BATTERIES

MAINTENANCE

Auto-stop

During playback, when the tape reaches its end, the automatic stop system will release [▶].

Note:

- Do not open the cassette compartment cover during tape operation.
- Between functions (during play, fast forward or rewind), always press
- [] first to avoid jamming the tape.

- •When the tape reaches the end after fast forward or rewind, press [to release the button.

If the surfaces are dirty






Mode selection


Press and hold [-MODE] for more than 2 seconds. "11" (MODE 1) or "2" (MODE 2) is shown on the display.

Memory presetting

1. Press and hold [• M.SELECT - MEMO].

2. While the frequency is flashing, Press (+) or (-) to tune the station.

- Press [+] or [-] to set the memory
- 5. Press (.M.SELECT MEMO).

When using overseas

The allocation settings according to the area are needed. A different allocation can be selected for each mode.

FM 0.05 MHz, AM 9 kHz-

How to adjust the allocation settings

- 1. Press and hold [MODE] to select the mode.
- 2. Press and hold [MODE] and [• M.SELECT - MEMO] at a same
- The changed allocation settings (FM and then AM) will appear on the display.

Listening caution
