











PRECAUTIONS



- The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing.
- Do not use where there are extremes of temperature (below 5°C or exceeding 35°C) or where direct sunlight may strike it.
- Because of the DVD player's extremely low noise and wide dynamic range, there might be a tendency to set the volume on the amplifier unnecessarily high. Doing so may produce an excessively large output from the amplifier which could damage your speakers.
- Sudden changes in the ambient temperature may cause condensation to form on the optical lens inside the unit. If this happens, take out the disc, leave the unit for about 1 hour, and then proceed to operate.
- When carrying the unit, be sure to remove any discs which may be inside and turn the power off. Wait at least 10 seconds, then unplug the mains lead from the AC outlet. Carrying the unit with any discs inside may damage the disc and/or the unit.
- Do not install this equipment in a confined space, such as a book case or built in cabinet.
- The DVD player is not completely disconnected from the mains when the O/ON button is set to the O position.

Important Information:

To connect this DVD player to a TV, TV must have a set of Audio/Video composite input sockets or a Euro-AV socket. You cannot use an aerial terminal to connect this DVD player.

IMPORTANT

If the plug supplied with this equipment is not suitable for the socket outlets in your home it should be cut off and replaced with the correct type.

Disposal of Plug

If the non rewireable plug is to be cut off, the removed plug should be disposed of carefully as there is a shock hazard should the plug be inserted into a live socket.

Replacing Fuse

The detachable fuse cover must be replaced after changing the fuse. Only a 3A fuse should be used and should comply with BS1362 and should carry the ASTA mark a.

The wires in the mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code;

Blue Neutral
Brown Live

The wires in the mains lead must be connected to the terminals in the plug as follows:

Wire colour Plug terminal marking
Blue N or Black or Blue
Brown L or Red or Brown


Do not connect either wire to the earth terminal.

If the mains plug contains a fuse this should be 3A, if a plug without a fuse is used the distribution board fuse should not be greater than 5A.

The unit is not disconnected from the mains unless it is unplugged from the AC outlet.

Inserting batteries


Install two "R6 (HP 7)" batteries (not supplied) as shown below.



Note:


Remove the batteries if the remote control is not to be used for a month or more. Batteries left in the unit may leak and cause damage.

Notes on connections

 Selecting TV system: Be sure the TV SYSTEM switch (rear of the unit) setting corresponds with your local TV system (PAL or NTSC).



- Do not connect the DVD player to a VCR directly.
 The playback picture will be distorted because DVD discs are copy protected.
- When you connect the DVD player to your TV and other equipment, be sure to turn off the power and disconnect all of the equipments from the wall outlet until all the connections have been made.
- Please refer to the instruction manuals for the components that you are connecting (TV, AV amplifier, etc.).

Connecting to a TV with an Audio and S-video cables

If your TV has a S-video input socket, connect the DVD player as shown below. (The VIDEO OUT socket connection is not necessary.) You can enjoy clearer picture playback.


Select "S-VIDEO" when using the S-VIDEO OUT socket.



Connecting to a TV with a EURO-AV cable

If your TV has a EURO-AV socket, connect the DVD player as shown below. (The AUDIO and VIDEO OUT sockets connections are not necessary.)

Select "RGB" when using the A/V EURO CONNECTOR.



Connecting to a HiFi system with analog two-channel stereo sound


As an alternative to using the TV's speakers, the sound can also be played back through a HiFi system.

Connect an audio cable (not supplied) to the AUDIO OUT sockets of the DVD player and to the appropriate sockets of the HiFi system.

The AUDIO OUT sockets can also be used for connection to an AV system with Dolby Pro Logic decoder.

Connecting to a digital multi-channel AV amplifier

The digital multi-channel sound of a DVD can best be decoded and played with a multi-channel AV amplifier (MPEG audio decoder or Dolby Digital decoder).



The AV amplifier has to be able to process the DTS audio signal in order to play a DVD with DTS. If it cannot, then you will not be able to hear the DVD.

Note:

- To enjoy Dolby Digital sound, select "Dolby Digital: 5.1ch" in AUDIO on the INITIAL SETTINGS. (See Page 12.)
- To enjoy MPEG sound, select "MPEG: MPEG" in AUDIO on the INITIAL SETTINGS. (See Page 12.)
- To enjoy DTS sound, select "DTS: ON" in AUDIO on the INITIAL SETTINGS. (See Page 12.)

Headphones

Connect stereo headphones (not supplied) to the PHONES socket for monitoring or for private listening. Use the PHONE LEVEL control to adjust the volume of the headphones.

Region number

Region number (Regional restriction code) is built-in to the DVD player and DVD discs.

There is a region number on the rear of the unit.

The same region number or region number "ALL" of DVD discs can be used on this unit.

Note:

- Only the above types of discs can be played on this unit. DVD-ROM, CD-ROM, SVCD, CVD, etc. cannot be played.
- CD-R can be played back, but it depends on the recorded condition.
- This unit is to be used exclusively with the NTSC or PAL colour system. SECAM system discs cannot be used with this unit.

DVD discs are divided into titles, and the titles are sub-divided into chapters.

Notes on handling discs

- Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight, high humidity or high temperatures for extended periods of time.
- Discs should be returned to their cases after use.
- Do not apply paper or write anything on the disc surface.
- Handle the disc by its edge. Do not touch the playing surface (glossy side).
- Fingerprints and dust should be carefully wiped off the playing surface of the disc with a soft cloth.
 - Wipe in a straight motion from the centre to the outside of the disc.
- Never use chemicals such as record cleaning sprays, antistatic sprays or fluids, benzene or thinner to clean discs.

BASIC OPERATION

Important note:

- This instruction manual explains the basic instruction of this DVD player using the remote control unit (RB-5100).
- Some DVD or Video CD discs have different functions that may not be explained in this instruction manual. You may be needed extra instructions. In this case, please follow the instructions displayed on the TV screen or jacket or case of the disc.
- " \(\rightarrow \)" may appear on the TV screen during operation. This icon means that the function is not available on the disc now.

Before starting

- Turn on the TV and select the channel for the DVD player.
 Select the playback picture size according to the aspect ratio of the TV
- Turn on the HiFi system, AV amplifier, etc. and select the audio input for the DVD player.

Basic play

Note:

- · Do not touch the disc tray while it is moving.
- Never place anything except a disc on the disc tray. Foreign objects can damage the unit.
- · Do not apply excessive force to the disc tray.
- Discs must be placed on the disc tray one at a time.


When operation buttons are pressed, that operation is displayed on the TV screen. The display turns off after several seconds.

- 1. Press the U/ON button.
 - · The STANDBY indicator turns off and the displays light.
 - "SANYO" logo appears on the TV screen.
 - "READING" then "NO DISC" appears on the display.
- 2. Press the OPEN/CLOSE button.
 - "OPEN" appears and the disc tray opens.

Note:

To open or close the disc tray, be sure to use the OPEN/CLOSE button. Do not press the disc tray with your hand.

3. Place the disc with the label facing up on the disc tray.



For 12 cm disc

For 8 cm disc

- Press the PLAY button. The disc tray closes then play starts automatically.
 - "Play ▶" briefly appears on the screen.
 - "CLOSE", "READING", "DVD" (or "VCD" or "CD") then the title/ chapter (or track) number and elapsed playing time appear on the display.

Note:

If the disc is loaded with the label side downward (and it is a single sided disc), or if a badly scratched disc is loaded, "NO DISC" (or "DISC ERROR" or "NO PLAY") appears. If this occurs, load the disc correctly or replace the disc.

If a menu screen appears on the TV screen...

Press the ▲, ▶, ▼ or ◀ button (or the number buttons), then press the ENT button to select the desired item. Playback of the selected item will start. Note:

For more details, please refer to the jacket or case of the disc.

Stopping play

Press the STOP button once. The player memories the point where you stopped. If you press the PLAY button, play starts automatically from the point where you stopped. (Resuming Playback)

Note:

- · Some discs may not start resuming playback.
- If the STOP button is pressed twice, the player stops completely.

Continuing play from where you stopped watching (LAST MEMO PLAY)

Note:

You must set "LastMemo Play: ON" first. (See Page 12.)

- During play, press the LAST MEMO button at the point from which you
 want to resume play later. "Last Memo" briefly appears on the screen.
 "LAST MEMORY" appears on the display. Play stops automatically.
- 2. Remove the disc or turn off the power.
- Load the disc (and press the PLAY button), or turn on the power. "Last Memo Play" briefly appears on the screen. Play resumes from the point where you stopped. (The memory is released.) If desired, press the LAST MEMO button again.

Note:

- Points on up to 5 discs can be memorized.
- The Last Memo Play mode may not work correctly with some discs.

VARIOUS PLAYING FUNCTIONS

Chapter (Track) skip



Skipping forward

Press the NEXT button (or the ►►I button on the front panel) during play to skip to the next chapter (or track). A chapter (or track) is skipped each time the button is pressed.

Skipping back

Press the PREV button (or the I◀◀ button on the front panel) during play to skip back to the beginning of the chapter (or track) currently play. Press the button again immediately to skip back to the beginning of the previous chapter (or track).

Title/Chapter (Track) search

- Press the SEARCH MODE button once during play or in the stop mode. "TITLE/CHAPTER SEARCH" or "TRACK SEARCH" screen appears.
- 2. Press the number buttons to enter the title (or track) number.
- 3. Press the ♥ button.
- Press the number buttons to enter the chapter number. (For Video CD and Music CD, skip this step.) Note:
 - If you made a mistake, press the CLEAR button.
 - To guit this menu, press the SEARCH MODE button twice.
- Press the ENT button. The selected title and chapter (or track) play starts.

Time search

- Press the SEARCH MODE button twice during play. "TIME SEARCH" screen appears.
- 2. Press the number buttons to enter the time.

Example:

20 minutes 5 seconds

Press 2, 0, 0 and 5.

1 hour 4 minutes 35 seconds

Press 1, 0, 4, 3 and 5.

Note:

- If you made a mistake, press the CLEAR button.
- To quit this menu, press the SEARCH MODE button.
- 3. Press the ENT button. Play starts from the searched time.

"\(\rightarrow\)" may appear on the TV screen during operation. This icon means that the function is not available on the disc now.

Fast play

Press the FWD or REV button repeatedly to select the fast speed forward or reverse play.

DVD/Video CD:

"FF1 ▶▶", "FF2 ▶▶", "FF3 ▶▶" or "FR1 ◄◄", "FR2 ◄◄", "FR3 ◄◄" Music CD:

"FF1 ▶▶", "FF2 ▶▶" or "FR1 ◀◀", "FR2 ◀◀"

Press the PLAY button to return to normal play.

Slow-motion play

Forward slow play [DVD], [Video CD]/Reverse slow play [DVD]

Press the FWD SLOW or REV SLOW button repeatedly to select the forward or reverse slow speed play.

"SF1 ▶", "SF2 ▶", "SF3 ▶" or "SR1 ◄1", "SR2 ◄1", "SR3 ◄1" Press the PLAY button to return to normal play.

Note

The sound is muted during fast play or slow-motion play.

Still picture (Pause)

[DVD], [Video CD]: Still picture mode, [CD]: Pause mode
Press the PAUSE/STEP button during play. "II" appears on the display.
"Pause II" appears on the TV screen. Press the PLAY button to resume normal play.

Note: The sound is muted.


Frame by frame advance play [DVD], [Video CD]

Press the PAUSE/STEP button during still play. "Step ▮ ▶" appears on the screen. Each time the button is pressed, the picture advances one frame. Press the PLAY button to resume normal play.

Note:

- The sound is muted.
- Frame play is operated forward only.

Zoom feature [DVD]




- Press the ZOOM button during normal play or still play.
 The player magnifies the image (2 times) in the centre of the picture.
- 2. Press the ▲, ▼, ◄ or ▶ button to change the zoom point.
- 3. To return to normal play or still play, press the ZOOM button again. Note:

Some discs may not work Zoom feature.

Viewing from a desired camera angle (Multi-Angle)

Some DVD discs may contain scenes which have been shot simultaneously from a number of different camera angles.



The jacket or case of discs that are recorded with angles will be marked. Example:



Note: The recorded angles differ depending on the disc used.

- 1. Play the disc that is recorded with angles.
- 2. Press the ANGLE button repeatedly until the desired angle appears. Example:

Angle

Angle replay

During Multi-angle play screen, press the ANGLE REPLAY button. The player skips back to last approximately 10 seconds, changes it to the next camera angle and plays it, and continues play. If desired, press the button again.

Normal repeat play

Press the REPEAT button during play (or programmed play) of the title or chapter (or track) you want to repeat.

Each time the button is pressed, the repeat mode changes as follows.

[DVD]

All Repeat: Repeat all titles

Title Repeat: Repeat of title being played Chapter Repeat: Repeat of chapter being played (Program Repeat: Repeat programmed play)

Clear: Normal play mode

[Video CD], [CD]

All Repeat: Repeat all tracks


Repeat 1: Repeat of track being played (Program Repeat: Repeat programmed play)

Clear: Normai play mode

Note:

When "All Repeat" appears on the TV screen, "REPEAT ALL" appears on the display. But, "REPEAT 1" appears on the display in all other repeat modes.

Designated range repeat play (A-B Repeat)



- 1. Press the A-B REPEAT button during play at the beginning of the section you want to repeat (Point A). "Repeat A-" appears on the screen. "REPEAT A-B" blinks on the display.
- Press the A-B REPEAT button again at the end of the section (Point B). "Repeat A-B" briefly appears on the screen. "REPEAT A-B" remains lit on the display.

The section between points A and B is played repeatedly.

For Video CD, wait 2 seconds at least before pressing the button.

3. To return to normal play, press the A-B REPEAT button again.

Note:

Normal repeat play or A-B repeat play mode may not work correctly with some discs.

Return button (RETURN) for Video CD

Normally, it returns to the previous menu during play when the RETURN button is pressed.

Note:

The operation differs according to the content of the Video CD.


Programmed play

Up to 32 selections can be programmed.

Programming procedure

- Press the PROGRAM button during play or stop mode. "PROGRAM" screen appears. "PROGRAM" blinks and "Pr 1" appears on the display.
- 2. Press the ▲, ▼, ◄ or ▶ button to select the title, chapter or track.
- 3. Press the ENT button.
- 4. Repeat steps 2-3 above to select another title, chapter or track.

Example:



Note:

If you want to guit this menu, press the PROGRAM button.

Press the PLAY button to start play. "PROGRAM" remains lit on the display.

Note:

If you wish to play the programme again, press the PROGRAM button to call up the programme screen then press the PLAY button.

To clear the programme one by one

In the programming mode, press the \triangle , ∇ , \triangleleft or \triangleright button to select the programme number. Then press the CLEAR button.

To clear all the programmes

In the programming mode, press the ▲, ▼, ◀ or ▶ button to select "ALL CLEAR". Then press the ENT button.

Setting and playing bookmarks

Up to five bookmarks can be memorized for the last five discs played, then select them directly for playback.

Note: Some discs may not work bookmark function.

Setting or clearing bookmarks

 Press the BOOKMARK button during play. "BOOKMARK" screen appears.

Example:

BOOKMARK

No:

T,C

1: NONE 2: NONE

3 : NONE

4 : NONE

5: NONE

2. Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the bookmark number.

Press the ENT button at the starting point to be viewed (listened to) again.

Example:

BOOKMARK

No: T, C 1: ENTRY 1, 6 2: NONE 3: NONE

4 : NONE 5 : NONE

Note:

- If you made a mistake, press the CLEAR button.
- · To guit this menu, press the BOOKMARK button.

Recalling a bookmark

- 1. Press the BOOKMARK button.
- 2. Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the bookmark to be recalled.
- Press the PLAY button. Play resumes from the point corresponding to the selected bookmark.

Clearing a bookmark

- 1. Press the BOOKMARK button.
- Press the ▲ or ▼ button to select the bookmark to be cleared then press the CLEAR button.

Selecting a title menu

- Press the TITLE button. A list of the titles on the disc appears. Note:
 - Press the TITLE button again to resume play from the scene when the TITLE button was first pressed.
- Press the ▲, ▼, ◄ or ▶ button (or the number buttons) to select the desired title.
- 3. Press the ENT button. The selected title play starts.

Selecting a DVD menu

- Press the MENU button. The main menu screen appears. Note: Press the MENU button again to resume play.
- Press the ▲, ▼, ◄ or ▶ button (or the number buttons) to select the desired menu.
- 3. Press the ENT button. The selected menu play starts.

Note:

- The selecting a title menu or DVD menu operation may differ depending on the disc used.
- Selecting a title menu or DVD menu may not be possible on some discs.

Selecting subtitle language

This operation works only with discs on which multiple subtitle languages are recorded.


- Press the SUBTITLE button during play. "SUBTITLE MODE" screen appears.
- Press the ▲, ▼, ◄ or ▶ button to select the desired subtitle language then press the ENT button.

Note:

- In some cases, the subtitle language is not changed to the selected one.
- When a disc supporting the closed caption is played, the subtitle and the closed caption may overlap each other on the TV screen. In this case, turn the subtitle off.
- When the desired language is not selected even if the button is pressed, the language is not available on the disc.
- When the power is turned on or the player is stopped completely or the disc is replaced, select the subtitle language again.
- If the subtitle language is not necessary, select "OFF".

Selecting audio soundtrack language (Multi-Language)

This operation works only with discs on which multiple audio soundtrack languages are recorded.



- 1. Press the AUDIO button during play.
- Press the AUDIO button repeatedly until the desired language appears on the screen.

Example:

Language Change 02 GER

Note:

- When the desired language is not selected even if the button is pressed, the language is not available on the disc.
- When the power is turned on or the player is stopped completely or the disc is replaced, select the language again.
- If the language is not recorded on the disc, only the available language on the disc will be heard.
- If "Others" is selected, enter the language code. (See "LANGUAGE CODE LIST".)

Changing the audio channel output [Video CD], [CD]

During Video CD/CD play, press the AUDIO button to select an audio channel.

LEFT MONO --- RIGHT MONO --- STEREO --- LEFT MONO ...

Selecting picture mode

Press the PICTURE MODE button. Each time the button is pressed, the picture mode changes as follows:

PICTURE MODE
Standard --- Mild --- Black and White --- Standard ...

Selecting display mode

Press the ON SCREEN button to show the disc information (Title, Chapter, Title pass time, etc.).

Example:

DVD		Play ►
TITLE: 01	Title pass time	00:05:45
CHAPTER: 04	Chapter pass time	00:00:51

AUDIO: ENG Dolby Digital 5.1ch SUBTITLE: ENG ANGLE: 1

DVD Play ►
TITLE: 01 Title remain time 00:56:07
CHAPTER: 14 Chapter remain time 00:00:37

AUDIO: ENG Dolby Digital 5.1ch SUBTITLE: Others ANGLE: 1

Once the initial settings have been completed, the player can always be operated under the same conditions. The settings will be retained in the memory until they are changed, even if the power is turned off.

Common procedures of initial settings

- 1. Press the SET UP button in the stop mode. "SET UP MENU" screen appears on the TV screen.
- 2. Press the ▲, ▼, ◄ or ▶ button, then press the ENT button to select the menu. Please follow these on the screen.
- 3. Press the SET UP button to quit this menu.

Example:


Notes on the flat connection lead

When using the system DC-X5D and optional Tape deck and/or MD deck, remove the fixer and protective tape before connecting.

 Do not remove the tape on the plug that is not used.

Note:
