GENERAL INFORMATION

The purpose of this manual is to assist you in operating and maintaining your Box Scraper and/or Rear Blade. Read it carefully. It furnishes information and instructions that will help you achieve years of dependable performance.

These instructions have been compiled from extensive field experience and engineering data. Some information may be general in nature, due to unknown and varying operating conditions. However, through experience and these instructions, you should be able to develop procedures suitable to your particular situation.

The illustrations and data used in this manual were current at the time of printing. However, due to possible inline production changes, your machine may vary slightly in detail. We reserve the right to redesign and change the machines as may be necessary without notification.

Throughout this manual, references are made to right and left directions. These are determined by standing behind the tractor, facing the direction of forward travel.

SAFETY RULES ATTENTION! BECOME ALERT! YOUR SAFETY IS INVOLVED!



Safety is a primary concern in the design and manufacture of our products. Unfortunately, our efforts to provide safe equipment can be wiped out by an operator's single careless act.

In addition to the design and configuration of equipment, hazard control and accident prevention are dependent upon the awareness, concern, judgement, and proper training of personnel involved in the operation, transport, maintenance, and storage of equipment.

PREPARATION

- Always wear relatively tight and belted clothing to avoid getting caught in moving parts. Wear sturdy, rough-soled work shoes and protective equipment for eyes, hair, hands, hearing, and head; and respirator or filter mask where appropriate.

- Never go underneath equipment (lowered to the ground or raised) unless it is properly blocked and secured. Never place any part of the body underneath equipment or between moveable parts even when the engine has been turned off. Hydraulic system leak down, hydraulic system failures, mechanical failures, or movement of control levers can cause equipment to drop or rotate unexpectedly and cause severe injury or death.
- Make sure attachment is properly secured, adjusted, and in good operating condition.
- Never perform service or maintenance with engine running.
- Keep all persons away from operator control area while performing adjustments, service, or maintenance.
- Tighten all bolts, nuts, and screws to torque chart specifications. Check that all cotter pins are installed securely to ensure equipment is in a safe condition before putting unit into service.

8 Safety

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OPERATION

The operator is responsible for the safe operation of this equipment. The operator must be properly trained. Operators should be familiar with the equipment, the tractor, and all safety practices before starting operation. Read the safety rules and safety decals, page 5 through page 8.

The box scrapers and rear blades are designed for a wide range of applications: scarifying, scraping, leveling, grading, and backfilling.

WARNING

- Power unit must be equipped with ROPS or ROPS cab and seat belt. Keep seat belt securely fastened. Falling off power unit can result in death from being run over or crushed. Keep foldable ROPS system in "locked up" position at all times.
- Never allow children or untrained persons to operate equipment.

CONNECTING ATTACHMENTS

This box scraper or rear blade should be mounted on tractors with a maximum engine rating of 35 hp and not to exceed 2000 lbs.

The box scraper and rear blade are compatible with Category 1, 3-point tractors equipped with side swing type lower lift arms.

Adjust or remove tractor drawbar to eliminate interference with box scraper or rear blade.

NOTICE




Figure 1. Attaching Box Scraper

■ The 3/4" bolt and sleeve in lower hole provide strength to the box scraper. Do not remove this bolt and sleeve when operating the box scraper. See Figure 1.

Category 1

- **1.** Place tractor 3-point lower lift arms over outer hitch pins.
- 2. Secure with klik pin (not provided) as shown in Figure 2.
- **3.** Attach the tractor's top link to the top of the attachment's A-frame bars.
- **4.** Secure with the heavy-duty top link pin and retaining pin supplied with the tractor's top link as shown.

Quick Hitch (Category 1)

(Refer to parts list drawings, page 18 & page 19.)

- 1. Use Bushing Kit #1022040 when using a quick coupler
- **2.** Place lower sleeves (A) over lower hitch pins and secure with linch pins (B).
- **3. On the box scraper,** replace the top spacer (9) with sleeve (D) by removing and replacing nut (6), washer (7), and bolt (8).
- **4. On the rear blade**, install sleeve (C), bolt (E), washer (F), and nut (G) in the top link hole.
- **5.** Align quick hitch with lower and upper sleeves and connect using the instructions with the quick hitch.

<u>OPERATING TECHNIQUES - BOX SCRAPER</u>

Adjusting Top Link

The box scraper is leveled by adjusting the length of the tractor's top link.

- Shortening the top link will deepen the scarifier tooth penetration.
- Lengthening the top link will provide better scraping and leveling action.

Experience will allow the operator to determine the best setting for each application.

Backfilling

1. Raise or remove scarifier shanks (see page 13).

- Lower the blade to the ground and back up into the fill material.
- **3.** Shorten the top link to raise the cutting blade and control how much the blade digs in.

Scarifying

- **1.** Place the scarifier shanks in position with the points facing toward the tractor.
- Lock into position with the pins provided. The lowest shank position provides the greatest ground penetration.
- **3.** Lower the box scraper and drive the tractor ahead to begin the scarifying operation.
- **4.** Adjust the depth of the scarifier by tilting the unit with the tractor top link. Shortening the top link will provide deeper and more aggressive operation.

Scraping

- Raise or remove the scarifier shanks (see page 13). Lower the box scraper and drive forward to move material.
- **2.** Adjust the depth of the blade by tilting the unit with the tractor top link.
 - Shortening the top link when scraping will transfer more weight on the front of the scraper and will raise the cutting blade to provide a more shallow cut.
 - When the top link is adjusted properly, the bowl of the blade should fill easily and material can be pulled to a desired location.

Leveling

- 1. Raise or remove scarifier shanks.
- **2.** Shorten the top link so the cutting edge clears the ground.
- **3.** Drive forward with the box scraper in this position and loose material will be leveled.

Storage



- To help prevent injury caused by a falling implement, always detach on a hard level surface.
- Block equipment securely for storage.
- Do not climb or lean on stored equipment.
- Keep children and bystanders away from storage area.

10 Operation

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OPERATING TECHNIQUES - REAR BLADE

Adjusting Top Link

Level the A-frame and boom with 3-point connecting links and top link. Adjusting the top link length will change the fore and aft pitch of the tool.

Lengthening the top link will cause the tool to contact the ground with a sharper pitch and feed itself into the ground more readily.

Position 3-point lift arm sway blocks or tighten sway chains to eliminate side sway. Install side braces if necessary.

Reversing

For most tractors, the blade may be rotated 360° without unhooking from the tractor.

To rotate without unhooking, pull hitch pin assembly, rotate to desired position, replace hitch pin assembly.

Angling

Remove hitch pin assembly.

The blade may be set 15° or 30° to the left or right for forward grading.

Backfilling

Reverse blade for backfilling ditches or trenches (see Reversing).

Storage

M WARNING

- To help prevent injury caused by a falling implement, always detach on a hard level surface.
- Block equipment securely for storage.
- Do not climb or lean on stored equipment.
- Keep children and bystanders away from storage area.




Figure 4. Optional Parking Stand - Rear Blade

Store the rear blade with the hitch lowered to the ground or use the optional parking stand on the upper hole (Figure 4).

BOX SCRAPER

Blocking Up

NOTE: To service the box scraper when attached to the tractor, it must be blocked up off the ground.




Figure 5. Box Scraper Blocked Up

- 1. Place two 4" x 4" (10 x 10 cm) blocks under each side frame of the box scraper as shown in Figure 5.
- Lower the box scraper to rest securely on the blocks.

NOTE: Do not block the machine any higher than needed for removing the shanks.

Adjusting or Removing Scarifier Shanks

Scarifier shanks have three operating positions in the scraper. They may be removed if scarifying action is not needed.

- 1. Block up machine by placing two 4" x 4" (10 x 10 cm) blocks under each side-frame of the box scraper (see Figure 5).
- 2. Lower the box scraper to rest securely on the blocks.

NOTE: Do not block the machine any higher than necessary to remove the shanks or cutting edge.




Figure 6. Scarifier Removal or Adjustment

- **3.** Remove safety pin and lock pin. Adjust scarifier to desired position, Figure 6.
- 4. Replace safety and lock pins.

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Replacing Scarifier Tooth

- 1. Remove scarifier shank (1) from the scarifier bar.
- 2. Remove the worn tooth by driving a chisel between the shank (1) and tooth (2).




Figure 7. Scarifier Point Replacement

- 3. Install replacement tooth and use a punch (3) to bend the locking tab (4) into the retaining hole on both sides of the shank (see Figure 7).
- 4. Reinstall the shank (1) in the scarifier bar.

CLEANING BOX SCRAPER & REAR BLADE

After Each Use

- Remove large debris such as clumps of dirt, grass, crop residue, etc. from machine.
- Inspect machine and replace worn or damaged parts.
- Replace any safety decals that are missing or not readable.

Periodically or Before Extended Storage

- Clean large debris such as clumps of dirt, grass, crop residue, etc. from machine.
- Remove the remainder using a low-pressure water spray.
 - Be careful when spraying near scratched or torn safety decals or near edges of decals as water spray can peel decal off surface.
 - **2.** Be careful when spraying near chipped or scratched paint as water spray can lift paint.
 - **3.** If a pressure washer is used, follow the advice of the pressure washer manufacturer.
- Inspect machine and replace worn or damaged parts.
- Sand down scratches and the edges of areas missing paint and coat with Woods spray paint of matching color (purchase from your Woods dealer).
- Replace any safety decals that are missing or not readable (supplied free by your Woods dealer).
 See Safety Decals section for location drawing.



ASSEMBLY

DEALER SET-UP INSTRUCTIONS

Assembly of this Box Scraper and Rear Blade is the responsibility of the WOODS dealer. It should be delivered to the owner completely assembled and adjusted for normal conditions.

Complete the Check Lists on page 17 before delivering the attachment to the customer.

The Box Scraper and Rear Blade are shipped partially assembled. Assembly will be easier if components are aligned and loosely assembled before tightening hardware. Recommended torque values for hardware are located on page 20.

A WARNING

- Before dismounting power unit or performing any service or maintenance, follow these steps: disengage power to equipment, lower the 3-point hitch and all raised components to the ground, operate valve levers to release any hydraulic pressure, set parking brake, stop engine, remove key, and unfasten seat belt.
- NEVER GO UNDERNEATH EQUIPMENT. Never place any part of the body underneath equipment or between moveable parts even when the engine has been turned off. Hydraulic system leak-down, hydraulic system failures, mechanical failures, or movement of control levers can cause equipment to drop or rotate unexpectedly and cause severe injury or death.

BOX SCRAPER

Remove Components from Shipping Configuration

- 1. Remove the banding that holds the box scrapers to pallet.




Figure 8. Shipping Configuration - Box Scraper

- **2.** Remove hitch pins (5) with lock washers and nuts shown in Figure 8.

- **3.** Remove bolts (10), nuts (6) and washers (7) securing A-frame hitch.
- 4. Remove A-frame hitch from box scraper.




Figure 9. Remove A-Frame Hitch from Shipping Configuration

14 Assembly

Assemble Box Scraper




Figure 10. A-Frame Support Bars & Scarifiers Assembled

- 1. Place the A-frame hitch over the three corresponding holes on the inside of the scraper frame as shown in Figure 10.
- **2.** Secure the hitch pin (5) with lock washer and nut. Repeat for opposite side.
- **3.** Finish securing the frame by installing the four sets of bolts (10), nuts (6) and washers (7).
- **4.** Remove lock pins (4) and scarifiers. Rotate scarifiers so teeth face forward and replace in slots with lock pins and safety pins.




Figure 11. Box Scraper Assembled




Figure 12. Shipping Configuration - Rear Blade




Figure 13. Slide Hitch onto Bolt Atop Rear Blade

1. Rotate hitch to its upright position and slide back onto the bolt on top of blade as shown in Figure 13.

- **3.** Secure the hitch pins (4) facing outward with lock washers and nuts as shown in Figure 15.




Figure 14. Hitch Attached to Rear Blade




Figure 15. Rear Blade Hitch Pin Assembly





Figure 16. Rear Blade Assembled


