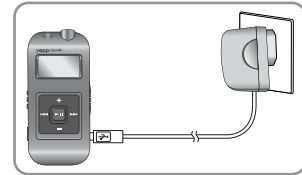
- To avoid electric shock, Use the charger only with a power outlet that matches the converter's plug.
- Make sure that the charger's plug is inserted all the way into the outlet.

# Cautions for Recharging

A charger is provided with the YP-60. Please be sure to only use the provided adapter.

Plug the charger into a wall outlet.

- \* When recharging is complete, "FULLY CHARGED" is shown in the display window.
- \* Recharging continues to take place even when the USB cable is connected.



## Caution

- Do not charge longer than the specified charge time to avoid risk of fire.
- Do not plug several devices into the same outlet.
- Do not use a damaged internal rechargeable battery or recharge adapter.
- When using the rechargeable battery for the first time or after several months of non-use, fully charge it first.
- Do not charge the rechargeable battery for more than 6 hours.
- Overcharging or overdischarging will reduce battery life.
- You should check the recharging time and switch to a new internal rechargeable battery when the battery life becomes low.
- The rechargeable battery is a consumable item and its capacity will decrease gradually.
- To prolong the life of your battery, use the fully charged battery until it is completely discharged, and then fully charge it again before use. If you charge a battery that is not completely drained, the battery operating time will decrease. In this case, repeat the full charge/discharge cycle several times.
- Do not let metallic objects, such as necklaces or coins, come into contact with the terminals (metallic parts) of the charger and the built-in rechargeable battery. A fire or electric shock may result.
- Be careful not to touch the recharge adapter with wet hands.

## System Requirements.

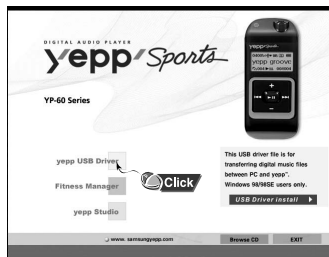
The PC system must meet the following specifications:

- Pentium 133MHz or greater.
- Windows 98SE/ME/2000/XP.
- 40MB of available hard disk space
- CD-ROM drive.  
(double speed or greater)
- USB port (1.1) supported.
- VGA graphics.
- DirectX 8.0 or above.

Before connecting yepp to PC, make sure to install USB driver. If "Add New Hardware Wizard" appears, press the [Cancel] button and install USB driver.

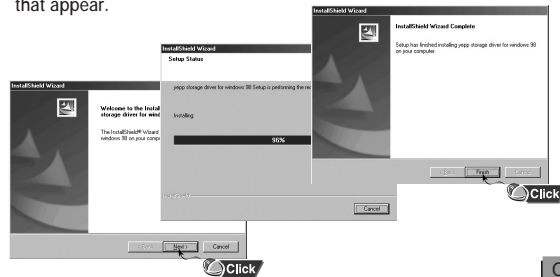

## Connecting the yepp to a PC with a USB cable

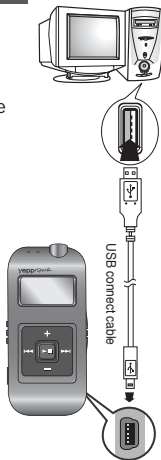
**4** Connect a USB cable to the USB port on the computer.

**5** Connect the opposite end of the USB cable to the USB cable port on the right side of the yepp.

- If you disconnect the USB cable from your PC while implementing a command or initializing during USB driver installation, your PC may not function correctly.

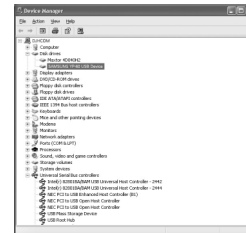
**6** The USB driver is installed with a message saying that it is searching for a new device. You may not see the display screen during installation. Go to the device manager to check that installation has been successfully completed.

**7** Upon installation of the USB driver "SAMSUNG YP-60" will appear in the [System Properties] → [Device Manager].



## How to check the USB driver

# Manual Installation of the USB Driver

## When an error occurs during installation of the USB driver

**1** Check the device manager.

**2** Check if there is a device listed with an exclamation point or a question mark (displayed as unknown device or USB device).

**3** Double click on the device listed with an exclamation point or a question mark.

**4** After selecting the driver, click on [Update Driver].



**5** Select a compatible driver, click on [Next] to finish.

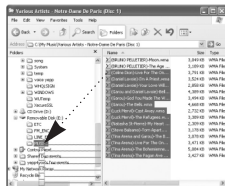

# Using the removable storage

## Downloading/Uploading files

- 1 Connect the yepp to your PC and turn it on.
- 2 Open Windows Explorer on PC.
- 3 Select the file to save and drag-and-drop it into the removable disk icon.  
(In numerical, alphabetical order)



### Notice

- Music File can be played only when it is downloaded in the MUSIC folder or the folder right below of MUSIC folder.
- The order of music files is not relative to the replay order when you select a Removable Disk in Windows Explorer.
- While either DOWNLOAD or UPLOAD on the LCD of yepp is turned on, do not remove USB cable. Your PC might malfunction.  
If "READY" will be displayed on the LCD of yepp, it means that transmission is completed. Then you can remove USB cable.

## Disconnecting the USB cable

After completing the file transmission, you must disconnect the cable in the following way:

- 1 Double-click on the green arrow in the taskbar on the bottom right of the window.
- 2 When the [Hardware device stopped] message appears, press the [OK] button and disconnect the USB cable.

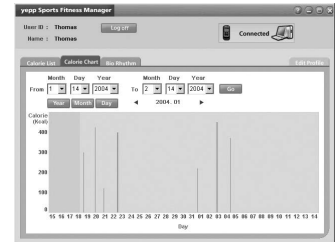

### [Calorie Chart]

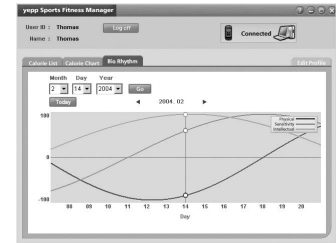
- You can check the calories consumed as a result of exercise in units of years, months and days.

- Year** : Displays calorie data for one year based on the current point.
- Month** : Displays calorie data for one month based on the current point.
- Day** : Displays calorie data by time as of today.



### [Biorhythm]

- You can check the biorhythm of the selected user.



### Note

- If [Edit Profile] is clicked, personal information can be changed.
- The resulting graph of the biorhythm reflects the statistical values of the measured data and so may be different from the actual values.

# Playing Music and Turning Off the Device

## Turning Power On and Off

- Power On : Press and hold the ►|| button to turn on the power.
- Power Off : Press and hold the ►|| button to turn off the power.

## Playing Music

Press the ►|| button.

- Playback starts.



## Pausing Music

Press the ►|| button to pause playback.

- While in Pause mode, briefly press ►|| again to resume playback.



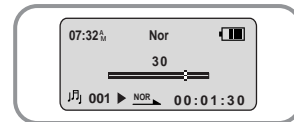
### Note

- WMA files can be played only as music files with a compression rate of 64Kbps-192Kbps, that can be created in Windows Media Player (Version 8.0).
- The power off time can be set in the menu.

# Adjusting the Volume/Hold Function

## Adjusting the Volume

Press the - , + buttons to adjust the volume.





### Note

- The volume can be adjusted in increments between 0 and 40.
- Press the - , + buttons once to adjust the volume by one step.  
Press and hold the - , + buttons to increase or decrease the volume in greater increments.

## HOLD Function

In Hold mode, all buttons are disabled.

Slide the  switch on the player in the direction of the arrow.

- When the button is pressed, the "  HOLD!" message will appear on the display.



# Searching for Music/Voice Files

## To search for specific parts during play

- A desired passage can be searched for by pressing and holding down the **⏮**, **⏭** buttons during play.

## To change tracks during play

- If the **⏭** button is pressed during play, the next track is played.
- If the **⏮** button is pressed before five seconds have passed since starting to play a track, the previous track is played and if the **⏮** button is pressed after five seconds, the current track is replayed from the beginning.

## To change tracks when stopped

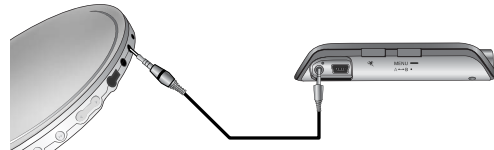
- If the **⏮**, **⏭** buttons are pressed when stopped, the yepp moves to the previous or next track, respectively.

### Note

- VBR(Variable Bit Rate) file: A file that constantly changes the compression rate according to the type of sounds, such as their pitch, in the file.
- With VBR files, pressing the **⏮** button within 5 seconds from the start of the track may not result in the previous track playing.
- Files that were downloaded in MP2 or MP1 and had their file extension changed to MP3 may not play.

# Encoding MP3s

- 1 Connect the Audio Output port on the external audio source (or the Line Out port) to the ENC port on the device with the Line in cable.



- 2 If the ENC button is pressed, MP3 encoding begins.
  - If the **⏭** button is pressed, encoding is paused and if the **⏭** button is pressed again, the encoding resumes.
- 3 If the ENC button is pressed during encoding, the encoding stops and an encoding file is created.
  - Encoding is performed in order (ENC001, ENC002, etc.) and files are saved in the MP3 format after encoding.

### Note

- The bit rate can be set to 64Kbps, 96Kbps and 128Kbps.
- During encoding, there is no beeping sound and the button lights and backlight do not illuminate.

### Caution

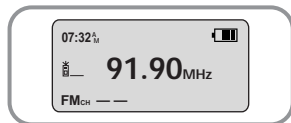
- Do not disconnect the Line cable during Encoding.
- If the battery is not sufficiently charged, encoding will not be done.
- Adjust the volume of the external audio source to a suitable level and encode it. If the volume level is extremely high, the sound quality may not be good.

# Listening to FM Radio

Select FM mode first. (Refer to "Changing Modes")

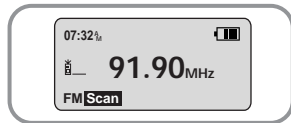
## Manual Search for a Frequency

- Press the **◀▶** buttons to search manually for the desired frequency.



## Automatic Search for a Frequency

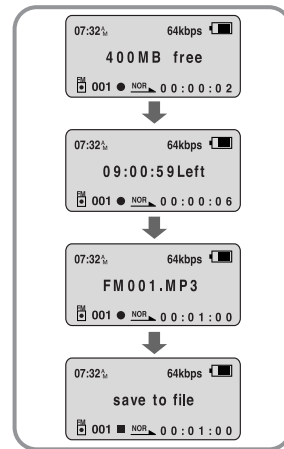
- Press and hold the **◀▶** buttons in order to search for and stop at frequencies with reception.



# Encoding From FM Radio

## Doing FM encoding

- 1 Press the ENC button during FM reception.
  - Encoding of the currently transmitted FM broadcast begins.
- 2 Press the ENC button again.
  - A file is created and the encoding stops.
  - Files are saved in order, starting FM001, FM002...etc., and stop automatically when the memory is full.



### Note

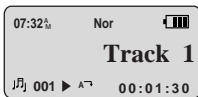
- During encoding, there is no beeping sound and the button lights and back light do not illuminate.
- Encoded files will become 64Kbps files after they are encoded from FM.

# Loop Repeating

## Starting Point

While playing music files, press the **A↔B** button briefly at the beginning of the loop you want to set.

**A↔** appears in the display.



## Ending Point

Press the **A↔B** button briefly again to set the end of the loop.

**A↔B** appears in the display.  
The loop is played repeatedly.



### Note

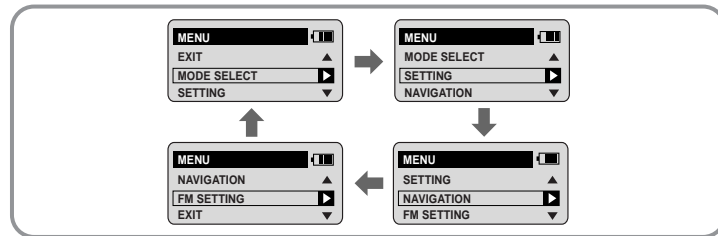
- Press the **A↔B** button briefly to cancel the loop.
- Loop Repeat is automatically released if you Speed Search with the **◀▶** buttons.

# MENU Mode

Press and hold the **MENU** button while in Music/Voice Mode.

After navigating with the **←**, **→** buttons, press the **▶** button to select the desired menu.

Menu mode is cancelled if the **MENU** button is pressed.



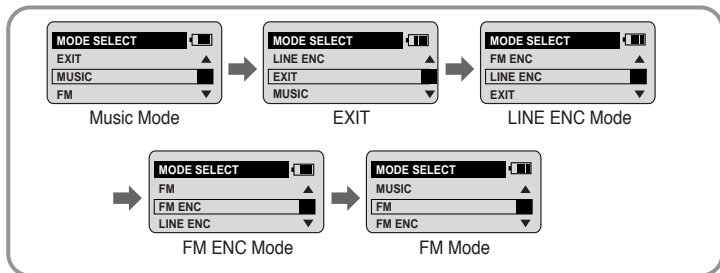
- **MODE SELECT** : When changing modes.
- **SETTING** : When changing the yep's advanced functions.
- **NAVIGATION** : When performing a simple search for saved music files.
- **FM SETTING** : When saving frequencies automatically or checking saved frequencies.
- **EXIT** : To exit MENU.

### Note

- In MENU mode, no input for 30 seconds will cancel the MENU mode.

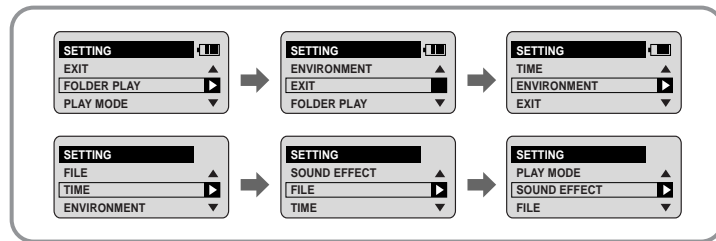
# Changing Modes

- 1 Press and hold the **MENU** button.

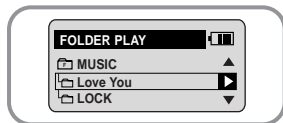

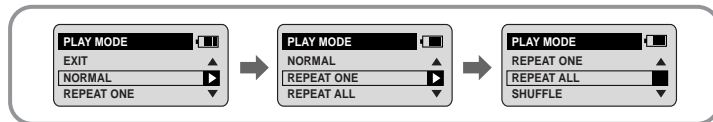

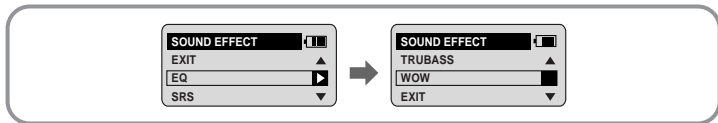


- NORMAL : To play all the tracks in order one time.
- REPEAT ONE : To repeat one track.
- REPEAT ALL : To repeat all tracks.
- SHUFFLE : To play tracks at random.
- EXIT : To move to the higher-level menu.

# Setting Sound Effects

1 Select **SOUND EFFECT** in **SETTING** menu.

2 In **SOUND EFFECT**, after moving to the desired sound mode with the **-**, **+** button, press the **▶||** button.



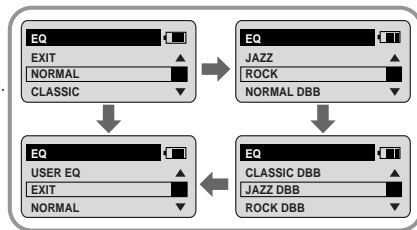
- SRS (⦿): You will hear 3D Stereo sound.
- TRUBASS (≡): This is a bass boost feature that adds fullness to the sound.
- WOW : This feature allows you to enjoy the SRS and Trubass features simultaneously.
- EXIT : To move to the higher-level menu

## Note

- Please adjust the volume to a suitable level, as the volume may increase in the SRS setting.
- This unit supports sampling frequencies of 32KHz, 44.1KHz or 48KHz.
- You can only set SRS functions in Music Mode.

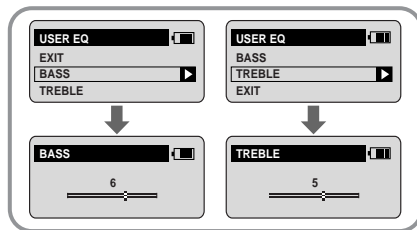
## EQ

1 Use the **-**, **+** buttons to move to the setting you want (out of the 4 settings available) and press the **▶||** button to select.



2 If you want to manually adjust the equalizer, select User EQ and Bass/Treble.

- BASS/TREBLE can each be adjusted from 0 to 10 with the **-**, **+** button.

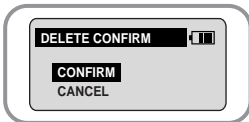
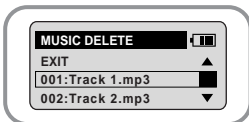




# Managing Files

## Deleting

  - The selected file is deleted.

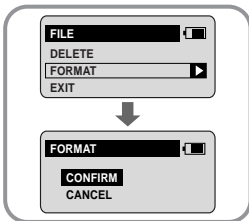


## Formatting

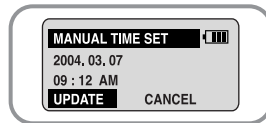

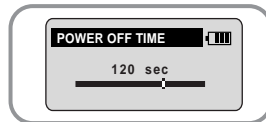
## WATCH TIME SET

- Use the **-**, **+** buttons to set the clock time manually.
- Select UPDATE to finish setting the time after setting manually.



## POWER OFF TIME

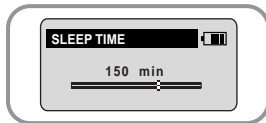
- Use the **-**, **+** buttons to set the POWER OFF TIME.
- The power off time can be set from 3 to 180 seconds. After stopping playback, the power is turned off automatically if no buttons have been pressed during the set time.
- When set to NO POWER OFF, the power does not turn off even when the device is stopped.



# Setting Times

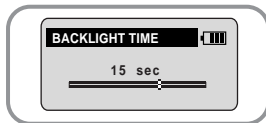
## SLEEP TIME

- Use the **-**, **+** buttons to set the SLEEP TIME.
- The sleep time can be set from 3 to 180 minutes.  
The power turns off automatically after the set time has passed.
- When set to NO SLEEP, the power does not turn off automatically.



## BACKLIGHT TIME

- Use the **-**, **+** buttons to set the Backlight "ON" time.
- The setting range for Backlight-On Time is 0 to 30 seconds.
- When set to Always On, the backlight stays on continuously.



### Note

- The backlight does not illuminate when the residual battery level is insufficient.

- It is possible to set the default volume to a value between 0 and 40. If the power is turned on again after having adjusted the volume above the default value, music is played at the default volume.
- If the power is turned on again after the volume was set to within the default value, the music is replayed at the previously played volume.



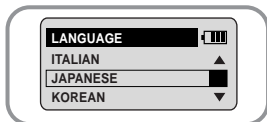

- Don't press too hard when placing your finger on the sensor.
- Don't move your finger during measurement.

## Setting the User

Before using the sports functions select the user.

- 1 Press the Sports Function Select button.
- 2 Select PROFILE in SPORTS FUNCTION.
- 3 Select a user ID registered on the PC or TRY IT and set the age, sex, height and weight of the user.
- 4 Select CREATE after the setting is complete.

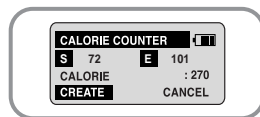
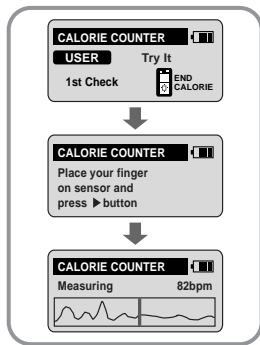

## Measuring Calories Consumed

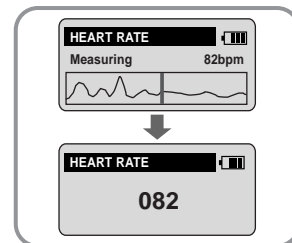
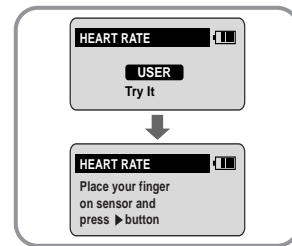
Measure your heart rate before and after exercise in order to find out the calories burned.

- 1 Before starting exercise, press the Sports Function Select  button.
- 2 Select CALORIE COUNTER in SPORTS FUNCTION.
  - Shows the selected user and whether or not measurement has started.
- 3 After placing your finger on the sensor on the top of the device, press the  button.
  - Measurement of heart rate starts.
  - When the heart rate measurement finishes, the heartrate that was measured is saved automatically and a "♥" indicator is shown in the display window.
- 4 Measure your heart rate one more time after finishing your exercise as in #2 and #3 above.
  - Shows the calories consumed by your exercise.
  - The calories are shown in kcal units.
- 5 If you want to save the data, select CREATE.
  - The measured data is saved.




## Measuring Heartrate

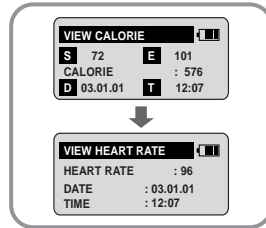
- 1 Press the Sports Function Select  button.
- 2 Press the  button in SPORTS FUNCTION and select HEART RATE MONITOR.
  - The selected user and whether a measurement has started will be shown.
- 3 After putting your finger on the sensor on the top of the device, press the  button.
  - Heart rate measurement starts.
  - When measurement is complete, the heart rate is shown on the screen.

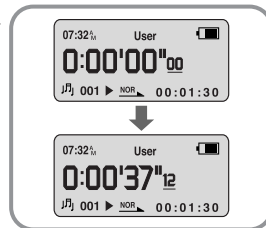
## Checking the Database

- 1 Press the Sports Function Select  button.
- 2 Select DATABASE in SPORTS FUNCTION.
- 3 To see the consumed calories measured, select VIEW CALORIES. To see the heart rate, select VIEW HEART RATE.
  - Shows the most recently measured data.








## STOP WATCH function

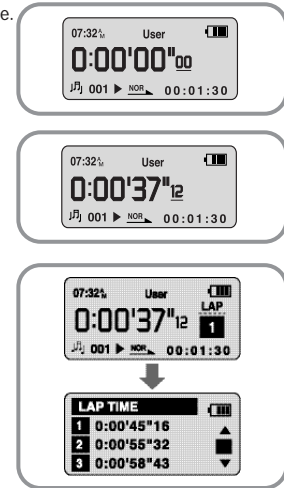
- 1 Press the Sports Function Select  button twice.
  - Shows the STOP WATCH.
- 2 Press the ENC/NAVI. button.
  - Time measurement starts.
- 3 Press the ENC/NAVI. button one more time.
  - The time measurement finishes.



## Measuring Lap Time

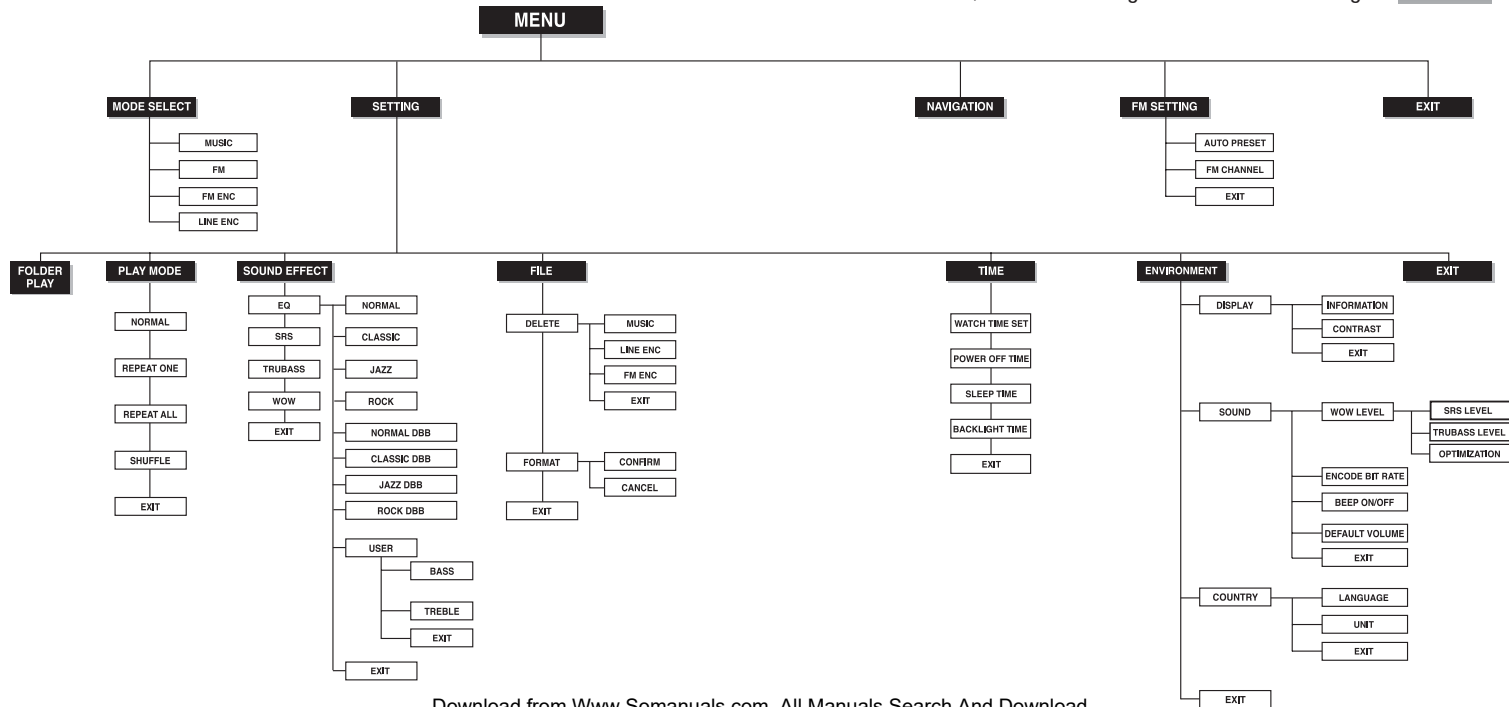
You can measure the user's interval time when exercising, such as when jogging or running a marathon.

- 1 Press the Sports Function Select  button twice.
  - Shows the STOP WATCH.
- 2 Press the ENC/NAVI. button.
  - Time measurement starts.
- 3 Press the  button during time measurement.
  - "LAP" is shown and the lap time is recorded every time the  button is pressed.
  - A maximum of **nine** lap times can be recorded.
  - Press the  button to record up to **nine** lap times and then press the  button to stop. The **nine** lap times and ending time are shown.

# Troubleshooting

## The software doesn't work

- Refer to the recommended PC specifications.

## The yepp does not work and the LCD displays nothing.

- Check the condition of the rechargeable battery.
- Press the RESET hole on the side of the main unit with a pin.
- **If a problem continues after you reset the main unit, try to use after formatting.**  
Since format is not supported in PC, make sure to format using the Format function in the menu of main unit.

## In PLAY mode, music is not played after pressing the ►|| button

- Verify that the device is currently set to Music mode.
- Check to see if MP3 or WMA files are saved in the built-in memory.
- Check to see if the HOLD switch is locked.
- Check if the REC button is on.

## Files cannot be downloaded.

- Check the condition of the rechargeable battery.
- Check the connection between yepp and computer.
- Check and/or replace the battery, turn on the yepp's power.

## Backlight does not work.

- Check the backlight setup.
- When the current and voltage of the rechargeable battery are low, the backlight automatically stays off in order to play longer.

## The buttons do not work.

- Check the Hold switch setting.
- **Press the RESET hole on the side of main unit with pin smaller than the hole.**

## The yepp keeps turning off.

- In Stop mode, the power is automatically turned off after ten seconds (changes depending on settings).
- Check to see if there are files saved in it.

## Something is wrong with the play time displayed during Play mode.

- The "VBR SONG" message is displayed while VBR (Variable Bit Rate) files are playing.

## LCD window is dark

- Check Contrast.

## Strange characters are displayed on the screen during playback.

- **Change the language setting in the menu.**

## External case of yepp gets dirty.

- **Wipe out with eraser or wet towel after squeezing out moisture.**
