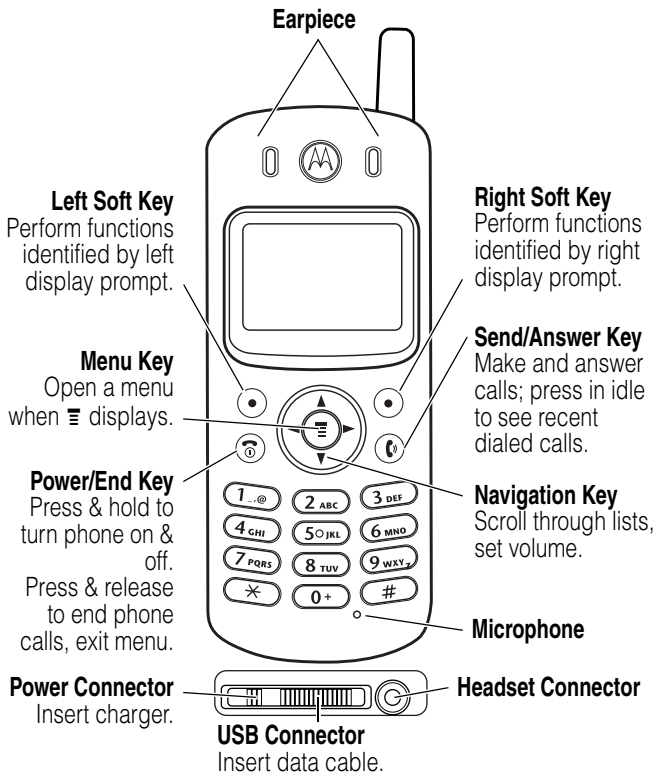

# Getting Started

## **Installing the Battery**

Install and charge the battery before you use your phone.

**CAUTION:** This phone comes with a 750 mAh (milliamp hours) battery and should be used only with Motorola Original batteries rated at 750 mAh or 1100 mAh. Use of any other battery could affect the performance of the phone and could also cause the phone to become noncompliant with the Specific Absorption Rate levels established by the FCC's Radiofrequency Exposure Guidelines.

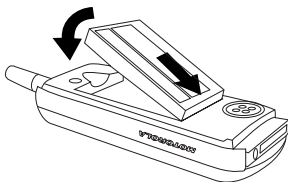


Your phone is designed to be used only with Motorola Original batteries and accessories.



## To Install the Battery

- 1 Remove the phone's back cover as described in "Changing Your Phone's Cover" on page 9.
- 2 Insert the battery, printed arrow first, **under the tabs** at the bottom of the battery compartment and push down.
- 3 Replace the phone's cover.



## Charging the Battery

New batteries are shipped partially charged. Before you can use your phone, you need to install and charge the battery, as indicated by the following instructions. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

### To Charge the Battery

- 1 Plug the charger into the left jack on the bottom of your phone.
- 2 Plug the other end of the charger into the appropriate electrical outlet.
- 3 When your phone indicates **Charge Complete**, remove the charger.





When you charge the battery, the battery level indicator in the upper right corner of the display shows how much of the charging process is complete. See “Battery Level Indicator” on page 15.

**Note:** If your phone’s ring style is set to **Vibrate**, that setting will automatically change to **Loud** while the battery is being charged. You can change the setting back to **Vibrate**. See “Setting a Ring Style” on page 31.

## **Battery Use**

**Caution:** To prevent injuries or burns, do not allow metal objects to contact or short-circuit the battery terminals.

To maximize battery performance:

- Always use Motorola Original™ battery chargers. The phone warranty does not cover damage caused from using non-Motorola battery chargers.
- New batteries or batteries that have been stored for a long time may require a longer initial charge time.
- Keep the battery at or near room temperature when charging.
- Do not expose batteries to temperatures below -10° C (14° F) or above 45° C (113° F). Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.
- When you do not intend to use a battery for a while, store it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place, such as a refrigerator.
- Over time, batteries gradually wear down and require longer charging times. This is normal. If you charge

your battery regularly and notice a decrease in talk time or an increase in charging time, then it is probably time to buy a new battery.



The rechargeable batteries that power this product must be disposed of properly and may need to be recycled. Refer to your battery's label for battery type. Contact your local recycling center for proper disposal methods. Never dispose of batteries in a fire because they may explode.



## ***Changing Your Phone's Cover***

Since you can change your phone's covers and keypads, it may not appear exactly as the phone pictured. All key locations, sequences, and functions remain the same with any of the covers.

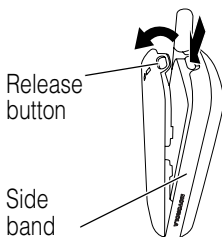
**Important:** To maintain compliance with FCC RF exposure guidelines, use only the housings supplied by Motorola with your CDMA phone, or a housing approved by Motorola for use with your CDMA phone. Use of housings not supplied by Motorola, or not approved by Motorola for use with your CDMA phone, may cause the phone-housing combination to exceed FCC RF exposure guidelines.

## Removing a Cover and Keypad



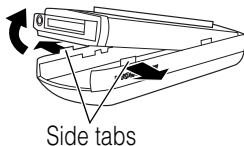
### Do This

- 1 Press down on the cover release button at the top of your phone.
- 2 Pull the top of the phone's back cover to release it.



**Note:** If the cover has a removable side band, remove it at this point.

- 3 Pull the side tabs away from the phone, then
- 4 Lift up on the bottom of the phone to pull it out of the front cover.



**Note:** Always use Motorola Original™ covers. The phone warranty does not cover damage caused from using non-Motorola accessories.

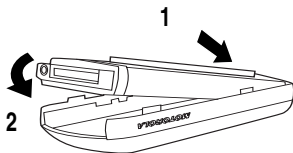
## Installing a Cover and Keypad

Always use the keypad and side band (if applicable) that matches the new cover.

### Do This

**Note:** If your phone has an end cap, install it before attaching the front cover.

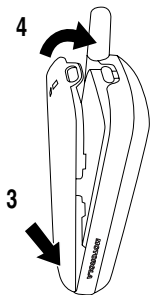
- 1 Place the keypad in the new front cover and slide the top of the phone into the top of the new front cover.



- 2 Press the bottom of the phone into the front cover until the side tabs snap into place.

**Note:** If the cover has a removable side band, attach it at this point.


- 3 Insert the bottom of the back cover.
- 4 Press the top of the back cover down until it hooks over the cover release button.



# Turning Your Phone On




## To Turn Your Phone On

- 1 Press and hold  (the End/Power key)


End/  
Power Key




- 2 If necessary, enter your four-digit unlock code and press **OK** (  ) to unlock your phone

**Note:** The unlock code is originally set to 1234 or the last four digits of your phone number (see page 27).

## Adjusting the Volume

Press right and left on the  to:

- increase or decrease earpiece volume during a call
- increase or decrease the ringer volume setting when the idle display is visible

**Tip:** At the lowest volume setting, press  down to activate silent alert. Press up to reset ring alert.

- Turn off an incoming call alert

# Making a Call

Do not block the antenna while you are on a call.



Press	To
1 keypad keys	dial the phone number
	<b>Tip:</b> If you make a mistake, press <b>DELETE</b> (⊖) to delete the last digit. Holding <b>DELETE</b> (⊖) clears all digits.
2 ⊖	make the call
3 ⊖	end the call and “hang up” the phone when you are finished

# Answering a Call

When you receive a call, your phone rings and/or vibrates and displays an incoming call message.

Press	To
1 ⊖ or <b>ANSWER</b> (⊖)	answer the call
2 ⊖	end the call and “hang up” the phone when you are finished

**Note:** If the phone is locked, unlock it to answer the call.

# Viewing Your Phone Number

Press ⊖ ⊖# to view your number from idle. While you are on a call, press ⊖ > **My Tel. Numbers**.

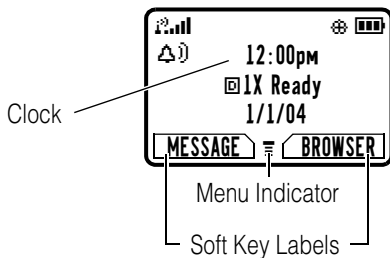
# Learning to Use Your Phone

## Using the Display

The *idle display* (shown below) is the standard display when you are *not* on a call or using the menu.

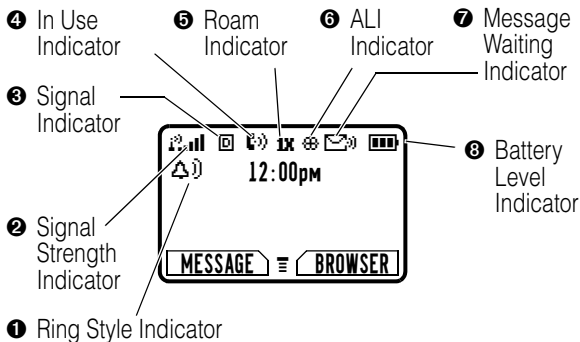


The ≡ (menu) indicator at the bottom center of the display indicates you can press the menu key (☰) to go to the main menu to see more features.

Labels at the bottom corners of the display show the current soft key functions. Press the left soft key (⊖) or right soft key (⊕) to perform the function indicated by the left or right soft key label.



At the top of the display are a number of status indicators:



**1 Ring Style Indicator** Shows the ring style setting.

= loud

= soft

= vibrate

= vibrate and ring

= silent

**2 Signal Strength Indicator** Vertical bars show the strength of the network connection. You cannot make or receive calls when the (no signal) indicator is displayed.



**3 Signal Indicator** Shows when you are receiving a digital or analog signal.

**4 In Use Indicator** Shows that a call is in progress.






**5 Roam Indicator** Shows that your phone is seeking or using another network system outside your home network. A **1X** icon indicates that it is using a CDMA 1X network.



**6 ALI Indicator** Shows the status of the automatic location information feature:

 ALI on     ALI off



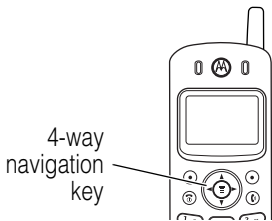
**7 Message Waiting Indicator** Displays when you receive a  text message,  voice message, or  both.

**8 Battery Level Indicator** Vertical bars show the battery charge level. Recharge the battery when you see **Low Battery** and hear the low battery alert.

## Using the 4-Way Navigation Key

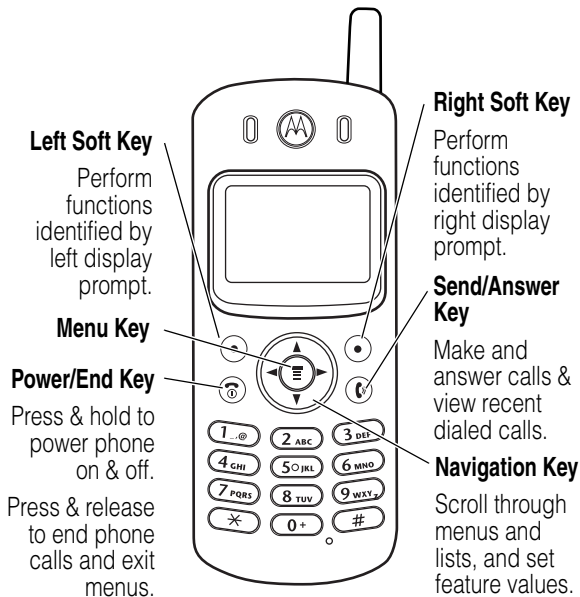
Use the 4-way navigation key to navigate the menu system, change feature settings, and play games.

**Tip:** Down and up are the primary movements within menus. Move left and right to change feature settings, navigate the datebook, and edit text.



# Using Menus

From the idle display, press  to display the main menu.





## Select a Menu Feature

From the idle display, select a menu feature as follows:

### Find the Feature

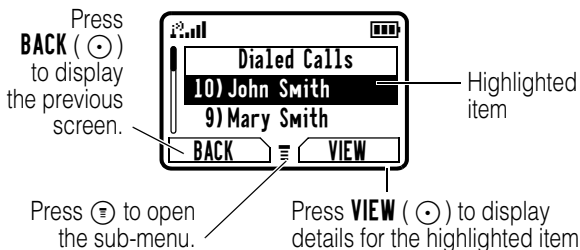
 > **Messages**  
> **Create Message**



This example shows that from the idle display, you must press , scroll to and select **Messages** from the main

menu, then scroll to and select **Create Message**. Use  to scroll, and use the left/right soft keys to select the functions listed in the bottom left and right corners of the display.

## Select a Feature Option

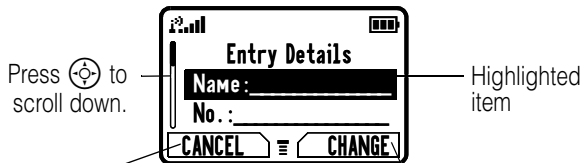
Some features require you to select an item from a list:



- Press  to scroll up or down to highlight an item.
- In a numbered list, press a number key to highlight the item.
- In an alphabetized list, press a key repeatedly to cycle through the letters on the key and highlight the closest matching list item.
- When an item has a list of possible values, press  to the left or right to scroll and select a value.
- When an item has a list of possible numeric values, press a number key to set the value.

# Entering Text

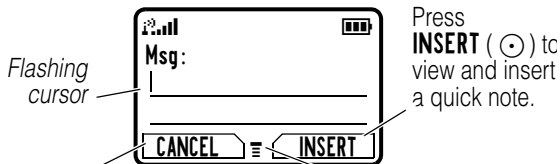
Some features require you to enter information:



Press **CANCEL** () to exit without making changes. **DONE** () displays when you enter or edit information.

Press **CHANGE** () to edit the information.

The message center lets you compose and send text messages. A *flashing cursor* shows where text will display:



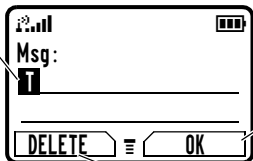
Press **CANCEL** () to exit without making changes.

Press to open the sub-menu.



When you enter text using the standard tap method (see page 21), the flashing cursor changes to a *block cursor*, and the soft key functions change:

*Block cursor* indicates current highlighted character.



Press **OK** (⊙) to accept and store the text.

After 2 seconds, the block cursor reverts to a flashing cursor and moves to the next position.

Press **DELETE** (⊙) to clear the last letter.



## Choosing a Text Entry Method

Multiple text entry modes make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages.

Press (☰) from any text entry screen to select a text entry method:


- |                          |  |

| <b>iTAP</b><br>(it)      | Let the phone predict each word as you enter it (see page 23).                         |
| <b>Tap Method</b><br>(T) | Enter letters, numbers, and symbols by pressing a key one or more times (see page 21). |
| <b>Numeric</b><br>(12)   | Enter numbers only.  |
| <b>Symbol</b><br>(@)     | Enter symbols only (see page 26).  |

**Note:** The text entry method you select remains active until you select another method.



## Using the Tap Method

This is the standard method for entering text on your phone.



Press  from a text entry screen and select **Tap Method**.

Press	To
1 A number key 1 or more times	select a letter, number, or symbol shown in the “Character Chart” on page 22
2 Number keys	enter the remaining characters
3 OK (  )	store the text

### Tap Method Text Entry Rules

- Press a number key repeatedly to cycle through its characters (see chart on page 22).
- If you do not press a key for 2 seconds, the character in the block cursor is accepted, and the cursor moves to the next position.
- Press  left or right to move the flashing cursor to the left or right in a text message.
- The first character of every sentence is capitalized. Press  down to force the character to lowercase while it is highlighted by the block cursor.













- Your phone may support multiple languages. The current language setting determines whether a new message begins on the left or right side of the display. You can switch languages within a message. Press  to select the text entry method and language you want to use.
- If you enter or edit information and do not want to save your changes, press  to exit without saving.
  - Press and hold a number key to cycle between tap, iTAP, and numeric text entry methods.




## Using iTAP<sup>®</sup> Software Text Entry Method

iTAP software is a predictive text entry method that lets you enter a word using one keypress per letter.

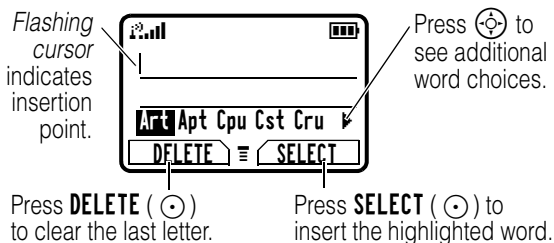
Press  from any text entry screen and select iTAP.

### Entering Words

Do This	To
1 Press a number key one time	enter the first letter of the word  The letters associated with the key are shown at the bottom of the display.
2 Press number keys (one per letter)	enter the rest of the word  Alternative words and letter combinations are shown at the bottom of the display. The word choices are updated with each keypress.
3 Press 	highlight the word you want
4 Press <b>SELECT</b> (  )	enter the word at the flashing cursor  A space is automatically inserted after the word.



For example, to spell the word “art,” press **2 ABC** **7 PQRS** **8 TUV**.



## Entering Novel Words

If the word you want is not displayed by the iTAP software:

Do This	To
1 Press <b>DELETE</b> (  ) one or more times	delete letters until you see a letter combination that matches the start of the word
2 Press  left or right	highlight the letter or letter combination
3 Press <b>SELECT</b> (  ), then press  to the left	shift the cursor to the left and “lock” the selected word portion
4 Continue to enter letters and highlight letter combinations	spell the word

## Deleting Letters and Words

Place the cursor to the right of the text you want to delete, and then:

Do This	To
Press <b>DELETE</b> (⊙)	delete one letter at a time
Hold <b>DELETE</b> (⊙)	delete the entire message

## Using the Symbol Method

To enter symbol characters in a message, press  from any text entry screen and select **Symbol**.

Do This	To
1 Press a number key one time	display its symbol options at the bottom of the display  See “Symbol Chart” on page 27.
2 Press   or  Press the number key repeatedly	highlight the symbol you want
3 Press <b>SELECT</b> (⊙)	enter the symbol

## Locking and Unlocking Your Phone

You can lock your phone manually or set the phone to lock automatically whenever you turn it off.

A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, *but you must unlock it to answer*. To use a locked phone, enter the unlock code.

You can make emergency calls on your phone even when it is locked (see page 38).



## Lock Your Phone Manually

### Find the Feature

- ☰ > Settings > Security
- > Phone Lock
- > Lock Now

Press	To
1 keypad keys	enter your unlock code
2 OK (⊙)	lock the phone

## Unlock Your Phone

**Tip:** Your phone's unlock code is set to 1234 or the last four digits of your phone number.

At the **Enter Unlock Code** prompt:

Press	To
1 keypad keys	enter your unlock code
2 OK (⊙)	unlock your phone

## Set Your Phone to Lock Automatically

You can set your phone to lock every time you turn it off.

### Find the Feature

- > Phone Lock
- > Automatic Lock > On

Press	To
1 keypad keys	enter your unlock code
2 OK (⊙)	activate automatic lock



# Changing a Code or Password

Your phone's four-digit unlock code is set to 1234, and the six-digit security code is set to 000000 at the factory. Your service provider may reset these numbers before you receive your phone.

If your service provider has *not* reset these numbers, we recommend that you change them to prevent others from accessing your personal information. The unlock code must contain four digits, and the security code must contain six digits.

To change a code or password:



## Find the Feature

 > Settings > Security  
> New Passwords

## If You Forget a Code or Password

If you forget your security code, contact your service provider.


If you forget your unlock code, try entering 1234 or the last four digits of your phone number. If that does not work, at the **Enter Unlock Code** prompt:

Press	To
1 	display the unlock code bypass screen
2 keypad keys	enter your security code
3 OK (  )	submit your security code



# Locking and Unlocking the Keypad

You can lock the keypad to prevent accidental keypresses (for example, when carrying your phone in a purse or pocket).

Press	To
 	lock or unlock your keypad

**Note:** Incoming calls and messages unlock the keypad.

## Setting a Ring Style

Your phone rings or vibrates to notify you of an incoming call or other event. This ring or vibration is called an *alert*.




You can select one of five different ring styles:

 = loud

 = soft

 = vibrate

 = vibrate and ring

 = silent

The ring style indicator in the display shows the current ring style (see page 15).

To set a ring style:

**Find the Feature**

 > Ring Styles > Style

**Press**

**To**

1 

scroll to the ring style

2 **SELECT** ()

select the ring style

Each ring style contains settings for specific event alerts, ringer ID, and ringer and keypad volume.

To change these settings:

**Find the Feature**

> Style Detail

\* **Style** represents the current alert style, such as **Loud**, **Soft**, **Vibrate**, **Vibe&Ring**, or **Silent**.

## ***Setting a Wallpaper Image***

You can set a picture or an animation as a wallpaper (background) image in your phone's idle display.

**Note:** When you set an animation as a wallpaper image, only the first frame of the animation is displayed.

- > **Wallpaper**

<b>Setting</b>	<b>Description</b>
<b>Picture</b>	select the picture or animation for the background image in your idle display

## ***Setting a Screen Saver Image***

You can set a picture or an animation as a screen saver image. The image displays when the phone detects no activity for a specified time.

The screen saver image fills the display. An animation repeats for one minute, then the first frame of the animation displays.

### Find the Feature

- ☰ > **Settings**
- > **Other Settings**
- > **Personalize**
- > **Screen Saver**

Setting	Description
Picture	select the picture that displays when your phone is idle
Delay	select how long your phone must be idle before the screen saver picture displays

## Zooming In and Out

Press and release ☰, then press and hold ☰ to zoom in and out on the display. Zoom in to increase text size, zoom out to display more information.

You can also zoom in and out from the menu:

- > **Initial Setup > Zoom**

You can select the color palette that your phone uses to display indicators, highlights, and soft key labels.

## Adjusting the Backlight

You can set the amount of time that the display backlight remains on, or turn off the backlight to conserve battery power.

### Find the Feature

- > Initial Setup
- > Backlight



**Caution:** Your battery will not last as long if you use the **Continuous** setting. Your phone might not offer this setting.

## Changing the Active Line





Change the active phone line to make and receive calls from your other phone number.

### Find the Feature

- ☰ > Settings
- > Phone Status
- > Active Line

## Redialing a Number

If you hear an ordinary busy signal:

Press	To
1 	hang up
2 	redial the busy number

## Using Automatic Redial

If the network is busy, you hear a fast busy signal, and your phone displays **Call Failed**.

With automatic redial, your phone automatically redials the number for four minutes. When the call goes through, your



phone rings or vibrates one time, displays **Redial Successful**, and then connects the call.

You must turn on automatic redial to use the feature. To turn automatic redial on or off:

### Find the Feature

- ⊙ > Settings
- > Other Settings
- > Initial Setup
- > Auto Redial

When automatic redial is turned off, you can manually activate the feature to redial a phone number. When you hear a fast busy signal and see **Call Failed**:

Press	To
⊙ or <b>RETRY</b> (⊙)	activate automatic redial

## Using Caller ID



*Calling line identification* (caller ID) displays the phone number for incoming calls.

The phone displays the caller's name when the name is stored in your phonebook, or

**Incoming Call** when caller ID information is not available.

## Canceling an Incoming Call

While the phone is ringing or vibrating:

Press	To
⊙ or <b>IGNORE</b> (⊙)	cancel the incoming call





Depending on your phone settings and/or service subscription, the call may be forwarded to another number, or the caller may hear a busy signal.

## **Turning Off a Call Alert**

You can turn off your phone's incoming call alert before answering the call.

<b>Press</b>	<b>To</b>
left or right	turn off the alert

## **Calling an Emergency Number**

Your service provider programs one or more emergency phone numbers, such as 911, that you can call under any circumstances, even when your phone is locked.

**Note:** Emergency numbers vary by country. Your phone's preprogrammed emergency number(s) may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues.

# Viewing Recent Calls

Your phone keeps a list of the calls you recently received and dialed, even if the calls did not connect. The lists are sorted from newest to oldest, and contain up to 10 entries. The oldest entries are deleted as new ones are added.



voicemail number. Your service provider may have already done this for you.

## Using Voicemail



You can listen to your voicemail messages by calling your network voicemail phone number. Voicemail messages are stored on the network—not on your phone.

Storing your voicemail number on your phone makes it easy for you to listen to new voicemail messages. Usually, your service provider has already done this for you.



## ***Specific Absorption Rate Data***

---

**This model wireless phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.**

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 W/kg.<sup>1</sup> Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) reported to the FCC and available for review by Industry Canada. The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested for use at the ear is 1.58 W/kg, and when worn on the body, as

described in this user guide, is 0.6 W/kg (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and regulatory requirements).<sup>2</sup>

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure. Please note that improvements to this product model could cause differences in the SAR value for later products; in all cases, products are designed to be within the guidelines.
