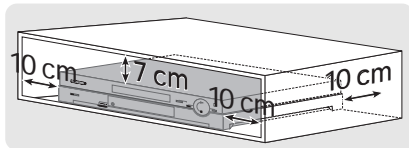

# Precautions

## Setting up

Ensure that the mains supply in your house complies with that indicated on the identification sticker located at the back of your set. Place the DVD player on a suitable base (furniture). Make sure the ventilation slots are not covered. Leave a 7 - 10 cm gap all around the unit, as shown below.



## Condensation

If your set and / or a disc have been stored in a cold atmosphere, as for example during transportation in the winter, wait approximately 2 hours until they have reached room temperature, to prevent serious damage.

## Use

This equipment is not intended for industrial use. It is designed specifically for domestic purpose.

## This device is intended for continuous operation.

Switching off the DVD player to the stand-by mode does not disconnect the electricity supply. In order to separate the player completely from the mains, the unit has to be disconnected by unplugging the mains plug – especially when left unused for a long period of time.

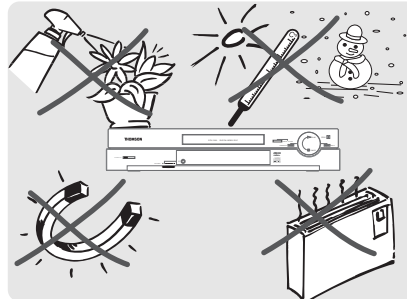
## Maintenance

Use a dry and clean soft cloth. Do not use any scouring agents, solvents or abrasive products. If an object or liquid gets into the set, unplug it immediately and have it checked by an authorized technician.

## Caution

Protect the unit from damp and excess heat. Disconnect the power cable from the mains electricity supply when the unit malfunctions. In particular, you should ensure that the motor driven disc drawer is not prevented from moving properly. If the disc loading system is hindered, the loading mechanism may be damaged. Install the DVD player horizontally, away from a source of heat (fireplace) or equipment creating strong magnetic or electric fields.

- Do not place anything heavy on it.
- Do not stack components on it.



## For your safety:

- Never open the unit or any of its components. It can be dangerous for you or for certain fragile components. You are risking electric shocks and are endangered by the laser beam.

## For your discs

### Always ...

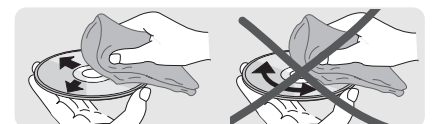
- handle your discs with care. Hold a disc with the fingers touching the border or the hole,




- place the disc with the label facing upside (in case of a single-sided disc),
- place the disc properly into the tray using the proper guide area,
- use a soft cloth to clean a disc if necessary wiping from the centre to the border,
- replace a disc into its case after playing and store it in a vertical position.

### Never ...

- never close the tray with two discs inside or a disc slipping out of the guide area,
- never play cracked, chipped or deformed discs nor try to repair them with adhesive tape or glue,
- never write on the disc,
- never move the player during playback,
- never scratch discs or store them in places of direct sunlight, high humidity or high temperature,
- never try to play a Photo CD or CD-R in this player,
- never use record cleaning sprays, benzine, static electricity liquids or any other solvent, if the disc surface is soiled. Wipe gently with a soft, damp (water only) cloth,
- never wipe the disc in a circular motion, since circular scratches are likely to occur, which will cause noise.



 Should you hear strange noise or vibration after starting playback, quickly press the STOP button on the remote control or the player.

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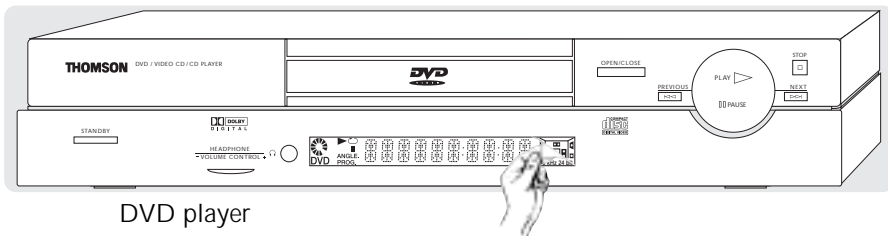

# Before you start



## Basic connections

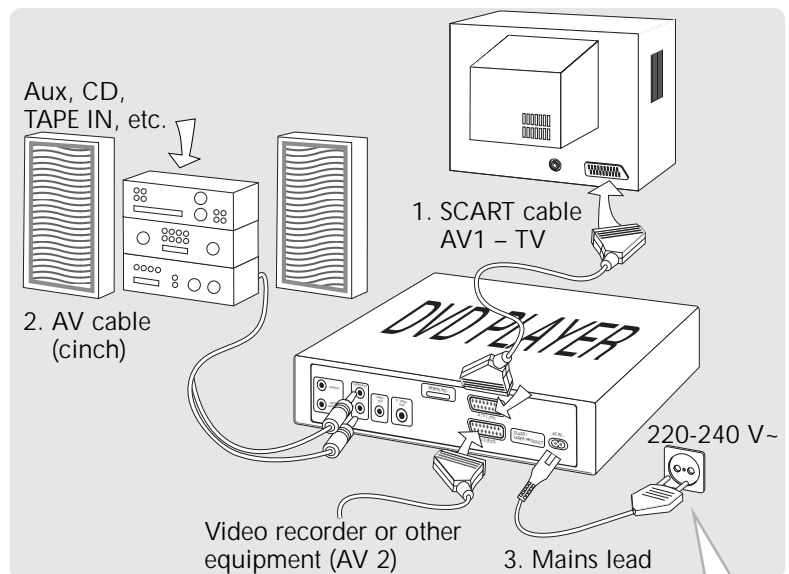
- Please install your DVD player horizontally with enough space around for ventilation.
- Protect the player against humidity, heat, cold and strong magnetic fields (i. e. speakers ...).
- Do not stack components on top of the DVD player.
- Connect all components before plugging any power cords in the wall outlet.
- Always turn off the DVD player, TV and other components before you connect or disconnect any cables.
- Insert all cables firmly into their jacks.
- Be sure that colors of connectors and plugs match for the audio connection.

1 Connect your television to your DVD player.

2 Connect your stereo system to your DVD player (optional).

- If you have also other pieces of equipment connected to your TV, or you want to use other cables, please see pages 34 - 39.

3 Connect your DVD player to the mains.



For users in Great Britain:  
Be sure to read page 47 about the plug.

## Initial set-up

1 Switch on your TV set and your DVD player.

2 Press **STOP** button.

3 Press **menu** button.

You see the menu on the right.

- If you do not see the menu, select the proper AV input of your TV set manually (see the manual of your TV set).

4 Press the appropriate **number button** for your language (example: **button 1** for English).

- Now English is the language for the menus of the player as well as the language of menus, dialogues, and subtitles of DVDs (if available). If you want to change languages, see page 22-23.
- This choice applies to all DVDs. For temporarily changes of dialogue and subtitle languages see page 19.

5 Now you can play discs.

But we recommend to proceed with the set-up on the pages 23-29:

- "4:3" or "16:9" TV set, - Displays and more,
- Picture / sound output optimization, - Rating.

## The "info" menus



Level 1 and 2:

- 1 Play a Disc; press the button **PLAY**.
- 2 Press
  - 1x the yellow *info* button for Info level 1,
  - 2x the yellow *info* button for Info level 2.

The Info menu may differ since it depends on type and content of the Disc (DVD, Audio CD, and Video CD, see page 9).

## How to use the menus



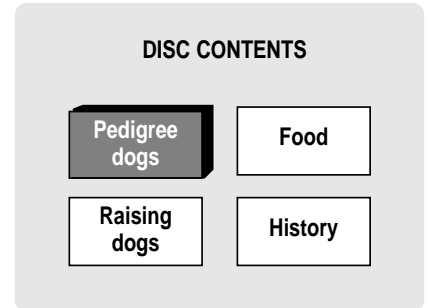
Move to the items using the arrow buttons < >, ^ v. Use *ok* button to confirm a selection (or use number buttons to select without confirmation).

Use *return* button to go back menu levels.

Press the buttons *info*, *guide* and *menu* once again to remove the menus.

## The "contents" menu of the Disc

## The "possibility" menu of the Disc

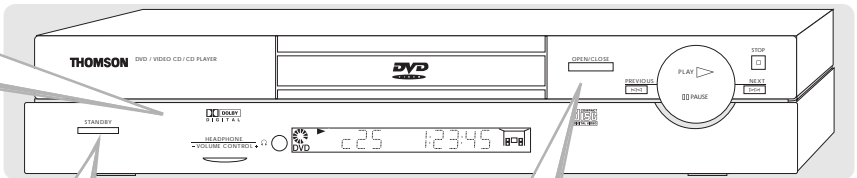

# Front and display

**HEADPHONE/VOLUME CONTROL**  
to plug a headphone (3.5 mm jack) and control its volume.



**STANDBY** (⏻), **PLAY**, **PAUSE**, **STOP**, **▶▶**, **◀◀** buttons see page 6/7.

**STANDBY**  
to switch your player on and off (stand-by), (lights up when power is off).

**OPEN / CLOSE**  
the disc tray to load or unload a 8 cm or 12 cm disc in its special guide area.

A disc turns (according to slow, play, or fast).



Disc playback (blinks when resume memory is on, page 12).

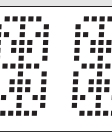

**ANGLE**

You can now select different viewing points of the scene recorded by different cameras (page 18).

**PROG.**

Audio CD, Video CD: The player just performs a programmed succession of tracks (page 20).



**96 kHz 24 bit**

**OPEN** The disc tray is open.

**CLOSE** The disc tray is just being retracted.

**NO DISC** There is no disc loaded.

**NO PLAY** Playback is not possible because the setting of the "RATING" prohibits playing (page 28) or the region code no. is other than #2 (page 40).

Indicates the current audio channel information of the disc:

2 channels (stereo, or Dolby Prologic) or 5.1 channels (Dolby Digital - AC-3 or MPEG 2 multi-channel).

**96kHz 24bit** Indicates that a disc in 96 kHz / 24 bit audio is being played (page 36-39).

This part also indicates various messages concerning operations such as **PLAY**, **STOP**, **SEARCH**, **STILL**, **REPEAT**, **RANDOM** ...



## Discs you can play



### Digital video discs

12 cm and 8 cm, single or double sided, single or dual layer DVDs are high density optical discs on which high quality picture and audio are recorded by means of digital signals.



### Audio CDs

12 cm and 8 cm.



### Video CDs

12 cm and 8 cm (with or without playback control).



### NTSC playback on PAL TV set

In addition to the PAL system DVDs and video CDs, you may enjoy your favourite NTSC system movie titles as well (a PAL 60 Hz capable TV is required).

## According to the disc



If available on the DVD you may choose via TV on-screen menu information such as titles, chapters, time info, sound track languages, subtitles, ratings (age limit), camera angles and more.

Disc menu operation and contents may differ from disc to disc. Please refer to the instructions accompanying the disc.

- Some discs may have been authored to prevent operation such as: Chapter skip, picture scan, and repeat play.
- When "⊘" appears on-screen, it indicates an invalid button press.

## Why a disc cannot be played



Discs you cannot play with this unit: CD-I, CD-ROM, DVD-ROM, DVD-RAM, CDV, CD-G. DVD with regional code other than region No. #2. If played, the message "NO PLAY" appears in the unit's display.

Do not try to play Photo CD or CD-R.



### Regional code number

Your DVD player is designed and manufactured to respond to the region management information that is recorded on a DVD disc.

If the DVD disc does not carry the region code corresponding to your player, it cannot be played. The region code for your player is region No. #2. (Europe, the Middle East, Republic of South Africa, Japan.)

# Basic play

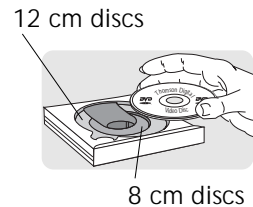
## Playback

Switch on your DVD player and your TV set. Select the correct AV input on your TV, if necessary. You may also turn on your HiFi system (properly connected to the player).

⚠ Please see page 20-21 for audio CD / video CD specials.

1 Open the disc tray using **OPEN/CLOSE** button on the set.

2 Place a single sided disc the label facing upwards.



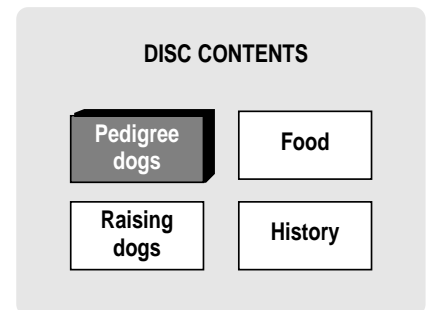
3 Start playback using **PLAY** button:  
The disc is playing.

Some discs may show a menu to select:  
Follow its on-screen help.

Choose a menu item using the **< >**, **^ v** arrows.  
Start playing using **ok** button.

- According to the menu, exit the menu, if necessary, using *guide* or *menu* button.
- To stop play and return to the menu screen:
  - DVD: Press *guide*, *menu*, or *return* (depending on the disc used).
  - Video CD: Press *return*.

Example



4 Stop playback, press **STOP** button.

- This location on the disc is memorized by the player, see below 'Resume memory'.
- Press **STOP** twice, to stop a disc without resume memory.
- **When "⊗" appears on-screen, it indicates an invalid button press.**



## Resume memory

If you press the button **STOP** or **⏻** (STANDBY), the player remembers this point on the disc. The symbol "▶" blinks slowly in the players display (page 10).

If you now press **PLAY** button, playback starts from this point.

To erase 'resume memory', press **STOP** button twice or unload the disc (but do not a press the "⏻" button).

Resume memory does not work with interactive discs (without play time info).

## Auto power off

If not used, the player will switch off automatically after 30 minutes.

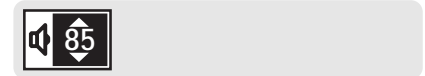
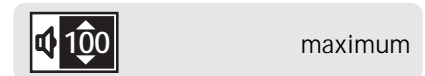
## Master volume

For each: DVDs, audio CDs, video CDs



The different types of discs (DVD, Audio CD, Video CD) may differ a lot regarding its volume levels. This function allows to harmonize them.

- 1 Start playback using **PLAY** button.
- 2 Press the yellow **info** button twice; you see the info strip (level 2) on-screen.
- 3 Move to master volume "100" using the **▶** arrow.
- 4 Set the volume level using the **▲ ▼** arrows.
- 5 Exit the display with **info** button.
  - Repeat these steps for each disc category: DVD, audio CD, and video CD.

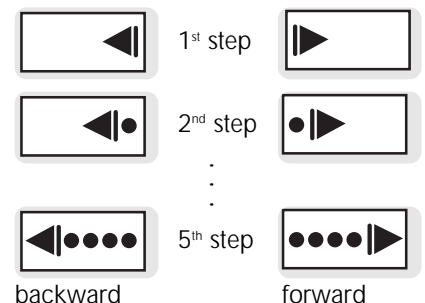


## Stills and frame advance

- 1 Start playback using **PLAY** button.
- 2 Press **PAUSE** button for a still.
- 3 Press the button repeatedly, to see the pictures one after another.
  - **PLAY** button resumes playback.

## Slow motion

- 1 Start playback using **PLAY** button.
- 2 Press **PAUSE** button for a still.
- 3 Start slow backwards or forwards using **REV** or **FWD** button.
  - Press repeatedly for higher speeds (5 steps).
  - **PLAY** button resumes playback.
  - For DVDs, in comparison with forward slow motion, backward slow motion may lack smoothness due to MPEG2 video data structure.





# Access to a scene

## Chapter / track skip

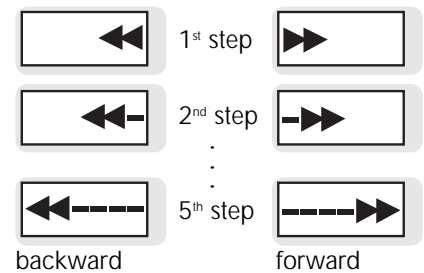
During playback skip to next or previous chapter / track using **▶▶|** or **|◀◀** button.

- Pressing **|◀◀** button once skips to the beginning of the current chapter / track (twice for the previous).
- Pressing **▶▶|** / **|◀◀** button repeatedly skips as many chapters / track forward/backward as number of presses.

## Picture / track scan

During playback press **REV** or **FWD** button for search backward or forward.

- Press repeatedly for higher speeds (5 steps).
- **PLAY** button resumes playback.

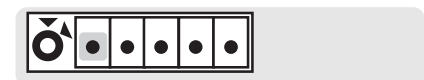


## Markers

The player can remember up to 5 locations on the disc as long as the disc remains loaded. You can immediately return to any of these 5 marker positions.

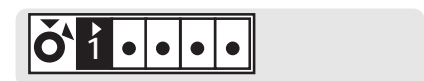
This function operates only with discs for which the elapsed time appears on the player's display during playback.

- 1 During play call the **marker** button on the top left part of the remote control. You see the marker display on-screen.



### 2a Placing markers

- 1 Select one of the 5 marker fields using **<** **>** arrows.
- 2 Place the marker using **ok** button as soon as you see the wanted scene. A number now appears in that marker field.
  - "." indicates: no marker stored, a stored marker will be replaced.



### 2b To play a marked scene

- 1 Select one of the numbered marker fields using **<** **>** arrows.
- 2 Do you now press **^** arrow, playback starts from the marked point.
  - To erase a marker place a new one in its field.
  - Some subtitles around the marker may fail to appear.



- 3 Exit the display with **marker** button.



## Titles, chapters, tracks, or elapsed time



A DVD may contain several titles which could be different movies or video programmes. These titles may be divided into chapters each of which is numbered, to give you a quick access to specific parts of the DVD. Tracks give you a quick access to specific parts of the audio CD and video CD (page 21).

1 Start playback using **PLAY** button.

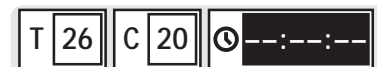
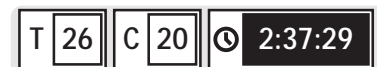
2 Press the yellow **info** button:

You see the info strip on-screen with the current title "T", chapter "C" (or the current track "T") and the elapsed time "⌚".



3 Choose "T" (title), "C" (chapter), track "T" or "⌚" (time) using **< >** arrows.

- Some discs cannot be searched by elapsed time, even if it appears on-screen.



4 Select titles / chapters / tracks using **^ v** arrows. For access with elapsed time use **number buttons**.

- You can also select using **number buttons**.
- To erase a wrong number press **<** arrow.
- If you select an amount of time not existing on the disc, "⌚" may then appear on-screen.

5 Start playback using **ok** button.



# Sound and picture

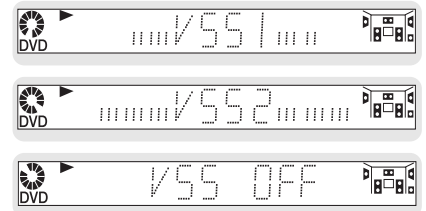
## Virtual Surround Sound

For DVDs

Playing Dolby Digital (AC-3) 5.1 channel DVDs you can hear virtual surround sound as if coming from non-existent rear speakers (even if you use only a stereo TV or a two-channel stereo system).

- 1 Start playback using **PLAY** button.
- 2 Press **virtual surround** (⏮⏭) button on the top left part of the remote control:
  - a 1x for a natural effect (VSS1),
  - b 2x for a more emphasized effect (VSS2), and
  - c the 3<sup>rd</sup> time, to cancel virtual Surround effect again.

- Virtual Surround sound may not be so impressive with some discs.
- Turn off the TV set surround sound and other surround effects (HiFi system) when using this virtual surround system.
- For optimum effects it is recommended that the distance between the TV set and the listening position should be about 3 or 4 times the distance between the left and the right front speakers.
- You also can set surround sound via menu: Press the yellow **info** button twice, then  $\blacktriangleright$  arrow. Set using  $\blacktriangle$   $\blacktriangledown$  arrows.

## Picture soft / sharp

For DVDs and video CDs



To have an appropriate setting for different quality video recordings.

- 1 Start playback using **PLAY** button.
- 2 Press the yellow **info** button twice; you see the Info strip on-screen (level 2).
- 3 Move to "⏮ x" picture using the  $\blacktriangleright$  arrow.
- 4 Switch the picture mode as you require in three steps from sharp to soft using  $\blacktriangle$   $\blacktriangledown$  arrows.
- 5 Exit the display with **info** button.





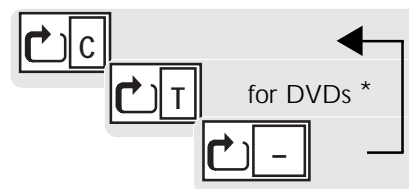

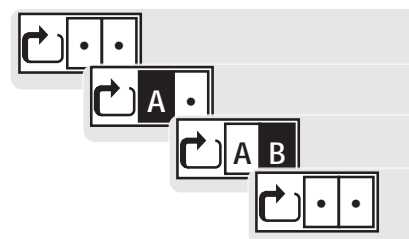
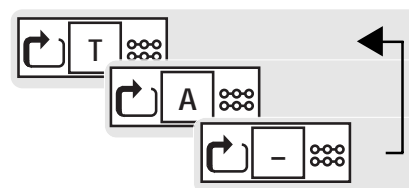
## Repeat play

Repeat the current title (or the track) "T", the chapter "C" or all the disc "A" (only audio / video CD).

- 1 Start playback using **PLAY** button.
- 2 Press the **repeat** button on the top left part of the remote control once, twice or three times.
  - DVD: "C" (chapter) → "T" (title) → "-" (normal play),
  - audio / video CDs: "T" (track) → "A" (all the disc) → "-" (normal play).
  - Repeat play only works with discs that show the elapsed time in the player's display.
  - It may not work correctly with some discs (PBC, interactive discs).
  - You can also select repeat play by pressing **info** button twice and  $\blacktriangleright$  arrow to  $\square$ . Set using  $\wedge$   $\vee$  arrows.
  - **Repeating programmes**  
for audio CDs and video CDs (no PBC, page 21).  
For programmes see page 20.  
During playback repeat the current track, programme, or switch off repeat play: Press **repeat** button once, twice or three times.
  - **Repeating sections between point A and point B.**
    - 1 Start playback using **PLAY** button.
    - 2 During playback press **info** button twice. You see the info strip (level 2) on-screen.
    - 3 Press **ok** button at the point you want repeat play to start (point A).
    - 4 Press **ok** button again at the point you want repeat play to stop (point B), repeat play starts.
    - 5 To return to normal play press **repeat** button several times, till you see " $\square$  ..".



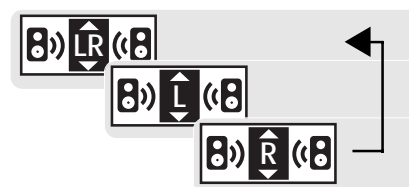
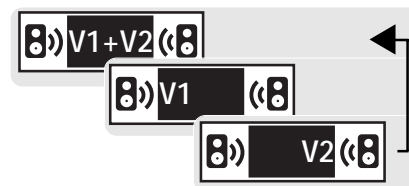

## Karaoke discs and vocals

For DVDs / video CDs.

- 1 Start playback using **PLAY** button.
- 2 Press the red "🔊" button (Audio); you see the karaoke display on-screen.
- 3
  - 2-vocals karaoke DVD:  
Select using  $\blacktriangleleft$   $\blacktriangleright$  arrows → (V1+V2) → (V1) → (V2) → etc.
  - 1-vocal karaoke DVD:  
Select using  $\blacktriangleleft$   $\blacktriangleright$  arrows → on → off → etc.
  - Video CD:  
Select using  $\wedge$   $\vee$  arrows → Left and Right (LR) → Left (L) → Right (R) → etc.

# Angle / rating

- Perhaps you want to change (if available) the dialogue language of a film (synchronisation), the subtitle language, the camera angle temporarily for one disc or override the rating (Set-up, page 23/28). Three dedicated buttons (📺, 🗣️, 📺) on your remote control offer easy direct access while viewing.
- Some DVDs provide a disc menu. Temporary change of languages (audio, subtitles) or camera angle may also be possible by pressing the **menu** button (sometimes **guide** button) during playback. Then follow the steps offered by the menu to make your selections.
- You can also select languages and angles pressing the **info** button (level 1) and > arrow. Set using the ^ v arrows.
- All the changes (audio, subtitles, rating, angle) return to the player's initial settings after the disc is removed or power is switched off.
- If the disc doesn't contain the set-up language of the player, it will select the default language of the disc.

## Camera angle

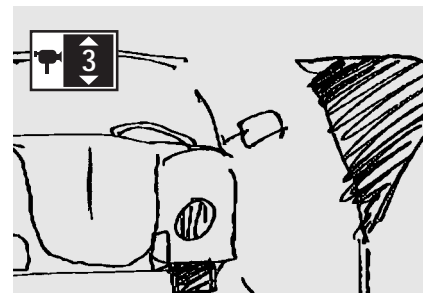
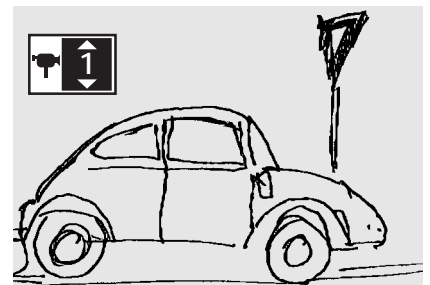


### For DVDs

On a DVD, particular scenes of the movie may be recorded by the studio from various points of view (up to 9 camera angles), which you can select. For example, enjoying a film, you could switch while watching the same scene, from the side, from above or maybe from the front etc. But note that not all DVDs contain multiple camera angles.

- Each angle number corresponds to a different view angle.
- With some discs you can identify the sections that contain multi-camera angles by "ANGLE" appearing on the player's display.

- 1 Start playback using **PLAY** button.
- 2 Press the violet 📺 button; you see the angle "📺" display on-screen.
- 3 Select a camera angle number, using the ^ v arrows.
- 4 To exit angle "📺" display, press the violet 📺 button.



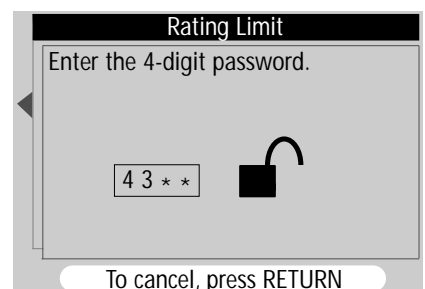
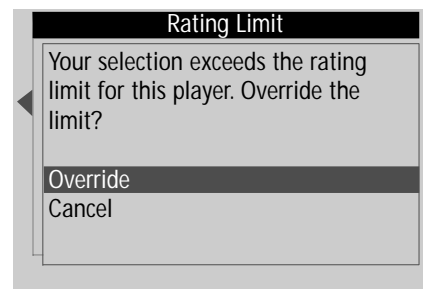
## Overriding the rating



### For DVDs

If you have previously set a rating limit (page 28), playing some disc may display this screen:

- 1 Choose "Override" using the ^ v arrows.
- 2 Confirm using **ok** button.
- 3 Type in your four digit code number using the **number buttons**.
- 4 Confirm using **ok** button.





## Audio language



For DVDs

A movie or video programme may be recorded in more than one language (up to 8) onto the disc. So you can hear the dialogue in your own language (if available) or in the original language of the movie. Set-up, page 23.

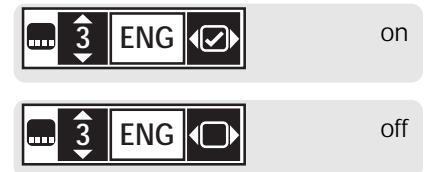
- 1 Start playback using **PLAY** button.
- 2 Press the red button; you see the "🔊" audio display on-screen with the number and (possibly) abbreviation of the language.
- 3 Select a language using the arrows.

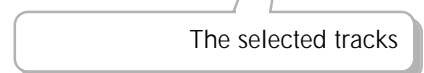
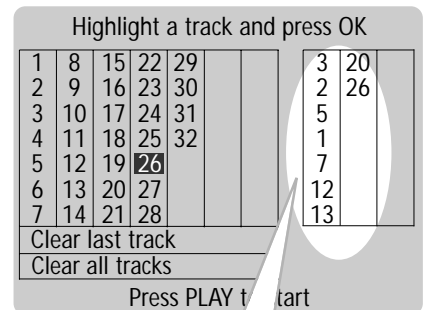
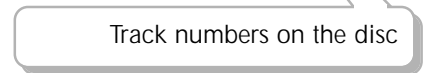


## Programme play

Playing up to 18 tracks in an order you specify. (Example: Playing track 3, 2, 5, 1, 7, 12, 13, 20, and 26 in this order.)

- 1 If a disc is playing press **STOP** button.
- 2 Call the programme menu using *random/prog* button on the top left part of the remote control.
- 3 Select a track number using the  $\langle \rangle$ ,  $\wedge$   $\vee$  arrows. Confirm with **ok** button. The selected number appears in the right table.  
(To cancel the last item move to "Clear last track" using the  $\vee$  arrow and press **ok**.)
- 4 Repeat from step 3 to select up to 18 tracks.
- 5 Start the programme, pressing the **PLAY** button.

- **After playback**  
The player stops and shows the programme screen again.
- **Returning to normal playback**
  - 1 Press **STOP** to interrupt the programme.
  - 2 Press *random/prog* twice to switch off programme play.
  - 3 Press **PLAY** for normal playback (the programme is still stored).
- **To clear the entire programme**  
Move to "Clear all tracks" and press **ok** button or switch the player off (stand-by) using  $\text{power}$  button or unload the disc using **OPEN/CLOSE** button.
- When video CD is played back with menu in playback control, "PBC" in the players display, the programme play is not available (see page 21).



## Random play

Your player can perform the tracks on the disc in random order.

## Using playback control menu (PBC)

Some video CDs (version 2.0, with playback control, "PBC" is written on the disc or its jacket) offer scenes or information to be selected interactively via menu screen. This menu appears after the disc is loaded (or after **PLAY** or *menu* button is pressed).  
Some video CD (vers. 2.0) with PBC may not have a menu on-screen and may behave like a video CD vers. 1.1.

- 1 Start playback using the **PLAY** button.
- 2 Choose a menu item using the **number buttons**.
  - Depending on the disc, the menu may extend over more than one screen. To see the other screens, use the skip buttons **⏪** / **⏩**.
  - Some discs showing a menu at start up, will automatically go in to play mode if nothing is changed on the menu after a period of time.

  - To return from playback to the menu again press the *return* button.
- 4 Stop playback and remove the menu press **STOP** button.
  - Complete stop is obtained by pressing **STOP** button twice.
  - Even after the player has finished playing a program, the disc may continue to rotate while the menu is displayed. When no further selections are to be played, press **STOP** to exit the menu.

# Rating limit

## Select a rating limit

This feature helps you control the type of discs or programme your family can watch. In case some discs, or scenes exceed the rating limit you have set, they will not be played.

- When using ^ v arrows for selection press **ok** button to confirm.

It works only with DVDs that have been assigned a rating limit and is therefore disc-dependent.

**1** If a disc is playing press **STOP** button.

- The rating is locked. Any disc whose rating is higher than your setting cannot be played unless the correct code number is entered.

**6** Confirm with **ok** button.

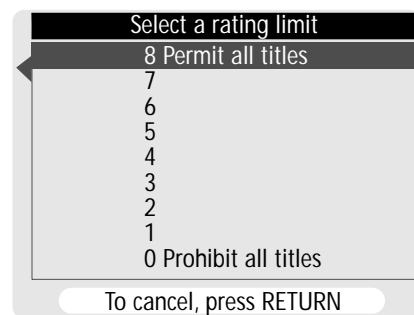

Such a connection can create a high level of noise that may be harmful to your ears, and could damage headphones or speakers. Older digital equipment, some of which is not fully compliant with IEC 958, is likely to cause this problem.

The same should be applied with the so-called "optical or coaxial REC.OUT jack" of Dolby Digital (AC-3) decoders, when they are connected to this DVD player. Since REC.OUT is a 1:1 copy of the decoder's input, no other equipment should be connected there.

## Surround sound

will always deliver a high-quality 2-channel (stereo) signal to the audio output, regardless of whether the soundtracks on DVD movies are in 2-channel stereo, in Dolby Surround, in Dolby Digital (AC-3) or in MPEG2 audio multichannel. In order to benefit from the full digital 5-channel surround sound (Dolby Digital or MPEG2 audio) you need an external appropriate decoder, which has to be hooked up to the special optical or coaxial audio digital output (page 36/37).

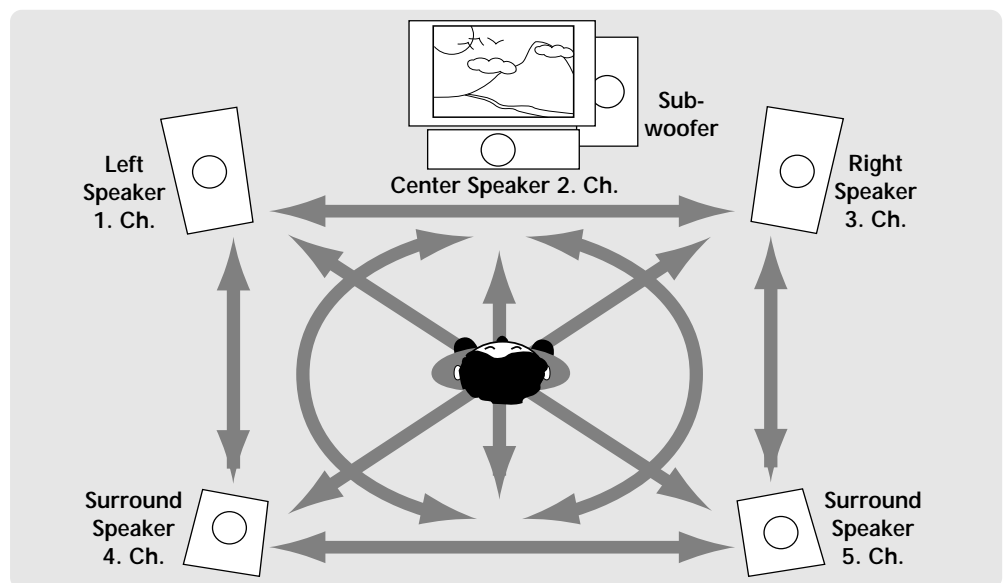

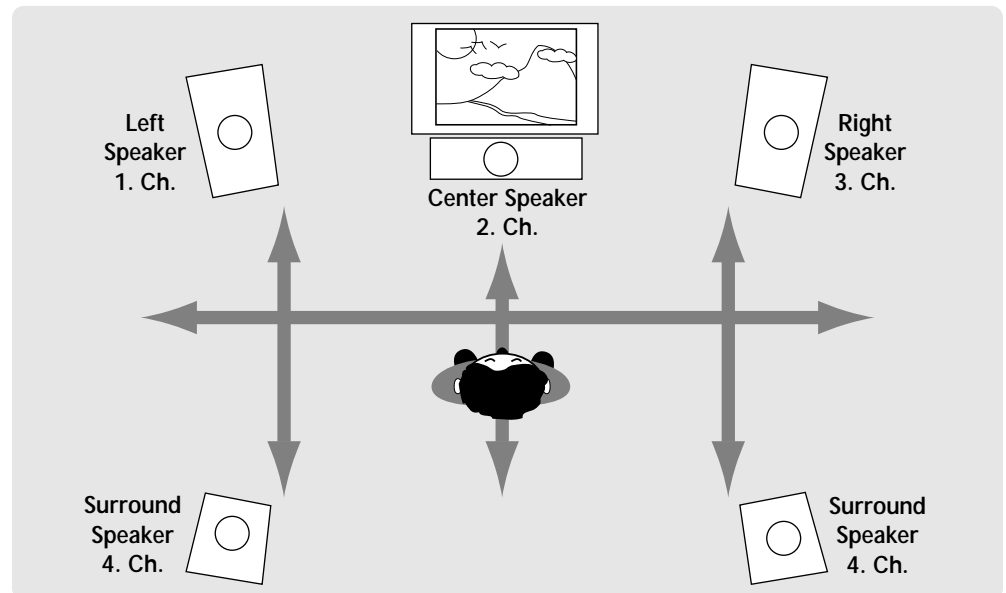

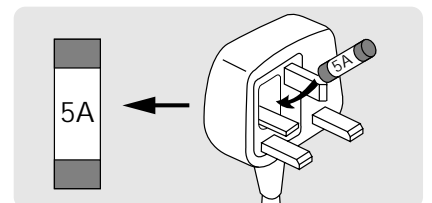
