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2. SAFETY GUIDELINES

IMPORTANT NOTICES CONCERNING POWER CORD SELECTION

The specific power cord for this LCD TV is enclosed and has been selected according to the country of destination. Use the enclosed power cord to prevent electric shock. Observe the following guidelines if it is necessary to replace the original cord set, or if there is no cord set enclosed. The female receptacle of the cord set must meet IEC-60320 requirements and should look like Figure A1 below:



For the United States and Canada

In the United States and Canada the male plug is a NEMA5-15 style (Figure A2), UL-listed, and CSA-labeled. For LCD TVs that are to be placed on a desk or table, type SVT or SJT cord sets may be used. For LCD TVs that are to be placed directly on the floor, only SJT type cord sets may be used. The cord set must be selected according to the current rating for the LCD TV. Consult the table below for the selection criteria of power cords used in the United States and Canada.

3. IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Make sure to note and follow all warnings and instructions marked on the LCD TV. Observe the following safety instructions.

- · Read and understand all the safety and operating instructions in this manual before you use the LCD TV.
- · Keep this user manual for future reference.
- · Do not use the LCD TV near water.
- Avoid exposing the LCD TV to moisture or high humidity.
- Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other apparatus (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
- · Avoid exposing the LCD TV to direct sunlight or high temperatures.
- · Do not install near a motor or transformer where strong magnetism is generated.
- Do not attempt to bypass the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding-type plug. A polarized plug has
 two blades with one wider than the other. A grounding-type plug has two blades and a third grounding
 prong. If the provided plug does not fit into your wall outlet, consult an electrician for replacement of the
 obsolete outlet.
- · Protect the power cord from being walked on or pinched particularly at the ends of the cord.
- · Only use attachments and accessories specified by the manufacturer.
- Use only with a cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table specified by the manufacturer, or sold with the LCD TV. When a cart is used, use caution when moving the cart to avoid injury or damage.

- DISC Do not use a cracked, deformed, or repaired disc. These discs are easily broken and may cause serious physical injury and/or product damage.

Circuit Overload

Power Cord Protection

Do not block the openings by placing the LCD TV on a bed, sofa, rug or other similar surface.



Do not place the LCD TV in a built-in installation such as a bookcase or a rack unless proper ventilation is provided or the manufacturer's instruction have been adhered to.


Warnings and Precautions

- Do not orient the LCD TV towards direct sunlight to reduce glare.
- If the LCD TV will not be used for a long period of time, unplug the unit and remove the batteries from the remote control.
- · Avoid touching the display screen by hand or any object.
- Never remove the rear cover. The LCD TV interior contains high-voltage parts. You may be seriously injured if you touch them.
- · Always handle the LCD TV with caution when moving it.
- Do not install the LCD TV in airtight compartments, or in areas where it can be exposed to water or high temperature.
- Ensure that the area around the LCD TV is clean and free of moisture.
- Do not place anything on the LCD TV that can hinder heat dissipation.
- Do not place anything on the LCD TV that can cause liquid to splash on it (e.g. flower vase).
- Do not place heavy objects on the LCD TV, audio/video cables, or power cord.

4. ANTENNA INSTALLATION SAFETY

Outdoor Antenna Grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the LCD TV, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded to prevent voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANS/NFPA 70, provides information on proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode.



Lightning



For added protection for the LCD TV during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. DO NOT disconnect the antenna or the power cord during a heavy storm—lightning may strike while you are holding the cable cord, causing serious injury. Turn off the LCD TV and wait for the weather to improve.

Power Lines



An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

5. CLEANING THE LCD TV



- MAKE SURE THE LCD TV IS TURNED OFF AND THE POWER CORD IS DISCONNECTED FROM THE POWER OUTLET.
- NEVER SPRAY OR POUR ANY LIQUID DIRECTLY ONTO THE SCREEN OR THE CASE.

To clean the screen:

- (1) Wipe the screen with a clean, soft, lint-free cloth. This removes dust and other particles.
- (2) If it still is not clean, apply a small amount of non-ammonia, non-alcohol based glass cleaner onto a clean, soft, lint-free cloth, and wipe the screen.

To clean the case:

- (1) Wipe the case with a soft, dry cloth.
- (2) If it still is not clean, apply a small amount of non-ammonia, non-alcohol based, mild non-abrasive detergent onto a clean, soft, lint-free cloth, then wipe the surface.

6. DISC USAGE

To handle discs:

- Hold the disc by its edges. Do not touch the surface of the disc.
- Do not attach paper labels or stickers to the disc.





To clean discs:

- Wipe the disc with a clean, dry cloth from the center outward toward the edges.
- · Do not wipe the disc in a circular motion.
- · Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners.





To store discs:

- Store the disc in the case to avoid any risk of scratches, dirt or damage.
- Do not leave the disc exposed to direct sunlight or store it in hot or humid places.


- Playback for non-standard discs is not guaranteed. If such discs are played, the image or sound quality may be poor.
- Only standard music CDs that does not have copy-restriction signals can be played in this unit.
- Playback for CD-R/RW and DVD-R/RW discs depends on the recording conditions.

Region Management Information


This unit supports DVDs with a region code of 1 or ALL. Some DVDs that have no region code label may still be subject to area restrictions and therefore not playable.

Disc Contents Structure

Normally, DVDs are divided into titles, and the titles are sub-divided into chapters.



Video CDs and audio CDs are divided into tracks.



Each title, chapter or track is assigned a number, which is called "title number", "chapter number" or "track number" respectively.





2. TV CONTROLS



1. MENU	Display the LCD TV setup screen.
2. VOL + / -	During playback, adjust thevolume. In a menu screen, select an item.
3. CH + / -	During TV viewing, adjust the channel. In a menu screen, select an item.
4. INPUT	Select the video source. In a menu screen, select an item.
5. ▶	Press to play or pause playback.
6.	Press once for fast rewind; press and hold to go to the previous chapter, track or picture.
7. >>	Press once for fast forward; press and hold to go to the next chapter, track or picture.
8. ■/▲	Press once to stop playback (the current playback position is saved). Press twice or more to stop and return to the DVD root menu (if one is available) Press and hold for two seconds to eject the disc.
9. (l)	Toggles the power on and off.
10. Eject	Eject the disc from the disc slot.

3. TERMINALS



1. Service

For service/maintenance purposes only.

2. PC Audio Input

Connect to the audio out port (green) of a computer.

3. VGA

Using a 15-pin VGA cable, connect to a computer or other device with a VGA output.

4. YPbPr Input

Connect an external video device with component output to these jacks.

5. YPbPr Audio Input (Left/Right)

Connect an external audio source to these iacks.

6. Analog Audio Output (Right/Left)


Connect this output to an external analog audio receiver.

7. SPDIF Audio Output

Connect this output to an external digital audio receiver.

8. AC In

Connect the power cord from this outlet to a power source.



9. HDMI 1/2

Connect to an external video device such as a DVD player, game system, cable, or satellite box.

10. HDMI Audio Input (Right/Left)

Connect an external audio source to these iacks.

11. TV Tuner


Connect the LCD TV to an antenna or cable service. Supports NTSC, ATSC, and cable formats.

12. Composite Video Input 1/2

Connect to an external video device with an analog signal such as a VCR.

13. Composite Audio Output 1/2 (Right/Left) Connect this output to an external audio receiver.


4. REMOTE CONTROL



1. LCD TV BASE

- (1) Open the LCD TV carton box.
- (2) Remove the LCD TV base from the carton box.
- (3) Remove the two top carton stabilizers from the LCD TV.
- (4) Remove the protective plastic covering the LCD TV.
- (5) Grasp the two sides of the LCD TV and then pull it out of the carton box.
- (6) Remove the two bottom carton stabilizers from the LCD TV.

CAUTION:

The LCD TV unit may be too heavy for one person to lift. If this is the case, make sure to ask assistance in handling the LCD TV to prevent physical injury and/or damage to the unit.



- (7) Lay the LCD TV on a clear, flat, and stable surface.
- (8) Remove the plastic bag containing the LCD TV base screws and screwdriver from the LCD TV base.


(9) Align the base to the bottom side of the LCD TV.



(10) Secure the base to the LCD TV with the four bundled screws.



(11) Carefully orient the LCD TV in an upright position.



2. REMOTE CONTROL BATTERIES

- (1) Remove the battery cover.
- (2) Insert the batteries. Make sure the (+) and (-) marks on the batteries match those inside the compartment.
- (3) Re-attach the battery cover.



CAUTION:

- (1) Only use AAA batteries.
- (2) Do not mix new and old batteries. This may result in cracking or leakage, which may pose a fire risk or lead to personal injury.
- (3) Insert batteries according to the (+) and (-) markings. Inserting the batteries incorrectly may result in cracking or leakage, which may pose a fire risk or lead to physical injury.
- (4) Dispose of used batteries in accordance with local laws and regulations.
- (5) Keep batteries away from children and pets.
- (6) When the remote control will not to be used for an extended period, remove the batteries.


Remote Control Transmission Range

Transmission range depends upon the reception angle. The range of coverage is 20° horizontal/vertical at a distance of 20 feet from the LCD TV.



3. ANTENNA CONNECTION


Outdoor Antenna Connection



► NOTE:

The F-type connector should be finger-tightened only.

When connecting the RF cable to the LCD TV, do not tighten F-type connector with any tool. If tools are used, it may cause damage to the LCD TV (e.g. breaking of internal circuit).




Cable TV (CTV/DTV) Connection

The unit has a TV tuner (75 ohm coaxial cable connector) located on the right I/O panel for for easy cable hookup. When connecting the 75 ohm coaxial cable to the unit, screw the 75 ohm cable to the TV tuner.

Some cable TV companies offer premium pay channels. Since the signals of these channels are scrambled, a cable TV converter/descrambler is usually provided to the subscriber by the cable TV company. This converter/descrambler is necessary for normal viewing of the scrambled channels. (Set your TV to channel 3 or 4. Typically one of these channels is used. If a channel is unknown, consult your cable TV company.) For more specific instructions on installing cable TV, consult your cable TV company. One possible method of utilizing the converter/descrambler provided by your cable TV company is explained below.

A position on the RF switch (not supplied): You can view all unscrambled channels by using the TV's channel keys.

B position on the RF switch (not supplied): You can view the scrambled channels via the converter/ descrambler by using the converter's channel keys.





4. EXTERNAL DEVICE CONNECTIONS

You can enjoy picture and sound by connecting various audio-video devices to the terminals located on the left and right I/O panels of the LCD TV.

IMPORTANT:

Turn off the LCD TV first before connecting an external device to prevent any possible damage or physical injury.






- For more information about external device connections, see the operation manual of the external device you wish to connect to the LCD TV.
- Make sure that the correct cables are connected to each terminal. Improper cable connections may cause damage to the LCD TV.
- TV cable input: You can use a commercially available audio/video cable.
- Component (YPbPr) input: Picture can be displayed only when a 480i, 480P, 720P or 1080i signal is received.
- HDMI input: Picture can be displayed only when a 640 x 480, 480P, 720P or 1080i signal is received.
 When you connect to the HDMI terminal with a DVI-HDMI conversion cable, there is a possibility that the picture may not display correctly.
- Audio output: You can output audio signals from the LCD TV set through the analog audio out and SPDIF terminals.
- This TV does not support DTS audio format. You may not hear proper audio output from the TV speakers if you choose a DTS audio format.

5. POWER CONNECTION

Connect the power cord to the LCD TV then to a proper AC outlet.

IMPORTANT:

The LCD TV works on a 120 VAC, 60 Hz power input voltage ONLY. Turn off all connected devices before plugging in the power cord.




6. INITIAL SETUP

Press 1 on the control panel or on the remote control to turn on the LCD TV. When you turn on the LCD TV for the first time, you will be prompted to perform a channel scan. Use the $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$ keys to select a channel source and then press 2.



1. TURNING THE POWER ON AND OFF



Indicator Status	Description
Power on	Blue light
Standby mode (DPMS on)	Amber light
Power off	No light

► NOTE:

The power indicator will illuminate from inside the disc slot. For more information on power mode configuration, go to page 43.

To turn on the power:

Press (1) on the control panel or on the remote control. A blue light will illuminate from inside the disc slot.


To turn off the power:

Press (1) on the control panel or on the remote control. The LCD TV shut down behavior will depend on the enabled Power Mode setting. Go to page 43 for related information.

► NOTES:

- If you are not going to use the TV for a long time, be sure to disconnect the power cord from the wall
 outlet and remove the batteries from the remote control.
- In standby mode, a small amount of electricity is still consumed even when the power is turned off, as indicated by an amber light illuminating from inside the disc slot

2. ADJUSTING THE VOLUME



Press Vol+ to increase the volume. The bar indicator shifts right.
 Press Vol- to decrease the volume. The bar indicator shifts left.





3. CHANGING CHANNELS

There are several ways to change channels. Unless otherwise indicated, the buttons referred to in the following instructions are located on the remote control.

Using the Ch ▲/▼ Buttons

To browse through the available channels, press Ch ▲ or Ch ▼ on the remote control or on the control panel.



Using the Channel Keys



To use the Channel Select function:

Key in the channel number using the 0 thru 9 buttons and then hold down the button for the last digit.

To select a standard channel:

Complete the following steps within 4 seconds. You can enter a single, double, or triple digit channel number (7, 12, 012, etc.).

- (1) Key in the channel number using the 0 thru 9 buttons.
- (2) Press ENT.

To select a digital channel:

Complete the following steps within 4 seconds.

- (1) Key in the main channel number using the 0 thru 9 buttons.
- (2) Press .
- (3) Key in the sub-channel number using the 0 thru 9 buttons.
- (4) Press ENT.

Using the Favorite Keys



To select a favorite channel:

Press the Favorite button (A, B, or C) corresponding to the preferred favorite channel.

To save a channel as a favorite:

- (1) Display the channel you want to add as a favorite.
- (2) Press and hold the Favorite channel key you want to add the current channel to. The Channel Saved message appears to confirm the new favorite channel item.



4. SELECTING THE INPUT SOURCE

There are two ways to select the video input source.

Using the Individual Input Keys



Press any of the following remote control keys to change the input source: TV, DVD, PC, YPbPr, Video, or HDMI.

Using the Input Key



- (1) Press Input.
- (2) Press ▲/▼ to select the preferred source.
- (3) Press 🚭 to switch to the selected input source.

▶ NOTE:

If you enable the Autosource function, the TV will automatically detect and switch to a new input connection (e.g. The TV will automatically switch to PC mode when you connect to a computer.). Go to page 43 for instructions on how to enable this function.

5. ADJUSTING THE DISPLAY FORMAT

The input source can sometimes affect the way images are displayed on-screen. You can adjust the display format to view the image properly.



- (1) Press €.
- (2) Press ▲/▼ to select the preferred display format. Options include:
 - · Standard Picture is displayed in its original size.
 - Fill Picture is displayed to cover the entire screen.
 - · Overscan Picture is caled down to fit the display area.
- (3) Press 🚭 to apply the new display format.

1. SETUP MENU OPERATION

Use the setup menus to configure the various operational settings of the LCD TV.

To display the setup menu screen:

Press \blacksquare on the remote control or **MENU** on the control panel.

To navigate through the setup menu screen:

Use the buttons on the remote control or on the control panel to navigate through the menu screens.

5. MP3/WMA/JPEG CD INFORMATION

Given the fact that technology in the optical disc market is still maturing, there are many different types of recordable disc formats that you can use to burn multimedia files into (e.g. CD-R disc containing MP3/WMA files). This unit cannot guarantee that all types of recordable discs will produce optimum playback quality. The technical criteria set out in this manual are meant as a guide only.

IMPORTANT:

Please be advised that you must obtain permission from the applicable copyright owners to download copyrighted content, including music files, in any format, including the MP3 and WMA formats, prior to their downloading.

MP3/WMA/JPEG CD Playback Information

The LCD TV can play back MP3/WMA/JPEG files that have been recorded on a CD-R, CD-RW, DVD-R, or DVD-RW disc. To produce the MP3/WMA/JPEG disc, burn the files in a compatible disc using a Windows PC with a CD-RW or DVD-RW drive and an appropriate encoding software.

▶ NOTE:

You must use a Windows PC to burn the MP3/WMA/JPEG disc. This unit does not support data disc burned using the Apple Mac OS (Hierarchical File System, HFS format).

- Make sure the filename of the MP3/WMA/JPEG files in the burned disc includes the 3-character file extension ("mp3", "wma", or "ipq").
- · MP3/WMA/JPEG CD must meet the ISO file standard.
- This LCD TV can only read 600 files per disc. If a directory has more that 600 files, the remaining files will be omitted during playback.
- This LCD TV can recognize a maximum of 50 directories per disc. If a disc has more that 50 directories, the last-listed directories will not be displayed.
- · If the disc contains both audio (MP3 or WMA) and image (JPEG) files, only audio files can be played.
- It may take more than one minute for this unit to read a MP3/WMA/JPEG disc depending on its structure.
- Audio tracks recorded using the Joliet Recording Specification can be played back. The LCD TV can display
 up to 16-character filenames. Longer file names will be condensed. Only the following characters in a
 filename will be displayed: small or capital A-Z letters, numbers of 0 through 9, and the underscore
 symbol (_).
- To enable sequential file playback, use an encoding software that allows for playlist creation. In the playlist, make sure the files are alphabetically or numerically arranged. You can use numerical prefixes to arrange the files (i.e., "01-party pic" or "002-con call track").

No power	Make sure the power indicator is illuminated blue. Make sure the power cord is securely connected to the AC-in jack and is plugged into a functional AC outlet. You may want to plug in another electrical device to the power outlet to verify that it is supplying the proper voltage.
Power is suddenly turned off	Press 🗐 and select Settings Sleep Timer to make sure the Leave TV On option is selected.
Forgotten PIN	(1) Press 🗐 and select Settings Reset All, and then Yes. (2) Access the setup screen again and select Locks. (3) Key in and reconfirm your new PIN.
Remote control does not work	Press only one button at a time. Make sure the batteries are properly inserted. The batteries may already be drained out. Replace batteries with new ones.
Remote control code cannot be detected by a universal remote	Purchase a separate learning remote control. Go to www.wde.com for a list of remote codes.
No picture	Nake sure the video input cable is properly connected to the correct terminal, and that the correct input mode is enabled. To illustrate, when a VGA cable is connected to display a computer screen, the PC input mode must be enabled. In TV mode, verify that the antenna is properly connected and that the preferred channel is enabled in the channel list. Press and select Channels Channel List. Press and select Picture to adjust the display settings. If you are using a Macintosh computer older that is older than a G3 model, you need a Macintosh adapter.

No sound	Make sure the audio input cable is properly connected to the correct terminal, and that the correct input mode is enabled. The volume may be muted, press ⋈ or the Vol+ key to turn on the volume on. Press ╗ and select Audio to adjust the Bass, Treble, and Balance settings. If you are using the TV speakers, press ╗ and select Audio to make sure the TV Speakers option is set to On. If you are using an external audio device, press ╗ and select Audio to make sure the TV Speakers option is set to On.
No Disc appears on-screen or file playback won't start	Make sure that a disc is loaded and that the disc and file formats are supported by the LCD TV. Go to page 59 for list of compatible disc and file formats. Make sure the DVD input mode is selected. The disc may be loaded improperly. Press ≜ and reload the disc making sure the label side is facing upward. The disc may be dirty. Press ≜ and clean the disc. Go to page 7 for information on how to clean and handle optical discs.

APPENDIX A - LCD TV BASE REMOVAL

If you intend to repack the LCD TV unit (for shipping or storage) or you want to change the installation to a wall mount option, you must first remove the LCD TV base.

IMPORTANT:

The LCD TV has VESA FPMPMI compliant 100×100 mm and 75×75 mm mounting holes. Be sure to follow the operating instructions supplied with the wall mount bracket when installing the unit. It is recommended that you employ qualified contractors for wall mount installation.

- (1) Eject any disc loaded in the disc slot.
- (2) Turn off the LCD TV and all connected devices.
- (3) Disconnect the power cord from the LCD TV.
- (4) Disconnect all signal cables from the I/O port terminals.
- (5) Lay the LCD TV on a clear, flat, and stable surface.

CAUTION:

The LCD TV unit maybe too heavy for one person to lift. If this is the case, make sure to ask assistance in handling the LCD TV to prevent physical injury and/or damage to the unit.




- (6) Remove the four screws securing the base to the LCD TV.
- (7) Detach the base from LCD TV.



(8) Pack the screws you removed in step 7 together with the LCD TV base for future reassembly.

APPENDIX B - SAFETY BRACKETS

You can use the safety brackets located on the LCD TV's spine module cover to protect the unit from accidentally tipping over or from unwanted theft.



1. ANTI-TIPPING MECHANISM

You can use the safety brackets to anchor the LCD TV in place by looping a security cable through the brackets and securing it to a surface that is strong enough to support the weight of the unit. Using the safety brackets in this manner does not preclude the use of the LCD TV base. *The safety brackets must be used in conjunction with the unit base.* The brackets are only to be used as an additional safety option.

2. ANTI-THEFT PROTECTION

The safety brackets can also be used to protect the LCD TV from unwanted theft by ooping a security cable through the brackets and bolting it to an immovable surface.

APPENDIX C - WALL MOUNT OPTION

The LCD TV has been fitted with two sets of VESA FPMPMI compliant mounting holes. These 100 x 100 mm and 75×75 mm mounting holes allow the unit to be mounted on a wall.



IMPORTANT:

Remove the LCD TV base first before mounting the unit on a wall. Go to page 63 for related instructions. It is the user's responsibility to use a UL listed wall mount unit rated to support the weight of this LCD TV. Please consult qualified contractors for wall mount installation. The incomplete or improper mounting of this unit to a wall may cause it to fall down resulting to property damage and/or potentially serious injury.

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
