For your safety, please read the following text carefully.

This appliance is supplied with a moulded three pin mains plug for your safety and convenience.

A 5-ampere fuse is fitted in this plug.

Should the fuse need to be replaced please ensure that the replacement fuse has a rating of 5-ampere and that it is approved by ASTA or BSI to BS1362.

Check for the ASTA mark  or the BSI mark  on the body of the fuse.

If the plug contains a removable fuse cover you must ensure that it is refitted when the fuse is replaced.

If you lose the fuse cover the plug must not be used until a replacement cover is obtained.

A replacement fuse cover can be purchased from your local dealer.

### CAUTION!

IF THE FITTED MOULDED PLUG IS UNSUITABLE FOR THE SOCKET OUTLET IN YOUR HOME THEN THE FUSE SHOULD BE REMOVED AND THE PLUG CUT OFF AND DISPOSED OF SAFELY.

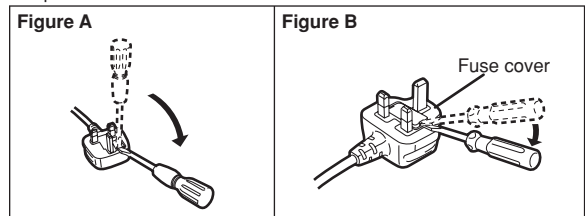

### How to replace the fuse

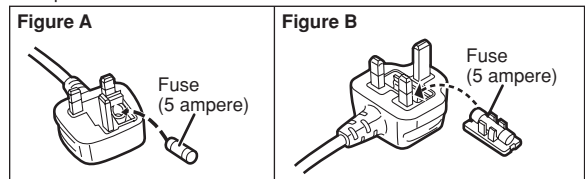
The location of the fuse differ according to the type of AC mains plug (figures A and B). Confirm the AC mains plug fitted and follow the instructions below.

Illustrations may differ from actual AC mains plug.

1. Open the fuse cover with a screwdriver.



2. Replace the fuse and close or attach the fuse cover.



## Safety precautions

### Placement

Set the unit up on an even surface away from direct sunlight, high temperatures, high humidity, and excessive vibration. These conditions can damage the cabinet and other components, thereby shortening the unit's service life.

Place it at least 15 cm away from wall surfaces to avoid distortion and unwanted acoustical effects.

Do not place heavy items on the unit.

### Voltage

Do not use high voltage power sources. This can overload the unit and cause a fire.

Do not use a DC power source. Check the source carefully when setting the unit up on a ship or other places where DC is used.

### AC mains lead protection

Ensure the AC mains lead is connected correctly and not damaged. Poor connection and lead damage can cause fire or electric shock. Do not pull, bend, or place heavy items on the lead.

Grasp the plug firmly when unplugging the lead. Pulling the AC mains lead can cause electric shock.

Do not handle the plug with wet hands. This can cause electric shock.

### Foreign matter

Do not let metal objects fall inside the unit. This can cause electric shock or malfunction.

Do not let liquids get into the unit. This can cause electric shock or malfunction. If this occurs, immediately disconnect the unit from the power supply and contact your dealer.

Do not spray insecticides onto or into the unit. They contain flammable gases which can ignite if sprayed into the unit.

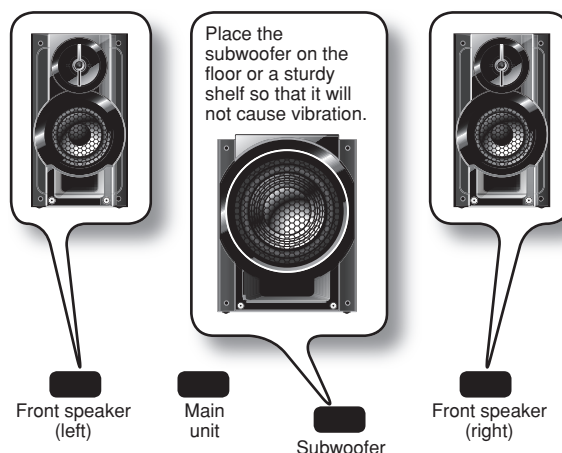
### Service

Do not attempt to repair this unit by yourself. If sound is interrupted, indicators fail to light, smoke appears, or any other problem that is not covered in these instructions occurs, disconnect the AC mains lead and contact your dealer or an authorized service centre. Electric shock or damage to the unit can occur if the unit is repaired, disassembled or reconstructed by unqualified persons.

Extend operating life by disconnecting the unit from the power source if it is not to be used for a long time.

## Placement of speakers

Front speakers are designed identically so that no left or right channel orientation is necessary.



You cannot take the front net off the speakers.

### Use only the supplied speakers.

The combination of the main unit and speakers provide the best sound. Using other speakers can damage the unit and sound quality will be negatively affected.

### Note:

- Keep your speakers at least 10mm away from the system for proper ventilation.
- These speakers do not have magnetic shielding. Do not place them near televisions, personal computers or other devices easily influenced by magnetism.
- You can damage your speakers and shorten their useful life if you play sound at high levels over extended periods.
- Reduce the volume in the following cases to avoid damage.
  - When playing distorted sound.
  - When adjusting the sound quality.

### Caution

- **Use the speakers only with the recommended system. Failure to do so can damage the amplifier and speakers, and can cause fire. Consult a qualified service person if damage occurs or if a sudden change in performance is apparent.**
- **Do not attach these speakers to walls or ceilings.**

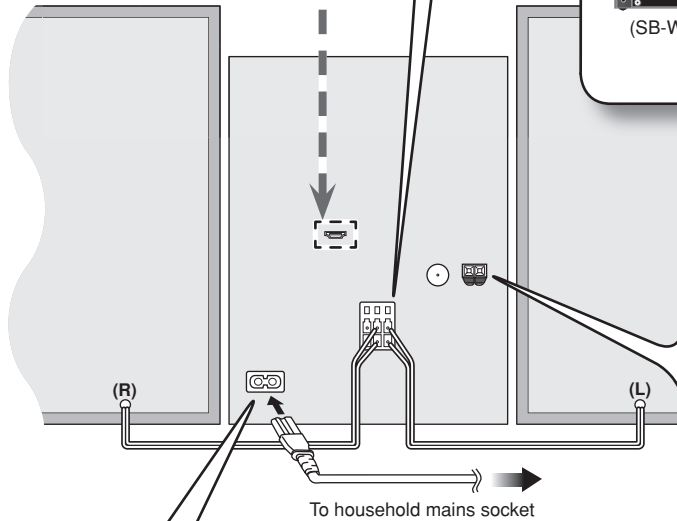
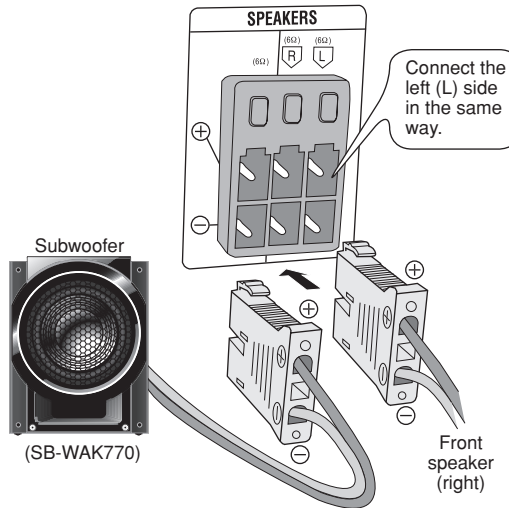
## Making the connections

Connect the AC mains lead only after all the other connections have been made.

### Speaker connections

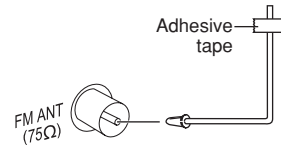
Speaker	Terminal or connector color

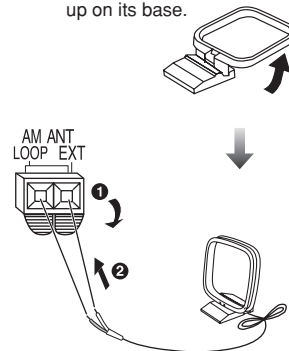
### Antenna connections

- **FM indoor antenna**  
Tape the antenna where reception is best.



- **AM loop antenna**

Stand the antenna up on its base.

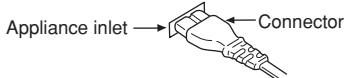


### Power supply connection

#### Insertion of connector

Even when the connector is perfectly inserted, depending on the type of inlet used, the front part of the connector may jut out as shown in the drawing. However there is no problem using the unit.



#### For your reference

To save power when the unit is not to be used for a long time, unplug it from the household mains socket. You will need to reset some memory items after plugging in the unit.

#### Note:

- The included AC mains lead is for use with this unit only. Do not use it with other equipment.
- Do not use an AC mains lead from other equipment.

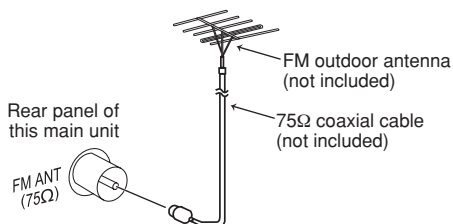
### Optional antenna connections

Use an outdoor antenna if the radio reception is poor.

**Note:**

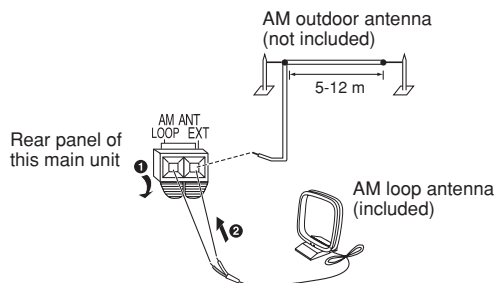
Disconnect the outdoor antenna when the unit is not in use.  
Do not use the outdoor antenna during a lightning storm.

#### FM outdoor antenna



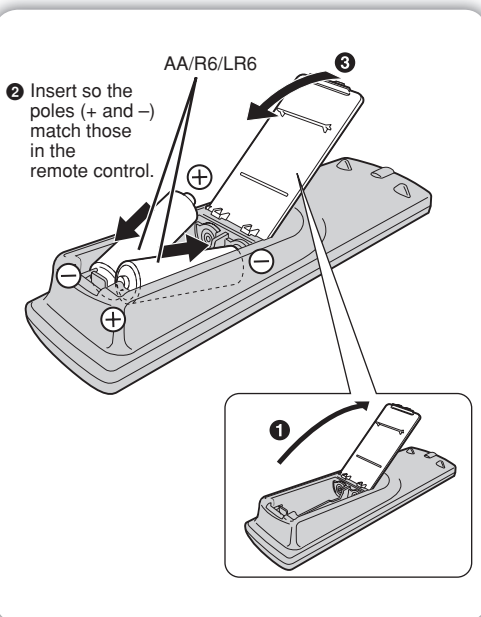
- Disconnect the FM indoor antenna.
- The antenna should be installed by a competent technician.

#### AM outdoor antenna



- Run a piece of vinyl wire horizontally across a window or other convenient location.
- Leave the loop antenna connected.

### Preparing the remote control



**Do not:**

- mix old and new batteries.
- use different types of batteries at the same time.
- take apart or short circuit the batteries.
- attempt to recharge alkaline or manganese batteries.
- use batteries if the covering has been peeled off.

Mishandling of batteries in the remote control can cause electrolyte leakage, which may cause a fire.

Remove the batteries if the remote control is not going to be used for a long period of time. Store in a cool, dark place.

■ **Use**

Aim at the remote control signal sensor (→ page 8), avoiding obstacles, at a maximum range of 7 m directly in front of the unit.

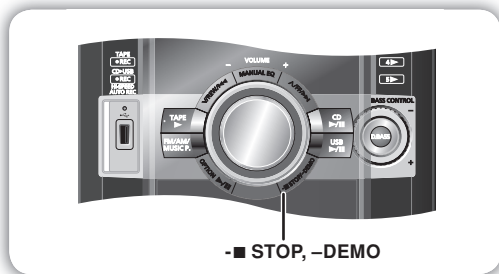

## DEMO function



When the unit is first plugged in, a demonstration of its functions may be shown on the display.  
If the demo setting is off, you can show a demonstration by selecting "DEMO ON".

**Press and hold [- ■ STOP, -DEMO] on the main unit.**

The display changes each time you press and hold the button.  
DEMO OFF (off) ↔ DEMO ON (on)

While in standby mode, select "DEMO OFF" to reduce power consumption.

## Handling of the disc trays and discs

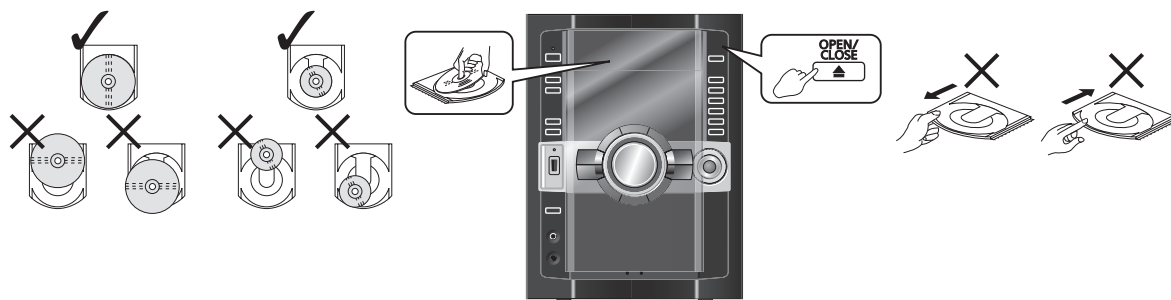
Not doing the following will cause damage to the unit.

### Removing the mains plug

Press [⏻/⏸] to turn off the unit and remove the mains plug only after all the displays have disappeared.

### Inserting a disc

### Tray caution



- Place the disc correctly with the label facing up as shown in the diagram.
- Insert one disc into the tray.

- Always press [▲, OPEN/CLOSE] to insert or remove a disc.
- Do not push or pull out the tray by hand as this will cause an accident.

### NOTE on CDs

- This unit can access up to 99 tracks.
- Choose disc with this mark.



- This unit can play MP3 files and CD-DA format audio CD-R/RW that have been finalised.
- It may not be able to play some CD-R/RW due to the condition of the recording.
- Do not use irregularly shaped disc.
- Do not use disc with labels and stickers that are coming off or with adhesive exuding from under labels and stickers.
- Do not attach extra labels or stickers on the disc.
- Do not write anything on the disc.

### Note about using a DualDisc

The digital audio content side of a DualDisc does not meet the technical specifications of the Compact Disc Digital Audio (CD-DA) format so playback may not be possible.

### NOTE on MP3

- Files are treated as tracks and folders are treated as albums.
- This unit can access up to 999 tracks, 255 albums and 20 sessions.
- Disc must conform to ISO9660 level 1 or 2 (except for extended formats).
- To play in a certain order, prefix the folder and file names with 3-digits numbers in the order you want to play them.

When "NOT MP3/ERROR1" appears on the display, an unsupported MP3 format is being played. The unit will skip that track and play the next one.

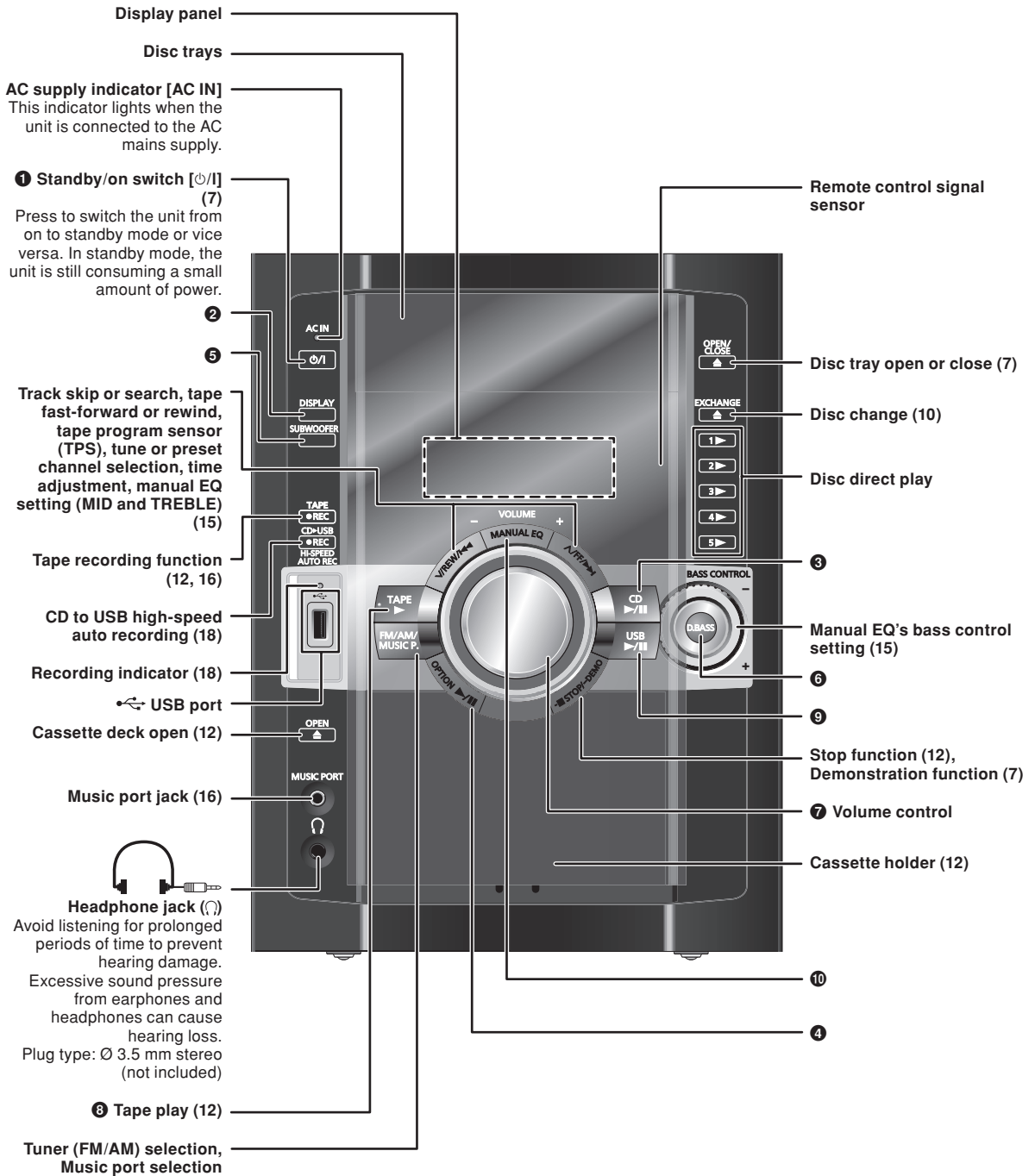
### Limitations on MP3 play

- If you have recorded MP3 on the same disc as CD-DA, only the format recorded in the first session can be played.
- Some MP3s may not be played due to the condition of the disc or recording.
- Recordings will not necessarily be played in the order you recorded them.

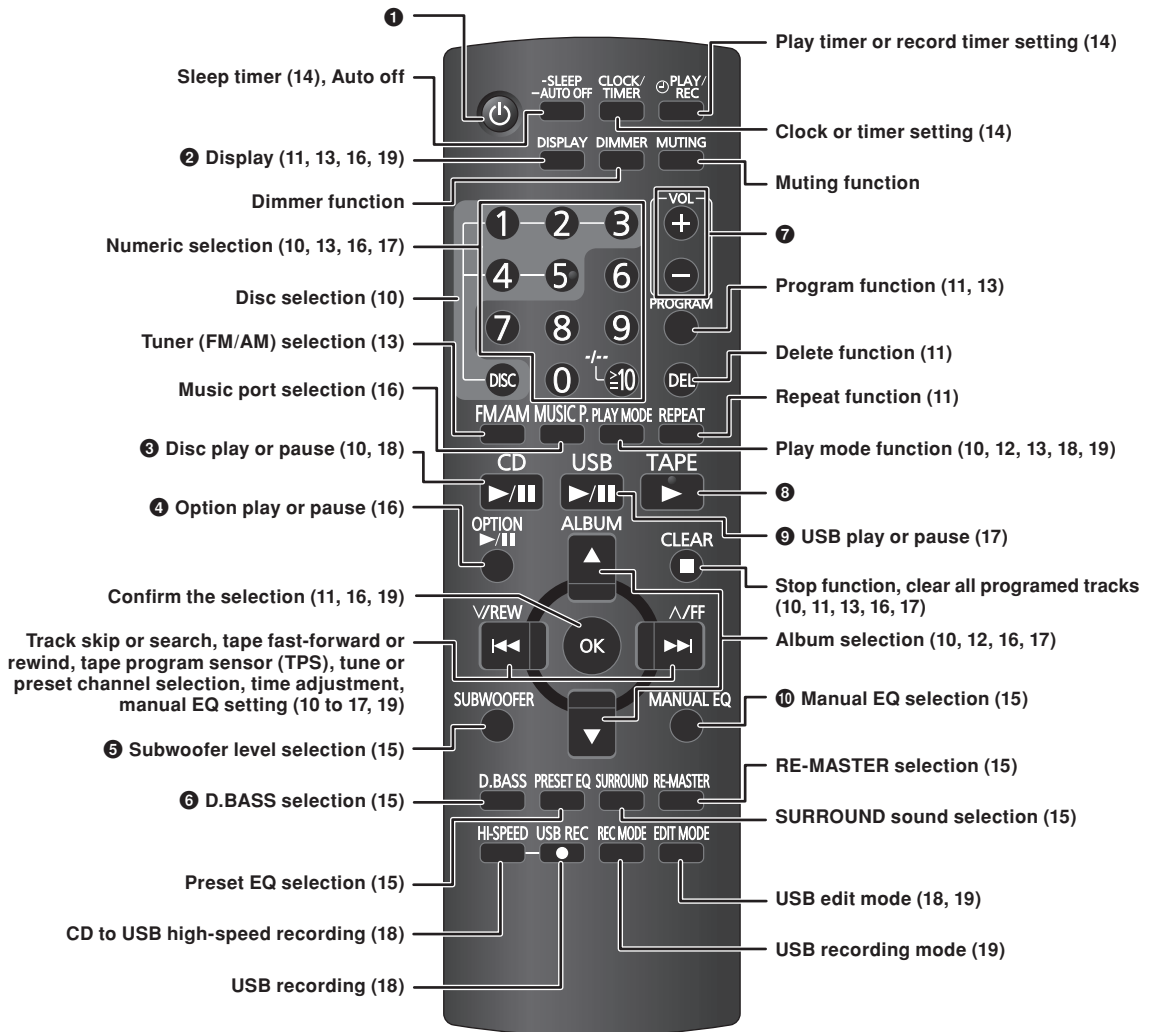

- Tape slack can get caught up in the mechanism and should be wound up before the tape is played.

## TPS (Tape Program Sensor)

This function enables you to search the beginning of up to a maximum of 9 tracks.

Press [∇/REW/◀◀] or [∧/FF/▶▶] during play. Play resumes from the track found.

### Note:

- TPS may not operate correctly in the following situations:
- If the interval between tracks is less than 4 seconds.
- If there is noise between tracks.
- If there are silent parts within tracks.



## Selection of tapes for recording

Use normal position tapes.

High position and metal position tapes can be used, but this unit will not be able to record or erase them correctly.

### Note:

- Changes to volume and sound quality do not affect recording.
- This function does not work during any “RANDOM” mode selection.

Wind up the source tape so recording can begin immediately.

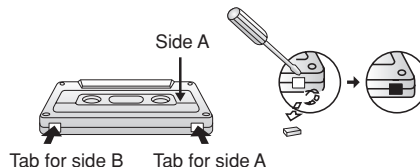

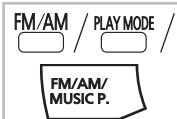

# Using the FM/AM radio



## Manual tuning

- 1 Press [FM/AM] (main unit: [FM/AM/MUSIC P.]) to select "FM" or "AM".
- 2 Press [PLAY MODE] to select "MANUAL".
- 3 Press [◀, √/REW] or [▶, ∧/FF] to select the frequency of the required station.  
"ST" is displayed when a stereo FM broadcast is being received.

### To tune automatically

- A device using NTFS file system is not supported. [Only FAT 12/16/32 (File Allocation Table 12/16/32) file system is supported]
- Depending on the sector size, some files may not work.
- Maximum album: 255 albums
- Maximum track: 2500 tracks
- Maximum track in one album: 999 tracks
- Only one memory card will be selected when connecting a multiport USB card reader. Typically the first memory card inserted.
- Disconnect the USB card reader from the unit when you remove the memory card. Failure to do so may cause malfunction to the device.
- When you connect a compatible digital audio player to the USB port, charging may be activated. It will not charge when the unit is in standby mode (during "DEMO OFF").

## Recording to a USB mass storage device

You can record sound or music tracks from the disc to a USB mass storage device.

- This function does not work during any "RANDOM" mode selection.

This unit uses a copy management system to limit the use of high-speed recording.

- You are unable to perform a second high-speed recording from the same CD within 74 minutes upon the completion of the first high-speed recording. (You are able to perform the second recording at the normal speed.) "PLEASE WAIT XX MIN" will be displayed if you try to perform a second high-speed recording. "XX MIN" – the number of minutes you need to wait prior to performing the second recording.
- You are unable to perform high-speed recording if the USB's remaining REC (recording) time is shorter than the CD album's total playback time. "CAN'T REC" will be displayed.
