## A. Introduction

Thank you for choosing the DS9106/DS9106PK portable DVD player. The main features include a 9" wide Screen (16:9 Aspect Ratio) Liquid Crystal Display (LCD) monitor and a DVD player. The unit applies the latest state of the art electronics and is designed for use in hotels, offices or your home. The unit is constructed to provide years of reliable, trouble-free service and is compact so that you can take it with you anywhere and is designed for quick and easy installation. Please read the entire instruction manual supplied with this product prior to using. The documentation will assist you in using the system properly to obtain the best equipment performance. Please save this manual for later use.

## B. DVD and Disc Information

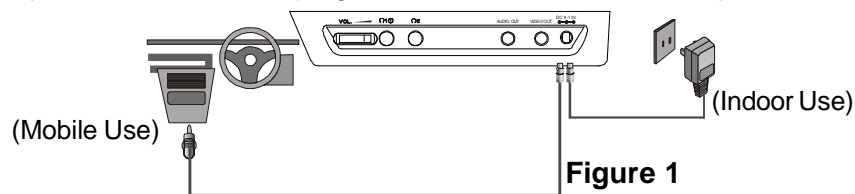
### D. Powering and Installation

#### 1. Powering the System Indoors (Refer to Figure 1)

Plug one end of the AC to DC adapter into the DC input jack on the right side of the main unit, then plug the other end into the 100~240V AC power receptacle.

#### 2. Powering the System in a Car (Refer to Figure 1)

Plug one end of the Automotive Power adapter into the DC input jack on the unit, then plug the other end into the vehicle power outlet.



#### 3. To Charge the Built-in Battery

Plug one end of the AC to DC power adapter into the DC jack on the side of the player, as shown in Figure 1, then plug the other end into the 100~240V AC power outlet. If the player is powered off, the charge indicator will turn red indicating the battery is charging.

Once fully charged, the charge indicator will turn off. Once the indicator is off, remove the AC to DC power adapter wall plug.

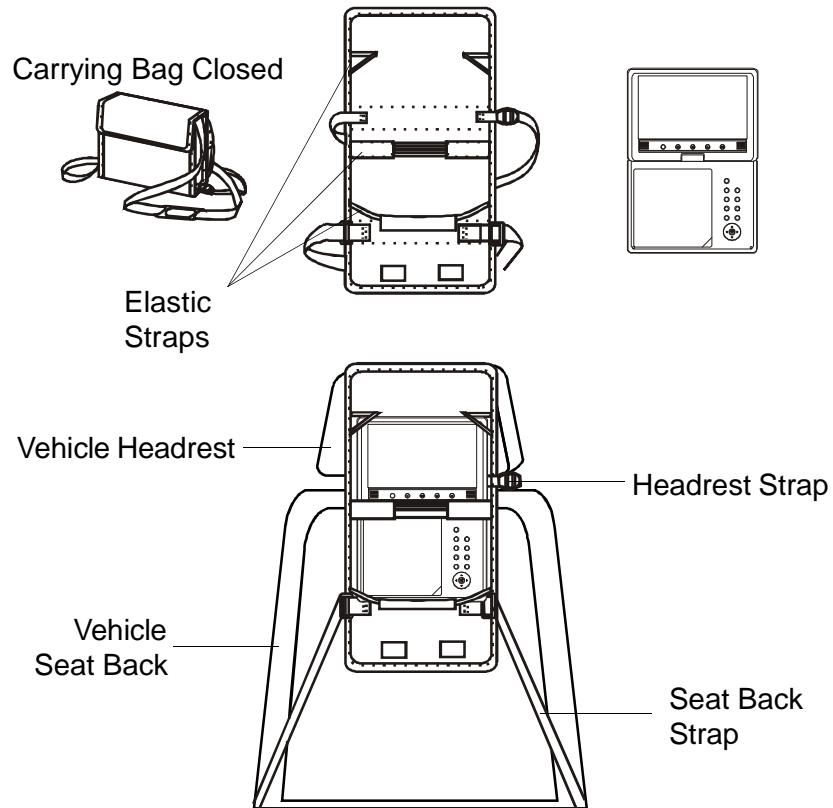
**NOTE:** Your new battery must be charged a minimum of eight hours before the first usage. DS9106/DS9106PK needs seven hours to fully recharge the battery.



## E. Vehicle Installation \*

### Installing the DVD Player onto the Seat Back in a Car

(Refer to Figure 2) Carrying Bag Opened

- 1) Unfold the carrying bag, and place the DVD player on the bag beneath the elastic straps. Ensure that the unit's corners are secured by the elastic straps.
- 2) Secure the upper portion of the carrying bag to the headrest support bars using the headrest strap. Adjust the headrest strap until the bag is firmly secured.
- 3) Secure the lower portion of the carrying bag to the vehicle seat back using the seat back strap. Adjust the seat back strap until the bag is firmly secured.

\* The bag is only provided for DS9106PK.

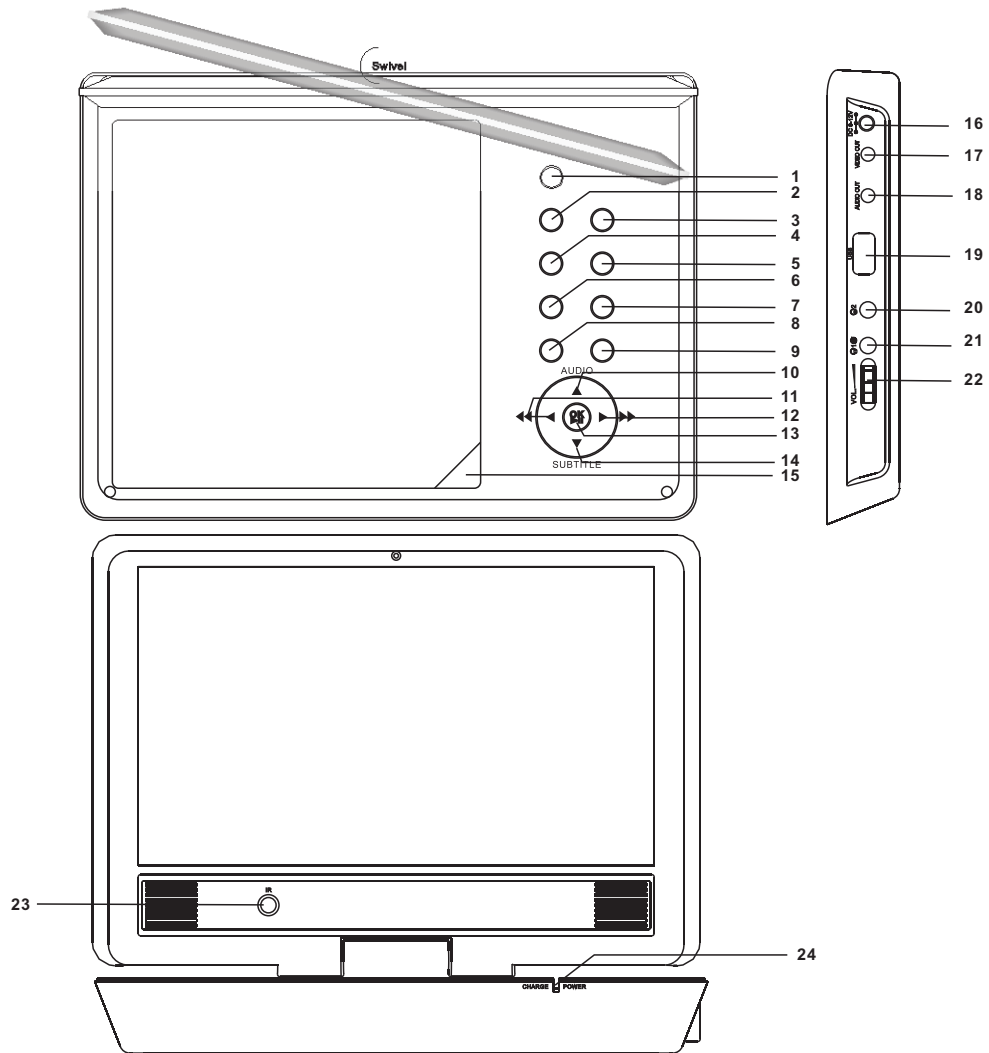


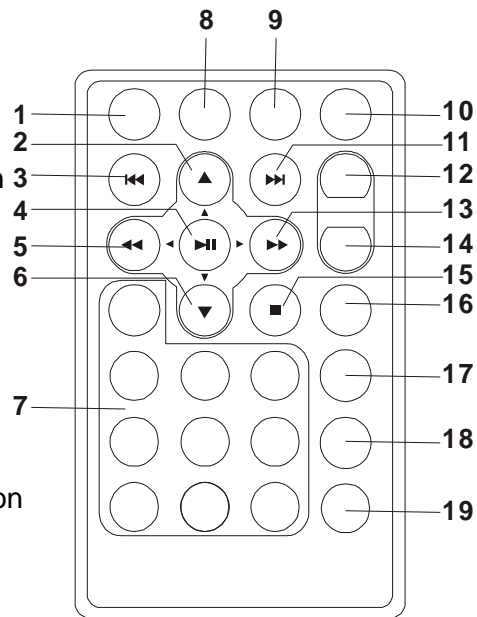

## G. Loading and Playing a Disc

- a. After connecting power to the unit, press the  $\text{⏻}$  button to power ON the unit. The power indicator will turn green.
- b. Open the disc tray by pressing the OPEN button and place a disc into the tray with the label side facing up.
- c. Close the tray cover. The unit will load the disc and start playing.
- d. Rotate VOLUME control to adjust the DVD player's volume.
- e. To stop playing a disc, press the Stop button.
- f. To turn off the DVD player, press the  $\text{⏻}$  button.

## H. Basic Operation

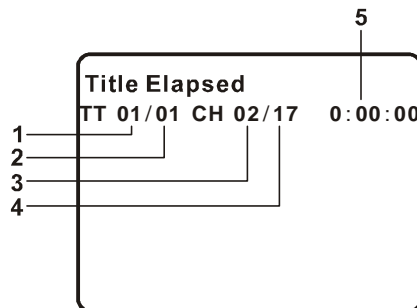
## I. Menu

A DVD is divided into sections called titles and chapters. When you play a DVD, a root menu of the disc will appear on the screen of your TV or Monitor. The contents of the menu vary from disc to disc. Press MENU during playback to display the menu. Some DVDs only allow you to select disc playback options using the DVD root menu.

## J. Display (Display contents vary from disc to disc.)

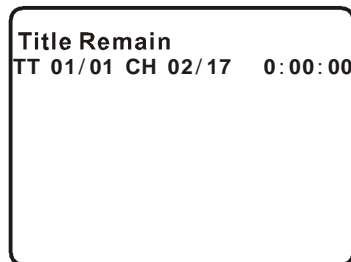
### 1. Playing Time and Remaining Time

- a. During playback press the DISPLAY button to display the current Title Number (1), the total Number of Titles (2), the current Chapter Number (3), the total Number of Chapters (4), and the elapsed playing Time for the title (5).



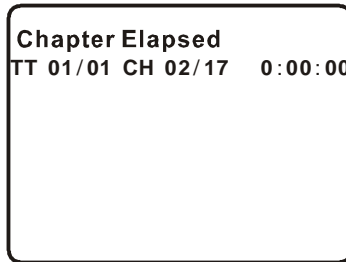
**Title, Chapter Number and Time Screen Display**

- b. Press the DISPLAY button again to display the Remaining Time of the title.



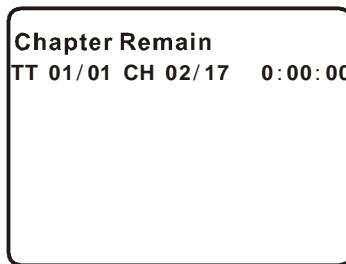
**Title Remaining Time Screen Display**

- c. Press the DISPLAY button a third time to display the Elapsed Time for the chapter.

- d. Press the DISPLAY button a fourth time to display the Remaining Time for the chapter.

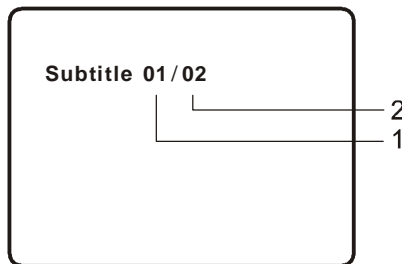


**Chapter Remaining Time Screen Display**

- e. Press the DISPLAY button a fifth time to exit, "DISPLAY OFF" will be displayed and will disappear automatically in 3 seconds.

## 2. Subtitle

During disc playback press the SUBTITLE button to select the subtitle language you desire\*, with the current Subtitle Language Number (1) and the total Number of Subtitle Languages (2) displayed. If there are multiple languages, press the SUBTITLE button again to select another subtitle language. To turn subtitles OFF, press the SUBTITLE button until 'Subtitle off' is displayed. The Subtitle display will disappear automatically if the SUBTITLE button is not pressed again within 3 seconds.

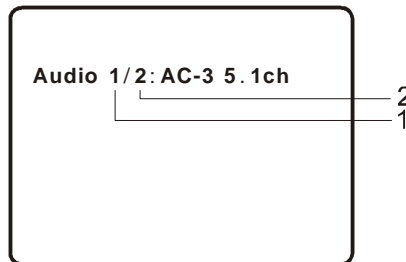

## 3. Audio

During playback press the AUDIO button to select the audio language you desire\*, with the current Audio Channel Number (1) and the total number of Audio Channels (2) displayed. Press AUDIO again to select another audio language. The audio display will disappear automatically if the AUDIO button is not pressed within 3 seconds.

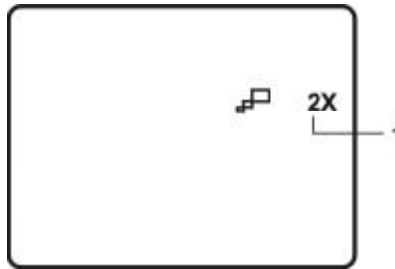


**Audio Language Screen Display**

#### 4. Zoom

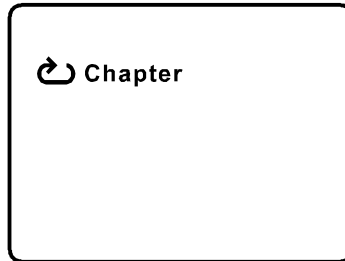
During playback press the ZOOM button to enlarge the picture by 2x, 3x or 4X. Press the ZOOM button once, the picture will be enlarged 2X. Press the ZOOM button twice, the picture will be enlarged 3X. Press the ZOOM button a third time, the picture will be enlarged 4X. Press the ZOOM button a fourth time, the picture will return to normal size.

#### 5. Repeat

a. During playback press the REPEAT button once to repeatedly play the current chapter.

b. Press the REPEAT button again to repeatedly play the current title.



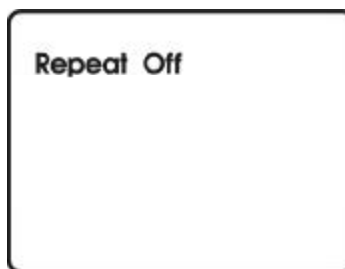

**All Repeat ON Screen Display**

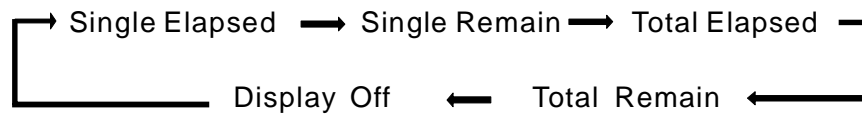
d. Press the REPEAT button a fourth time to resume normal playback.

## K. Playing Audio CDs

To play an audio CD, load it onto the disc tray and the CD will start playback automatically. Press the DISPLAY button repeatedly on the remote control or the unit to view disc information. The time information is displayed in the the following sequence:



### CD Display Mode

**Single Elapsed:** The current track playing and the elapsed time on that track appears on the screen.

**Single Remain:** The current track playing and the amount of time remaining on that track appears on the screen.

**Total Elapsed:** The current track playing and the total elapsed time on the CD appears on the screen.

**Total Remain:** The current track playing and the amount of time remaining on the CD appears on the screen.

## L. Playing JPEG Files

- 1) Load a JPEG disc into the disc tray.
- 2) A screen showing folders or picture files contained on the disc will be displayed automatically after loading.
- 3) Press ▲, ▼ and OK buttons to select a folder or a picture. If a picture is selected, a photo slideshow will start with the selected picture.
- 4) Press the ZOOM button to enlarge the picture size by 100%, 125%, 150%, 200% . When the image is enlarged, you can use the navigation buttons to view the blocked parts of the picture.
- 5) During photo slideshow or in slideshow PAUSE mode:
  - Press ◀ to rotate the picture 90 degrees counterclockwise.
  - Press ▼ to mirror the picture horizontally.
  - Press ▲ to mirror the picture vertically.
  - Press ▶ to rotate the picture 90 degrees clockwise.
  - Press ◀◀ or ▶▶ to view the previous / next photo.
- 6) Press ▶|| button then the slideshow will pause.  
Press the button again to resume the slideshow playback.
- 7) Press ■ STOP to view thumbnails. Use the navigation button to select a photo, press ▶|| to start slideshow from the selected photo.
- 8) Press MENU or ■ STOP to go to the folder where the picture is in.

## M. Connecting to Other Electronic Equipment

### 1. Connecting to a TV or Another Monitor ( Refer to Figure 4)

- a. Connect one end (1/8" stereo plug) of the audio cable (not supplied) into the unit's AUDIO OUT jack. Connect the other end (2 RCA jacks) to the Left and Right channel audio input jacks on your TV or monitor. (White = left audio channel, Red = right audio channel)
- b. Connect one end (1/8" plug) of the video cable (not supplied) into the unit's VIDEO OUT jack. Connect the other end (RCA jack) to the VIDEO INPUT jack on your TV or Monitor. (Yellow = video)

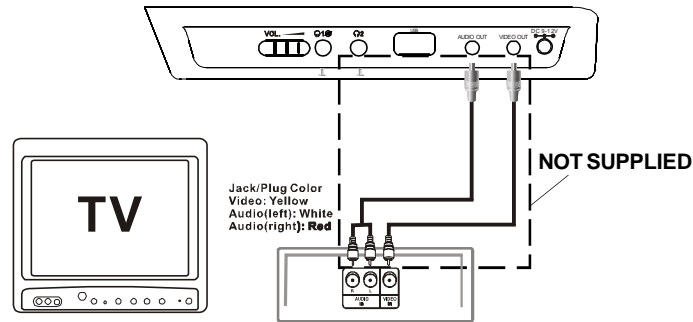
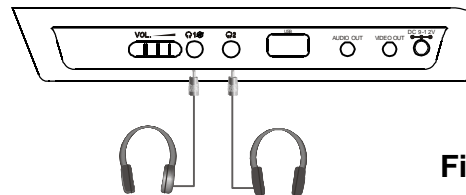

### 2. Connecting Headphones\*

Plug the headphones into either Headphone jack 1 or Headphone jack 2 on the right side of the DVD Player.  
(Refer to Figure 5)



Plugging into Headphone jack 1 will disable the internal speakers.

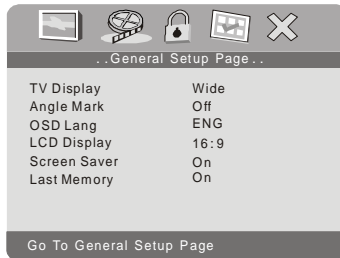

## N. Setup

Press SETUP button to display the Main screen of the SETUP Menu on the screen. Press SETUP button again to exit the SETUP Menu.

### 1. General Setup Page

Press SETUP, the 'GENERAL SETUP PAGE' will display on the screen.



### Main SETUP Menu Screen Display

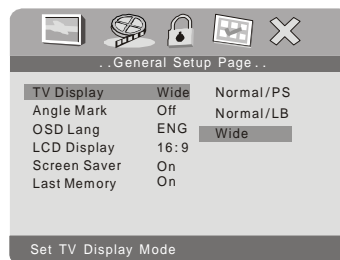
#### a) TV Display

Select 'TV DISPLAY' using the DOWN button, and then press the Right button enter the submenu. Select the TV display mode on the screen using UP/DOWN button, and press the OK to confirm the setting. Press the LEFT button to exit the TV DISPLAY menu.

\*NORMAL/PS: The wide-screen image will be displayed on the normal TV (4:3) in its native aspect ratio with some part on the left and right cut off.

\*NORMAL/LB: The wide-screen image will be displayed on the normal TV (4:3) in its native aspect ratio with black bands on the upper and lower sections of the screen.

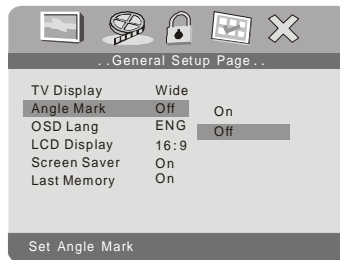
\*WIDE: If the unit is connected to a wide-screen TV set, select this option. The widescreen image will be displayed in full screen in its native aspect ratio.

b) Angle Mark

Select 'ANGLE MARK' using the DOWN button, and then press the RIGHT button to enter the submenu. Choose Angle Mark on or off using the UP/DOWN button and then press the OK button to confirm the setting. Press the LEFT button to return.

c) OSD Language

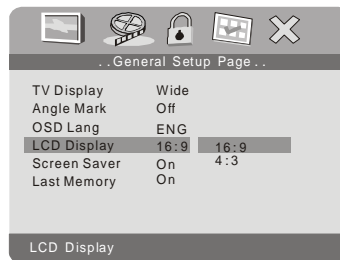
Select 'OSD LANG' using the DOWN button, and then press the RIGHT button to enter the submenu. Choose the language you desire as the display language. Press the LEFT button to return.

Select 'LCD Display' using the DOWN button, and then press the RIGHT button to enter the submenu. Choose the LCD Aspect Ratio you desire as the display. Press the LEFT button to return.

Select 'SCREEN SAVER' using the DOWN button and then press the RIGHT button to enter the submenu. Choose Screen saver on or off using the UP/DOWN buttons and then press the OK button to confirm the setting. Press the LEFT button to return.

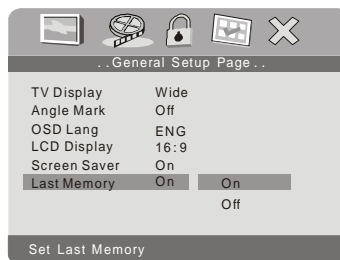
*\*ON: Enables screen saver.*

*\*OFF: Disables screen saver.*

**NOTE:** The DVD player will enter the Screen Saver mode after approximately five minutes if the same image remains on the screen.

f) Last Memory

Select 'LAST MEMORY' by using the DOWN button and then press the RIGHT button to enter the submenu. Choose Last Memory on or off using the UP/DOWN buttons and then press the OK button to confirm the setting. Press the LEFT button to return.

*\*ON: During playback or in the pause mode, if you open the disc tray and then close without changing a disc, the unit will memorize the last playback status and resume playback from the memorized point.*

*\*OFF: The unit will not return to the last position on the disc.*

## 2. Video Quality Setup

Select 'VIDEO QUALITY SETUP' page by using the LEFT/RIGHT button, press the OK button to enter the 'VIDEO QUALITY SETUP' page.

a) Select 'BRIGHTNESS' by using the UP or DOWN button, then press the OK button. Adjust the Brightness by pressing the LEFT or RIGHT button. To exit Brightness Setting, press the OK button again.




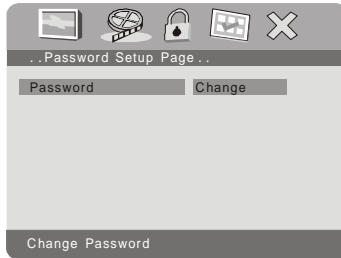
### Brightness Screen Display

b) The "CONTRAST", "HUE", and "SATURATION" are adjusted in the same manner as the "BRIGHTNESS". Press the LEFT button to exit the VIDEO QUALITY SETUP menu.



### 3. Password Setup

Select 'PASSWORD SETUP PAGE' (  ) using the LEFT or RIGHT buttons, then press the OK button to enter the submenu.

Press the OK button twice to enter the PASSWORD CHANGE PAGE. Input the Old Password or the Default Password, the New Password, and the Confirmed New Password. Press the OK button to confirm the change.

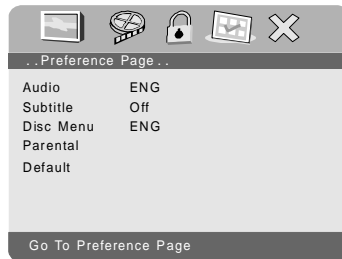


**Password Change Page Screen Display**

**NOTE:** The Default Password is **3308**. This password is always effective even after you have selected your own password and changed it. To avoid the possibility of others using the default password to set the parental level and change the password, you can record this default password in another area and delete it from this manual. Some discs can be limited depending on the age of users while some discs cannot.

#### 4. Preference page

With no disc inside the player select 'PREFERENCE' (  ) using the LEFT or RIGHT button, then press the OK button to enter the 'PREFERENCE PAGE'.

##### a) Audio

Select 'AUDIO' using the DOWN button, then press the OK button to enter the submenu. Select the audio language you desire using the UP or DOWN buttons, then press the OK button to confirm the setting. Press the LEFT button to return.

b) Subtitle

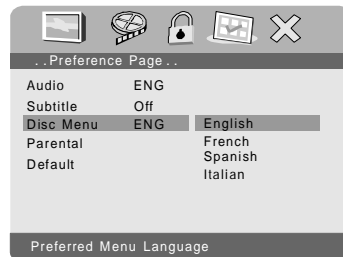
Select 'SUBTITLE' using the DOWN button, then press the OK button to enter the submenu. Select the desired subtitle language or OFF using the UP or DOWN buttons, then press the OK to confirm the setting. Press the LEFT to return.

Select 'DISC MENU' using the DOWN button, then press the OK button to enter the submenu. Select the Disc Menu Language you desire using the UP or DOWN buttons, then press the OK button to confirm the setting. Press the LEFT to return.

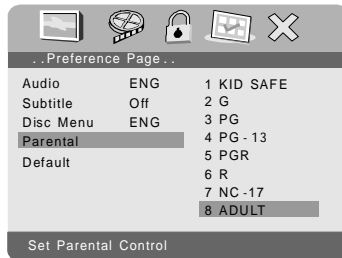


**Preferred Disc Menu Language Screen Display**

**NOTE:** Language and subtitle selection is only available for discs that are recorded in the above listed languages. If the selected language is not available, the player will play and display on the screen the original recorded language contained in the disc.

d) Parental

Select 'PARENTAL' using the DOWN button, then press the OK button to enter the submenu.



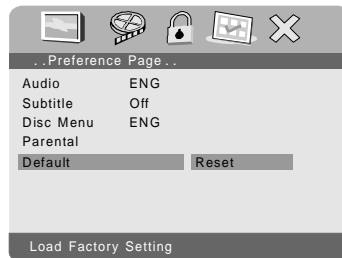
### Parental Preference Screen Display

Select the parental level you desire using the UP or DOWN button for discs with lock-out function or multiple rating levels. These are listed from the lowest level (1 KID SAFE) to the highest level (8 ADULT). Enter a 4 digit password, then press the OK button to confirm the parental level setting.

**NOTE:** The level of 8 ADULT is the factory default.

e) Default

Select 'DEFAULT' using the DOWN button, then press the OK button to enter the submenu. Press the OK button to make the setting return to the factory default mode.

## P. Rechargeable Built-in Battery Use

The DVD player utilizes a long-life Li-Polymer battery for portability. Li-Polymer batteries feature high storage capacity and low level of degradation. This means the Li-Polymer batteries do not have “Memory Effect” and thus can be recharged regardless of whether the battery is fully or only partially discharged. **The battery must be charged at least 8 hours prior to first use.**

**NOTE:** If you do not plan to use the battery for an extended period of time (one week or longer), we recommend that you fully charge the battery. For longer periods of storage, please recharge the battery at least once every two months to maintain the battery in optimum condition.

Each full recharge takes approximately seven hours. During recharge, the red indicator will stay on. Once fully recharged, the red light will turn off. At this point you may remove the wall plug and stop charging.

**Precautions Related to Battery Recharge:**

1. The DVD player must be set to power off.
2. Once the battery is fully discharged, immediately the battery (regardless of whether you plan to use battery or not) in order to maximize battery life.
3. To charge the battery, please connect the power jack directly into the DVD Player and leave it connected until the red charge indicator turns off.

**Using and Maintaining Your Rechargeable Batteries**

1. Please make sure you always use **only** the AC adapter included with the player to recharge your battery. The battery can only be charged with the AC adaptor and will **NOT** charge with the car DC adaptor.
2. Recharge efficiency will degrade when environmental temperatures drop below 41°F (5°C) or exceed 95°F (35°C).
3. Do not leave the DVD player in a hot automobile or temperatures exceeding 122°F (50°C). Permanent battery damage, fire, or explosion may result.

Disc stops playing after the unit is bumped	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Remove the disc. Go to the Setup menu and set Last Memory to "OFF". Replace disc.</li> </ul>
IR sensor inoperative	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Verify that the batteries in the remote are fresh.</li> <li>• Verify that the remote sensor eye is not obstructed.</li> </ul>
