## Key Functions

1. Speaker: The speaker allows you to hear the other caller and the different ring tones and sounds offered by your phone.
2. Signal Strength Indicator: This icon represents the signal strength by displaying bars. The more bars displayed, the better the signal strength.
3. Display Screen: The display screen displays all the information needed to operate your phone. The screen is divided into three areas; the top line contains stationary icons, a graphic area in the middle, and a bottom line displaying a banner along with the time and date.
4. Rotating Flip: The flip rotates to the right and can be folded down placing it on top in a closed and working position.
5. Lens Rotate: The digital camera lens can be positioned up or down using the thumb wheel adjustment.
6. Digital Camera Lens: This is the integrated digital camera lens.
7. OK/Message Key: This key can be used in several different ways. Pressed once to automatically launch Messaging. Press for two or more seconds to automatically dial your voicemail. Pressing ow when navigating through a menu accepts the highlighted choice in the menu.
8. One Touch Camera Key: Allows you to access the integrated digital camera with the press of a button. When pressed, the camera menu is automatically displayed.
9. Headset Jack: (located in the upper left side of the phone.) Allows you to plug in an optional headset for safe and convenient handsfree conversations.
10. Navigation Key: This key allows you to scroll through the phone menu options, and provides a shortcut to phone functions from Standby Mode.
11. Volume Keys: Allows you to adjust the ringer volume in standby mode (with the flip open) or adjust the voice volume during a call. The volume keys can also be used to scroll up or down to navigate through the different menu options. To mute the ringer during an incoming call, press the Volume Key up or down. Press and hold to reject and forward an incoming call to voicemail.
12. SEND: This key can be used in several different ways. Press once to answer an incoming call. Enter a number and press once to place a call. Press once in standby mode to access the Outgoing call log. Press twice in standby by mode to re-dial the last outgoing number. Press and hold to initiate the Voice Recognition feature.
13. Numeric Keypad: Use these keys to enter numbers, letters, and characters.
14. Shift/Asterisk: Enters the asterisk [*] character for calling features. In text entry mode, press to change the character input type. Press to change letter case when writing a message. Press to enter a decimal when using the calculator. Press and hold in idle state to activate silent mode.
15. Power Interface Connector: The power interface connector is used to plug in the charging accessories.
16. Accessory Interface Connector: This connector is used to connect any available accessory cables to your phone.
17. Microphone: The Microphone allows the other caller to hear you clearly when you are speaking to them. The microphone is also used in recording.
18. Space/Pound: Enters the pound [\#] character for calling features. In text entry mode, press to enter a space.
19. BACK: Deletes characters from the display. When in a menu, press to return to the previous menu. This key also allows you to return to the previous screen in the Mobile Web browser.
20. END: This key can be used in several different ways. Press and hold to turn your phone On or Off. Press once during a call to hang-up. Press once during an incoming call to reject and forward the incoming call directly to voicemail. When in the menu, press once to return to standby mode.
21. Side Camera Button: This button is also used to launch the integrated digital camera. Press button once in camera mode to take pictures. Press again to return to camera mode after a picture is taken. In standby mode, press and hold to activate the camera menu.
22. Do More Key: This button is used to launch the Do More menu which allows you to download web based content.
23. MENU Key: Displays the first level or Main Menu of options. Press menv again to view the next menu page. When writing a message, press once to display options for entering symbols, numbers, etc.
24. Ringer/Vibrate Indicator: This icon indicates that a ring tone or vibrate is selected as the ringer.
25. Battery Indicator: The battery indicator displays the amount of remaining battery charge currently available in your phone. When all bars are displayed in the battery icon, the phone's battery is fully charged. When they are not displayed, the phone's battery is completely discharged or empty.
26. 1X Indicator: Technology that allows faster data rates, always-on data service, and improved voice network capacity.

## Viewing the Display Screen

This list identifies the symbols you'll see on your display screen.

- means your phone cannot find a signal.
tells you a call is in progress.
sindicates you have a text, numeric page, or Web Alert messages waiting. Press briefly to see a list of pending messages.

indicates that you have a Picture MSG waiting. If there is an Picture MSG and a Text message waiting, the Picture MSG icon is displayed.
indicates you have a voicemail message. Press and hold on to dial voicemail.
sindicates that 3 G functionality is active.
indicates that 3 functionality is dormant or inactive.
indicates that you are receiving information.
indicates that you are sending information.
indicates your phone is in vibrate mode.
shows your current battery charge strength. (Icon shown fully charged.) If the battery is discharged, there are no bars displayed and the battery icon flashes.

>indicates that your phone is roaming.
indicates that your phone is in security mode.

sindicates that your phone is operating in analog service.
indicates that your phone is operating in digital service.
sindicates that your phone is in 1 X service.
-indicates that your phone is in Airplane Mode. All TX and RX transmissions are turned Off.

d indicates that the ringer is set at a level between 1-8 or 1-Beep is selected.

- Indicates that the ringer is turned Off.

Tip: Display indicators let you know when you're off the network.

## Turning Your Phone ON and OFF

## Turning Your Phone ON

- Press $50^{\circ}$ for approximately two seconds to turn your phone On. Once your phone is ON, it displays "Looking for Service" which indicates that your phone is searching for a signal. When your phone finds a signal, it automatically enters standby mode - the phone's idle state. At this point, you are ready to begin making and receiving calls.
If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. When a signal is found, your phone automatically returns to standby mode.
In Power Save mode, your phone searches for a signal periodically without your intervention. You can also initiate a search for service by pressing any key (when your phone is turned ON ).

Tip: The Power Save feature helps to conserve your battery power when you are in an area where there is no signal.

## Turning Your Phone OFF

Pressfor two seconds until you see the powering down animation on the display screen.

Your screen remains blank while your phone is off (unless the battery is charging).

## Using the Battery

## Battery Capacity

Your phone is equipped with a standard Lithium Ion (Lilon) battery. It allows you to recharge your battery before it is fully drained. The standard battery provides approximately 3 hours of continuous digital talk time ( 1.5 hours in analog) or approximately 216 hours of continuous digital standby time (15 hours in analog).
The extended battery provides approximately 4 hours of continuous digital talk time (2 hours in analog) or approximately 288 hours of continuous digital standby time (20 hours in analog).
When the battery reaches $5 \%$ of its capacity, the battery icon blinks. When there are approximately two minutes of talk time left, the phone sounds an audible alert and then powers down.

Note: Long backlight settings, searching for service, vibrate mode, camera usage and browser use affect the battery's talk and standby times.

Tip: Be sure to watch your phone's battery level indicator and charge the battery before it runs out of power.

## Installing the Battery

Your phone comes with a Lilon battery. Follow these steps to install it:

1. Insert the battery into the opening on the back of the phone, making sure the plastic tab on the back is inserted into the matching slot in the phone.
2. Press up until the latch snaps into place.


## Removing the Battery

To remove your battery, follow these easy steps:

1. So that no stored messages or numbers are lost, power off your phone by pressing and holding the

2. Push the battery release latch down completely. The battery will separate slightly from the phone.
3. Slide the battery down and remove.


## Charging the Battery

Your phone comes with a rechargeable battery. You should charge the battery as soon as possible so you can begin using your phone.
Keeping track of your battery's charge is important. If your battery level becomes too low, your phone automatically turns off. For a quick check of your phone's battery level, glance at the battery charge indicator located in the upper-right corner of your phone's display screen. If the battery charge is getting too low, the battery icon ( ) blinks and the phone sounds a warning tone. Always use a Samsung approved desktop charger, travel charger, or vehicle power adapter to charge your battery.

Warning! Using the wrong battery charger could cause damage to your phone and void the warranty.

## Using the Desktop Charger

To use the desktop charger provided with your phone:

1. Plug the outlet from the desktop charger in the wall. Place your phone into the desktop charger, making sure that it fits securely. If properly connected, you should see the charging lights.

- A red light on the desktop charger and an animated battery icon on the phone indicates that the battery is charging.
- A green light on the desktop charger indicates that the battery is at least 90 percent charged.
- A orange light on the desktop charger indicates that there is a problem charging the phone.

It takes approximately 4 hours to fully recharge a completely rundown standard battery. With the Samsung approved Lilon battery, you can recharge the battery before it becomes completely run down.
If a Travel Charger is used to charge the battery, multi-colored lights are displayed when the flip is closed. Red, green, and blue lights are cycled during the charging process. When the flip is open, an animated battery icon is displayed on the screen. When the battery is completely charged, all lights are displayed continuously, or if the flip is open, the battery animation is stopped and the battery icon is displayed with all full bars.

## Displaying Your Phone Number

Just in case you forget your phone number, your phone can remind you.
To display your phone number:

1. Press verv for Main Menu.
2. Press 2 mor for Phe Book.
3. Press fata for My Phone \#.

## Making and Answering Calls

## Making Calls

Your phone offers many different ways to make calls, including downloading games and ringers (page 112), Speed Dialing (page 14) and using Call History (page 51).
To make a call using your keypad:

1. Make sure your phone is on.
2. Enter a phone number. If you make a mistake while dialing, press (max) to erase one digit at a time. Or, press and hold (max) to erase the entire number.
3. Press semo
4. When you're finished, close the flip or press

Tip: To redial your last outgoing call, press seno twice.

## Answering Calls

1. Make sure your phone is on. (If your phone is off, incoming calls go to voicemail).
2. Press (semo to answer an incoming call. (Depending on your phone's settings, you may also answer incoming calls by opening the phone or by pressing any digit.)
Your phone notifies you of incoming calls in the following ways:

- The phone rings or vibrates.
- The LED flashes.
- The backlight illuminates.

The screen displays an incoming call message.

- If available, the phone number of the caller is displayed.
- If the phone number is in your Internal Phone Book, the Phone Book entry's name is displayed.

The following option is also displayed．To select an option，press the corresponding softkey button．
－＊avio to mute the ringer．
Press and hold the volume key to send directly to voicemail．

## Ending a Call

To disconnect a call when you are finished：
－Close the phone or press

## Missed Call Notification

When an incoming call is not answered，the Missed Call Info is displayed on your screen．Press semo to return the call．
To place a call from the Missed Call log：
1．Highlight the entry and press（x⿴囗十介贝）．
2．Press setor to dial the phone number．

## Calling Emergency Numbers

Your can place calls to 911 （enter（1－）（t－）and press（semo），even if your phone is locked or your account is restricted．

## Using One／Two／Three Touch Speed Dialing

With this feature，you can automatically call Speed Dial entries using one key press for locations 1－9，two key presses for locations 10－99，or three key presses for locations 100－300．
To use One－Touch Dialing for Speed Dial locations 1－9：
－Press and hold the appropriate key for a few seconds．The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows＂Calling＂．

To use Two－Touch Dialing for Speed Dial locations 10－99：
1．Press the first digit．
2．Press and hold the second digit for a few seconds．The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows＂Calling＂．
To use Three－Touch Dialing for Speed Dial locations 100－300：
1．Press the first digit．
2．Press the second digit．
3. Press and hold the third digit for a few seconds. The display confirms that the number has been dialed when it shows "Calling".

> Note: Your phone also supports 1-4 digit dialing. If you enter a number using the keypad without holding the last number and then press sero, your phone will dial those digits. (For example, if you enter [2*) (1-) and press semo , it dials 211, not the number stored in memory location 211.

## Dialing Options

Dialing options are displayed when you enter numbers using the keypad. To select an option press nemu and the number on the keypad that corresponds with the desired choice.

[^0](1) Send is used to dial the phone number. (If you are roaming and have the Call Guard feature activated, you must then press
(2) Save to save the phone number in your Internal Phone Book. See "Finding Internal Phone Book Entries" on page 58.
(3) Find is used to locate and display Internal Phone Book entries that contain the numbers entered. See "Finding Internal Phone Book Entries" on page 58.
(4) Hard Pause is used to insert a hard pause.
(5) 2 Second Pause to insert a 2 -second pause.

## In-Call Options

During a call, your phone displays menu options in addition to the main menu.
To select an option, highlight it and press ox
(1) Mute or UnMute: Select Mute to mute your phone's microphone. Select Unmute to reactivate the microphone. (For more information, see "Silence Mode" on page 25.)
(2) Call History: checks your call log for missed, outgoing, and incoming calls. You can also erase the logs from this menu. (For more information, see "Call History Options" on page 51.)
(3) Phone Book: accesses the Phone Book menu options. (For more information, see "Internal Phone Book Entry Options" on page 55.)

- (4) 3-Way Call: allows you to talk to two different people at the same time. (For more information, see "Making a Three-Way Call" on page 94.)
(5) Messaging: allows you to check for voicemail and notifications. (For more information, see "Messaging" on page 99.)
(6) Voice Memo: allows you to record the current conversation. (For more information, see "Recording Memos" on page 78.)
(7) Utilities: accesses the utilities menu options. (For more information, see "Personal Organizer" on page 63.)
(8) Phone Info: displays the hardware/software version, Username, and PRL being used. (For more information, see "Controlling Your Phone's Settings" on page 19.)


## End-of-Call Options

After receiving a call from or making a call to a phone number that is not in your Internal Phone Book, the phone number, the duration of the call and the following menu options are displayed for 10 seconds. During this time you can press owe to add this number to your internal phone book. (See "Saving a Phone Number" on page 16.)

Note: The End-of-Call options are not displayed for calls identified as Unknown, No ID, or Restricted. (page 94).

## Saving a Phone Number

Your phone can store up to six phone numbers in each entry for a total of 300 Internal Phone Book numbers. Each entry's name can contain 20 characters. Your phone automatically sorts the Internal Phone Book entries alphabetically.

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To save a number from standby mode:

1. Enter a phone number.
2. Press ow(0) for Save.
3. Press ow to Add New Entry.
4. Select a label and press \% < a .
5. Enter a name for the new entry and press .
6. Press ow to Save.

## Finding a Phone Number

You can search Internal Phone Book entries for phone numbers that contain a specific string of numbers.
To find a phone number:

1. Enter one to three numbers of the last four digits of a phone number and press nerv.
2. Press (4.e] for Find.

Note: If you enter a number larger than 300, press for Find.
3. A list of possible matches is displayed. Select the desired entry and press or(i).
4. To dial the number, press

## Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses

You can dial or save phone numbers with pauses for use with automated systems, such as voicemail or credit card billing numbers. If you select a hard pause, the next set of numbers are sent when you press seroo. If you select a 2 -second pause, your phone automatically sends the next set of numbers after two seconds.

Note: You can have multiple pauses in a phone number and combine
2-second and hard pauses.
To dial or save phone numbers with pauses:

1. Enter the phone number.
2. Press mew and select Hard pause or 2-sec pause. Hard pauses are displayed as a "P" and 2-second pauses as a "T".
3. Enter additional numbers.
4. Press Seno to dial the number or Press mew f2ne for Save to save the number in your Internal Phone Book.
When dialing a number with a hard pause, select Send to send the next set of numbers.

## Dialing From the Internal Phone Book

To dial directly from an Internal Phone Book entry:

1. Press the navigation key left to display your Internal Phone Book.
2. Scroll left or right to search by Name, Entry, or Group.
3. Highlight the desired option and press the navigation key down.
4. Enter the first few letters or the entry number to locate the desired entry.
or
Enter the entry number using the keypad.
or
Press the navigation key left or right to select the desired group.
5. Scroll to highlight the name and press seno to make the call.

## Display Settings

## Changing the Banner

The text banner can be up to 14 characters and is displayed on your phone's screen in standby mode. You may choose to display a custom banner or display your User Name on the phone's screen.
To display or change your custom banner:

1. Press for Main Menu.
2. Press 0 for Setup.
3. Press (1-) for Display.
4. Press (tan for Banner.
5. Press and hold tome toar the existing banner.
6. Use the numeric keypad to enter a new custom banner.
7. Press tow save and exit.

## Changing the Backlight Time Length

The backlight setting lets you select how long the display screen and keypad are illuminated after any key press is made.

1. To changePress new for Main Menu.
2. Press 8 mor Setup.
3. Press $t-$ for Display.
4. Press for (5x) Backlight.
5. Press (1-) for LCD, 2me $^{2 w}$ for Keypad, $3^{3^{* 0}}$ for Pwr Save Mode.
6. Use the navigation key to select Flip Open, $\mathbf{3 0}$ seconds, 15 seconds, 8 seconds, for the LCD, Flip Open, 30 seconds, 15 seconds, $\mathbf{8}$ seconds, Off for keypad, or On/Off for Power save mode.
7. Press to Select.

Note: Long backlight settings affect the battery's talk and standby times.

## Changing the Wall Paper

Your new phone offers options for what you see on the display screen while powering on or off and when in standby mode.
To change the wall paper images:

1. Press for Main Menu.
2. Press for Setup.
3. Press for Display.
4. Press for Wall Papers.
5. Press for Local Image, for Downloads, or for Picture Album.
6. Press the navigation key left or right to display Flower, World Time, Calendar, Launch Pad, or Digital Clock in local image mode.
7. Press to Select.

4. Press (1-7) for Ringer Volume or [50] for Key Beep.

Tip: You can adjust the ringer volume in Standby mode or the earpiece volume during a call by using the volume keys on the side of your phone.

## Ringer Types

Ringer types help you identify incoming calls and messages. You can assign ringer types to individual phone book entries, types of calls, and types of messages.

- Ring Tones include a variety of standard ringer types.

Melodies includes a variety of standard musical melodies.
Downloaded are ringers that have been downloaded right to your phone.(See "Downloading Images" on page 114 and "Ringers" on page 112.)

- Vibrate alerts you to calls or messages without disturbing others. To select vibrate mode, press the volume key down while your phone is in idle mode until Vibrate is selected.


## Selecting Ringer Types for Voice Calls

Your phone provides a variety of ringer options which allow you to customize your ring and volume settings.
To select a ringer type for voice calls so you recognize when a certain type of call is coming in by the ringer:

1. Press $\stackrel{m}{ }$ for Main Menu.
2. Press ${ }^{8 \mathrm{~mm}}$ for Setup.
3. Press $\sqrt{2 m}$ for Sounds.
4. Press ${ }^{2 w e}$ for Ringer Type.

6. Press (1-- for With Caller ID or $2 \times 0$ for No Caller ID.
7. Press the navigation key left or right to select Ring Tones, Melodies, or Downloaded Ringers.
8. Press the navigation key down and then left or right to select the desired Ringer.
9. Press ow to Save to exit.

5. Press $2 m$ for Messages.
6. Press (1-) for Voicemail/Text or ${ }^{2 w e}$ for Web/Pic MSG.
7. Press the navigation key left or right to select Ring Tones, Melodies, or Downloaded ringers.
8. Press the navigation key down and then left or right to select the desired Ringer.
9. Press owid to Save.

## Selecting Ringer Types for Schedule

To select a ringer type for schedules:

1. Press ${ }^{n e w}$ for Main Menu.
2. Press ${ }^{8 m}$ for Setup.
3. Press $2 m$ for Sounds.

6. Press the navigation key left or right to select Ring Tones, Melodies, or Downloaded ringers.
7. Press the navigation key down and then left or right to select the desired Ringer.
8. Press owid to Save.

## Selecting a Key Tone

Your phone offers a number of options for selecting the audible tones accompanying a key press. Longer tone lengths may be better for tone recognition when dialing voicemail or other automated systems, or you may choose from other more entertaining options.
To select a key tone:

To enable or disable alert sounds:

6. Select On or Off using the navigation key and press ork to Select.

## Silence Mode

There may be times when you need to silence your phone entirely. The phone's Silence All option allows you to mute all sounds without turning your phone off.
To activate Silence Mode:
$\square$ Press and hold the volume key down in standby mode. (The screen will display "Ringer Off.")

- Press and hold to activate silent mode.

To deactivate Silence Mode:

- Press the volume key up and select a desired volume level.


## Airplane Mode

When your phone is in Airplane Mode, it cannot send or receive any calls or access online information. You may still use the phone's other features, such as Games, Notepad, Voice Memos, etc., while you are in Airplane Mode.
To set your phone to Airplane Mode:

1. Press New for Main Menu.
2. Press ${ }^{\text {Bmo }}$ for Setup.
3. Press for Airplane Mode.
4. Press (ow to to continue.
5. Press the navigation key up or down to select $\mathbf{O n}$ or $\mathbf{O f f}$ and press or (10).
While in Airplane Mode, your phone's standby screen will display "Phone off." The phone will power cycle when you change from Airplane mode "On" to Airplane mode "Off". Turning the phone off and on again will reset the phone to airplane mode "off".

Note: 911 and emergency calls can not be made in Airplane mode "on"

## Understanding Roaming

## Roaming on Other Digital Networks

When you are roaming, your phone will display the Roaming icon $\mathbf{R}$. When the roaming icon is displayed, you are outside of your home network and you will be charged a higher per minute rate for calls.

## Roaming on Analog Networks

When you roam on analog networks, you will experience a similar quality provided by other analog carriers today. Although some features, such as Mobile Web services and Voice Command, will be unavailable, you can still make and receive calls and access voicemail. You will experience a few differences:

- You are more likely to experience static, cross-talk, fade-out, and dropped calls.
- Some features which are standard on the network, such as call waiting, web services, and direct international dialing, are unavailable.
- Though callers can leave voicemail messages while you are roaming, you will not receive notification until you return to the network. While roaming, you can periodically check your voicemail for new messages by dialing 1 +area code+your Phone Number.
- There are security and privacy risks (eavesdropping and cloning) that exist with conventional analog services today.
- Your battery needs recharging sooner when you use your phone for analog roaming.


## Setting Your Phone's NAM and Mode

Your phone allows you to control your ability to roam. By using the Roaming menu option, you can determine which signals your phone accepts.

## Set NAM

This setting allows you to associate your mobile identification number (MIN) to your phone's electronic serial number (ESN).

1. Press nemu for Main Menu.
2. Press $\sqrt{8 \mathrm{mv}}$ for Setup.
3. Press $\sqrt{8 \mathrm{mv}}$ for Others.
4. Press 5 mm for Roaming.
5. Press $\stackrel{1--}{ }$ for Set NAM.
6. Press the navigation key up or down to select NAM 1 or NAM 2.
7. Press ow to Select.

## Set Mode

Choose from three different settings on your phone to control your roaming experience:

## Viewing History

You'll find the Call History feature very helpful. It is a list of the last 20 phone numbers (or Internal Phone Book entries) for calls you placed, accepted, or missed. Call History makes redialing a number fast and easy. It is continually updated as new numbers are added to the beginning of the list and the oldest entries are removed from the bottom of the list.
Each entry contains the phone number (if it is available) and Internal Phone Book entry name (if the phone number is in your Internal Phone Book).
Duplicate calls (same number and type of call) may only appear once on the list.
To view a Call History entry:

1. Press $\stackrel{\text { Nemver }}{ }$ for Main Menu.
2. Press ${ }^{1 .-}$ for Call History.

- Press $\sqrt{1--)}$ for Outgoing Calls
- Press 2 ned for Incoming Calls
- Press $\sqrt[3^{\text {aº }}]{ }$ for Missed Calls

## Making a Call From Call History

To place a call from Call History:

## Internal Phone Book Entry Options

When you display an Internal Phone Book entry, the following options are displayed when you press $\qquad$
Send to dial the phone number.

- Edit allows you to modify or add information to the entry.
- Prepend allows you to add a series of numbers before the phone number is dialed.
- Erase allows you to permanently delete the entry.

To select an option, highlight it and press or or press the corresponding number on the keypad.

Tip: You can view the next entry by pressing the navigation key right or view the previous entry by pressing the navigation key left.

## Entering Text

## Selecting a Character Input Mode

Your phone provides convenient ways to enter words, letters, punctuation, and numbers whenever you are prompted to enter text (for example, when adding an Internal Phone Book entry).
To change the character input mode:

1. Before you start entering text, press
2. To select a character input mode, highlight it and press (owiv.

- T9 (English) to enter characters using T9 Text Input (see page 56).
- Alpha to enter characters by tapping the keypad (see page 56).
- Symbol to enter symbols (see page 57).
- Number to enter numbers (see page 57).

The Shortcut option is displayed when you are creating an email or entering a URL. The following options are available:

## Entering Characters Using T9 Text Input

T9 Text Input lets you enter text in your phone by pressing keys just once per letter. (To select the T9 Word mode when entering text, see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 55.)
T9 Text Input analyzes the letters you enter using an intuitive word database and creates a suitable word. (The word may change as you type.) If the word you want does not display after you have entered all the letters, press to scroll through additional word selections. To accept a word and insert a space, press \#"
If you make a mistake, press to erase a single character. Press and hold [mex to delete an entire entry.

## Entering Characters by Tapping the Keypad

To enter characters by tapping the keypad, select the Alpha mode (see "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 55). Press the corresponding key until the desired character appears. By default, the first letter of a word is capitalized and following letters are lowercase.
Characters scroll in the following order:

(5m JKL5jkI
(6) MNO6mno
(7) PQRS7pqrs
[8w TUV8tuv
WXYZ9wxyz
0 m 0
Space
Shift
After a character is entered, the cursor automatically advances to the next space after two seconds or when you enter a character not on the same key.

Note: If you press and hold a numeric key for a few seconds, it will automatically display the number.

## Entering Numbers and Symbols

- To enter numbers, select the Number mode and press the appropriate key. (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 55).
- To enter symbols, select the Symbols mode. (See "Selecting a Character Input Mode" on page 55.) To enter a symbol, press the appropriate key indicated on the display.


## Adding a New Internal Phone Book Entry

Your phone can store up to 300 Internal Phone Book numbers or email addresses. Phone book entries can store up to a total of six phone numbers and the entry's name can contain 20 characters.
To add a new entry:

1. Press venu for Main Menu.
2. Press ${ }^{2 w o w}$ for Phone Book.
3. Press $2 w$ for Add New Entry.
4. Enter a new phone number and press

5. Select the Type using the navigation key.
6. Enter the name using the keypad and press ond .
7. Press neme to Save.

## Finding Internal Phone Book Entries

There are several ways to display your Internal Phone Book entries. Follow the steps outlined in the sections below to display entries from the Internal Phone Book menu.

## Finding Names

You can review all the entries stored in your Internal Phone Book or find an entry quickly by following these simple steps:

1. Press verv for Main Menu.
2. Press $[2 \mathrm{~mol}$ for Phone Book.
3. Press (t-7) for Find.
4. Press the navigation key left or right to search by Name, Entry, or Group.
5. Once the desired option is highlighted, press the navigation key down.
6. Enter the first few letters or entry \# to locate the desired entry.
7. Scroll to highlight the name and press semo to make the call.

Shortcut: From standby mode, press the navigation key left to display the Find feature.

## Finding Speed Dial Numbers

To find phone numbers you have stored in speed dial locations:

1. Press verw for Main Menu.
2. Press $[2 \mathrm{mec}$ for Phone Book.
3. Press (t-7) for Find.
4. Press the navigation key to the right until By Entry is highlighted.
5. Enter the entry or speed dial location number.

## Finding Group Entries

To find entries designated as part of a group:

1. Press nemu for Main Menu.
2. Press $[2 \mathrm{mec}$ for Phone Book.
3. Press (i- for Find.
4. Press the navigation key to the right until By Group is highlighted.
5. Press the navigation key down once to highlight the group
selection. Press the navigation key left or right to select the desired group. (If you do not have any groups associated with your phone book entries, see "Changing the Group Name" on page 62 to change the group names. If no group is selected, the entry is automatically set to No Group.)

## Adding a Phone Number to an Internal Phone Book Entry

To add a phone number to an entry:

1. Press verv for Main Menu.
2. Press 2me for Phone Book. $^{2}$
3. Press (1-7) for Find.
4. Select the desired entry and press
5. Press Nem $2 m$ to Edit the entry.
6. Press the navigation key down until the desired label is selected and press to edit.
7. Enter the phone number using the keypad and press $\qquad$
8. Press verv to Save.
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## Editing an Internal Phone Book Entry's

## Phone Number

To edit an entry's phone number:

1. Press $\stackrel{\text { Nem }}{ }$ for Main Menu.
2. Press ${ }^{2 m m}$ for Phone Book.
3. Press (1-) for Find.
4. Select the desired entry and press orvo.
5. Press vemu 2 mex to Edit the entry.
6. Press the navigation key down until the desired phone number is selected and press oriv to edit.
7. Press and hold to erase the entire number or press once to erase just the last number.
8. Enter the new number using the keypad and press oriv.
9. Press verve to Save.

## Selecting a Ringer Type for an Entry

You can assign a ringer type to an Internal Phone Book entry so you can identify the caller by the ringer type. (See "Ringer Types" on page 22.)
To select a ringer type for an entry:

1. Press Nem for Main Menu.
2. Press $2 m$ for Phone Book.
3. Press (1-) for Find.
4. Select the desired entry and press (oriv.
5. Press Nenv to edit the entry.
6. Press the navigation key down until Name Ringer is selected and press (ovil) to Edit.
7. Press the navigation key to the right and highlight the desired Ringer Category (Default, Ringtones, Melodies, or Downloaded.)
8. Press the navigation key down.

9．Press the navigation key to the left or right to highlight and listen to the desired Ringer and press（ब⿴囗大巾）．
10．Press

## Secret Internal Phone Book Entries

You can hide an entry＇s phone number（s）and require your lock code to edit the entry by making it secret．The entry name is still displayed，but the entry＇s phone numbers are replaced by＂（SECRET）＂．
To make an entry secret：
1．Press Nem for Main Menu．
2．Press ${ }^{2 m o d}$ for Phone Book．
3．Press（i－7）for Find．
4．Select the desired entry and press oriv．
5．Press Nemver to edit the entry．
6．Press the navigation key down until Secret is selected．
7．Press the navigation key left or right until $\mathbf{O n}$ is displayed in the Secret field and press nem to Save．
To make an entry public：
1．Display an Internal Phone Book entry．
2．Press Nemu to edit the entry．
3．Enter your lock code．
4．Press the navigation key down until Secret is selected．
5．Press the navigation key left or right until Off is displayed in the Secret field and press verve to Save．

## Changing the Group Name

You can associate a preset group name to your entries to help you sort them easier in the phone book. The preset group names already programmed into your phone are:

- Family
- Friends
- Colleague
- VIPs
- No Group

To associate an existing number located in your phone book:

1. Press verv for Main Menu.
2. Press 2 for Phone Book.
3. Press (1-7) for Find.
4. Select the desired entry and press or(0).
5. Press Nemy to edit the entry.
6. Press the navigation key down until the Group is selected.
7. Press the navigation key left or right until the desired group name is displayed.
8. Press verve to Save.

To associate a new number:

1. Follow the steps for entering a Adding a New Internal Phone Book Entry.
2. Before saving, press the navigation key down until Group is selected.
3. Press the navigation key left or right until the desired group name is displayed.
4. Press verv to Save.

## Adding an Event to the Scheduler

Your Scheduler helps organize your time and reminds you of important events.
To add an event:

1. Press nemu for Main Menu.
2. Press for Utilities.
3. Press (1--) for Schedule.
4. Press new 2 for Add New.
5. Enter the event description using the keypad and press ork.
6. Enter the Start Time and Date using the keypad. Press for AM and (7omer for
7. Enter the End Time and Date using the keypad.
8. Press the Navigation key left or right and select one of the following:

- No Alarm
- On Time
- 10min before
- 30min before
- 1 Hr before

9. Press to ox Save.

## Event Alerts

There are several ways your phone alerts you of scheduled events:

- By playing the assigned ringer type.
- By illuminating the backlight.

By flashing the LED.
To select the ringer:

1. Press $n$ nem for Main Menu.
2. Press $8^{\text {miv }}$ for Setup.
3. Press $\sqrt{2 m 0}$ for Sounds.
4. Press ${ }^{2 m 0}$ for Ringer Type.
5. Press for Schedule.
6. Press the navigation key left or right to select the desired ringer category.
7. Press the navigation key down and then left or right to select the desired ringer or melody.
8. Press to Save.

## Viewing Events

To view your scheduled events:

1. Press Nem for Main Menu.
2. Press 7 fom Utilities.
3. Press (1-) for Schedule.
4. Select desired date and a list of the events scheduled for the day are displayed.

## Erasing a Day's Events

To erase a scheduled day's events:

1. Press vem for Main Menu.
2. Press 7 Tom Utilities.
3. Press (1-) for Schedule.
4. Select desired date and a list of the events scheduled for the day are displayed.
5. Highlight the desired event and press nem $2 m 0$ to Erase.
6. Highlight Yes using the navigation key and press ow(10) to confirm.

## Going to Today’s Scheduler Menu

If you are viewing the Scheduler menu and wish to go to the Scheduler menu for today's date:

1. From the Scheduler menu, highlight the current date and press vemu (1-).

## Purging Events

To delete events scheduled before a specific time and date:

1. Press nemu for Main Menu.
2. Press (7omer Utilities.
3. Press ${ }_{1-1}^{1-7}$ for Schedule.
4. Highlight the desired day of the event being deleted and press oxiv.
5. Press the navigation key up or down to select the desired event.
6. Press Nenv to Erase the event.
7. Highlight Yes with the navigation key and press to confirm.

## Purging All Events

To delete all scheduled events:

1. Press nenu for Main Menu.
2. Press ${ }^{700}$ for Utilities.
3. Press ${ }^{1--}$ for Schedule.
4. Highlight the desired day of the event being deleted and press oxie.
5. Press nerv $3^{\text {mio }}$ to Erase All events.
6. Highlight Yes with the navigation key and press ook to confirm.

## Using the Alarm Clock

Your phone comes with a built-in alarm clock with multiple alarm capabilities.
To use this feature, follow these easy steps:

1. Press nem for Main Menu.
2. Press for Utilities.

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3. Press ${ }^{2 n c}$ for Alarm Clock.

5. Press the navigation key left or right and select $\mathbf{O n}$.
6. Press the navigation key down once and enter the alarm time.
7. Press the navigation key down once to select the desired ringer. Cycle through the ringers by pressing the navigation key left or right.
8. Press the navigation key down once to select the alarm frequency. Press the navigation key left or right and select one of the following options:

- Daily
- Once
- Mon to Fri
- Sat \& Sun

9. Press owio to Save.

## Using the Note Pad

Your phone comes with a note pad you can use to compose and store reminders and notes to help keep you organized.

## To compose a note:

1. Press Nem for Main Menu.
2. Press timu for Utilities.
3. Press for Note Pad.
4. If there are no existing notes, the phone displays "No Note Entered" and a New Note screen is automatically displayed. If there is a note already saved, press (1-~er) for Add New.
5. Enter up to 64 characters in the memo and press to Save.

## To read a saved note:

1. Press Nem for Main Menu.

2．Press ${ }^{7 \pi m}$ for Utilities．
3．Press for Note Pad．
4．Highlight the desired note using the navigation key and press（x⿴囗十介） to view．

## To erase saved notes：

1．Press ${ }^{N} \mathrm{New}$ for Main Menu．
2．Press ${ }^{7 \mathrm{Tmam}}$ for Utilities．
3．Press ${ }^{3^{(0)}}$ for Note Pad．
4．Highlight the desired note using the navigation key and press ［2me for Erase．
5．Select Yes and press orive to confirm the deletion．

## Using the Calculator

Your phone comes with a built－in calculator function．To use this feature， follow these easy steps：

1．Press Nem for Main Menu．
2．Press timer Utilities．
3．Press（tam for Calculator．
4．Enter a number with the keypad．（Press＊－an to insert a decimal point and／or to make the number negative or positive．）
5．Press the navigation key：
－Left－Subtract
－Right－Multiply
－Up－Add
－Down－Divide
－Ena－Decimal
－－To change the $\%+$ sign．
6．Enter the next number using the keypad．

Note: For more complex equations, enter all the numbers and mathematical signs before pressing OK.
7. Press ox to view the results.

## World Clock

World Clock displays what time it is in twenty-four different time zones around the world together with one or more major cities, states, regions, or countries in a time zone.
To access world clock:

1. Press nemu for Main Menu.
2. Press 7 fom Utilities.
3. Press 5 mm for World Clock.
4. Press the navigation key left, right, up, or down to display the different time zones.
5. Press werv (1-) to turn DST (Daylight Savings Time) On or Off for that time zone.

Note: A sun icon is displayed on-screen if DST is selected for a time zone.

## Countdown

Countdown allows you to enter a future date and time into the phone and then see the amount of days, hours, and minutes until that time is reached.
To setup a new countdown:

1. Press nemu for Main Menu.
2. Press ${ }^{700}$ for Utilities.
3. Press $6^{m o \mathrm{~m}}$ for Countdown.
4. If there are no existing countdowns, the phone displays "No Countdown Entered" and a New Countdown screen is automatically displayed. If there is already a countdown entered, press mew (1--) for Add New.
5. Enter a name using the keypad and press on
6. Enter the Input time and date values and press (ow(0) to Save. To view a countdown:
7. Press vem for Main Menu.
8. Press Tram for Utilities.
9. Press ${ }^{6 m}$ for Countdown.
10. Press the navigation key up or down to highlight the desired countdown and press (ow(1).

Tip: When viewing an existing countdown, press the navigation key left or right to cycle between the other countdown entries.

Note: No audible alert is sounded when the countdown is reached.

- Using Voice-Activated Dialing
- Voice Memos


## Activating Voice Recognition

Voice recognition allows you to say commands to perform common functions supported by your phone. There is no voice training required to use the voice recognition feature. You simply say the pre-designated command displayed on your screen in a normal tone of voice to perform the desired function. To activate voice recognition:

1. Press and hold

2. The phone prompts you to say a voice command. Wait for the beep and then say one of the following commands:

- Digit Dial
- Name Dial
- Voice Memo
- Phone book
- Browser
- Play Games

When it recognizes one of these commands, the phone launches the associated application. If the phone does not hear a command within approximately eight seconds, it de-activates voice recognition without taking any action.

Note: If you want to use a different button to activate voice recognition, press [8m for Launch Pad. On this menu, you can change button assignments, including the button used to launch "Voice Dial," which is the voice recognition application.

## Digit Dial

Digit Dial allows you dial any valid 7 or 11 digit North American phone number by speaking the number naturally, without pausing between the digits.
Tips for using Digit Dial:

- Digit Dial works best in quieter environments.
- When saying a number, speak at a normal speed and say each digit clearly. There is no need to pause between digits.

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- The phone recognizes the digits one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, zero, and oh. The phone does not recognize numbers such as "one eight hundred" for "1-800." Instead, say "one-eight-zero-zero."

The phone recognizes only valid 7,10 , or 11 digit North American phone numbers.

- If your phone does not usually recognize you correctly when you are using Digit Dial, try adapting Digit Dial to your voice, which can significantly improve accuracy for some speakers. See the section "Adapting Digit Dial" for details.


## To place a call using Digit Dial:

1. Activate voice recognition by pressing and holding sevo. The phone prompts you for a command.
2. Say Digit Dial. The phone prompts you to say the number.
3. Say a valid 7,10 or 11 digit North American phone number naturally and clearly.
4. If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by the correct number, say "Yes." You can also select the correct number from those displayed on the screen by pressing on on the correct number. The phone will then dial the number.
5. If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by an incorrect number, say "No." If there are other alternatives, the phone will prompt you with the next one. You can also press the navigation key up or down to select the correct number from the Choice List, and then press to dial.

## Enabling/Disabling Digit Dial Choice Lists

You can customize whether the Digit Dial feature displays the list of top voice recognition choices or automatically dials the first number, without displaying a choice list.
To enable or disable choice lists for Digit Dial:

5. Press the navigation key up or down to select Yes or No and press (ovie).

Note: Disabling the choice list does not disable the digit dial feature. Only the choice list is disabled.

## Adapting Digit Dial

Digit Dialing is speaker independent, which means that no training or adaptation is required. Some users with heavy accents or unusual voice characteristics may find difficulty in achieving high accuracy with speaker independent digit dialing, so the Adapt Digits feature allows users to dramatically improve the digit accuracy through adaptation. Users who get acceptable digit recognition accuracy will find no additional benefit to performing the Adapt Digit adaptation.
After you adapt Digit Dial, your phone will be customized to your voice. Other people will not be able to use Digit Dial on your phone unless they reset the phone to factory defaults.

[^4]Adaptation involves recording several digit sequences to teach the system your voice. The adaptation process takes about 3 minutes.
Tips for adapting Digit Dial:
Adapt digits in a quiet place.

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Make sure you wait for the beep before starting to speak.

- Speak clearly, but say each digit sequence naturally.
- If you make a mistake while recording a sequence of digits, or if there is an unexpected noise that spoils the recording, you can say or select No when the prompt asks, "Did the recording sound OK?". You will then be prompted to re-record the sequence.

To adapt Digit Dial to your voice:

1. Press new fow for Setup.
2. Press ${ }^{3^{(0)}}$ for Voice Dial.
3. Press (1-) for Adapt Digits.
4. The phone displays the first digit sequence. When you are ready to start recording, press oriब). The phone prompts you to say the first sequence of digits.
5. Wait for the beep, and then repeat the digits using a normal tone of voice. The phone plays back your recording and asks you if the recording sounds "OK."
6. If the recording sounds ok (no mistakes, and no background noises), say "Yes." If you need to re-record the digits to fix any problems, say "No." The phone then prompts you to say the digits again. Wait for the beep, and then record the digits again. Repeat this step until you are satisfied with the recording.
7. After confirming that the recording sounds ok, repeat the recording process with the next set of digits. After six sets of digits, the phone will ask you whether you want to do more adaptation. Answer "Yes."
8. Repeat steps $4-8$ for another six sets of digits. After the sixth set of digits, you will be half way through the session and the phone asks "More Adaptation?". Select OK to continue for six more sets of digits, or press an $0^{\circ}$ for partial adaptation. When you are finished with a full session, you will reach a screen that reads, "Adaptation Complete".

Note: It is recommended that you perform the complete adaptation of Digit Dial at least once to achieve the maximum benefit of this feature. If a partial adaptation is performed, you can always return later and resume the process from the half way point.

## Resetting Digit Dial Adaptation

To erase any adaptation and reset Digit Dial to its original state:

1. Press Nem fom for Setup.
2. Press ${ }^{3^{\circ 0}}$ for Voice Dial.
3. Press ${ }^{2 m e}$ for Reset Digits.
4. Press the navigation key up or down button to select Yes and press (OWV).

## Using Name Dial

For best results with Name Dial, enter first and last names in your phone book, avoid using abbreviations, and make sure the names are spelled correctly. Name Dial automatically voice-activates every contact in your Phone book without the need to record or "train" names before using them. With Name Dial you can dial any person in your Phone book by saying that person's name.
To place a call using Name Dial:

1. Activate voice recognition by pressing and holding semo. The phone prompts you for a command.
2. Say Name Dial. The phone prompts you to say a name.
3. Say the full name of the person you want to call, exactly as it is entered in your Phone book. The phone plays the name through the earpiece and displays it on the screen. If the Phone book contains only one number for the name, the phone automatically dials that number.
4. If the name that you spoke has more than one number associated with it, the phone displays the different locations (home, work, etc.) and asks you which one to dial. Say one of the following locations:

- Home

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5. The phone dials the number for the location you specified.

## Enabling/Disabling Name Dial Choice Lists

You can customize whether the Name Dial feature displays a list of choices for names that sound alike, or brings up information for the first recognized name, without displaying a choice list.
To enable or disable choice lists for Name Dial:

1. Press
2. Press for Voice Dial.
3. Press (4.- for Choice List.
4. Press $\sqrt{2 m \mathrm{~m}}$ for Name Dial.
5. Press the navigation key up or down to select Yes or No and press (ove).
When choice lists are enabled for Name Dial, after you say the name, the phone will display one or more names on the screen and prompt you to confirm the name you spoke.
"If the phone says, "Did You Say," followed by the correct name, say "Yes." "If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by an incorrect name, say "No." The phone then prompts you with the next name, if there is one. If there are no more names, the phone will say "Sorry, No Match Found," and will not place a call.
You can also choose a name from the choice list manually. Use the Launch Pad up and down buttons to highlight the name, and then press (owis) to select it.

## Using Phone Book

Phone book allows you to retrieve contact information for any person saved in your phone by saying the full name of the person.
To retrieve information using Phone book:

1. Activate voice recognition by pressing and holding semo . The phone
prompts you for a command.
2. Say Phone book. The phone prompts you to say the name.
3. Say the full name of the person, exactly as it is entered in your Phone book. The phone plays the name it recognized through the earpiece, and then opens the contact information for that name.

## Enabling/Disabling Phone book Choice Lists

You can customize whether the Phonebook feature displays a list of choices for names that sound alike, or brings up information for the first recognized name, without displaying a choice list.
To enable or disable choice lists for Phone book:

1. Press Nemu for Setup.
2. Press $3^{(00}$ for Voice Dial.
3. Press (40) for Choice List.
4. Press ${ }^{3^{(0)}}$ for Phone book.
5. Press the navigation key up or down to select Yes or No and press (ow(i).
When choice lists are enabled for Phone book, after you say the name, the phone will display one or more names on the screen and prompt you to confirm the name you spoke.
"If the phone says, "Did You Say," followed by the correct name, say "Yes." "If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by an incorrect name, say "No." The phone then prompts you with the next name, if there is one. If there are no more names, the phone will say "Sorry, No Match Found."
You can also choose a name from the choice list manually. Press the navigation key up or down to highlight the name, and then press (owvel to select it.

## Recording Memos

You can use your phone to record memos that you can listen to later. You can record yourself speaking into the phone's built-in microphone, or record the person at the other end of a phone call.

Note：You can store up to 10 minutes of memos at a time，in up to 20 separate memos．Individual memos can be up to 30 seconds long．

To record a memo using the phone＇s built－in microphone：
1．Press Nenv for Voice Tools．
2．Press（1－－for Voice Memo．
3．Press ${ }^{1--}$ for Record．The phone prompts you to start recording after the beep．
4．Wait for the beep and then start speaking．As it is recording，the phone displays a countdown timer that shows how many seconds are left for recording．
5．To pause the memo，press menv．When a memo is paused，press wen again to resume recording．
6．To finish recording，press ork ．
When you have finished recording，the phone offers you the option of reviewing the memo，re－recording the memo，saving it，or quitting without saving the memo．
－To listen to the memo again，select Review and press orve．
－To discard the current recording and make a new one，select Rerecord and press oriब．
－To save the memo and return to the home screen，select Save and press onv．The phone prompts you to enter a name for the memo． Enter a name．Use the Menu to enter letters，numbers，or symbols． When you are done，press （ox（10）．
－To quit the memo feature without saving the memo，select Quit and press ox⿴囗大

## Send To

This feature allows you to send a recorded voice mail to an email address or another phone. To send a voice memo:

1. Press for Voice Tools.
2. Press (1-) for Voice Memo.
3. Press ${ }^{2 w e}$ for Play or follow the steps under Recording Memos to create a new memo.

## Reviewing and Erasing Memos

To review（replay）a memo you have recorded earlier：

2．Select the memo to erase．

## Taking Pictures

Taking pictures with your phone's built-in Digital Camera is as simple as choosing a subject, pointing the lens, and pressing a button. You can activate Camera mode and take pictures whether the phone is open or closed.

## To Take a Picture With the Phone Open:

1. Press Nem for Main Menu.
2. Press $[5 m$ for Camera.
3. Press (1-) for Take Picture.

Shortcut: To activate Camera mode, you can also press or the Side Camera button twice. (see illustration on page 3). You can also press and hold either button to activate the camera.
4. Using the phone's main LCD as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject. Use the thumb wheel to move the lens up or down.
5. Hold the camera steady. To take the picture, press or the Side Camera button until the shutter sounds.

## To Take a Picture With the Phone Closed:

1. Rotate the flip to the out position and close. Press and hold the Side Camera button to activate Camera mode.
2. Point the camera lens at your subject. You can check the picture framing through the external display screen.


#### Abstract

Note: When taking a picture with the phone closed and the camera lens rotated towards you, the subject image appears in reverse on the external display. Select Inversion using the volume keys and navigating the icon settings on the bottom of the display to make the image display correctly.


3. Press Side Camera button to take the picture.
4. Press the Side Camera button again to return to the camera mode.

## Image Resolution

Your full-color digital camera can take pictures in three different modes. Two of the modes allow you to increase the zoom using digital magnification up to two times the original display. This allows you to get a closer view of the subject or scenery being photographed.
The following image resolutions are available:
High: This is the highest resolution setting available for this camera, thus allowing you the most image detail. Images taken at the high setting require more memory to save than the other two modes. The zoom feature is not available in this mode.

- Medium: The medium setting allows you to take good quality images without using too much memory. The zoom feature is available using the navigation key.
- Low: The low setting allows you to take average quality images. You can save the most images in memory using this setting. The zoom feature is available using the navigation key.

To access the picture settings:

1. Press $n=0$
2. Press $[5 m$ for Camera.
3. Press $\left[5^{5 \pi}\right.$ for Settings.
 Quality, or fian for Help.

## Camera Icons

When the flip is closed and you are in Camera mode, there are several icons displayed on the bottom of the screen. These icons are the options associated with taking pictures when the flip closed.
The available settings are:

- Inversion: allow s you to change the image display to match the viewing angle of the lens. If the image is upside down, you can make it display right side up by
using inversion. Inversion can also be done by pressing the volume keys located on the side of the phone.
- Zoom: allows you to digitally zoom up to two times the original display.
- Flash: turns the flash On or Off.
- Brightness: allow s you to increase/decrease or use auto mode for the brightness setting of the image. The brightness setting is changed and displayed on screen to insure you get the proper lighting.
- Resolution: allows you to change the resolution of the image from high, medium, or low.
- Review: allows you to review the images already saved in memory.
To access the different settings available, press the volume key up to display the different options and then press down to select.


## Camera Options

Camera options allow you to set up options associated with taking the picture. When you are in the camera mode, press nemy to display the following options:

Flash - Allows you to turn the flash always on or off when taking a picture. Also allows you to turn the flash on for just one picture.

- Self Timer - Allows you to configure a timer for 5 or 10 seconds. This feature can also be turned Off.
- Brightness - Allows you to set the brightness level automatically or manually. when brightness is set to manual, the left or right navigation key can be used to increase or decrease the desired brightness.

Fun Frames - Allows you to select a frame around the image before the picture is taken. Press the navigation key left or right to select the desired frame. Press to select and return to the camera mode.

Multi－Shot－Allows you to configure the camera to take 3，5，10，or 15 quick pictures when you press $\$$ ．The number of pictures depends on the image quality selected．

Color Tones－Allows you to select between several different color tones by pressing the navigation key left or right．When you find the desired tone，press مx⿴囗十介 ．

White Balance－Allows you to set up the white balance of the camera automatically or manually using the different preset modes．

## Setting the Self－timer

To activate the Self－timer and get yourself in on the picture：
1．With the phone open and in Camera mode，press
 to select Options．
2．Press ${ }^{2 m m}$ for Self－timer．
3．Using the navigation key，highlight the length of delay you want the timer to use（ 10 seconds or 5 seconds）and press orve．An icon is displayed in the top right corner of the screen．To deactivate the self timer press（Veme（Cancel）．The self timer icon in the top right corner of the camera screen disappears and the camera mode is returned to normal shooting mode．
4．Press ow ）to start the timer．（A timer is displayed in the lower left portion of the main LCD during the self－timer countdown．）
5．Get ready for the picture．When the timer is down to three seconds， the Self－timer icon will turn red and the phone will begin to beep．
To take a picture of yourself using the self－timer：
－Press nemy to Cancel．
Note：While the Self－timer is active，all keys are disabled except Back，End，and the right softkey button（Cancel）．

## Camera Album

Picture options allow you to set up different options associated with the images saved on your phone. When reviewing your pictures, press vear to display the following options:

- Take Picture - Allows you to go back to the live camera mode from review mode.
- Assign - Allows you to use the picture for a wallpaper, picture ID, or incoming caller. In the address book, pictures can be used to identify incoming callers by displaying the image on screen.
- Send To - Allows you to send the picture to another user.
- Upload - Allows you to send a picture to an online album.
- Erase - Removes the image for memory.

Edit Caption - Allows you to edit the caption of the image. Up to 32 characters can be entered to identify the image.

- Picture Info - This option displays the caption, time and date, resolution, size and quality of the image.
- Expand/Thumbnail - Changes the display to thumbnail or expanded view, which allows you to see several images at once or the whole image on screen.


## Picture MSG

You can send pictures, text, and sound from one phone to another or to an email address conveniently. You can create sound files to add while composing a Picture Message.
For more information on Creating a Voice Memo, see 'Recording Memos" on page 78. For more information on Picture Album, see "Camera Album" on page 87.

- Settings - Allows you to set up the slide duration and slide format settings of the image. Slide duration is used to change the amount of time a slide is displayed on the screen. Slide format is used to change the slide position in the picture.
- Add Slide/Remove Slide - Allows you to add or remove a slide.
- Delete Image/Sound - Allows you to delete an image or sound from the picture message.


## Online Album

Online album will open a mobile browser and connect to the TELUS online album.

## Settings

## Picture Settings

There are several settings associated with the full-color digital camera. These settings allow you to customize how the camera operates when taking pictures.
The settings are:
Picture Lock: This setting allows you to password protect the images that are saved in memory. No one can review the images without entering a password.

- Shutter Sound: The shutter sound allows you to select between 7 different shutter sounds. The shutter sound is heard when you take a picture.

Quality: The quality allows you to select between Fine and Normal. These settings dictate the image quality settings for the pictures.

Help: Allows you to display the photo help file. The photo help file gives simple instructions of how to take pictures using the full-color digital camera.

## Using Voicemail

## Setting Up Your Voicemail

All unanswered calls to your phone are automatically transferred to voicemail， even if your phone is in use or turned off．Therefore，you will want to set up your Voicemail and personal greeting as soon as your phone is activated． To set up voicemail：

1．Press and hold $\qquad$
2．Follow the system prompts to create your passcode，record your greeting，and record your name announcement．

Note：You must request this feature from your service provider for it to work correctly．

Note：The voicemail setup process may vary in certain Affiliate areas．

## Voicemail Notification

There are several ways your phone alerts you：
By displaying a message on the screen．
By sounding the assigned ringer type．
By multi－colored LED turning On．
By displaying at the top of your screen．

## New Voicemail Message Alerts

When you receive a new voice message，your phone alerts you and prompts you to call your voicemail．To call your voicemail，press and
hold ox（⿴囗⿱一一⿻儿口一大）．

## Retrieving Your Voicemail Messages

You can review your messages directly from your phone or from any other touch-tone phone. To dial from your phone, you can either speed dial your voicemail or use the menu keys.

## Using One-Touch Message Access:

Press and hold ow. Follow the system prompts.

## Using the Menu Keys on Your Phone to Access Your Messages:

1. Press Nem for Main Menu.
2. Press $3^{3^{(0)}}$ for Messaging.
3. Press (1-) for Voice Mail.
4. Press (1-) for Inbox.
5. Press (1-) for Connect.

Note: You are charged for airtime minutes when you are accessing your voicemail from your phone.

## Using a Phone Other Than Your Wireless Phone to Access Messages:

1. Dial your wireless phone number.
2. When your voicemail answers, press \%
3. Enter your passcode.

## Clearing the Voice Mail Count

Your phone may temporarily continue to display the message icon after you have checked your voice and text messages.
To clear the icon from the display screen:

1. Press nem for Main Menu.
2. Press $3^{3^{\circ}}$ for Messaging.
3. Press (t-7) for Voice Mail.
4. Press $\sqrt{2 \pi \times e}$ for Clear VM Count.

## Using Caller ID

Caller ID lets people know who's calling by displaying the number of the person calling.
To block your phone number from being displayed for a specific outgoing call:

1. Press
2. Enter the number you want to call.
3. Press seno.

To permanently block your number, call Customer Service.

## Responding to Call Waiting

When you're on a call, Call Waiting alerts you to incoming calls by sounding two beeps. Your phone's screen informs you that another call is coming in and displays the caller's phone number (if it is available and you are in digital mode).
To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:
$\square$ Press ${ }^{\text {SERNO}}$. (This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.)
To switch back to the first caller:
Press seno again.

Tip: For those calls where you don't want to be interrupted, you can temporarily disable Call Waiting by pressing , before placing your call. Call Waiting is automatically reactivated once you end the call.

## Making a Three-Way Call

With Three-Way Calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

1. Enter a number you wish to call and press semo .
2. Once you have established the connection, press (new (mat for 3-Way Call.
3. Dial the second number and press sstoro.
4. When you're connected to the second party, press (seave again to begin your three-way call.
If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all three callers are disconnected.

Tip: You can also begin a Three-Way Call by displaying a phone number stored in your Internal Phone Book, Call History, or Messaging. To call the third party, press sewo.

Note: Call Waiting and Three-Way Calling are not available while roaming.

## Using Call Forwarding

Call Forwarding lets you forward all your incoming calls to another phone number - even when your phone is turned off. You can continue to make calls from your phone when Call Forwarding is activated.

## To Activate Call Forwarding

## 1. Press

2. Enter the area code and phone number to which your future calls should be forwarded.
3. Press semoro. You will see a message and hear a tone to confirm the activation of Call Forwarding.

## To Deactivate Call Forwarding


2. Press sezoro. You will see a message and hear a tone to confirm the deactivation.

Note: You are charged a higher rate for calls you have forwarded.

## Data/Fax

Your phone is capable of sending and receiving digital data and fax calls when connected to a computing device (laptop, desktop, hand held, palmtop, etc.) running the Windows or Windows NT operating system. Your phone functions similar to a typical modem on your PC, enabling you to use wireless data involving a wide variety of Windows applications.
To use digital data or fax services with your phone, you will need to obtain a digital data/fax kit from your service provider. This kit contains the necessary cables, software, and documentation required for you to connect and use your phone with your computing device.

## Data/Fax setup

1. Press nem for Main Menu.
2. Press $\left[{ }^{8 \mathrm{~m} w}\right)$ for Setup.
3. Press $\sqrt[8 \mathrm{~mm}]{ }$ for Others.
4. Press $7=0$ for Connection.
5. Press the navigation key up or down to select Voice Only, Fax in Only, Data in Only, Fax in Once, or Data in Once.
6. Press ow to save.

- Voice Only: No incoming Data/Fax calls can be received.
- Fax in Only: No Voice Calls can be received. Only allows incoming Fax transmissions.
- Data in Only: No voice calls can be received. Only allows incoming data transmissions.
- Fax in Once: No Voice Calls can be received. Allows one incoming Fax transmission.
- Data in Once: No voice calls can be received. Only allows one incoming data transmission.


## Receiving a fax

1. Press Nem for Main Menu.
2. Press Bivi $^{\text {for Setup. }}$
3. Press 8 mm for Others.

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4. Press ${ }^{7 \times 0}$ for Connection.
5. Press the navigation key up or down and select Fax in Only.
6. Press (oxiv to save.

In the Fax program on your PC, configure the Answer Mode. Click Receive and select either Automatic Receive (recommended) or Manual Receive. Your phone is ready to receive an incoming fax.

Note: Once you have set your phone's mode to fax for next call, you cannot receive regular voice calls until you change back to voice calls only, or a fax is received.

## Ending a Fax or Data Call

Some common ways to end a call, like closing the phone, will not end a fax or data call. Always disconnect the connection through the application on your computer, which returns your phone to standby mode. Disconnecting the data cable or turning off your phone will also end a data or fax call, but it may disrupt your computer.

## Sending a Fax or Data File

When connected to a computing device, your phone allows wireless fax and data transmissions. Your computing device software initiates the call to the destination phone number. Your phone functions as a wireless modem to send the Fax or Data file to the number designated by your PC software.

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## Messaging

Messaging now consists of pictures, text, and voicemail capabilities. Picture messages can be sent to another picture message capable phone or an email address. Picture messages can also contain text, pictures, and a voice attachment.
Text messaging allows you to send text messages to another text messaging capable phone.

## Text Messaging

## Using Text Messaging

With Text Messaging, you can use a person's wireless phone number to send instant text messages from your web enabled phone to their messaging-ready phone - and they can send messages to you. When you receive a new message, you'll automatically be notified with a one-way text message. In addition, messaging includes a variety of pre-set messages, such as "l'm running late, l'm on my way," that make composing messages fast and easy. The following folders are available:

- Send Message - Allows you to create and send a new text message.
- Inbox - allows you to view email messages in the Inbox.
- Outbox - contains a copy of outgoing messages.
- Web MSG - allows you to review a new web message.
- Saved - allows you to store saved messages.
- Erase MSG -allows you to delete messages stored in the any of the folders listed above or all folders at once.
- MSG Settings - allows you to configure text messaging options.


## To send a text message:

1. Press nem for Main Menu.
2. Press ${ }^{3^{(0)}}$ for Messaging.
3. Press $\sqrt{3^{(0)}}$ for Text MSG.
4. Press (1--) for Send Message

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5. Enter the phone number or email address of the person to whom you're sending a message and press or(0).
6. Enter your message using the keypad. Press nemve to select the desired character format. Press or(0) when finished.
7. Press serroo to send.

## Sending Options

When you are sending a new text message, there are options associated with the new message. These options allow you to configure the following:

- Priority - allows you to set the priority level between Normal and Urgent.
- Validity - allows you to configure the amount of time a message is good before it can no longer be read by the recipient. If the message is not read in the time allotted, it is cancelled.
- Send Later - allows you to time delay the sending of a message using one of the preset time limits.
- Delivery Ack - requests that a delivery acknow ledgment is sent upon reading the new message.
- Message Save - allows you to configure the Auto-Save, Do Not Save, or Prompt Save options for the new message.


## To read a Text Message:

1. When you receive a text message, you will see "New Text Message" on your display screen. Select OK.

## To reply to a Text Message:

1. While the message is open, select Menu Reply.
2. Compose your reply or use canned messages.

- Use your keypad to type a message. Use the right softkey to select a character input mode.
- To use canned messages press nemur for Canned Msg. Press the corresponding number on the keypad to enter the canned message response.

3. Press
4. Press to Send.

## Erasing Messages

You can erase messages at anytime from the Inbox, Outbox, or Saved message folders. To erase the messages from the desired folder:

Canned messages are used to enter common responses to questions. A canned message can be selected and automatically entered into the message. Canned messages can also be customized to whatever you want by editing the 10 pre-set messages already stored in your phone. To edit a canned message:

3. Press 3 for Text MSG.
4. Press for MSG Settings.
5. Press ${ }_{2 n c}$ for New Message.
6. Press 5 for Canned MSG.
7. Highlight the desired message and press orv.
8. Press and hold [mex to erase the message. Enter your new message or changes and press ox to Save.

## Picture Messaging

Your phone gives you the ability to take pictures, view them using the phone's display, and instantly send them to your friends and family. It's as easy to use as a traditional point-and-click camera. In addition to sending your pictures to friends and family, you can also send them to a Picture Messaging Web site for storage. Cameras can take and store pictures and the image quality is similar to what you see on your computer screen.

## Sending Picture Messaging to Others from your Phone

1. Press nenv for Main Menu.

3. Press 2 noc for Picture MSG.

## The Wireless Web

Your phone comes equipped with Wireless Web access through your browser. You can view specially designed version of popular sites which includes sports, weather, news, stock quotes etc...as well as downloadable ringtones, wallpapers and images. When you launch the browser, the phone will connect to the Internet and the service indicator icon will display.

## Launching the Browser

To launch a web connection:

1. Press nemu for Main Menu.
2. Press 4ater Do More.
3. Press 1 1-- for Wireless Web.
4. Your web connection will launch and the Mobile Web Home page.

Shortcut: You can also press and hold the center of the navigation key down to
launch the Web.
If you had a previous web connection, the last page you visited will display when you launch your browser, for example, Short Mail or ESPN Top News. When this occurs, you may not see the "Connecting as..." message when you launch the session. Though the browser is open, you are not currently in an active data session - that is, no data is being sent or received. As soon as you navigate to another page, the active session will launch and you will see the "Connecting" message.

Your phone's display lets you know the current status of your web connection through indicators which appear at the top of the screen. The following symbols are used:

41Your web connection is active (data is being transferred). Incoming voice calls go directly to voicemail; outgoing voice calls can be made, but the web connection will terminate.

46Your web connection is dormant (no data is being sent or received). Though not currently active, when dormant the phone can restart an active connection quickly; voice calls can be made and received.

4You are receiving data when the down arrow is illuminated. You are transmitting data when the up arrow is illuminated.

## Navigating the Wireless Web

Navigating through menus and Web sites during a web session is easy once you've learned a few basics. Here are some tips for getting around:

## Softkeys

When browsing the Web, the bottom line of your phone's display contains one or more softkeys. These keys are shortcut controls for navigating around the Web, and they correspond to the softkey buttons directly below the phone's display screen. Depending on which Web sites you visit, the labels on the softkeys may change to indicate their function.
To use softkeys, simply press the desired softkey button. If an additional popup menu appears when you press the softkey button, select the menu items using your keypad (if they're numbered) or by highlighting the option and pressing (oriv).

## Scrolling

As with other parts of your phone's menu, you'll have to scroll up and down to see everything on some Web sites.

- Press the navigation key up and down to scroll line by line or press the volume buttons on the side of the phone to scroll one page at a time.


## Selecting

Once you've learned how to use softkeys and scroll, you can start navigating Web sites.

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## Getting the Most Out of Your Reception

## Keeping Tabs on Signal Strength

The quality of each call you make or receive depends on the signal strength in your area. Your phone informs you of the current signal strength by displaying a number of bars next to the signal strength icon. The more bars displayed, the stronger the signal. If you're inside a building, being near a window may give you better reception.

## Understanding the Power Save Feature

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. If your phone is active, it periodically rechecks service availability or you can check it yourself by pressing any key. Anytime the Power Save feature is activated, a message displays on the screen. When a signal is found, your phone returns to standby mode.

## Understanding How Your Phone Operates

Your phone is basically a radio transmitter and receiver. When it's turned on, it receives and transmits radio frequency (RF) signals. When you use your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level. This power can range from 0.006 watts to 0.2 watts in digital mode.

## Knowing Radio Frequency Safety

The design of your phone complies with updated NCRP standards described below. In 1991-92, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) joined in updating ANSI's 1982 standard for safety levels with respect to human exposure to RF signals. More than 120 scientists, engineers and physicians from universities, government health agencies and industries developed this updated standard after reviewing the available body of research. In 1993, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted this updated standard in a regulation. In August 1996, the FCC adopted hybrid standard consisting of the existing ANSI/IEEE standard and the guidelines published by the National Council of Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP).

## Maintaining Your Phone's Peak Performance

There are several simple guidelines to operating your phone properly and maintaining safe, satisfactory service.

- Hold the phone with the antenna raised, fully-extended, and over your shoulder.
- Try not to hold, bend, or twist the phone's antenna.

Don't use the phone if the antenna is damaged.
Speak directly into the mouthpiece.

- Avoid exposing your phone and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your phone does get wet, immediately turn the power off and remove the battery. If it's inoperable, return it to a TELUS Store or call Customer Support for service.

> Note: For the best care of your phone, only TELUS authorized personnel should service your phone and accessories. Faulty service may void the warranty.

## Using Your Phone While Driving

Talking on your phone while driving (or operating the phone without a handsfree device) is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Laws vary as to specific restrictions. Remember that safety always comes first.
When using your phone in the car:

- Get to know your phone and its features, such as speed dial and re-dial.
- When available, use a hands-free device.
- Position your phone within easy reach.
- Let the person you are speaking to know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.

Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when stationary or before pulling into traffic.

- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may divert your attention from the road.

Dial 911 to report serious emergencies. It's free from your wireless phone.

- Use your phone to help others in emergencies.

Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless number when necessary.

## Following Safety Guidelines

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, always follow any special regulations in a given area. Turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

## Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from wireless phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.
RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating systems and/or entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or their representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. Also check with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle. Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.

Note: Always turn off the phone in health care facilities and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

## Turning Off Your Phone Before Flying

Turn off your phone before boarding any aircraft. To prevent possible interference with aircraft systems, the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations require you to have permission from a crew member to use your phone while the plane is on the ground. To prevent any risk of interference,
FCC regulations prohibit using your phone while the plane is in the air.
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## Turning Off Your Phone in Dangerous Areas

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn off your phone when in a blasting area or in other areas with signs indicating that two-way radios should be turned off. Construction crews often use remote-control RF devices to
set off explosives.
Turn off your phone when you're in any area that has a potentially explosive atmosphere. Although it's rare, your phone or its accessories could generate sparks. Sparks could cause an explosion or a fire resulting in bodily injury or even death. These areas are often, but not always, clearly marked. They include:

- Fueling areas such as gas stations.
- Below deck on boats.
- Fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities.
- Areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, just or metal powders.
- Any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.

Note: Never transport or store flammable gas, liquid or explosives in the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.


## Restricting Children's Access to your Phone

Your phone is not a toy. Children should not be allowed to play with it because they could hurt themselves and others, damage the phone or make calls that increase your phone bill.

## Caring for the Battery

## Protecting Your Battery

The guidelines listed below help you get the most out of your battery's performance.

- Use only Samsung approved batteries and desktop chargers. These chargers are designed to maximize battery life. Using other batteries or chargers voids your warranty and may cause damage.
- In order to avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures that range from $32^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ to $113^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\left(0^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\right.$ to $\left.45^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\right)$.
- Don't use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in high humidity areas, such as the bathroom.
- Never dispose of the battery by incineration.
- Keep the metal contacts on top of the battery clean.

Don't attempt to disassemble or short-circuit the battery.

- The battery may need recharging if it has not been used for a long period of time.

What is Not Covered? This Limited Warranty is conditioned upon proper use of Product by Purchaser. This Limited Warranty does not cover: (a) defects or damage resulting from accident, misuse, abuse, neglect, unusual physical, electrical or electromechanical stress, or modification of any part of Product, including antenna, or cosmetic damage; (b) equipment that has the serial number removed or made illegible; (c) any plastic surfaces or other externally exposed parts that are scratched or damaged due to normal use; (d) malfunctions resulting from the use of Product in conjunction with accessories, products, or ancillary/peripheral equipment not furnished or approved by SAMSUNG; (e) defects or damage from improper testing, operation, maintenance, installation, or adjustment; (f) installation, maintenance, and service of Product, or (g) Product used or purchased outside the United States or Canada.
