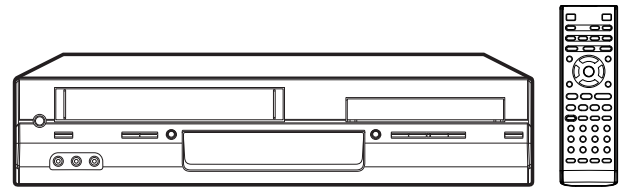

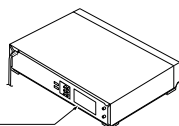

Precautions

Notes on handling

- When shipping the DVD/VCR, the original shipping carton and packing materials come in handy. For full protection, repack the unit as it was originally packed at the factory.
- Do not use volatile liquids, such as insect spray, near the DVD/VCR. Do not leave rubber or plastic products in contact with the DVD/VCR for a long time. They will leave marks on the finish.
- The top and rear panels of the DVD/VCR may become warm after a long period of use. This is not a malfunction.
- When the DVD/VCR is not in use, be sure to remove the disc and turn off the power.
- If you do not use the DVD/VCR for a long period, the unit may not function properly in the future. Turn on and use the DVD/VCR occasionally.

Notes on locating

- Place the DVD/VCR on a level surface. Do not use it on a shaky or unstable surface such as a wobbling table or inclined stand. The loaded disc or video tape may become dis-aligned and damage the DVD/VCR.
- When you place this DVD/VCR near a TV, radio, or VCR, the playback picture may become poor and the sound may be distorted. In this case, place the DVD/VCR away from the TV, radio, or VCR.

Notes on cleaning

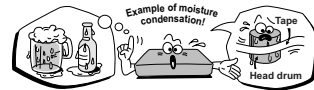
Use a soft, dry cloth for cleaning.

- Use a dry cloth to wipe.
- Do not use any type of solvent, such as thinner and benzine, as they may damage the surface of the DVD/VCR.

Notes on moisture condensation

Moisture condensation damages the DVD/VCR. Please read the following carefully.

Moisture condensation occurs, for example, when you pour a cold drink into a glass on a warm day. Drops of water form on the outside of the glass. In the same way, moisture may condense on the head drum or the optical pick-up lens inside this unit, one of the most crucial internal parts of the DVD/VCR.



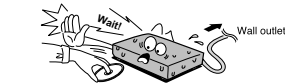
Moisture condensation occurs during the following cases:

- When you bring the DVD/VCR directly from a cold place to a warm place.
- When you use the DVD/VCR in a room where you just turned on the heater, or a place where the cold wind from the air conditioner directly hits the unit.
- In summer, when you use the DVD/VCR in a hot and humid place just after you move the unit from an air conditioned room.
- When you use the DVD/VCR in a humid place.



Do not use the DVD/VCR when moisture condensation may occur.

If you use the DVD/VCR in such a situation, it may damage discs and internal parts. Remove the disc or the video tape, connect the power cord of the DVD/VCR to the wall outlet, turn on the DVD/VCR, and leave it for two or three hours. After two or three hours, the DVD/VCR will have warmed up and evaporated any moisture. Keep the DVD/VCR connected to the wall outlet and moisture condensation will seldom occur.



Notes on discs

On handling discs

- Do not touch the playback side of the disc.



- Do not attach paper or tape to discs.



On cleaning discs

- Fingerprints and dust on the disc cause picture and sound deterioration. Wipe the disc from the centre outwards with a soft cloth. Always keep the disc clean.



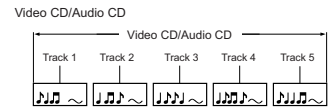
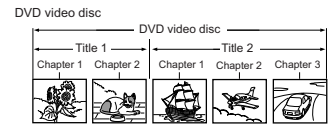
- Do not use any type of solvent such as thinner, benzene, commercially available cleaners or antistatic spray for vinyl LPs. It may damage the disc.

On storing discs

- Do not store discs in a place subject to direct sunlight or near heat sources.
- Do not store discs in places subject to moisture and dust such as a bathroom or near a humidifier.
- Store discs vertically in a case. Stacking or placing objects on discs outside of their case may cause warping.

Structure of disc contents

Normally, DVD video discs are divided into titles, and the titles are sub-divided into chapters. Video CDs and Audio CDs are divided into tracks.



Each title, chapter or track is assigned a number, which is called "title number", "chapter number" or "track number" respectively. There may be discs that do not have these numbers.

Notes on discs

About this owner's manual

This owner's manual explains the basic instructions of this DVD/VCR. Some DVD video discs are produced in a manner that allows specific or limited operation during playback. As such, the DVD/VCR may not respond to all operating commands. This is not a defect in the DVD/VCR. Refer to instruction notes of discs.

The following symbol may appear on the TV screen during operation.



It means that the operation is not permitted by the DVD/VCR or the disc.

For example, sometimes it is unable to stop the playback of copyright message of the disc when the STOP (■) button is pressed. Alternatively, this symbol may also indicate that the feature is not available for the disc.

Notes on region numbers

The region number of this DVD/VCR is 2. If region numbers, which stand for their playable area, are printed on your DVD video disc and you do not find (2) or (2) disc playback will not be allowed by the player. (In this case, the DVD/VCR will display a message on-screen.)

On Video CDs

This DVD/VCR supports Video CDs equipped with the PBC (Version 2.0) function. (PBC is the abbreviation of Playback Control.) You can enjoy two playback variations depending on types of discs.

Video CD not equipped with PBC function (Version 1.1)

Sound and movie can be played on this DVD/VCR in the same way as a DVD.

Video CD equipped with PBC function (Version 2.0)

In addition to operation of a Video CD not equipped with the PBC function, you can enjoy playback of interactive software with search function by using the menu displayed on the TV screen (Menu Playback). Some of the functions described in this owner's manual may not work with some discs.

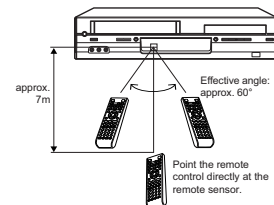
How to install the batteries

Use micro batteries type UM-4 (R03/AAA-Size). These batteries are offered as carbon / zinc-type or as alkaline-type. You may use both, but do not mix types. The alkaline type lasts longer compared to the carbon / zinc type but is more expensive.
Note: Flat, weak batteries will leak. Corrosive electrolyte will damage the remote control. Leak proof batteries will not leak immediately when they are flat. As long as the remote control is still working, there is no danger of leakage. To prevent damage, remove the batteries if you do not use the remote control for a long period of time.
Damage because of leakage is not covered by the guarantee.

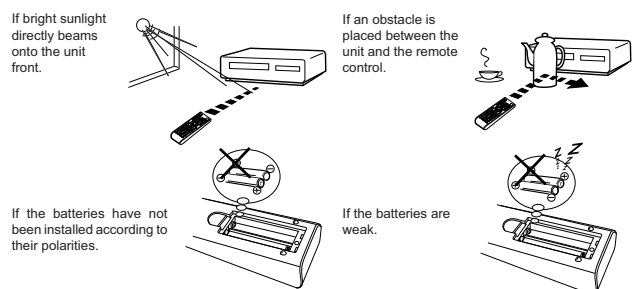
- 1 Open the battery compartment cover in the direction of the arrow.
- 2 Install two "R03/AAA" batteries (supplied), paying attention to the polarity diagram in the battery compartment.
- 3 Replace the compartment cover.



Distance of Remote Control Operation

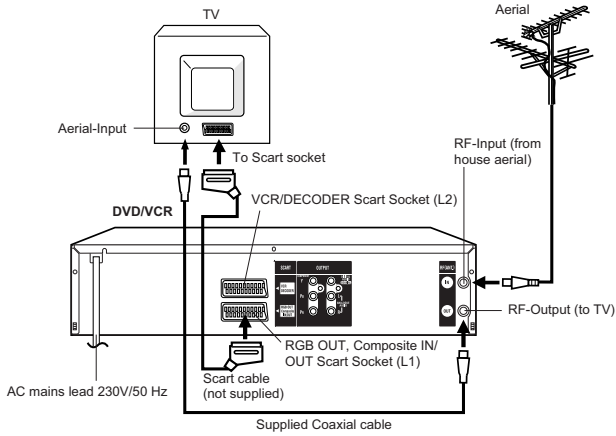


The remote control will not work properly in the following cases:



Basic connection

Connect your DVD/VCR to your home's aerial and to your TV-set as shown in the illustration. When you have finished these connections, connect your DVD/VCR to the 230 V / 50 Hz mains.



Connect a TV with the Scart socket

In addition to the coaxial cable connection, you should also connect the SCART cable from the DVD/VCR to your TV as shown. As well as transferring the high quality pictures and sound to your TV, the SCART connection can automatically switch the TV to its AV channel for playback.

If your TV-set does not switch to video-playback operation automatically, please turn your TV's video switch to VIDEO position manually.

Note:

Make sure that both the television and the DVD/VCR are switched off before connecting the cables.

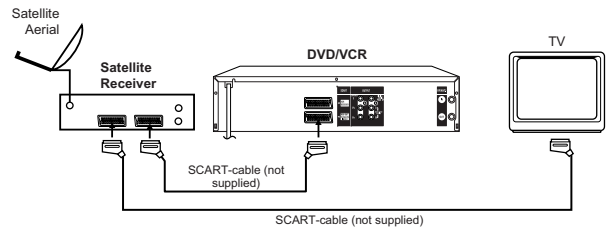
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Playback connection

The exact arrangement you use to interconnect various video and audio components to the DVD/VCR is dependent on the model and features of each component. Check the Owner's Manual provided with each component for the location of SCART socket.

Connection to a Satellite Receiver

If a Satellite Receiver is used, we recommend the following configuration:



To view TV-program from Satellite Receiver, press **AUX** on the remote control of DVD/VCR repeatedly until "L1" appears on the front display. To record TV-program from Satellite Receiver, press **VCR/DVD** to select the VCR mode. Then load a blank cassette tape with the erase prevention tab intact and select the desired TV-program. And follow steps 3-4 on page 25.

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Playback connection

Component video outputs/inputs

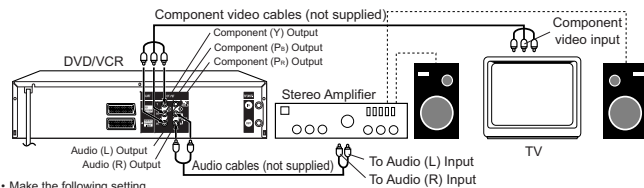
PROGRESSIVE outputs/inputs

Some TVs or monitors are equipped with component video inputs that are capable of reproducing a progressively scanned video signal. Connecting to these inputs allows you to view the highest quality pictures with less flicker.

INTERLACED outputs/inputs

Some TVs or monitors are equipped with component video inputs. Connecting to these inputs allows you to enjoy the highest quality DVD picture playback.

Notes:

- Actual labels for component video inputs may vary depending on the TV manufacturer. (ex. Y, R-Y, B-Y or Y, CB, CR)
- In some TVs or monitors, the colour levels of the playback picture may be reduced slightly or the tint may change. In such a case, adjust the TV or monitor for optimum performance.

Note:

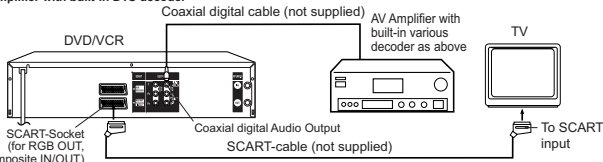
In connecting to TV's that are not capable of reproducing a progressively scanned video signal using the component sockets, do not select "Progressive" in "Output" menu. If you do, the component video outputs do not feed the correct signals and you cannot see any picture (see page 53).

Connect to an AV Amplifier with built-in digital surround

If you are using an Amplifier with a built-in digital surround as follows, you can enjoy the various audio systems such as Dolby Digital and DTS by using the Coaxial Digital Output.

Use this connection to connect an:

- AV amplifier with built-in Dolby Digital decoder
- AV amplifier with built-in DTS decoder



Notes:

- The COAXIAL jack is useful only for DVD section.
- DTS audio will output only from the coaxial output. To hear DTS audio, DTS-Decoder is necessary. When playing DTS-encoded CDs, only noise will be heard from the speakers or analogue stereo outputs.
- Some DTS decoders which do not support DVD-DTS interface may not work properly with the unit.

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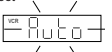
Tuning the TV stations and setting the time and date automatically

Plug your DVD/VCR into the mains supply and it will start automatically tune itself in and set the correct date and time.

Preparation

- Make sure that your DVD/VCR is connected properly to the TV.
- Turn on the TV and switch the TV to its AV channel.

1 Plug your DVD/VCR's plug into the mains supply. "Auto" will start to flash in the display. Your DVD/VCR will automatically tune itself in and set the correct time and date (This may take approx. 4 minutes).



2 Press **POWER I/O** to turn OFF the DVD/VCR. The broadcast stations received will be turn on your unit.

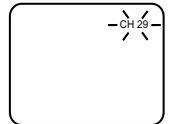
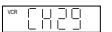
- The DVD/VCR automatically corrects the clock setting every hour and automatically adjusts the clock setting for Daylight Saving Time (see page 17).
- Your DVD/VCR will tune the TV stations as follows.

- CH 1 BBC 1
- CH 2 BBC 2
- CH 3 ITV
- CH 4 Channel 4
- CH 5 Channel 5
- CH 6 Satellite
- CH 7 etc.

- Skipped channels still may be selected directly through the **Number buttons (0-9)**.
- To cancel skipping, select the skipped channel using the **Number buttons (0-9)**, then press **CANCEL**. The channel No. does not blink any longer, and the channel No. now can be selected again using **CHANNEL +/-**.

To skip a channel position

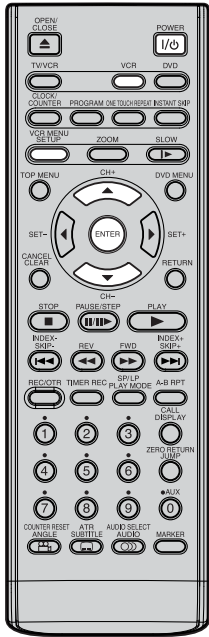
Unwanted channels can be skipped so that they cannot be called up by pressing **CHANNEL +/-**. Select the channel to be skipped, then press **CANCEL**. This channel number will be flashing and you can cancel further channels one after the other.

Setting the on-screen language

Turn on your TV and select the AV input mode. So you can follow the setting on TV screen.



Preparation:

- Press **POWER** I/O button to turn on the DVD/VCR.
- Press **VCR** to select the VCR mode. (The VCR indicator will light.)

You can choose from five different languages for the on-screen displays.

- Press **VCR MENU**. Press ▲ or ▼ to select the **SYSTEM SETUP** menu, then press **ENTER**.
If you use the unit for the first time and press **VCR MENU**, instead of the main menu screen on the right, the **LANGUAGE** setup menu screen in step 3 may appear.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select the **LANGUAGE** option, then press **ENTER**.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select the desired language:
English (ENGLISH), German (DEUTSCH), French (FRANCAIS), Italian (ITALIANO), Spanish (ESPAÑOL), then press **ENTER**.
- Press **VCR MENU** repeatedly until the TV picture appears on the screen.

Notes:

- If the unit does not operate properly, or No key operation (by the unit and/or the remote control): Static electricity, etc., may affect the player's operation. Disconnect the AC mains lead once, then connect it again.
- If no buttons are pressed for more than 60 seconds, the VCR menu screen will return to normal TV-operation automatically.

Setting the time and date manually

You must set the date and time manually for timer recordings if Auto setup process did not set them correctly.

Preparation:

- Turn ON the TV and set to the AV input mode.
- Press **VCR** to select the VCR mode. (The VCR indicator will light.)

Example: Setting the clock to "11:30" March, 31 (SAT), 2007.

- Press **VCR MENU**. The VCR menu screen will appear.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select **SYSTEM SETUP**, then press **ENTER**.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select **CLOCK SET**, then press **ENTER**.
- Press ◀ or ▶ repeatedly until "31" appears. Then press ▼.
- Set the month, year, hour and minute as in step 4. Then press **ENTER**.
• In case of an erroneous input, press ▲ to go back to previous step and enter again.
- Press ◀ or ▶ to select **AUTO TIME ON** or **OFF**. The VCR automatically corrects the clock setting every hour once you set **AUTO TIME** to **ON**.
- Press **VCR MENU** repeatedly until the TV picture appears on the screen.
- The clock will begin operation.

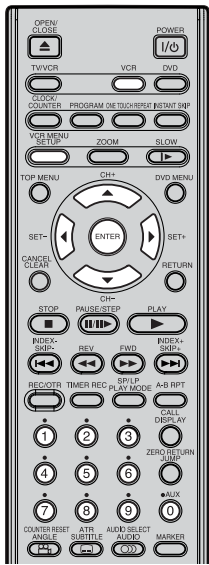
Notes:

- In case of a power failure, the clock will continue to operate for another 30 minutes with quartz-controlled precision. To indicate that the power failure has lasted for an excessive period of time ":-:" will appear on the display. In this case, readjust time and date.
- The **AUTO TIME** function adjusts the clock only if the error is within 5 minutes.
- The VCR automatically adjusts the clock setting for Daylight Saving Time once you set **AUTO TIME** to **ON**.

Tuning the TV stations manually

The Auto setup function (see page 15) memorizes all broadcasts to the suitable CH positions. However, some broadcasts may not be memorized due to weak signal. In this case, use manual tuning function.



Preparation

- Turn ON the TV and set to the AV input mode.
- Press **VCR** to select the VCR mode. (The VCR indicator will light)

Example: Preset the BBC 2 on programme position 2.

- Press **VCR MENU**. Press ▲ or ▼ to select the **CH TUNING**. Then press **ENTER**.
- Press ◀ (falling frequency) or ▶ (rising frequency) once to start the search. It stops at each broadcast automatically (" " changes to " " or " " (during picture), repeatedly until BBC 2 appears. Only in case of receiving of the weak search does not stop. If you want to stop, press ◀ or ▶.
Press **ENTER** to preset. The search menu screen will disappear if the next mode is not activated in less than 50 seconds.
- Press ▲ or ▼ repeatedly until 2 is displayed. (Or enter 0 2 with the **Number buttons (0-9)**). Then press **ENTER**.
- Repeat the steps 2 and 3 to preset other TV stations.
- Press **VCR MENU** repeatedly until the TV picture appears on the screen.

Note:

- Occasionally, the auto search might catch a weak signal and stop. If the TV station signal is weak, you shouldn't store this station.

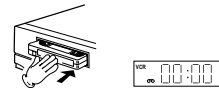

Loading and unloading a cassette tape

Use only video cassette tapes marked **VHS**.

Loading

Push the centre of the tape until it is automatically inserted.



Insert the cassette tape with its labeled side facing up and the erase prevention tab positioned at your left. An inverted cassette tape cannot be inserted.



Automatic power ON

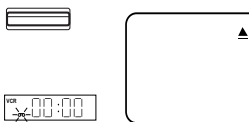
When you insert a cassette tape, the DVD/VCR power will turn ON automatically.

Automatic playback

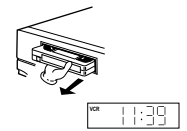
When loading a cassette tape without an erase prevention tab, playback will start automatically.

Unloading

- Press **EJECT** on the DVD/VCR. Even if a tape is being played, press this button only once.



- Remove the cassette tape.

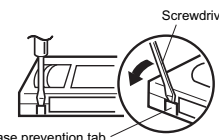


Automatic tape eject

This VCR will automatically rewind the tape when the tape has ended and when the tape has rewound to its beginning, the cassette tape will be ejected automatically.

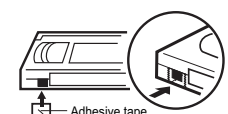

Remove the erase prevention tab with a screwdriver.



To record again

Cover the hole with a piece of adhesive tape.

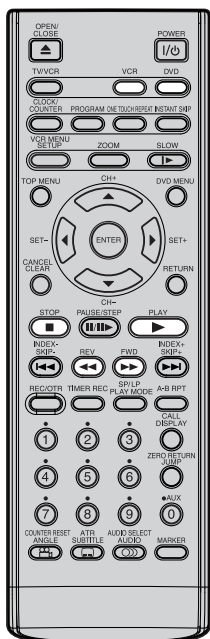

Cassette tape playback



Notes:

- This VCR selects the playback tape speed SP or LP automatically.
- The cassette tape and DVD disc can be played back simultaneously. If you press **VCR** or **DVD**, the tape playback and DVD playback alternate with each other on the screen.

Preparation:

- Turn ON the TV and set to the AV input mode.
- Press **VCR** to select the VCR mode. (The VCR indicator will light.)

- 1 Load a pre-recorded tape (When loading a cassette tape without the erase prevention tab, playback will start automatically).



- 2 To start playback Press **PLAY**. Playback will start.



- To stop playback Press **STOP**.



- To rewind the tape or forward it rapidly Stop the playback or recording with **STOP**.

To rewind the tape:

Press **REV**.

To forward the tape:

Press **FWD**.



To stop the tape-winding, press **STOP**. To switch to playback directly (without **STOP**), press **PLAY**.

Forward/Reverse picture search mode

When the tape is being wound, you can switch to picture search mode (see page 21). To do this, press **REV** or **FWD** and hold it down. The unit will resume the tape winding as soon as the button is released.

NTSC video cassette playback

When using a pre-recorded NTSC video cassette tape, the connected TV must operate with a 60 Hz vertical frequency. Otherwise, the on-screen picture will be affected by vertical rolling. Even if your VCR is capable of processing NTSC video signals, the picture may be shortened vertically (appearance of black bars at the top and at the bottom of the TV screen). The dubbing of a NTSC video cassette tape to a standard PAL VCR is impossible.

Special playback

Picture Search

Reverse picture search function

Press **REV** once or twice during the playback. To resume normal playback: Press **PLAY**.

Forward picture search function

Press **FWD** once or twice during the playback. To resume normal playback: Press **PLAY**.

Still Picture

Press **PAUSE/STEP** during playback. To resume normal playback: Press **PLAY**.



Slow Motion

During playback, press **SLOW**. You can change the slow speed by pressing **SLOW** several times. To resume normal playback: Press **PLAY**.



Slow tracking and vertical lock adjustment

If noise bars appear in the picture during slow motion, press **SET +** or **-** to reduce the noise bars. If the still picture jitters excessively, press **SET +** or **-** to stabilize the still picture.

Frame by Frame picture

During playback, press **PAUSE/STEP** repeatedly. The picture advances frame by frame. To resume normal playback: Press **PLAY**.



Adjusting tracking condition

Automatic tracking adjustment

Whenever you insert a tape and start playback, automatic tracking starts working and continuously analyzes the signal to enable optimum picture quality during playback.

Manual tracking adjustment

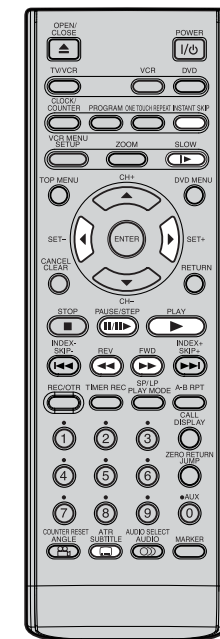
If automatic tracking cannot eliminate noises well during playback, press **SET +** or **SET -** to eliminate the noises. "MANUAL TR." will appear. Press it briefly for a fine adjustment, or press and hold for a coarse adjustment.

To return to automatic tracking, press **ATR**.

Instant skip

Press **INSTANT SKIP** during playback. The DVD/VCR will search forward through approximately 30 seconds of the tape (e.g. unwanted commercial time) for each press of **INSTANT SKIP** (maximum six presses) and then resume normal playback.

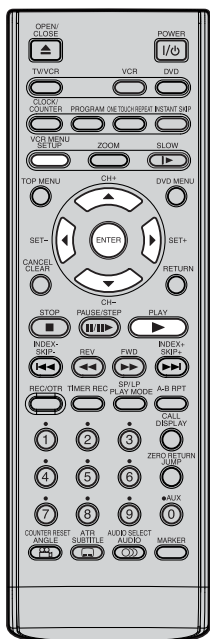
For example: 1 press: 30 seconds of tape
2 press: 60 seconds of tape
3 press: 90 seconds of tape



Notes:

- The audio output is muted during special playback.
- During picture search mode, there will be noise bars which are caused by the system.
- The Special Playback will automatically change to normal playback after approx. 5 minutes to protect the video tape against excessive wear.

Repeat playback



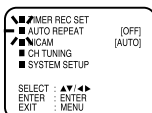
Note:

If the unit is turned off or starts recording, the repeat mode is cancelled.

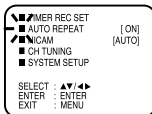
Normal repeat playback

The entire video tape will be played until its end. The tape will then automatically rewind to the beginning and the playback will be repeated.

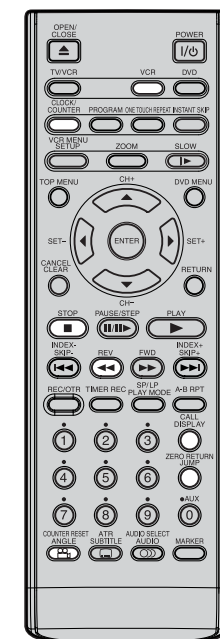

- When you load a video cassette, the display indication changes to "00:00:00", even when the tape counter does not reach its beginning yet. Even if the tape counter indicates 00:00:00, it can be rewound. If was in the counter display. Although the tape counter seems to forward when you press **REV**, the tape is in fact being rewound. When the tape reaches the beginning, the tape-rewinding stops automatically.

Preparation

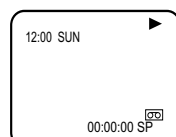
- Turn ON the TV and set to the video input mode.
- Press **VCR** to select the VCR mode. (The VCR indicator will light.)

- 1 Press **CALL**.

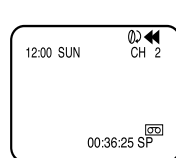
The counter display shows the tape running time during playback or recording. The Recorder will indicate REC during recording.



- 2 Press **COUNTER RESET** at the desired tape position. The counter display will be reset to the "00:00:00" position (e.g. the beginning of recording).

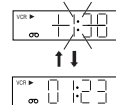


- 3 Press **STOP** when playback or recording is finished. Press **ZERO RETURN**. The tape will be rewound or fast forwarded and automatically stop at the "00:00:00" position.



The CLOCK/COUNTER button

Press **CLOCK/COUNTER** during the playback. The **CLOCK** and **COUNTER** counter alternate with each other on the display.

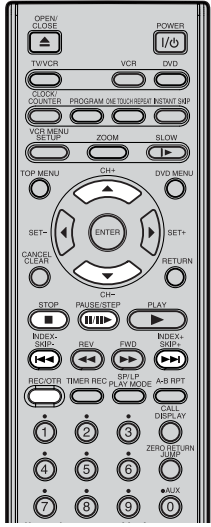


Note:

You can set the tape counter to 00:00:00 with **COUNTER RESET** anytime. Therefore, the counter display can also indicate 00:00:00, even when the tape counter does not reach its beginning yet. Even if the tape counter indicates 00:00:00, it can be rewound. If was in the counter display. Although the tape counter seems to forward when you press **REV**, the tape is in fact being rewound. When the tape reaches the beginning, the tape-rewinding stops automatically.

Video Index Search System

Whenever a recording is begun, an invisible index mark is recorded on the tape. These index marks are all identical, and each mark means: "Here starts a new recording". Every DVD/VCR equipped with the Video Index Search System (VISS) can locate these marks at the beginning of any recording.



Notes:

- When you record an INDEX mark at the very beginning of the tape, the mark may not be found.
- During INDEX search, the tape may stop and begin to play at a slightly different location.
- INDEX may not function properly with old or worn out video tapes.
- INDEX marks may not be found if it is extremely close to the point where the search began.
- In recording, if you stop recording temporarily, the INDEX mark is not recorded on the tape.

Example: Indexing of TV commercials.

- 1 Start playback and wait until the end of the TV commercial is reached, then press **STOP**.

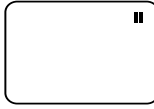
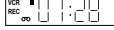


- 2 Press **REC/OTR** once. When the "INDEX" on-screen indication goes off, **STOP** may be pressed. This short recording process will be sufficient to set an index mark. This will result in about 10 seconds of the TV commercials to be overwritten by another recording. Due to the system, the end of this recording will be followed by a recording gap (noise signal) of approx. 5 seconds.

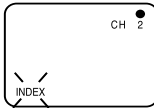
Recording several index marks

Due to the system, only one index mark will be recorded at the beginning of a recording. If you intend to set several index marks during a single recording, follow the procedure below:

- 1 At the point of the recording where an index mark is to be set, press **PAUSE/STEP**. The unit will switch to the recording pause mode.



- 2 Press **CH +/-** repeatedly to switch back to the original TV program. Press **PAUSE/STEP** to resume recording.



Index Search

Press **INDEX +** or **-** during stop or playback mode.

For Succeeding programs: Press **INDEX +**.

For Preceding programs: Press **INDEX -**.

(Additional press increases the INDEX NO. up to 9.)

When the **INDEX +** or **-** is pressed, the unit starts searching the INDEX NO. selected and finds the portion, then playback starts automatically. To stop the Index Search, press **STOP**.

Press **STOP**.



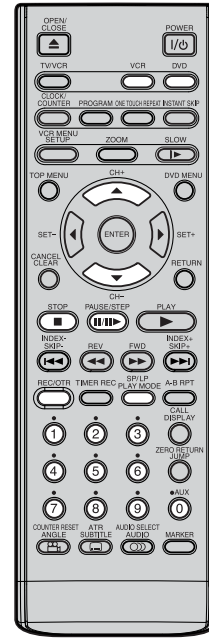
To Stop Recording Temporarily

To stop a recording for a short period of time, press **PAUSE/STEP**. Press this button again if you want to resume the recording.



Attention:

A safety circuit turns the pause mode off automatically after 5 minutes, and the DVD/VCR will stop the recording mode.



Notes:

- Since the DVD/VCR has a built-in TV tuner, the TV set may be turned off when recording. The TV set may only be used to check for accurate program adjustments or to monitor recordings.
- If you wish to watch the DVD playback during the recording on VCR, press **DVD** to change to DVD mode and perform the DVD playback (see page 33).

Recording a TV Program

You can record a program using the TV receiver of the DVD/VCR and at the same time watch another program on the TV set using its receiver. As the DVD/VCR automatically switches the TV set the following points should be observed:



- 1 Press **TV/VCR** until "VCR" appears on the display. Select the program on the DVD/VCR you want to record. This program can be watched on the screen and recorded by the DVD/VCR.



- 2 While the VCR is recording, press **TV/VCR** until the "VCR" indicator on the display goes off. The TV set now displays the program of its built-in receiving module. Select the TV channel you want to watch on the TV set. Although the TV set now shows another program, the DVD/VCR will continue recording the previously selected program.



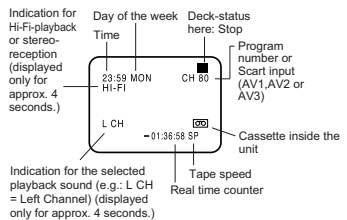
- 3 Using **TV/VCR** you can switch the TV screen between the DVD/VCR picture and the TV picture. If the "VCR" indicator is lit on the display, you will watch the DVD/VCR picture. This will not affect on the recording.



To Display VCR operation Status

Press **CALL**. The clock, the day of the week and more information will be indicated.

To cancel the indicating: Press **CALL** until all indicators disappear.



Auto Rewind Feature

The DVD/VCR will automatically rewind when the tape has ended (except during OTR and TIMER REC). It will also eject the cassette tape.

One-touch Timer Recording (OTR)

The one-touch timer recording feature provides a simple and convenient way to make a timed recording.

Preparation

- Turn ON the TV and set to the AV input mode.
- Press **VCR** to select the VCR mode. (The VCR indicator will light.)

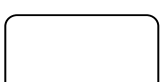
- 1 Load a blank cassette tape with the erase prevention tab intact. (The DVD/VCR will automatically turn on.)



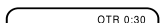
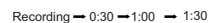

- 3 If a recording in Long Play mode is intended, press **SP/LP** to display "LP".



- 4 Press **REC/OTR** twice. The recording will start and stop after 30 minutes. Each additional press of **REC/OTR** will increase the recording time to a maximum of 6 hours.

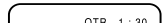
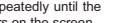


"REC" will keep blinking on the display.

If **REC/OTR** is pressed once during the recording, the remaining time appears on the screen. When pressed again, the recording time is extended to the nearest 30-minute or 1-hour interval.

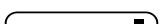
To Extend the Recording Time

Press **REC/OTR** repeatedly until the desired time appears on the screen.



To stop the OTR

Press **STOP**.



Note:

If the tape supply has not sufficed for OTR recording, the clock symbol (⌚) will blink at the tape-end and then VCR mode will change to DVD mode. In this case, press **TIMER REC** to cancel the ⌚ blink or press **EJECT** on the DVD/VCR to remove the cassette tape.

Timer recording

Timer recording can be programmed on the TV-screen with the remote control. The built-in timer allows automatic unattended recording of up to 8 programs within 1 month.



Notes:

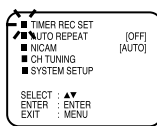
- In the event of a power failure, the data of the automatic recording will be maintained in the built-in memory for about 30 minutes. Also, the clock will continue to run for this period of time. Thereafter the data will be deleted. When the power resumes, the time display will change to "--:--" and the timer setting will have to be set.
- Not all TV Stations transmit PDC signal all of the time, therefore it is advisable to check before setting PDC to ON, if you do set PDC to ON and no signal is received your recording might not take place at all. To check PDC status, change to the channel on your DVD/VCR you wish to record from, if the word "PDC" appears on the screen for a few seconds then that channel is broadcasting PDC and you can set the feature to ON.

Preparation

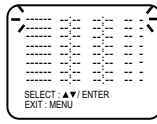
- Turn ON the TV and set to the AV input mode.
- Press **VCR** to select the VCR mode. (The VCR indicator will light.)
- Load a video cassette with the erase prevention tab intact. Make sure with **CALL** that the time and date are correct. (see page 26).

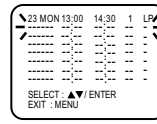
To record with the PDC (Programme Delivery Control) system

The PDC system starts recording when it picks up a special signal transmitted by the broadcaster with the TV programme – even if the TV programme starts early, late or runs on longer than scheduled. In step 4, press **▼** repeatedly until PDC OFF flashes, then press **◀** or **▶** to display "ON" for recording with PDC.



5 Press **ENTER** to accept them.

To enter other programs, repeat steps 2 through 5.



To return to the normal screen, press **VCR MENU** twice.

6 Press **TIMER REC**. The clock symbol (⌚) will appear on the display and the DVD/VCR stands by for recording. At the same time, VCR mode will change to DVD mode automatically. You can use DVD even if the VCR is in the Timer recording mode. If you do not use the DVD, turn the power off.

- If the clock symbol (⌚) blinks on the display in spite of the pressing of **TIMER REC**, the cassette may not have been loaded yet. (see page 19)
- If the cassette is ejected in spite of the pressing of **TIMER REC**, the erase prevention tab of the cassette may have been removed. (see page 19)

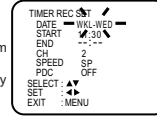
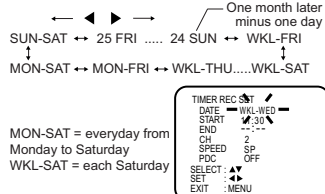
Notes:

- In case of the timer recording from the start socket, proceed as follows: In step 4, press **▲** or **▼** repeatedly until the "CH" line blinks. Then press **◀** or **▶** repeatedly until "AV1" or "AV2" or "AV3" appears.
- If the clock symbol (⌚) blinks when the timer recording ended, the TV program has not been completely recorded because of an insufficient tape supply. Press **TIMER REC** to cancel the timer program or press **EJECT** on the DVD/VCR to remove the cassette tape.
- During timer recording standby mode, the VCR mode cannot be selected. To use the VCR, press **TIMER REC** at first, then press **VCR** to change to VCR mode. Press **TIMER REC** again to set the VCR into timer recording standby mode.

Timer Recording Special Case

Weekly (e.g. WKL-TUE: each Tuesday) or daily (e.g. MON-SAT: Monday to Saturday) Timer recording

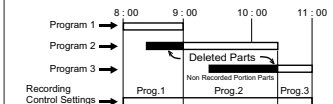

Timer recording

In case of Timer programs-overlapping

Do not overlap timer programs as portions of the conflicting programs will be lost. The first recording time has priority over the next recording time as shown in the diagram below. If you set up many timer recording programs at the same start time, the priority will be the top program in the timer recording list.



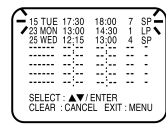
Notes:

- The daily/weekly recording can be made continuously until the recording is cancelled or the tape reaches the end.
- During timer recording, the automatic rewinding mechanism does not function.

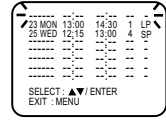

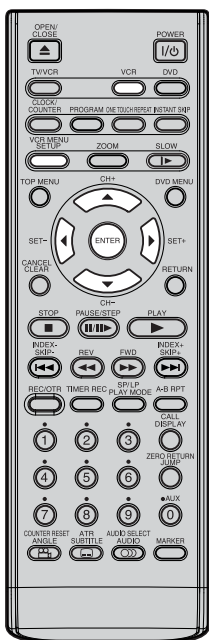

Stereo recording and playback

This DVD/VCR is capable of recording sound in Hi-Fi system. The recording will be performed automatically. **NICAM STEREO** broadcasts are recorded in its original sound system regardless of the setting. If you wish to record **NICAM** programmes, select **NICAM "AUTO"** as follows.



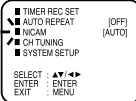
Note: When listening to a stereo broadcast or playing back a Hi-Fi tape recorded in stereo, you have to connect the DVD/VCR with the stereo audio system or the stereo TV.

Preparation:

- Turn ON the TV and set to the video input mode.
- Press **VCR** to select the VCR mode. (The VCR indicator will light.)

NICAM stereo sound reception:

1 Press **VCR MENU**. Press **▲** or **▼** to select **NICAM**. Then press **◀** or **▶** or **ENTER** to select [AUTO].

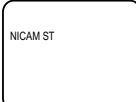

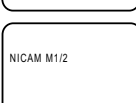

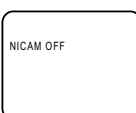

HiFi signal indication

It displays for approx. 4 seconds when playing HiFi video cassette tapes.



Note:

When playing Hi-Fi cassette tapes recorded on another VCR, the sound output may be distorted. This is normal and no indication of a unit malfunction. Try to minimize sound distortions by using **SET +/-** or change to **MONO** by pressing **AUDIO SELECT**.

Duplicating a video tape

When you try to connect video recorder or Video camera to the recording DVD/VCR with audio/video cables, make sure the power of both units have been turned off. Connect the recording DVD/VCR with the TV. Therefore, you can watch what the recording DVD/VCR is recording.

1 Load a blank cassette tape with the erase prevention tab intact into the recording DVD/VCR. Load the previously recorded cassette tape into the playback VCR or a video camera.

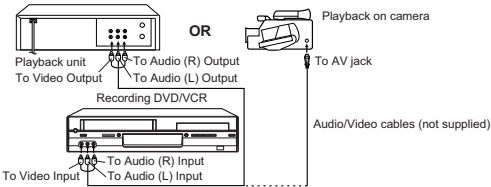


2 Use **AUX** or **CH +/-** of the recording DVD/VCR to select the "L1", "L2" or "L3" instead of the preset channel.
L1 = TV-RGB/Composite Scart Socket
L2 = VCR/DECODER Scart Socket
L3 = Front AV jacks

3 Press **REC/OTR** and then **PAUSE/STEP** on the Recording DVD/VCR.
4 Press **PLAY**-button and then **PAUSE/STEP**-button on the Playback unit. Now you can see the still picture of the scene that you wish to duplicate.
5 Press **PLAY**-button on the Playback unit and **REC/OTR** on the Recording DVD/VCR simultaneously to start the duplicating.

Note:
Before starting the duplicating process, select the proper tape speed using **SP/LP**. For a pre-recorded tape, the correct tape speed will be set automatically during playback.

Connection with second Video recorder or Video camera



Press **AUX** on the recording DVD/VCR repeatedly until "L3" appears.

Duplicating a disc material onto a video tape

You can record disc material in DVD, Video CD, Audio CD, etc. onto a video tape with this DVD/VCR only. If the DVD disc has a Copy-guard feature, the duplicating is not possible. A symbol mark "Ⓢ" will appear on the screen for approx. 4 seconds. See page 33 for more information about the DVD playback.

Preparation:

- Load a cassette tape with the erase prevention tab intact.
- Select the tape speed in the VCR mode. (see page 25)
- Load a disc you wish to duplicate.

1 Press **DVD** to select the DVD mode. (The DVD indicator will light)

2 Press **PLAY** to start the disc playback.

3 During disc playback, press **REC/OTR**.

Notes:

- You can set the duplicating time using the OTR-function. At step 3 above, press **REC/OTR** repeatedly until the desired duplicating time appears on the screen. (see page 27)
- Only non-protected PAL discs can be dubbed to video tape.

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Playing a disc

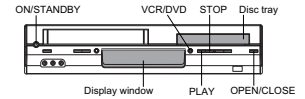
This section shows you the basics on how to play a disc.

CAUTION
Keep your fingers well clear of the disc tray as it is closing. Neglecting to do so may cause serious personal injury.

Basic playback (DVD/VCD/CD)

Preparations:

- When you want to view a disc, turn on the TV and select the corresponding video input connected to the DVD/VCR. This may include component video inputs which is exclusive to DVD playback.
- When you want to enjoy the sound of discs from the audio system, turn on the audio system and select the input connected to the DVD/VCR.



1 Press **ON/STANDBY**.
The DVD/VCR turns on.



2 Press **VCR/DVD** to select the DVD mode.
The DVD indicator will light.



3 Press **OPEN/CLOSE**.
The disc tray opens.



4 Place a disc on the disc tray.
With the playback side down



With the playback side down

- There are two different disc sizes. Place the disc in the correct guide on the disc tray. If the disc is out of the guide, it may damage the disc and cause the DVD/VCR to malfunction.
- Do not place a disc which is unplayable in this DVD/VCR.

5 Press **OPEN/CLOSE** or **PLAY** on the unit.

The disc tray closes automatically. On the TV-screen, "▶" changes to "Reading" and then playback commences.



- A menu screen will appear on the TV screen if the disc has a menu feature.
- Press **▲/▼/◀/▶** to select title, then press **ENTER**.
Title is selected and play commences.

6 Press **STOP** to end playback.

- The unit records the stopped point, depending on the disc. "■" appears on the screen. Press **PLAY** to resume playback (from the scene point).
- If you press **STOP** again ("■" appears on the screen.), the unit will clear the stopped point.

■ To start playback in the stop mode

Press **PLAY**.

Note:

If the unit does not operate properly: Static electricity, etc., may affect the player's operation. Disconnect the AC power cord once, then connect it again.

Playing a disc

To pause playback (still mode)

Press **PAUSE/STEP** during playback.

PAUSE/STEP To resume normal playback, press **PLAY**.

PLAY • The sound is muted during still mode.

To stop playback

Press **STOP**.



To remove the disc

Press **OPEN/CLOSE**.

OPEN/CLOSE Remove the disc after the disc tray opens completely.



Be sure to press **OPEN/CLOSE** to close the disc tray after you remove the disc.

Notes:

- If an non-compatible disc is loaded, "Incorrect Disc", "Region Code Error" or "Parental Error" will appear on the TV screen according to the type of loaded disc. In this case, check your disc again (see pages 6 and 52).
- Some discs may take a minute or so to start playback.
- When you set a single-faced disc label downwards (i.e. the wrong way up) and press **OPEN/CLOSE** or **PLAY** on the unit, "Reading" will appear on the display for a few minutes and then "Incorrect Disc" will continue to be displayed.
- Some discs may not work the resuming facility.
- Resuming cannot function when you play a PBC-featured Video CD while the PBC is on. To turn off the PBC, see page 42.
- Some playback operations of DVDs may be intentionally fixed by software producers. Since this unit plays DVDs according to the disc contents the software producers designed, some playback features may not be available. Also refer to the instructions supplied with the DVDs.
- Do not move the unit during playback. Doing so may damage the disc.
- Use the **OPEN/CLOSE** to open and close the disc tray. Do not push the disc tray while it is moving. Doing so may cause the unit to malfunction.
- Do not push up on the disc tray or put any objects other than discs on the disc tray. Doing so may cause the unit to malfunction.
- In many instances, a menu screen will appear after playback of a movie is completed. Prolonged display of an on-screen menu may damage your television set, permanently etching that image onto its screen. To avoid this, be sure to press **POWER I/O** on your remote control once the movie is completed.
- There may be a slight delay between the button is pressed and the function activates.

To obtain a higher quality picture

Occasionally, some picture noise not usually visible on the TV screen during a normal broadcast may appear while playing a DVD video disc. It is due to high resolution pictures on these discs which include a lot of information. The amount of noise depends on the TV you use with this unit. You should generally reduce the sharpness adjustment on your TV when viewing DVD video discs.

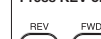

Playing a disc

You can play discs at various speeds.

Playing in fast reverse or fast forward directions (DVD/VCD/CD)

Press **REV** or **FWD** during playback.

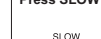

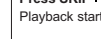

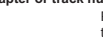
Locating a chapter or track (DVD/VCD/CD)

When you press twice in quick successions, playback starts from the beginning of the preceding chapter or track.

One touch repeat (DVD/VCD/CD)

Press **ONE TOUCH REPEAT** during playback.

If you leave the still video image or On screen display image displayed on your TV for an extended period of time, you risk permanent damage to your television screen. Projection televisions are very susceptible.

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Zooming/Locating desired scene

Zooming (DVD/VCD)

This unit will allow you to zoom in on the frame image. You can then make selections by switching the position of the frame.

- 3** First option will be highlighted. Press **▲** or **▼** to select the desired option.


- 4** Then press **▶** or **ENTER**. The selectable settings will appear.


- 5** Change the selection using **▲** or **▼**, by referring to the corresponding pages 50 ~ 53. Press **ENTER** to save the setting.

 - Repeat steps 3 and 5 to change other option.
 - To select another section, go back to step 2 by pressing **◀** repeatedly.

Customizing the function settings

Display

On screen display can be switched on or off when you press any buttons.

On: On screen displays appear when you press the buttons (factory setting).

There are two types of source content in pictures recorded in DVD video discs: film content (pictures recorded from films at 24 frames per second) and video content (video signals recorded at 30 frames per second). Make this selection according to the type of content being viewed.

Auto: Select this selection normally. The DVD player automatically detects source content, film or video of playback source, and converts that signal in an appropriate method.

Film: The DVD player converts film content pictures appropriately. Suitable for playback of film content pictures.



On:

■ Night Mode

Night Mode enables you to control the dynamic range so as to achieve a suitable sound for your equipment.

Off: It plays back at the recording level on the disc.

On: Loud sound such as explosion is toned down slightly when played back. This is suitable when it is connected to a stereo.

Notes:

- This function works only when the disc recorded with Dolby Digital is played back.
- The level of Night Mode may differ depending on DVD video disc.

■ QSound

This DVD player is equipped with "QSound". It can produce the effect of being in a cinema or a concert hall.

Off: The QSound is disengaged.

On: The QSound operates.

Notes:

- The QSound setting can also be changed with **AUDIO** on the remote control (see page 41).
- This function works only when the disc recorded with Dolby Digital is played back.
- When this function works, the volume might change.
- When the voice is distorted, turn off QSound.

■ Digital Out


You can select the digital output sound format corresponding to your system connection.

PCM:
Change Dolby Digital to PCM for the output. Select when connected to a 2 channel digital stereo amplifier.

Bitstream:
Disc audio bitstream data will be output.

Off:
There is no sound output from DIGITAL AUDIO OUT jack.

Note:
Even if you select "Bitstream", MPEG Audio will be output in PCM format.



■ Parental control setting

Some discs are specified as not suitable for children. Such discs can be limited not to playback with the unit.

- Press **▲** or **▼** to select "Parental", then press **ENTER**. "Enter Password" screen will appear.
- Press "0000" using **Number buttons (0-9)**. (Please note, this is pre-setting password of this unit). Then press **ENTER**. The parental level list will appear.
 - Level Off:** The parental control setting does not function.
 - Level 8:** Virtually all DVD software can be played back.
 - Level 1:** DVD software for adults cannot be played back.
- Press **▲** or **▼** to select from the level 1 to level 8. The limitation will be more severe as the level number is lower. Then press **ENTER**.
- Press **OPEN/CLOSE** to activate Parental control setting.

- While holding **7** down on the remote control and at the same time press **STOP** on the front panel. "Password Clear" appears on the screen. Now the password has been returned to the initial value ("0000").

■ Output

You can select the video output signal of the DVD video player to the TV from "RGB", "Component" or "Progressive".

RGB:
Select when connecting to a composite TV.

Component:
Select when connecting to a TV equipped with component video inputs but progressive scan is not compatible.

Progressive:
Select when connecting to a TV equipped with component video inputs and progressive scan compatible.

Warning:
Once "Progressive" is selected when connecting to a TV progressive scan incompatible, no image will be seen on the video display. In this case, you must reset the unit by pressing **STOP** on the front panel for five seconds. The video output will be restored to "RGB" setting, and a picture will once again be seen on a conventional analogue display.

Notes:

- Some discs may not be played back with the progressive scanning mode correctly because of the disc characteristics or recording condition.
- Once Progressive scan on, RGB output is disabled.

■ DivX(R) VOD

In order to play DivX® VOD (Video On Demand) content on this unit, you first need to register the unit with your DivX® VOD content provider. You do this by generating a DivX® VOD registration code, which you submit to your provider.


Press **▲** or **▼** to select "DivX(R) VOD". Then press **ENTER**. Your 8-character registration code is displayed. Make a note of the code as you will need it when you register with a DivX® VOD provider. Then press **ENTER**.

Note:
If each setup (pages 50 ~ 53) has been completed, the unit can always work under the same condition (especially with DVD discs). Each setup will be retained in the memory even if you turn the power off.

Temporary cancel the rating level by DVD disc



Video head cleaning

Video head clogging

The video heads are the means by which the DVD/VCR reads the picture from the tape during playback. In the unlikely event that the heads become dirty enough to be clogged, no picture will be played back. This can easily be determined if, during playback of a known good tape, there is good sound, but no picture (picture is extremely snowy). If this is the case, have the DVD/VCR checked by qualified service personnel.
