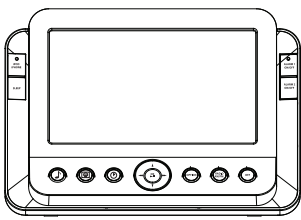

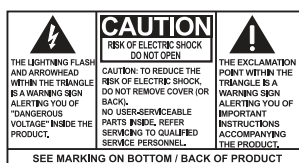

## Connect the main unit power

- Connect the supplied AC/DC power adapter to the product's DC jack, and connect to a convenient wall outlet.

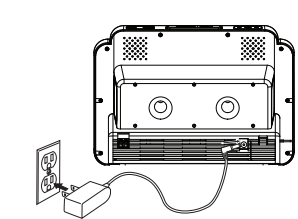
## Music

### Playing music

1. Insert an SD, MMC or MS card into the SD/MMC/MS card slot or insert a USB flash drive into the USB connector.
2. Press **J** and then press **◀** or **▶** to select the source of music and press **OK**.
3. Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight the file you want to play.
4. Press **OK** to start playback.
5. To pause the playback, press **OK**. Press **OK** again to resume playback.
6. Press **◀** or **▶** to select the previous/next file or press and hold to search backward or forward the current song.

### Settings

1. When a music file is highlighted, press **OPTION**.
2. A pop-up menu shows **Play mode** and **Delete**.
3. Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight **Play mode** and press **OK**.
4. Press **▲** or **▼** to select among normal, Repeat one, Repeat all and Shuffle.



- Once connected with power, "Press OPTION to set the clock time" appears after the RCA logo screen. Refer to the following pages for more information on setting up date, time, alarm, listening to radio and viewing photos.

## Battery back-up operation

This clock radio is equipped with a memory holding system that can be powered with 2 "AAA" batteries (not included). The power failure protection circuit will not operate unless battery is installed. When normal household power is interrupted, or AC/DC power adapter is unplugged, the batteries will power the clock radio to keep track of time and alarm settings programmed into memory. When the battery backup functions, the digital display will not light, however, the function of alarm still occurs during the power interruption if remaining battery power.

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is adequate. Normal operation will resume after AC power is restored so you will not have to reset the time or the alarm.

When the battery backup functions, the alarm duration is five minutes only. When AC power is connected, the alarm duration is one hour.

### To install or replace the batteries:

1. Remove battery compartment door (located at the rear of the unit) by applying thumb pressure to the tab on battery door and then lift the door out and off the cabinet.
  2. Insert or replace 2 AAA batteries.
  3. Replace the compartment door.
- It is recommended that you replace the batteries every year.
  - It is recommended to plug the unit for AC power while replacing batteries to avoid the loss of clock and wake time/mode settings.

### Power failure indicator

When AC power is interrupted (disconnected) for a short period of time, both time and alarm settings will change (unless batteries are installed). After AC power is restored (reconnected), the Digital Display will blink to indicate that power was interrupted and you should readjust the time and alarm settings.

## Photo

### Viewing photo

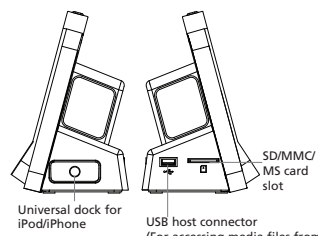
1. Insert an SD, MMC or MS card into the SD/MMC/MS card slot or insert a USB flash drive into the USB connector.
2. Press **☰** and then press **◀** or **▶** to select the source of photo and press **OK**.
3. Press **▲**, **▼**, **◀** or **▶** to highlight the desired file.
4. Press **OK** to start photo slideshow.
5. To pause the slideshow playback, press **OK**. Press **OK** again to resume playback.
6. Press **◀** or **▶** to select the previous/next file.

### Settings

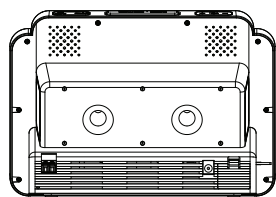
1. During slideshow playback, press **OPTION**.
2. A pop-up menu shows:
  - **Rotate** - to rotate the photo
  - **Slideshow interval** - to set the playback duration of each photo
  - **Display mode** - to select display mode
  - **Wallpaper** - to select wallpaper
  - **Slideshow Transition** - to select different ways of transition

## General controls

### Side view

Universal dock for iPod/iPhone  
USB host connector (For accessing media files from USB Flash Drive only. Do not use to connect PC.)

### Back view

**AM loop antenna socket** - Connect to the AM loop antenna**DC jack** - Connect to the power adapter**Battery compartment** - To install 2 x AAA batteries

## Clock

### Setting date and time

1. "Press **OPTION** to set the clock time" will be displayed when you first power on the unit. Press **OPTION** to enter clock setting menu. (This prompt will be disappeared and the clock time will be flashing to remind user if no button is pressed for a while.)
2. Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight the time display format and date format, date and time and then press **OK**.
3. Press **◀** or **▶** to highlight the option.
4. Press **▲** or **▼** to change the values and then press **OK** to confirm.
5. Press **OPTION** to save and exit the clock settings menu or the menu will exit automatically if no button is pressed for a while.
6. Press **☰** to toggle among three different clock display formats.

### Setting Alarm

1. Press **ALARM SET**.
2. Press **◀** or **▶** to select Alarm 1 or Alarm 2 setting and then press **OK** to confirm.
3. Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight the

different options include **Alarm Time**, **Alarm Volume**, **Alarm Date**, **Snooze** and **Alarm sound** and then press **OK**.

4. Press **▲** or **▼** to change the values and then press **OK** to confirm.
5. Press **☰** to exit the alarm setting menu or the menu will exit automatically if no button is pressed for a while.
6. Press **ALARM 1 ON/OFF** or **ALARM 2 ON/OFF** to turn/off the alarm.

## Radio

3. Press **▲** or **▼** to select a preset station and press **OK** to confirm.

### Radio step frequency change

In FM/AM radio mode, press **OPTION** and **▲** or **▼** to access "FM step" or "AM step" items (depends on what the current radio band is). Select the desired step frequency and press **OK** for confirmation.

- The default FM step frequency is 200kHz and AM step frequency is 10kHz.
- All radio preset stations will be reset when the step frequency is confirmed to change.

### Antenna

#### Built-in AFC

The Built-in Automatic Frequency Control (AFC) works only on FM. It helps reducing drift on FM reception and keeping the radio locked in on the FM station to which it is tuned.

#### AM Antenna

For AM reception, connect the AM antenna loop to the back of the radio. Stretch out the antenna cord to its fullest length and rotate the antenna for better reception.

## Display brightness

Press **SNOOZE/BRIGHTNESS** to select the brightness level among High, Middle and Low.

## System settings

1. Press **SYSTEM** to show system menu.
2. Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight the option and then press **OK**.
3. In **Language** sub-menu, press **▲** or **▼** to change the values and then press **OK** to confirm.
4. In **Reset all setting sub-menu**, press **OK**. Then press **◀** or **▶** to select **Yes** and press **OK** to confirm.
4. Press **☰** or **SYSTEM** to exit the system menu.

All user defined settings (e.g. clock presets, clock time format and date format) will be lost after reset.

## Sleep function

### Sleep timer

The unit has a built-in sleep timer which enables the unit to automatically turn off after a set period of time.

Press **SLEEP** repeatedly until the sleep time (Off, 15, 30, 60, 90 Mins) you desire displays.

1. Press **SLEEP** to activate the sleep timer function and the sleep icon will be turned on.
2. When the sleep timer function is activated, press **SLEEP** to show the remaining sleep time.
3. Press **SLEEP** again will show a pop-up menu. To change sleep time (90, 60, 30, 15 mins and off), press **▲** or **▼** to highlight different sleep time and press **OK**.

You can also change the sleep setting from the clock setting menu.

1. Press **OPTION** to enter clock setting menu. This menu can be recalled under in clock display mode screen.
2. Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight Sleep Time and then press **OK**.
3. Press **▲** or **▼** to select the sleep time and then press **OK** to confirm. The default sleep time is 90 mins.
4. Press **▲** or **▼** to highlight Sleep Mode and then press **OK**.

5. Press **▲** or **▼** to select the sleep mode from radio, music (USB or memory card) and iPod/iPhone. The default sleep mode is radio.
6. To turn off the sleep timer, press of **OFF** or **SNOOZE**. It can also be turned off by pressing **SLEEP** twice, then select **OFF** in the pop-up menu.

The display will automatically dimmed so that it will not disturb you while you are sleeping.

## Wallpaper

### Setting wallpaper

Follow the below two options to set the wallpaper:

1. Press **☰** to enter Clock mode if you are in other modes.
2. Press **OPTION** to enter clock setting menu and then press **▲** or **▼** to select Wallpaper.
3. Press **OK**.
4. Select below options by pressing **▲** or **▼** and then **OK**.
  - **Default**: To use the built-in photo as wallpaper
  - **External**: To select a desired photo as wallpaper from USB device or memory card
  - **Off**: To turn off the wallpaper option and use a black background instead
5. If you select External, press **◀** or **▶** to select the source of wallpaper and then press **OK**.
6. Press **▲**, **▼**, **◀** or **▶** to select desired wallpaper.
7. Press **OK** to confirm.

If the "Slideshow" item in the clock setting menu is set to "ON" and "Wallpaper" item is set to "Default" or "Off", the built-in photos will be used for slideshow in clock display mode. Otherwise, the photos in the memory card or USB flash drive will be used for slideshow in clock display mode.

1. Press **☰** and then press **◀** or **▶** to select the source of photo and press **OK**.
2. Press **▲**, **▼**, **◀** or **▶** to select the desired photo from the thumbnails.
3. Press **OPTION** to enter photo setting menu and then press **▲** or **▼** select Wallpaper.
4. Press **▲** or **▼** to select **ON** and press **OK**.
