



Environmental Information

All unnecessary packaging has been omitted. We have tried to make the packaging easy to separate into three materials: cardboard (box), polystyrene foam (buffer) and polyethylene (bags, protective foam sheet).

Your system consists of materials which can be recycled and reused if disassembled by a specialized company. Please observe the local regulations regarding the disposal of packaging materials, exhausted batteries and old equipment.



Safety Information

- Before operating the system, check that the operating voltage indicated on the typeplate (or the voltage indication beside the voltage selector) of your system is identical with the voltage of your local power supply. If not, please consult your dealer.
- Place the system on a flat, hard and stable surface.
- Place the system in a location with adequate ventilation to prevent internal heat build-up in your system. Allow at least 10 cm (4 inches) clearance from the rear and the top of the unit and 5 cm (2 inches) from each side.
- The ventilation should not be impeded by covering the ventilation openings with items, such as newspapers, table-cloths, curtains, etc.
- Do not expose the system, batteries or discs to excessive moisture, rain, sand or heat sources caused by heating equipment or direct sunlight.
- No naked flame sources, such as lighted candles, should be placed on the apparatus.
- No objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the apparatus.
- The apparatus shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing.
- Install this unit near the AC outlet and where the AC power plug can be reached easily.
- If the system is brought directly from a cold to a warm location, or is placed in a very damp room, moisture may condense on the lens of the disc unit inside the system. Should this occur, the CD player would not operate normally. Leave the power on for about one hour with no disc in the system until normal playback is possible.
- The mechanical parts of the set contain selflubricating bearings and must not be oiled or lubricated.
- When the system is switched to Standby mode, it is still consuming some power. To disconnect the system from the power supply completely, remove the AC power plug from the wall socket.

Preparations



Rear connections

The type plate is located at the rear of the system.

A Power

Before connecting the AC power cord to the wall outlet, ensure that the following are done;

 If your system is equipped with a Voltage Selector, set the VOLTAGE SELECTOR to the local power line voltage.

- All other connections have been made.

WARNING!


 For optimal performance, use only the original power cable.

 Never make or change any connections with the power switched on.

To avoid overheating of the system, a safety circuit has been built in. Therefore, your system may switch to Standby mode automatically under extreme conditions. If this happens, let the system cool down before reusing it (not available for all versions).

(B) Antennas Connection MW Antenna

Connect the supplied MW loop antenna to the "AM antenna" terminal. Adjust the position of the antenna for optimal reception.



 Position the antenna as far as possible from a TV, VCR or other radiation source.

FM Antenna

It is unnecessary to connect the FM pigtail antenna since it is fixed to the main unit.

English

Adjust the FM antenna for optimal FM stereo reception.

C Speakers Connection

Connect the speaker wires to the SPEAKERS terminals, right speaker to "**R**" and left speaker to "**L**", colored (marked) wire to "**+**" and black (unmarked) wire to "**-**".



 Fully insert the stripped portion of the speaker wire into the terminal as shown.

Notes:

- For optimal sound performance, use the supplied speakers.
- Do not connect more than one speaker to any one pair of +/ — speaker terminals.

 Do not connect speakers with an impedance lower than the speakers supplied. Please refer to the SPECIFICATIONS section of this manual.

D Video Out Connection

Connect the **VIDEO OUT** terminal at the rear of the system to the TV or VCR VIDEO IN for viewing or recording.

Optional connection

The optional equipment and connecting cords are not supplied. Refer to the operating instructions of the connected equipment for details.

Connecting other equipment to your system

Connect the audio left and right OUT terminals of a TV,VCR, Laser Disc player, DVD player or CD Recorder to the **AUX** terminals.

Note:

 If you are connecting equipment with a mono output (a single audio out terminal), connect it to the AUX left terminal. Alternatively, you can use a "single to double" cinch cable (the output sound still remain mono).

Inserting batteries into the Remote Control

Insert two batteries (type R06 or AA) into the remote control with the correct polarity as indicated by the + and - symbols inside the battery compartment.



CAUTION!

- Remove batteries if they are exhausted or not to be used for a long time.
- Do not use old and new or different
- types of batteries in combination.
- Batteries contain chemical substances, so they should be disposed off properly.

Controls on the system and remote control

1 STANDBY ON O

switches the system on or to standby mode.

2 Display screen

views the current status of the system.

3 SOURCE

 selects the respective sound source :VCD/CD TUNER, TAPE or AUX.

4 BAND

for Tuner selects waveband : FM or MW.

5 PROGRAM (PROG)

for VCD/CD/MP3-CD.....programs disc tracks.

(6) ALBUM-/+ ◄◄/►► (ALBUM ▲/▼)

for MP3-CD selects previous/next album. for Clock/Timer adjusts the hours. *for VCD/CD/MP3-CD.....(on the set only) fast reverses/forwards the disc.

(7) TITLE-/+ ◄/ ► (◄< / ►►)

for VCD/CD/MP3 CD....selects a desired track/ preset. for Clock/Timer adjusts the minutes.

*for VCD/CD/MP3-CD.....(on the remote only) fast reverses/forwards the disc.

for VCD/CD/MP3-CD....starts or interrupts playback.

for VCD/CD/MP3-CD...stops playback or clears a program.

 plays a certain scene or passage of a CD/VCD repeatedly. (REPEAT A - B is not possible for MP3-CD)

 returns to the previous MENU level during playack (for VCD with PBC on)

26 AUDIO/VOCAL

- fades out the original vocal from a Karaoke VCD or switches between mono or stereo mode during audio disc playback.

turns on/off the dim mode.


- adjusts the VCD echo level for Karaoke after inserting the microphone.
- selects MIC ON or OFF.

Notes for remote control:

 First, select the source you wish to control by pressing one of the source select keys on the remote control (VCD/ CD or TUNER, for example).

Basic Functions



IMPORTANT!

Before you operate the system, complete the preparation procedures.

Switching the system on

Press STANDBY ON (). The system will switch to the lateral system will switch to the lateral system.

→ The system will switch to the last selected source.

 Press SOURCE on the system or VCD/CD, TUNER, TAPE or AUX on the remote control.

→ The system will switch to the selected source.

→ The volume level (up to a maximum level of 20), interactive sound settings and last selected source will be retained in the player's memory.

Power-saving automatic standby

As a power-saving feature, the system automatically switches to standby 15 minutes after a tape or disc has reached the end and no control is operated.

Adjusting volume and sound

 Adjust the VOLUME control (or press VOL +/on the remote) to decrease or increase the volume of the system.

→ Display shows the volume level 1^{\prime} $^{\circ}$ L and a number from 0, 1, ...39, 40.

Press DBB to switch bass enhancement on or off.

→ Display shows: DBB ON or DBB OFF.

To listen through the headphones

- Connect the headphones plug to the A socket at the front of the system.
 - → The speakers will be muted.

To switch off the volume temporarily

- Press MUTE on the remote control.
 Playback will continue without sound and "MUTE" is displayed.
- To restore the volume, press MUTE again or increase the volume level.


Dimming the system's display

You can select the desired brightness for the display panel.

In any active mode, press **DIM** on the remote control.

→ **DIM** is shown, except for DIM OFF mode.

CD/VCD/MP3-CD Operation



IMPORTANT!

This system is designed for regular discs. Therefore, do not use any accessories such as disc stabiliser rings or disc treatment sheets, etc., as offered on the market, because they may jam the disc mechanism.
Do not load more than one disc into the tray.

Before viewing the Video CD, ensure that the set is switched to corresponding PAL or NTSC system of your TV set (except Multisystem TV).

Discs for Playback

This system can play all digital audio CD, video CD, MP3-CD format discs, finalised digital audio CD-Recordable (CDR) discs and finalised digital audio CD-Rewritable (CDRW)discs.



Support following MP3-CD formats (IS09660 format):

- The max. track number plus album number is: 416
- The max. nested directory: 8 levels

- Supported variable bit rate.
- The max. number of programmed MP3 tracks: 20
- Supported sampling frequencies for MP3 disc : 32 kHz, 44.1 kHz, 48 kHz
- Supported Bit-rates of MP3 disc: 56, 64, 96, 128, 192, 256 (kbps)

Formats not supported

- Files such as *.WMA, *AAC, *.DLF, *.M3U, *.PLS
- Non-English album/title names
- CD-ROM, CD-I, CDV, DVD or computer CDs, however, are not possible.

IMPORTANT!

The lens of the CD player should never be touched.



Playing a disc

- Select VCD/ CD source.
- Press OPEN•CLOSE to open the disc tray.
 DPEN is displayed when you open the CD compartment.
- I Load a disc with the printed side facing up. Press
 OPEN•CLOSE again to close the disc tray.
 → READ is displayed as the system scans the contents of a disc.

Playback starts automatically.

The current track number and elapsed playing time of the track are displayed during disc playback.

I To interrupt playback, press ►II. Press it again to resume playback.

→ (For VCD/CD) The total number of tracks and playing time are shown.

- → (For MP3) The total album number and total title/ track number are displayed.
- Playback will also stop when;
 - the CD door is opened.
 - the disc has reached the end.
 - you select another source:TAPE,TUNER or AUX.

Notes:

 To ensure good system performance, wait until the disc is completely read before proceeding.
 For MP3-CD, the disc reading time may exceed 10 seconds due to the large number of songs and different formats compiled in one disc.

Selecting a different track/title

- Press **TITLE-/+** I</▶I (I◄</▶►I on the remote) once or repeatedly until the desired track/title number appears in the display.
- Use the Numeric Keypad (0-9) to select the desired track.(numbers consisting more than 2 figures must be keyed in within 2 seconds).

For MP3-CD only

To select a desired Album

Press ALBUM-/+ ◄◄/►> (ALBUM ▲/▼ on the remote) repeatedly until the desired Album appears on the display.

Finding a passage within a track

To search for a particular passage during playback:

For CD/MP3-CD

- Press and hold ALBUM-/+ <
 I on the remote).
- When you recognise the passage you want, release ALBUM-/+ <
 (I<< / >> I on the remote).
 Normal playback continues.

For VCD

Press and hold ALBUM-/+ <
 Press and hold ALBUM-/+ <
 Press and hold ALBUM-/+ <
 Press and release to be but on until the desired rewind or forward speed is shown on the display or the TV.

→ "REWINDX1"; "REWINDX2"; "REWINDX3" or "REWINDX4" will be displayed on the TV screen when you select a fast rewind search. → "FORWARDX1"; "FORWARDX2";

"FORWARDX3" or "FORWARDX4" will be displayed on the TV screen when you select a fast forward search.

→ Normal playback will begin at the end of the fast rewinding or forwarding of the selected track.

Playback returns to normal when II is pressed or when a new track is selected.

Different play modes: SHUFFLE and REPEAT

You can select and change the various play modes before or during playback.

SHUFtracks of the entire disc are played in random order

SHUF REPALL...repeats the entire disc continuously in random order

REP ALL repeats the entire disc/ program **REP** plays the current track

repeatedly

- To select your play mode, press REPEAT or SHUFFLE on the remote control before or during playback until the display shows the desired function. (SHUF, REP, REP ALL)
- Press II to start playback if in the STOP position.
- To return to normal playback, press REPEAT or SHUFFLE until the various SHUFFLE / REPEAT modes are no longer displayed.

You can also press STOP ■ to cancel your play mode.

Text display and ID3 Text

In CD mode

- Press **DISPLAY (OSD)** repeatedly to see the following information on the display panel.
 - → Elapsed play time of current track.
 - → Remaining play time of current track.
 - → Total remaining play time.

In MP3-CD mode

This feature is used to display the ID3 information for MP3-CD.

 Press DISPLAY (OSD) repeatedly to display the ID3 Text (if available) on the TV screen.

Programming the disc tracks

Programming tracks is possible when playback is stopped. Up to 20 tracks can be stored in the memory in any order.

- In the disc mode and when disc playback is stopped, press **PROGRAM** (**PROG** on the remote) to start programming.
 - → ForVCD/CD, PROG flashes.
 - For MP3-CD, an album and title numbers are shown and **PROG** flashes.
- For MP3-CD, press ALBUM-/+ ◄◄/>> (ALBUM ▲/▼ on the remote) and TITLE-/+ I◀/ ▶ (I◄◀ / ▶→I on the remote) repeatedly (or use the Numeric Keypad (0-9) on the remote control) to select the desired Album and Title for programming.
- Press PROGRAM (PROG on the remote) to store the track.
- Repeat **steps 1–3** to store other tracks.
- ④ Press ▶ II to start programme playback.

Notes:

Programme cannot be used for VCDs when PBC is switched on. Switch off PBC before storing tracks.
 If you attempt to programme more than 20 tracks, "FULL " will be displayed.

To review the programme

- Stop playback and press TITLE-/+ I</>→ (I<
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- To exit review mode, press ■.

Erasing the program

You can erase the program by:

- opening the CD compartment;
- change to other source.

Playing a mixed mode disc

This set can play a mixed mode disc.

mixture of audio CD and MP3-CD

mixture of other combination may not be operated normally.

- I As default, audio CD tracks will be read first.
- Press MIX/SEL on the remote control repeatedly to select other disc modes.

MP3-CD:


→ MP3 is displayed.

→ On the TV screen, an MP3 menu is displayed.

Note :

For protected CDs, "MIX CD-DA" is displayed on your TV screen even if the disc does not have other format. The MIX/SEL normal functions are not available for protected CDs.

VIDEO CD



Adjusting the TV System

Before viewing the Video CD, ensure that the set is switched to corresponding PAL or NTSC system of yourTV set (except Multi–system TV).

 Press and hold PAL/NTSC on the remote control for more than 3 seconds to switch between PAL or NTSC TV system.

OSD – On Screen Display

If you insert a VCD/ CD/ MP3 disc, your TV screen will serve as an additional display for messages (e.g. PLAY, STOP), and information stored on the VCD.

 Press **DISPLAY** (**OSD**) on the remote control repeatedly to switch on or off the On Screen Display.

When OSD is switched ON, you can see the following display on the TV screen.

Below is an example of the OSD message.

- Elapsed playback time of current track
- Remaining playback time of current track
- Total remaining time of current disc
- OFF

XX-MM:SS

SINGLE REMAIN

- "XX" is the current track.
- "MM" is in minutes.
- "SS" is in seconds.

Note:

- You can also view the information from an MP3-CD or normal CD.

Playing a Video CD with PBC

VCD with PBC (Playback Control) will be indicated on the display of the set as soon as the disc is inserted. PBC is a predefined play sequence stored in the VCD.

- Switch on the TV, insert a VCD with PBC and press ►II to start playback.
- 2 A menu appears on the TV screen.

If the menu consists of a list of titles, you can select a sequence directly

Use the Numeric Keypad (0-9) on the remote control to select your choice.
 The VCD starts to play in the selected sequence automatically.

Switching off PBC

Press **PBC** on the remote control.

→ "PBC OFF" appears on the TV screen.

Notes:

 The programme mode is not available whenever the PBC mode is switched on.

 The menu structure depends on the information stored on the VCD. Please refer to the information supplied with the disc.

– PBC will be set to OFF if ■ is pressed. To play the same VCD with PBC on, please press PBC on the remote control again.

Return

Press RETURN to return to the previous VCD disc MENU level. PBC mode must be switched on.

Digest

This feature allows you to scan through a VCD for a quick review.

In the stop mode

- Press **DIGEST** on the remote control.
 The first 6 seconds of each track are played.
- 2 Use the Numeric Keypad (0-9) on the remote control to play the desired tracks.
 → Press TITLE-/+ I</>> I
 → In the remote) to view the previous or next page for additional information.

During playback

- Press DIGEST on the remote control.
 The current track of the selected disc will be divided into 9 parts and displayed on the TV screen.
- Use the Numeric Keypad (0-9) on the remote control to play from the desired position.
- Press TITLE-/+ I√/► (I◄◄ / ►►I on the remote) to digest the previous or next track.

To exit the DIGEST mode

- Press DIGEST again.
- Press ▶ II on the remote control.

A-B Repeat

This feature is also applicable to audio CD (*except for MP3-CD*). To play a certain scene or passage of the disc repeatedly:

- Press REPEAT A- B on the remote control during playback to mark the start of the chosen scene or passage.
 - → "REP R" appears on the display panel.

Press REPEAT A- B again to mark the end of the chosen scene or passage.

- \rightarrow "REP R-B" appears on the display panel.
- The selected scene or passage is played repeatedly.
- Press REPEAT A- B once more to return to normal playback.

→ "REP R-B" disappears from the display panel.

Notes:

- You can also cancel the **A-B** Repeat by pressing **TITLE-I+** $|\mathbf{A}| \rightarrow \mathbf{I}$ ($|\mathbf{A}| \rightarrow \mathbf{A}|$ on the remote).

- You can set the A-B mark within the same track.
- If the track is completed before you set the end point, "REP A" will disappear at the end of the track and "REPEAT AB CANCEL" will appear on

GOTO

the TV screen.

Press GOTO on the remoto control.
 → "GOTO---: ---" appears on the TV screen.

Use the Numeric Keypad (0-9) on the remoto control to key in the disc time from which you want the disc to begin.

Notes:

- Switch off PBC before selecting GOTO.
- This function is also available for CD.

Resume

In the stop mode, press **RESUME** on the remote control to start playback again from where you have stopped.

Note:

 The resume information is lost if the disc tray is opened, the source is changed or the system is disconnected from the power supply.

 For VCD, it may take more than 20 seconds to resume playback due to the large number or size of tracks.

- This function is also available for CD/MP3.

Slow

- Press SLOW on the remote control to watch a VCD at a slower speed. There are 4 types of slow modes to select.
 - → The sound is muted.
 - → On TV screen, "SLOW 1/2", "SLOW 1/4",
 - "SLOW 1/8", SLOW 1/16 or PLRY is displayed.
- 2 To resume playback at normal speed, press

PLAY PAUSE

Microphone Mixing

Connect microphones (not supplied) to the system to sing along with the music source.

- Connect microphones to MIC jack.
- Before connecting the microphone, set the microphone MIC VOLUME to the minimum level to prevent howling sound.
- 2 Select VCD/CD to start playback.
- Press **ECHO** to select ECHO ON.
- Adjust the volume level of the source with the VOLUME control (or by pressing VOL +/- on the remote).
- Start singing or talking through the microphone.
- Press KEY to select key tone if necessary.

Notes:

 Keep the microphones away from the speakers to prevent howling.

Microphone mixing is only available in VCD mode.

Vocal

This feature allows you to fade out the original vocal from a karaoke VCD. This feature is used together with Echo mode. You can also use it to select the different audio modes.

Pressing AUDIO/VOCAL on the remote control repeatedly allows you to select the following modes.

→ STERED → VOCALL-VOCAL R → MONO L → MONO R→ STERED ...

VOCAL LEFT/RIGHT - fade out the original vocal for specially recorded karaoke discs only (press ECHO to select MIC ON)

STEREO – same effect as the original recorded disc.

 $\label{eq:monological} \begin{array}{l} \mbox{MONO L/R} - \mbox{select the language on a bilingual} \\ \mbox{VCD}. \end{array}$

Ensure that the MIC mode is switched on

when pressing **VOCAL** to fade out the original vocal during STEREO VOCAL L/R mode.

Key Control


This feature allows you to change the key tone of your vocal range.

- Press KEY on the remote control.
 "-KEY SHIFT+" appears on the TV screen.
- Press VOLUME -/+ to decrease or increase the vocal key level between -6 and +6.

Echo


This feature allows you to add echo while singing or talking through a microphone.

- Press ECHO on the remote control.
- Press VOLUME –/+ to decrease or increase the echo level.



Tuning to radio stations

- Select TUNER source.
- Press BAND (TUNER on the remote) to select the desired waveband : FM or MW.
- Turn the **TUNING** control knob to tune to a desired radio frequency.



IMPORTANT!

Before playing a tape, check and tighten slack tape with a pencil. Slack tape may get jammed or may burst in the mechanism.
C-120 tape is extremely thin and is easily deformed or damaged. It is not recommended for use in this system.
Store the tapes at room temperature and do not put them too close to a magnetic field (for example, a transformer, TV or speaker).

Tape playback

- Select TAPE source.
- Open the tape key flap marked "OPEN►" on the front panel.
- Press STOP•OPEN ▲ to open the tape door:

Tape Operation/Recording

- Insert a recorded tape and close the tape door.
- Load the tape with the open side downward and the full spool to the left.
- In the second secon
- The key is automatically released at the end of a tape, except if **PAUSEII** has been activated.
- To pause, press PAUSEII Press again to resume.
- By pressing SEARCH ◄< or ▷▷ on the system fast winding of tape is possible in both directions.</p>
- **8** To stop the tape, press **STOP**•**OPEN** \blacksquare **\triangleq**.

Notes:

 The sound source cannot be changed while playing or recording a tape.

 The system will change to the tape mode from any other active mode as long as you press down PLAY ▶.

General information on recording

- If you do not intend to record via the microphone, unplug the microphone to avoid accidental mixing with other recording source.
- Recording is permissible insofar as copyright or other rights of third parties are not infringed.
- For recording, use only NORMAL (IEC type I) tapes on which the tabs have not yet been broken. This deck is not suited for recording on METAL (IEC IV) type tapes.
- The recording level is set automatically, regardless of the position of the Volume, DBB, DSC and so forth.
- The recording sound quality might differ depending on the quality of your recording source and the recording tape.
- The tape is secured at both ends with leader tape. At the beginning and end of the tape, nothing will be recorded for six to seven seconds.
- To protect a tape from accidental erasure, have the tape in front of you and break out the left tab. Recording on this side is no longer possible. If, however, you wish to record over this side again, cover the tabs with a piece of adhesive tape.

Synchro start CD recording

- Select VCD/CD source.
- Insert a disc and if desired, programme track numbers.
- Press STOP•OPEN ▲ to open the tape door.
- Insert a suitable tape into the deck and close the tape door.
- S Press RECORD to start recording.


To select and record a particular passage within a CD track:

- Press and hold down on ALBUM-/+ ◄◄/►► (ALBUM ▲/▼ on the remote). Release the control when you recognize the passage you want.
- To pause CD playback press ►I
- Recording starts from this exact point in the track when you press **RECORD●**.
- 6 To pause, press **PAUSEII**. Press again to resume.
- ⑦ To stop recording, press STOP•OPEN ▲.


Recording from the radio

- Tune to the desired radio station (see Tuning to radio stations).
- Press STOP•OPEN ▲ to open the tape door.
- Insert a suitable tape into the deck and close the tape door.
- Press RECORD● to start recording.
- To interrupt playback press PAUSEIL To resume, press this key again.
- 6 To stop recording, press STOP•OPEN ▲.

Clock/Timer



View clock

The clock (if it is set) will be shown in standby mode.

To view the clock in any source mode (CD or TUNER for example)

Press CLOCK•TIMER (CLOCK SET on the remote).

The clock is displayed for a few seconds.
 If the clock has not been set, "----" is displayed.

Clock setting

In standby or view clock mode, press CLOCK•TIMER (CLOCK SET on the remote) once. In other source mode, press CLOCK•TIMER (CLOCK SET on the remote) twice.

→ The clock digits flash on the display panel.
 → If the clock has not been set, "----" flashes

Press ALBUM-/+ ◄◄/►► (ALBUM ▲/▼ on the remote) repeatedly to set the hour.

Press TITLE-/+ I◄/►I (I◄◄ / ►►I on the remote) repeatedly to set the minute.

- Press **CLOCK-TIMER** (**CLOCK SET** on the remote) again to store the setting.
 - ightarrow The clock starts working.

To exit without storing the setting

Press 🔳 on the system.

Notes:

 The clock setting will be cancelled when the power cord is disconnected or if a power failure occurs.

 During clock setting, if no button is pressed within 20 seconds, the system will exit clock setting mode automatically.

Timer setting

The system can switch on to CD or TUNER mode automatically at a preset time, serving as an alarm to wake you up.

IMPORTANT!

- Before setting the timer, ensure that the clock is set correctly.

In standby mode, press and hold

CLOCK-TIMER for more than **two seconds** (or press **TIMER** on the remote) to select timer mode.

→ The current source and timer digits flash on the display panel.

→ If the timer has not been set before, "----" flashes.

Clock/Timer

- Press CD orTUNER to select the desired source.
- Before setting timer, make sure the music source has been prepared.
 CD – load the disc.

TUNER – tune to the desired radio station.

- ③ Press ALBUM-/+ ◄◄/►► (ALBUM ▲/▼ on the remote) repeatedly to set the hour for the timer to start.
- Press TITLE-/+ I◄/►I (I◄◄ / ►►I on the remote) repeatedly to set the minute for the timer to start.
- At the preset time, the selected source will play.

To exit without storing the setting

Note:

 During timer setting, if no button is pressed within 20 seconds, the system will exit timer setting mode automatically.

Sleep timer setting

The sleep timer enables the system to switch off by itself after a set period of time.

Press SLEEP on the remote control repeatedly to select a preset time.

→ The selections are as follows (time in minutes):

 $OFF \rightarrow 15 \rightarrow 30 \rightarrow 45 \rightarrow 60 \rightarrow 90 \rightarrow 120$

→ "SLEEP XX" or "SLEEP DFF" is displayed. "XX" is the time in minutes.

When you reach the desired length of time, stop pressing the SLEEP button.

To deactivate the sleep timer

 Press SLEEP repeatedly until "SLEEP OFF" is displayed, or press the STANDBY ON O button.

Note:

 - ZZZ will start flashing when the remaining length of time after activation of the sleep timer is less than 10 seconds.

Cleaning Discs

 When a disc becomes dirty, clean it with a cleaning cloth.
 Wipe the disc from the centre out.



 Do not use solvents such as benzene, thinner, commercially available cleaners, or antistatic spray intended for analogue records.

Cleaning the disc lens


 After prolonged use, dirt or dust may accumulate at the disc lens. To ensure good playback quality, clean the disc lens with Philips CD Lens Cleaner or any commercially available cleaner. Follow the instructions supplied with cleaner.

Cleaning the Heads and the Tape Paths

 To ensure good recording and playback quality, clean the heads (A), the capstan(s) (B), and pressure roller(s) (C) after every 50 hours of tape operation.

Caution: Do not rotate the heads during cleaning.

- Use a cotton swab slightly moistened with cleaning fluid or alcohol.
- You can also clean the heads by playing a cleaning tape once.



Demagnetising the heads Use a demagnetising tape available at your dealer
