Getting Started Open View of Phone



- 1. Indicator LED: Shows your phone's connection status at a glance.
- Display Screen: The display screen shows signal and battery strength, time, day, and date. It also displays incoming calls or messages.
- Menu/OK Key: Pressing when navigating through a menu accepts the highlighted choice in a menu.
- Headset Jack: Allows you to plug in an optional headset for safe, convenient conversations.
- Left Softkey: This key is used to navigate through menus and applications by selecting the choice available in the Left Softkey Option.
- 6. Volume Keys: Allows you to adjust the ringer volume in idle mode (with the phone open) or adjust the voice volume during a call. To mute the ringer during an incoming call, press the volume key up or down.
- Speaker Key: This key allows you to place or receive calls in speakerphone mode.
- TALK Key: Allows you to place or receive a call. In idle mode, press the key once to access the recent call log.
- QWERTY Keypad: Use these keys to enter numbers, letters, and characters.
- 10. Earpiece: Allows you to hear the caller and automated prompts.
- 11. Status Bar Icons: Displays information about your phone's status, such as signal strength, roaming, ringer setting, messaging, and battery charge.
- **12. Navigation Key**: Allows you to scroll through the phone menu options and provides a shortcut to phone functions from standby mode.
- 13. Right Softkey: This key is used to navigate menus and applications by selecting the choice available in the Right Softkey Option.
- 14. microSD™ Card Slot: This expansion slot allows you to insert a microSD™ memory card to add additional memory and storage capacity.
- 15. Clear/BACK Key: Deletes characters from the display when you are in text entry mode. Press to return to the previous menu or screen when navigating features on your phone.

- 16. Power/Accessory Connector: The power/accessory interface connector is used to plug in the charging accessories and also connect any available accessory cables to your phone.
- 17. END/Power Kev: Ends a call. If you press and hold the END key, the power goes On or Off. When you receive an incoming call, press to ignore the call and send the call to voicemail.
- 18. Camera/Camcorder Kev: This key is used to launch the integrated digital camera.
- 19. Microphone: The Microphone allows the other caller to hear you clearly when you are speaking to them.

Viewing the Display Screen

The following list identifies the icons you'll see on your phone's display screens:



indicates that your 1X connection is active. Incoming voice calls go directly to Voicemail; outgoing voice calls can be made, but the connection will terminate



indicates that data is being sent over the 1X network.





indicates that your 1X connection is dormant.



indicates that EV-DO is available.



indicates the FV-DO status



indicates that you have an active EV-DO connection. When the arrows are moving, data is being transferred over the EV-DO network. indicates that the FV-DO connection is dormant



indicates that position location is active.



indicates that the self-timer function is enabled. With the self timer enabled, a set amount of time is required prior to taking a picture.



indicates that the white balance has been set to Automatic.



indicates that the white balance has been set to Sunny. This is used for taking pictures outdoors on bright sunny days.



indicates that the white balance has been set to Cloudy. This is used for taking pictures outdoors under cloudy conditions.



indicates that the white balance has been set to Tungsten. This is used for taking pictures indoors under normal lighting conditions.




indicates that the white balance has been set to Fluorescent. This is used for taking pictures indoors under fluorescent lighting conditions.




indicates that the white balance has been set to Manual. This is used for taking pictures indoors or outdoors using your own custom settings.



indicates that a voice memo or video is being recorded.





indicates that voice captioning is enabled and audio is currently being recorded.

indicates that Bluetooth technology is active and enabled.

indicates that Bluetooth technology is connected.

indicates that Bluetooth headset is connected and visible.

indicates that Bluetooth stereo device is connected and visible.

indicates that Bluetooth technology is hidden.

Your phone can also display a handy glossary of icons:

- 1. Press , select the **Settings** menu, and press .
- Select Phone Info.
- 3. Select Icon Glossary.
- 4. Use the navigation keys to scroll through the list of icons.

Turning Your Phone On and Off

To turn your phone on:

• Press and hold of to turn your phone on.

Once your phone is On, it displays "Looking for Service" which indicates that your phone is searching for a signal. When your phone finds a signal, it automatically enters standby mode – the phone's idle state. At this point, you are ready to begin making and receiving calls.

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. When a signal is found, your phone automatically returns to standby mode.

In Power Save mode, your phone searches for a signal periodically without your intervention. You can also initiate a search for service by pressing any key (when vour phone is turned On).

Tip: The Power Save feature helps to conserve your battery power when you are in an area where there is no signal.

To turn your phone off:

 Press for two or more seconds until you see the powering down animation on the display screen.

Your screen remains blank while your phone is off (unless the battery is charging).

Using Your Phone's Battery and Charger

Battery Capacity

Your phone is equipped with a Lithium Ion (Lilon) battery. It allows you to recharge your battery before it is fully drained.

When the battery runs low, the battery icon will blink to remind you to recharge the battery. When the battery capacity is close to completely drained, the phone sounds an audible alert and then powers down.

Note: Long backlight settings, low signal strength, searching for service, vibrate mode, playing games, or browser use affect the battery's talk and standby times.

Tip: Be sure to watch your phone's battery level indicator and charge the battery before it runs out of power.

Installing the Battery

To install the Lilon battery:

 Press the top of the battery cover and slide the battery cover in the direction of the arrow (1) to release it. Lift the cover up by the bottom corners to remove it (2).



2. Insert the bottom end of the battery into the phone housing by using the direction of the arrow printed on the battery (3). The gold contacts on the bottom of the battery should match up with those on the phone. Push the top end of the battery down until it snaps into place (4).



Insert the top end of the battery cover into the grooves of the phone. Snap the lid into place.

Removing the Battery

Note: Make sure the power is off so that you don't lose any stored numbers or messages.

To remove your battery:

 Use your finger to lift the battery (top end first) up and away from the phone.



Charging the Battery

Your phone's Lilon battery is rechargeable and should be charged as soon as possible so you can begin using your phone.

Keeping track of your battery's charge is important. If your battery level becomes too low, your phone automatically turns off and you will lose all the information you were just working on. For a quick check of your phone's battery level, glance at the battery charge indicator located in the upper-right corner of either of your phone's display screens. indicates that the battery is full. If the battery charge is getting too low, the battery icon blinks and the phone sounds a warning tone.

Always use a Samsung-approved desktop charger, travel adapter, or vehicle power adapter to charge your battery.

Using the Travel Adapter

- Locate the interface connector on the side of the phone and pull out and turn the plastic cover.
- Plug the terminal end of the adapter into the phone's interface connector.

- 4. An animated battery icon is displayed on the main screen. The icon provides an indication of whether the battery is being charged or is fully charged.
 - A red charge indicator light means the battery is charging.
 - A green indicator light means the battery is at least 90 percent. charged.

Note: It takes approximately 4 hours to fully recharge a completely drained standard battery. With the Samsung approved Lilon battery, you can recharge the battery before it drains completely.

Using a microSD Memory Card in Your Phone

Your phone is capable of supporting a memory storage media known as a microSD[™] memory card. This card is the newest standard of flash memory specifically designed for use with ultra-small mobile phones and other devices. It is ideal for storing media-rich files such as music, videos, and photographs in your phone.

The maximum storage size for this media card is 32 GB.

Note: Compatibility with all high capacity microSD[™] memory cards is not guaranteed.

Installing the microSD™ Memory Card

Your phone has a memory card slot on the upper right side. You can install a microSD™ card to provide additional memory for storing files (such as sound files and photos) in your phone.

To install the card:

- 1. Locate the memory slot on the right side of the phone and pull out and turn the plastic cover.
- 2. Insert the microSD[™] card—pin side facing you and smaller end pointing toward the phone—into the memory card slot.

 Carefully insert the microSDTM card into the opening and firmly push it in until you hear a click, which indicates that the card is now securely installed



Note: To remove the card once it has been inserted, firmly push the end of the card further into the phone and release—the card should pop out of the memory card slot. If this does not work, repeat the process again.

 With the card now securely installed, resecure the plastic cover over the microSD slot on the phone.

Phone Basics

Your handset supports a flexible user interface that allows you to modify the user interface via downloadable themes. The availability of a custom user interface is subject to your carrier. The following description of the basic capabilities of the phone is a general description and not specific to a particular user interface.

However, there are some general principles that govern the handset's user interface. For each user interface, there will be a mechanism to access a main menu that provides access and control for most of the phone's capability.

Accessing Menus

- 1. Select the user interface's main focus button or press on to activate the main menu
- 2. Select menu items by highlighting them with the navigation key and pressing on.

Displaying Your Phone Number

- 1. Press , highlight the **Settings** menu, and press .
- 2. Select Phone Info
- 3. Select Phone Number

Making and Answering Calls

To make a call:

- 1. Make sure your phone is on.
- 2. Slide open your phone and enter a phone number. (If you make a mistake while dialing, press \infty to erase one digit at a time. Press and hold for to erase the entire number.)
- Press to call.
- when you are finished. Press

Tip: To redial your last recent call, press



twice

Tip: Some networks support + dialing. + dialing automatically indicates to the network that you are dialing an international call and adds the international dialing prefix (typically '011') to the call automatically. To use + dialing, press and hold the 0 key (until the + appears) before entering the phone number.

To answer an incoming call:

- Make sure your phone is on. (If your phone is off, incoming calls go to Voicemail.)
- 2. Press .

Your phone notifies you of incoming calls in the following ways:

- The phone rings or vibrates (unless set to Silence All).
- The screen displays an incoming call message.

If the incoming call is from a number stored in your Contacts, the Contacts entry's name is displayed. The caller's phone number may also be displayed, if available.

The following options are also available to handle an incoming call:

- Press the volume key on the side of the phone to quiet the ringer.
- Press the right softkey for IGNORE or press and hold the volume key to send the incoming call to your Voicemail box immediately.

To disconnect a call when you are finished:

Press

Missed Call Notification

When an incoming call is not answered, a Missed Call message is displayed on your screen.

To dial a missed call back press

Calling Emergency Numbers

You can place calls to 911 (dial **911** and press), even if your phone is locked or your account is restricted.

Warning: After initiating a 911 call, you must end the call by pressing * and # on your keypad. This notifies the phone that the 911 call was terminated intentionally by the user. No other calls can be made prior to terminating the emergency call.

In-Call Options

During a call, use the left softkey at to **MUTE** or **UNMUTE** your phone's microphone. Additional actions are available by pressing the right softkey after **OPTIONS** during a call. (To select an option, press the corresponding keypad number or highlight the option and press (a).)

- (1) Save allows you to save the new number in your Contacts.
- (2) 3-way call allows you to talk to two different people at the same time. (For more information, see "Making a Three-Way Call" on page 19.)
- (3) Contacts accesses the Contacts menu options.
- (4) Voice Memo allows you to record the current conversation. (For more information on recording a voice memo, see "Voice Memo" on page 76.)
- (5) Phone Info displays the phone number, icon glossary, the hardware/ software version, and advanced information.
- (6) Key Mute or Key Unmute allows you to mute the key tones on your phone so the other caller cannot hear you pressing any keys on your phone.
- (7) Messaging allows you to check notifications and access the contents of voice or text messages.
- (8) Recent History checks your call log for Missed, Outgoing, Incoming and Recent calls. You can also erase the logs from this menu.
- (9) Tools accesses the Tools menu options.
- (0) Whisper On or Whisper Off allows you to whisper (such as when you are in a public area) and your voice will be amplified so that the other caller can hear you.

During a call, you can route the device's audio through the speaker by pressing the speakerphone button. You will see the message "Entering speaker mode". To turn off the speakerphone, press the speakerphone button again. You will see the message "Exit speaker mode".

WARNING: Because of higher volume levels, do not place the device near your ear during speakerphone use.

End-of-Call Options

After receiving a call from or making a call to a phone number that is not in your Contacts, the phone number and the duration of the call are displayed. Press the right softkey for **OPTIONS** and then press **Save** to save the new number in

your Contacts. (See "Saving a Phone Number" on page 16" below for more information.)

Note: The End-of-Call options are not displayed for calls identified as Unknown ID or Restricted Number

Saving a Phone Number

You can store up to 600 phone numbers in the Contacts list. (For more information, see "Adding a New Contact" on page 55.)

- 1. Enter a phone number from standby mode.
- Press the right softkey for OPTIONS.
- 3. Select Save
- 4. Select New Entry and press .

Note: Step 4 does not appear when your Contacts list is empty.

- 6. Enter the name using the keypad.
- 7. Press the left softkey and for **DONE**.

Finding a Phone Number

- 1. From the Idle screen, press the right softkey for **Contacts**.
- Scroll down through your list of contacts to highlight the name and press to make the call.

Tip: To search through your list more quickly, enter the first few letters in the search box. The display will move down the list to the first entry that matches the text in the Name box

Tip: If the entry contains more than one phone number, scroll left or right to display the number you wish to call and press to make the call.

Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses

You can dial or save phone numbers with pauses for use with automated systems, such as Voicemail or credit card billing numbers.

There are two types of pauses available on your phone:

- Hard Pause sends the next set of numbers when you press
- 2-Second Pause automatically sends the next set of numbers after two seconds.

Note: You can have multiple pauses in a phone number and combine 2-second and hard pauses.

To dial or save phone numbers with pauses:

- 1. Enter a phone number from standby mode.
- Press the right softkey for OPTIONS and select Hard Pause or 2-Sec Pause. Hard pauses are displayed as a "p" and 2-second pauses as a "t"
- 3. Enter additional numbers.
- 4. Press to dial the number.

Press the right softkey for **OPTIONS** and select **Save** to save the number in your Contacts.

When dialing a number with a hard pause, press to send the next set of numbers.

Abbreviated Dial

Abbreviated dialing allows you to program a five or six digit prefix for commonly used phone numbers. When abbreviated dialing is on, you can enter the last four or five digits of any phone number that matches the five or six digit prefix, and the number is dialed.

To set up abbreviated dialing:

1. Press 🕟, highlight the **Settings** menu, and press 🐼.

- 2. Select More....
- 3. Select Call setup.
- 4. Select Abbreviated Dial.
- 5. Select **On** and press **.**
- Input the five or six digit prefix (for example, area code and prefix) and press .

Making an Abbreviated Dial Call

 Enter the last four or five digits of the phone number. Abbrev. Dial is displayed in the lower left corner with the prefix digits displayed.

Note: If there is more than one Contact entry that matches the last four or five digits, a list is displayed which allows you to select the desired number to call.

2. Press to make the call.

Using Speed Dialing

You can store up to 98 numbers in your phone's speed dial memory to make contacting friends and family as easy as pressing a few buttons. With this feature, you can dial Speed Dial entries using one key press for locations 2-9, or two key presses for locations 10-99.

To use One-Touch Dialing for Speed Dial locations 2-9:

Press and hold the appropriate key for approximately two seconds.

To use Two-Touch Dialing for Speed Dial locations 10-99:

- 1. Press the first digit.
- 2. Press and hold the second digit for approximately two seconds.

Using Caller ID

To block your phone number from being displayed for a specific outgoing call:

- 1. Dial *67 on your keypad.
- 2. Enter the number you want to call.
- 3. Press .

To permanently block your number, call the Customer Service department of your network service provider.

Responding to Call Waiting

When you're on a call, Call Waiting alerts you of incoming calls by sounding two beeps. Your phone's screen informs you that another call is coming in and displays the caller's phone number (if it is available and you are in digital mode).

To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

• Press (This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second) call.)

To switch back to the first caller:

Press again.

Making a Three-Way Call

With Three-Way Calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

To make a Three-Way Call:

- 1. Enter a number you wish to call and press
- 2. Once you have established the connection, press the right softkey for OPTIONS and select 3-way call.
- 3. Select Contacts, Recent History, or Enter phone number to dial the second number and press .
- 4. When you're connected to the second party, press the right softkey for **JOIN** to begin your three-way call.

If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all three callers are disconnected

Tip: You can also begin a Three-Way Call by displaying a phone number stored in your Contacts, Recent History, or Messaging. To call the third party, press

TTY Use With Handset

A TTY (also known as a TDD or Text Telephone), is a telecommunications device that allows people who are deaf or hard of hearing, or who have speech or language disabilities, to communicate by telephone.

Your phone is compatible with selected TTY devices. Please check with the manufacturer of your TTY device to ensure that it supports digital wireless transmission. Your phone and TTY device will connect via a special cable that plugs into your phone's headset jack. If this cable was not provided with your TTY device, contact your TTY device manufacturer to purchase the connector cable.

Note: Not all service providers support TTY. Consult your service provider for more information

To turn TTY Mode on or off:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Settings** menu, and press @.
- Select More....
- 3. Select Accessibility.

IMPORTANT 911 Emergency Calling: We recommend that TTY users make emergency calls by other means, including Telecommunications Relay Services (TRS), analog cellular, and land line communications. Wireless TTY calls to 911 may be corrupted when received by public safety answering points (PSAPs) rendering some communications unintelligible. The problem encountered appears related to TTY equipment or software used by PSAPs. The wireless industry and PSAP community are currently working to resolve this.

20 Phone Basics

Entering Text

Your phone has a keyboard-style keypad, referred to as a full QWERTY keyboard. The keyboard is located beneath the display screen and is accessed by sliding it open.

To change the text input mode:

- When you display a screen where you can enter text, press the right softkey for OPTIONS then select Text Mode.
- 2. Select one of the following:
 - Predictive Text: To enable or disable entering characters using predictive text input.
 - Smiley's: To enter icons that express an emotion through a facial expression.

Predictive Text

Predictive text input analyzes the letters you enter using an intuitive word database and creates a suitable word. (The word may change as you type.) Other possible words appear in a list below your text.

- To accept a word, press
 A space is automatically inserted after the word.

To enter text using predictive text:

- From the text entry screen (for example, a new event in scheduler), press the right softkey for OPTIONS and select Text Mode.
- 2. Select Predictive Text.
- 3. Select On.
- Slide open your phone and use the QWERTY keypad and special function keys to create the event or message.

Alpha Text

Alpha or alphabet text input creates words using the characters entered from the keypad. To enter alpha text, turn off predictive text input.

To enter text using alpha text:

- From a text entry screen, press the right softkey for OPTIONS and select Text Mode
- 2. Select Predictive Text
- Select Off.
- Slide open your phone and use the QWERTY keypad and special function keys to create the event or message.

Using the QWERTY Keypad

Using your phone's QWERTY keypad is just like using any standard computer keyboard. The following keys perform special functions:

- Press or to erase a single character. Press and hold or to delete an entire entry.
 - Press to insert spaces between words or characters.
 - Press to use characters displayed at the top of the QWERTY keys (e.g. \$, @, #,!) and to lock/unlock **123** mode.
 - Press to change the text input between uppercase (e.g. ABC, PREDICTIVE), lowercase (e.g. abc, predictive), or initial caps (e.g. Abc, Predictive).
 - Press for move the insertion point to the next line in a message.

Note: When the Dual Language text option is enabled, accented characters are also displayed.

Numbers, Symbols, Smileys and Quick Messages

To enter symbols:

 From a text entry screen, press the right softkey for OPTIONS and select Text Mode

To enter numbers:

Call <Name or #>

You can dial any valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone number. You can also dial by pronouncing a name stored in your Contacts.

Tips for using Call <Name or #>:

- Voice Service works best in quieter environments.
- When saying a number, speak at a normal speed and say each digit clearly.
 There is no need to pause between digits.
- The phone recognizes the digits one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, zero, and oh. The phone does not recognize numbers such as "one eight hundred" for "1-800." Instead. say "one-eight-zero-zero."
- The phone recognizes only valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone numbers
- If your phone does not usually recognize you correctly when you are using Voice Service, try adapting Voice Service to your voice, which can significantly improve accuracy for some speakers.

To place a call using Call <Name or #>:

- Say "Call" followed by either a name stored in your Contacts or a valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone number naturally and clearly.
 - If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by the correct number, say Yes. (You can also select the correct number from those

 - If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by the correct number, say Yes. (You can also select the correct number from those displayed on the screen by pressing on the correct number.)
 - If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by an incorrect number, say No. (If there are other alternatives, the phone will prompt you with the next one. You can also press the navigation key up or down to select the correct number from the Choice List.)
- Compose your text message. For more information, see "To send a text message:" on page 45, beginning at step 6.

Send Picture <Name or #>

To compose Pic/Video Message using Voice Service:

- 1. Activate voice recognition. (See page 26.)
- 2. Say "Send Picture" followed by a name stored in your Contacts or a valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone number.

- If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by the correct name, say Yes. (You can also select the correct address from those displayed on the screen by pressing an on the correct number.)

Lookup <Name>

You can retrieve contact information for any person in your Contacts by saying the full name of the person.

Main Menu

User Interface

The SPH-m560 is equipped with the capability to provide multiple user interfaces that can provide a different look and feel, and be customized to user preference. The availability of a customized user interface is subject to your service provider. Below the idle screen, all user interfaces provide a main menu to support the operation and configuration of the handset's feature. This will be accessible via either a special soft "button" (softkey) or pressing the key. This user guide focuses on describing the functions and features of the main menu. For other ways to access the main menu, please see the additional printed material that comes with your phone or talk to your service provider's customer support.

Menu Styles

Your phone can display the various features and options in one of two different menu styles: grid and list. By default, your handset is set to the grid view style.

Grid style

The grid style displays the first level menu choices with graphical icons arranged in a grid pattern. In other menu levels, choices are arranged in a vertical list.

 To navigate through a first level menu, simply press the navigation key in the direction towards your desired menu choice. Once the desired menu option is highlighted, press .

List style

The list style displays all the various menu choices in a vertical list. As you navigate through the menu, menu options are highlighted. You can use your navigation keys to scroll through menus quickly and easily. The scroll bar at the right of the menu keeps track of your position in the menu at all times.

- To navigate through a menu, simply press the navigation key up or down. If you are in a first-level menu, such as **Settings**, you may also navigate to the next menu by pressing the navigation key left or right.
- You can also press the number on the keypad that corresponds to the menu choice to immediately access the menu.

Changing the Phone's Menu Style

Web

Navigating the Wireless Web

- Music displays music files that are available for purchase and download.

TV & Radio

- Activate the main menu, highlight the Entertainment menu, and press .
- Highlight TV & Radio and press . Please note that additional charges may apply for accessing this service.
- Once the application launches, navigate through the media content offered by your service provider using the navigation keys. Press to make your selections.
- Follow the on-screen instructions to purchase and play the desired media clip.

Music

- Activate the main menu, highlight the Entertainment menu, and press .
- 2. Highlight **Music** and press @. The Music Centre is displayed.
- Follow the onscreen instructions to download songs or other audio tracks. A service charge may apply.

Music Player

To start the music player:

Safety Getting the Most Out of Your Reception

Keeping Tabs on Signal Strength

The quality of each call you make or receive depends on the signal strength in your area. Your phone informs you of the current signal strength by displaying a number of bars next to the signal strength icon. The more bars displayed, the stronger the signal. If you're inside a building, being near a window may give you better reception.

Understanding the Power Save Feature

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. If your phone is active, it periodically rechecks service availability or you can check it yourself by pressing any key. Anytime the Power Save feature is activated, a message displays on the screen. When a signal is found, your phone returns to standby mode.

Understanding How Your Phone Operates

Your phone is basically a radio transmitter and receiver. When it's turned on, it receives and transmits radio frequency (RF) signals. When you use your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level. This power can range from 0.006 watts to 0.2 watts in digital mode.

Knowing Radio Frequency Safety

The design of your phone complies with updated NCRP standards described below. In 1991-92, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) joined in updating ANSI's 1982 standard for safety levels with respect to human exposure to RF signals. More than 120 scientists, engineers and physicians from universities, government health agencies and industries developed this updated standard after reviewing the available body of research. In 1993, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted this updated standard in a regulation. In August 1996, the FCC adopted hybrid standard consisting of the existing ANSI/IEEE standard and the guidelines published by the National Council of Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP).

Maintaining Your Phone's Peak Performance

There are several simple guidelines for operating your phone properly and maintaining safe, satisfactory service.

Speak directly into the mouthpiece.

 Avoid exposing your phone and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your phone does get wet, immediately turn the power off and remove the battery. If it's inoperable, return it to a dealer store or call Customer Support for service

Note: For the best care of your phone, only authorized personnel should service your phone and accessories. Faulty service may void the warranty.

Maintaining Safe Use of and Access to Your Phone

Failure to follow the instructions outlined may lead to serious personal injury and possible property damage.

Using Your Phone While Driving

Talking on your phone while driving (or operating the phone without a hands-free device) is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Laws vary as to specific restrictions. Remember that safety always comes first.

When using your phone in the car:

- Get to know your phone and its features, such as speed dial and re-dial.
- When available, use a hands-free device.
- Position your phone within easy reach.
- Let the person you are speaking to know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.
- Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when stationary or before pulling into traffic.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may divert your attention from the road.
- Dial 911 to report serious emergencies. It's free from your wireless phone.
- Use your phone to help others in emergencies.
- Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless number when necessary.

Following Safety Guidelines

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, always follow any special regulations in a given area. Turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from wireless phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating systems and/or entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or their representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. Also check with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.

Note: Always turn off the phone in health care facilities and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

Turning Off Your Phone Before Flying

Turn off your phone before boarding any aircraft. To prevent possible interference with aircraft systems, the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations require you to have permission from a crew member to use your phone while the plane is on the ground. To prevent any risk of interference, FCC regulations prohibit using your phone while the plane is in the air.

Turning Off Your Phone in Dangerous Areas

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn off your phone when in a blasting area or in other areas with signs indicating that two-way radios should be turned off. Construction crews often use remote-control RF devices to set off explosives.

Turn off your phone when you are in an area with a potentially explosive atmosphere. Although it is rare, your phone or its accessories could generate sparks. Sparks could cause an explosion or a fire resulting in bodily injury or even death. These areas are often, but not always, clearly marked. These areas include:

- Fueling areas such as gas stations.
- Below deck on boats
- Fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities.

- Areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust or metal powders.
- Any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.

Note: Never transport or store flammable gas, liquid or explosives in the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.

Restricting Children's Access to your Phone

Your phone is not a toy. Children should not be allowed to play with it because they could hurt themselves and others, damage the phone, dial 911 by mistake or make calls that increase your phone bill.

Warning Regarding Display

The display on your handset is made of glass or acrylic and could break if your handset is dropped or if it receives significant impact. Do not use if screen is broken or cracked as this could cause injury to you.

Caring for the Battery

Protecting Your Battery

The guidelines listed below help you get the most out of your battery's performance.

- Use only Samsung approved batteries and desktop chargers. These chargers are designed to maximize battery life. Using other batteries or chargers voids your warranty and may cause damage.
- In order to avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures that range from 32° F to 113° F (0° C to 45° C).
- Don't use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in high humidity areas, such as the bathroom.
- Never dispose of the battery by incineration.
- Keep the metal contacts on top of the battery clean.
- Don't attempt to disassemble or short-circuit the battery.
- The battery may need recharging if it has not been used for a long period of time.
- It's best to replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. When used correctly, the battery can be recharged hundreds of times before it needs replacing.


