


# **Battery Replacement**

When the battery becomes weak, the operating distance of the remote control is greatly reduced and you will need to replace it.

Note: If the remote control is not going to be used for a long time, remove the battery to avoid damage caused by battery leakage corrosion.



# TO ADJUST THE VOLUME

Adjust the VOLUME control to obtain the desired volume. FOR PERSONAL LISTENING Connect headphones ( Ø3.5mm stereo mini plug) to the PHONES jack. Adjust the VOLUME control to

#### On Operation


Do not turn up the volume while listening to your iPod with no audio signals or very low level inputs. If you do so, the speakers may be damaged when the peak level of the sound is played.

#### On Use

Use the unit in moderate climates. Never use the unit where it would be subject to:

- Heat sources such as radiators or air ducts.
- Direct sunlight.
- Excessive dust.
- Moisture or rain
- Mechanical vibration or shock.
- Uneven surface.
- Do not place any heavy objects on top of the unit.
- When the unit is used with an AC power adaptor, do not wrap the unit in a cloth, blanket, etc.. If you do so, the temperature inside and outside the unit may rise considerably, resulting in malfunctioning of the unit
- If the unit is brought directly from a cold to a warm location, or is placed in a very damp room, the moisture may condense on the lens inside the unit. Should this occur, the unit will not operate. In this case, remove the disc and leave the unit in a warm place for several hours until the moisture evaporates.

Open the battery door and insert two "1.5V UM-4/AAA size" batteries into the battery compartment. Be sure to install two optional "1.5V UM-4/AAA size" batteries for the power back-up function. If the AC power supply is interrupted, the batteries supply power to keep the clock operating and the alarm times set. • During power interruption, the clock function is still maintained. The alarm sound will not come on. • These batteries are only for clock operation and alarm memory during power interruption. You cannot listen to the radio/iPod/AUX with the batteries.

#### WHEN TO REPLACE THE BATTERIES

To check the batteries' condition, unplug the AC adaptor from the wall outlet and plug it in again after a few minutes. If the displayed time is incorrect, replace the batteries with new ones

# **VOLUME ADJUSTMENT**

When headphones are connected, the speakers are automatically disconnected.

# CLOCK SETTING

Setting the clock can only be done in STANDBY mode.

1. Press and hold the FUNCTION/O button until the hour and the minute digits blink.

2. Press the HOUR/ I d button to adjust the desired hours. 3. Press the MIN/>>Ibutton to adjust the desired minutes.

· In RADIO mode, press the DISPLAY button on the remote control to shuffle between the current radio station and the current time.

In iPod/AUX mode, the current time is always shown on the display.

# LISTENING TO THE RADIO

1. Press the STANDBY/ONUbutton to turn the unit on. 2. Press the FUNCTION/@ button to FM or AM band.

4. Press the **MI/MEMORY** button again to store it in memory.

# LISTENING TO YOUR IPOD

#### iPod Compatibility

The unit works with iPod mini (4GB, 6GB), iPod nano (1st generation) - 1GB, 2GB, 4GB, iPod 5th generation (video) - 30GB, 60GB, 80GB, iPod nano (2nd generation) - 2GB, 4GB, 8GB, iPod classic (80GB, 160GB), iPod nano 3rd generation (video) - 4GB, 8GB and iPod touch (8GB, 16GB, 32GB). Other iPod models(and other audio devices) are supported through the AUX IN jack on the unit back panel (see AUX IN CONNECTION section).

#### iPod Dock Adaptor

Before connecting your iPod, you need to install the appropriate iPod Dock Adaptor in the dock of the unit. Four iPod Dock Adaptors are included as shown below(if the adaptor is not supplied in the accessory, please use the adaptor that comes with your iPod.):

#### Installing the iPod Dock Adaptor

1. Choose the iPod Dock Adaptor that fits your iPod (if the adaptor is not supplied in the accessory, please use the adaptor that comes with your iPod).

3. Insert your iPod Dock Adaptor into the dock



#### Removing the iPod Dock Adaptor

Remove the Dock Adaptor by gripping the inside with your thumb, then lifting out the adaptor using the friction between your thumb and the adaptor.



#### Start playback

- 1. Press the STANDBY/ONU button to turn on the unit.
- 2. Press the FUNCTION/@ button repeatedly until the indicator "iPod" appears on the display.
- 3. Press the **MEMORY** button to start playing.

#### Notes:

- The iPod will charge automatically while docked in the cradle.
- To prevent possible interference to the AM signal, please switch off the iPod while the radio is playing.

# Pausing Playback

• Press the MI/MEMORY button. • To resume playback, press the MI/MEMORY button again.

#### Skipping to a Another Track

• Press theldd button to skip to the beginning of the current track or skip to previous track. Press the ▶▶ button to skip to the beginning of the next track.

### Locating a Particular Point on a Track

 Keep either the Iddor >>I button pressed during playback, according to the desired direction, and release at the desired point.

Note: Please refer to the user's guide that was included with your iPod for more details.

# **AUX IN CONNECTION**

# Connecting to AUX IN for other sound sources

You can connect audio devices such as your iPod, CD players or MP3 players to the unit through the AUX IN jack. Use the Line-in cable (not supplied), connect the AUX IN jack on the back panel to the Line Out or Earphone jack of the other audio devices.


# Listening to the Connected Device

- 1. Press the FUNCTION / @ button to AUX IN mode and "AUX" is shown on the display.
- 2. Turn on the audio device you have attached to the AUX IN jack.

# PRESET EQ

# This system supports a variety of equalizers and sound effects.

During playback, press the PRESET EQ button on the remote control to select a desired music mode. Each time the **PRESET EQ** button is pressed, the music mode will be changed to the next one as follows:



# **DUAL ALARM SETTING**

The unit should be in STANDBY mode to set alarm.

- · The alarm can be set to activate twice a day by setting two different alarm times in ALARM1 and ALARM2
- The unit can be set to "Buzzer", "Radio" or "iPod" alarm.
- To Set Alarm 1
- 1. Press the ALARM1 button, the "D" icon blinks on the display.
- 2. Press the ALARM1 button once again, then the "Q" icon, hour
- & minute digits blink on the display.
- 3. Press the HOUR/I + button to adjust the hours.
- 4. Press the MIN/►►I button to adjust the minutes.
- 5. Press the FUNCTION/@ button to select "Buzzer", "FM", "AM", "iPod",
- 6. Adjust the volume control to obtain the desired volume for the Alarm1.
- 7. Press the ALARM1 button again to confirm.
- 8. The Alarm 1 indicator will light up.

#### Note: For the "Radio" Alarm, you should tune into your desired radio station before setting alarms-the alarm will turn on to the last station you tuned.

The clock radio will wake up to "Buzzer", "Radio", "iPod", when alarm timer reaches the preset time and then turns off automatically after 60 minutes.

### TO SET ALARM 2

Setting the alarm for Alarm2 is the same as setting Alarm1 (Use the ALARM2 button instead of the ALARM1 button).

Note: If the Alarm1 & Alarm2 are set to the same time, the unit will activate once only.

### TO TURN OFF ALARM

1. Snooze (If you want to snooze a few more minutes)

Pressing the SNOOZE button will deactivate the sound for 9 minutes. You can repeat this function as many times as you like within 60 minutes from the preset alarm time.

#### 2. To stop alarm sound

Press the STANDBY/ON button to stop alarm sound, Alarm Mode will stay active-alarm will activate again in 24 hours

# TO CANCEL ALARM MODE

After setting alarms, press and hold the ALARM1 or ALARM2 button for 2 seconds until the Alarm1 or Alarm2 indicator disappears.

# SLEEP TIMER SETTING

- The sleep timer automatically turns the unit off after a certain time.
- 1. While the unit is on, press the SLEEP button-the display will indicate "90".
- 2. Press the SLEEP button repeatedly to select the desired sleep time as below:

- 3. After setting a desired sleep time, the "SLEEP,z" icon will be shown on the display.
- 4. The unit will automatically turn off once it counts down the sleep time.
- To clear the preset sleep time, keep pressing the SLEEP button until "00" is shown. The "sLEEP\_zz" icon disappears.

### **TROUBLE SHOOTING GUIDE**

#### **ITEMS TO CHECK**

- There has been an electrical power interruption. Reset the clock.
- Is the current time correctly set on the time display?
- Is the alarm time correctly set?
- · Make sure FM antenna wire is unwound.
- · Electrical interference in your home can cause poor reception. Move the unit away from sources of interference (especially those with motors and transformers).
- · Reposition or turn the main unit for better reception.
- · Remove your iPod from the dock and check for obstruction on the connectors in the dock and on your iPod. Make sure you are using the appropriate adaptor for your model of iPod.
- Make sure that your iPod is working properly before docking into the unit. Please refer to your iPod manual for details.
