VCR that can't play back tapes in stereo or second audio, the VCR will automatically play the tape in monaural sound.

Read the directions on this page to familiarize yourself with your VCR's stereo and second audio setups. Then follow the directions on page 39 to record in stereo or second audio and the directions on pages 40-41 to play back tapes recorded in Hi-Fi stereo.

Understanding On-Screen Displays

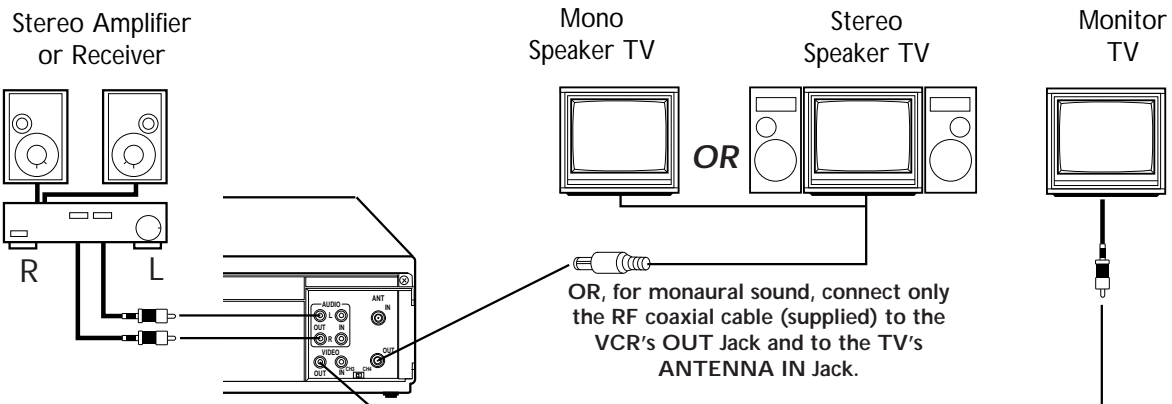
When you receive a signal from a channel you're watching, portions of the on-screen display shown below will appear when you press the STATUS/EXIT button on the remote control.

The indication 2ND AUD or TV STEREO that appears on this side of the status display tells you if your VCR is programmed to receive a second audio or stereo broadcast (it cannot be programmed to receive both at the same time). Follow the steps on page 39 to program the VCR to receive a second audio or stereo broadcast.

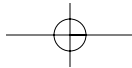


The indication 2ND AUD or STEREO that appears on this side of the status display tells you if the program you're watching is available in second audio or stereo. Even though a program is available in second audio or stereo, you still must program the VCR to receive or record the program. Follow the directions on page 39. This indication is not available during tape playback.

To record and play back programs broadcast in stereo, even if you have a Mono Speaker TV, just use one of the connections shown, then follow the steps on pages 39-41.

If you need to call a customer service representative, please know the model number and serial number of your product before you call. This information is displayed on the back of the product. Also, please take a moment to identify the problem you are having, and be prepared to explain this to the representative. If you believe the representative will need to help you with operations, please stay near the product. Our representatives will be happy to assist you.

No power

- Make sure the power plug is completely connected to an AC (alternating current) outlet.
- Make sure the power is turned on.

Power Failure

- Timer recordings, the clock setting, the language selection, and channel setup may be lost if the power fails for more than one minute. Follow the steps on pages 11 and 15. Then, see pages 28 - 31 to reprogram your timer recordings.

A TV program cannot be recorded.

- Check the connections between the VCR, TV, antenna/cable, and Cable Box/Direct Broadcast System (if applicable) (pages six - 10).
- Make sure the tape has a record tab (page five).
- Check the TV/VCR position (page 22).
- Check the CH3/CH4 switch (pages six - nine).

The VCR will not perform a timer recording.

- Make sure the recording start and stop times are set correctly (pages 28 - 31).
- Make sure a tape is in the VCR and the tape has a record tab (page five). If, after programming a timer recording, you turn off the VCR power without putting a tape in the VCR, the TIMER light will blink.
- If the record tab on a tape is missing, the VCR will eject the tape. The TIMER light will blink.
- Make sure the VCR power is off.
- Make sure the clock is set (page 15).
- The VCR may not perform or continue a timer recording if a power interruption of more than one minute occurs.
- If you have a Cable Box/Direct Broadcast System, timer recordings are programmed differently. (See page eight for details.)
- Finish programming a timer recording at least five minutes before the recording is set to begin.
- 12 p.m. is noon; 12 a.m. is midnight.

There is no playback picture or the playback picture is noisy or contains streaks.

- Make sure the TV is on the same channel as the VCR's CH3/CH4 switch.
- Make sure the VCR is in VCR position. (The VCR/TV light will appear on the display panel.)
- Make sure channel 03 or 04 is properly adjusted at the TV.
- Adjust the tracking (page 37).

The VCR cannot be controlled with the remote control.

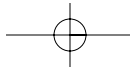
- Make sure the VCR/TV light appears on the display panel. If it does not, press the VCR/TV button once.
- Aim the remote control directly at the VCR's remote sensor (page 22).
- Remove all obstacles between the remote control and the VCR.
- Inspect and/or replace the batteries in the remote control (page five).

The VCR does not respond normally to the remote control. (For example, the VCR may change channels multiple times when you press the CHANNEL ▲ button once.)

- Install new batteries (preferably alkaline) in the remote control.

The Number buttons won't work for channels above 69.

- Select CABLE TV at the TUNER SET UP menu (page 12), then let the VCR set up the channels.



Helpful Hints (cont'd) 43

TV programs cannot be watched normally.

- Put the VCR in TV position. (Press the VCR/TV button so that the VCR/TV light disappears from the display panel. For details see page 22.)
- Check the connections between the VCR, TV, antenna/cable, and Cable Box/Direct Broadcast System (if applicable). (See pages six - 10 for details.)

Tape cannot be inserted.

- Insert the tape, window side up, with the record tab facing you.
- Make sure a tape isn't already in the VCR by pressing the STOP/EJECT button on the VCR.
- Gently push on the center of the tape when putting it in the VCR. Never force the tape into the VCR.
- If a timer recording is programmed and the VCR power is off, you can not insert a tape without a record tab.

Tape cannot be removed.

- Make sure the power plug is completely connected to a power outlet.
- You have set a timer recording. Turn the VCR power on, then eject the tape. Be sure to insert a tape and turn off the power for your timer recording.

VCR ejects the tape when the REC(ord)/OTR button is pressed or when the VCR power is turned off to set a timer recording.

- Make sure the tape has a record tab (page five).

Channels above 13 cannot be received.

- Select CABLE TV at the TUNER SET UP menu (page 12), then let the VCR set up the channels.

Poor reception

- You may need to tune your TV again.

The motor (cylinder) rotates even when the VCR is in Stop mode.

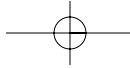
- To enable the quick play mechanism, the cylinder will rotate for about five minutes. This is normal. The quick play mechanism enables the tape mechanism to switch from Stop mode to Play mode in one second.

Line Input mode

- If you accidentally enter Line Input mode (A/V IN will appear on your TV screen briefly), press the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons or use the Number buttons to select another channel.

Hi-Fi Stereo Sound (VRZ250 only)

- During playback, Hi-Fi audio may temporarily revert to normal audio when you adjust tracking. This is normal.
- When connecting the VCR to a stereo TV, you will only get stereo sound if you use audio cables to connect the AUDIO OUT jacks on the VCR to the AUDIO IN jacks on your TV, and if the TV is in Line (Auxiliary) Input mode.
- When you connect the AUDIO OUT jacks on the VCR to the AUDIO IN jacks on your TV, the stereo light on the TV might not glow. But, as long as the status display indicates you are receiving a stereo signal, you are receiving a stereo signal. This is normal.
- Only tapes recorded in Hi-Fi audio will play back in Hi-Fi audio. Tapes recorded in normal audio will play back in monaural audio.



44 Glossary

AUDIO IN/OUT Jacks: jacks located on the back of the VCR which are used to record audio from another source (IN) or to send audio to another source (OUT). The VRZ220 has single AUDIO IN/OUT Jacks on the back of the VCR. The VRZ250 has Right and Left AUDIO IN/OUT Jacks on the back of the VCR.

Automatic Channel Setup: process in which the VCR memorizes all available channels. Then, when you press the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons, you only scan through channels you receive.

Bands: settings that allow you to tune channels.

- **Antenna** – VHF (very high frequency; channels 2 - 13) and UHF (ultra high frequency; channels 14 - 69).
- **Cable** – all standard channels can be received without a Cable Box.

Cable Box/DBS Output Channel: 03 or 04.

Dubbing: copying a tape using a second VCR.

Frame: a still picture.

HQ: high quality; a feature in the VCR circuitry which provides enhanced picture detail.

Line Input: The channel to which you set your VCR during dubbing (0, 0).

If you accidentally enter Line Input mode, press the CHANNEL ▲/▼ buttons or use the Number buttons to select another channel.

OTR: One-Touch Recording; a timed recording that starts immediately and records for 30 minutes to eight hours.

Remote Control: the small electronic unit that came with your VCR; allows you to operate your VCR from a distance.

RF coaxial cable: The cable supplied with your VCR. Use it to connect your VCR to your TV (or Cable Box or DBS). The supplied cable is a snap-on type. However, you may use a screw-on type if you prefer.

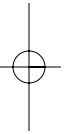
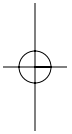
Special Effects: forward and reverse searching; a still picture; slow motion (VRZ250 only) playback.

Tape Speeds: how fast the tape travels during a recording or playback.

- **SP** (standard play) – fastest tape speed (recording time for a T120 tape is approximately two hours); best picture quality.
- **LP** (long play) – average tape speed (recording time for a T120 tape is approximately four hours).
