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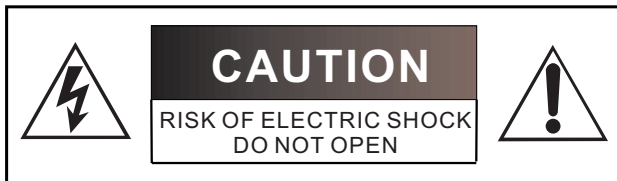

### 1. Read Instructions

All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the product is operated.

### 2. Retain Instructions

The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.

### 10. Ventilation

### 11. Power Sources

### 13. Power Cord Protection

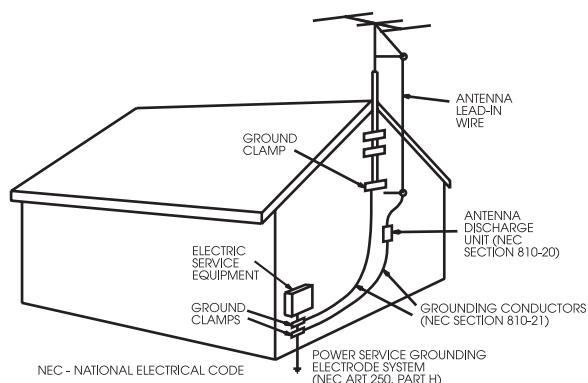

### 14. Protective Attachment Plug

The product is equipped with an attachment plug having overload protection. This is a safety feature. See Instruction Manual for replacement or resetting of protective device. If replacement of the plug is required, be sure the service technician has used a replacement plug specified by the manufacturer that has the same overload protection as the original plug.

### 15. Outdoor Antenna Grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the product, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges. Article 810 of the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70, provides information with regard to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge unit, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna discharge unit, connection to grounding electrodes, and requirements for the grounding electrode. ### 16. Lightning

For added protection for this product during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the product due to lightning and power lines surges.

### 17. Power Lines

# Basic Operation

## Basic Playback

Preparation before playing:

1. Connect the DVD player to your TV and amplifier.
2. Turn on the TV.
3. Set the TV to the AV input connected to the DVD player.
4. Turn down the volume on your amplifier, and then power it on.
5. Set the amplifier to the AV input connected to the DVD player.



**STEP 1** - Press **POWER** to start the player. The DVD logo appears on the TV screen.

**STEP 2** - Press **OPEN/CLOSE** either on the front panel or remote control. When the tray is open, place the disc on the tray with the label side up. Press **OPEN/CLOSE** again to close the disc tray.

**STEP 3** - Press the **PLAY** button on the front panel or remote control. The player will automatically read and identify the disc, and begin playback.

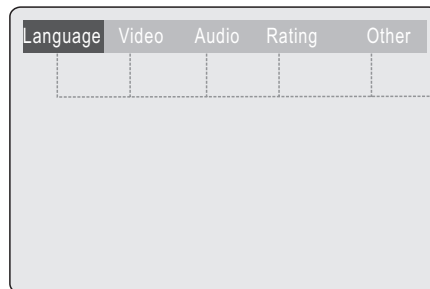

[Full Screen] - The full height of the picture is displayed on a standard 4:3 television, but some left/right detail is lost as the movie "pans and scans" to keep the most important action on the screen.

[Widescreen] - The picture fills the screen of a wide-screen (16:9) television.

**Note:** Not all DVDs offer movies in Full Screen format. If not, the disc will override your TV Display setting and the movie will be displayed in Letterbox format.

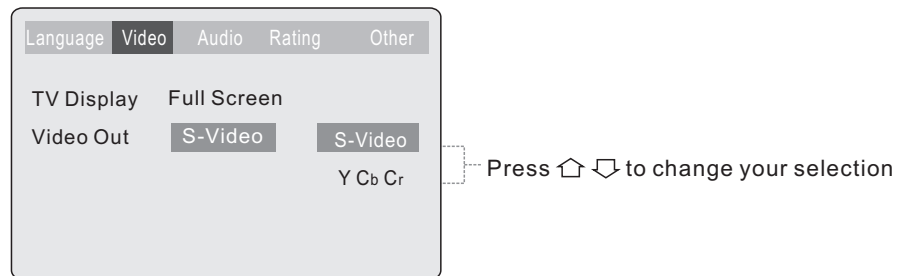

### 0-9 keys



These keys are used to input the time, as well as title, chapter and track numbers.

When a numeric item is displayed on the screen, press the **0-9 keys** to select the desired entry, and press **OK** to confirm.

### CLEAR



Press **CLEAR** to delete numbers you have entered.




**Notes:** Time searches for an exact time in the movie.  
In Title/Chapter mode, you cannot enter a value outside the range of the total number of titles or chapters.  
For some DVD discs, the Search function is unavailable.

Use the number keys to input the desired Time, Title or Chapter then press **OK** to confirm.

Press **SEARCH** again, the [Disc Search] menu will display as follows:

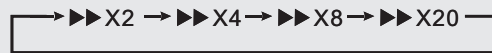


**Notes:** During VCD and SVCD playback (with PBC off), press **SEARCH** twice to display the [Disc Search] menu.



During DVD, CD or VCD playback, press **FF** once to play the next chapter, title or track.

During DVD, CD or VCD playback, press and hold **FF** to scan forward. The player will cue the disc at 2, 4, 8 and 20 times normal speed as follows:

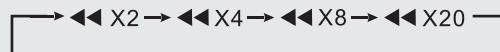


Press **PLAY** to resume normal playback.



During DVD, CD or VCD playback, press **REW** once to play the previous chapter, title or track.

During DVD, CD or VCD playback, press and hold **REW** to scan in reverse. The player will review the disc at 2, 4, 8 and 20 times normal speed as follows:



Press **PLAY** to resume normal playback.

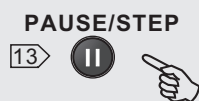


Press **STOP** once during playback to stop and hold playback.

Press **PLAY** to resume playback from the point you pressed **STOP**.

Press **STOP** twice to stop playback completely.

**Note:** The screen saver will automatically turn on if playback is stopped about 5 minutes (when Screen Saver is set to on).



Press **PAUSE/STEP** during playback to pause playback.

Press **PAUSE/STEP** again to step forward one frame.

Press **PLAY** to resume normal playback.

**Note:** The step function is not available during CD playback.





### PLAY

Press **PLAY** from stop mode to start playback.  
Press **PLAY** during playback to replay the last 10 seconds. This function is not available if the elapsed time of current track is less than 10 seconds.

**Note:** MP3 discs and some DVD discs do not have a 10 second review feature.



### MENU/RETURN

During DVD, VCD or SVCD playback (with PBC on), press **MENU/RETURN** to return to the program menu.

In the Setup Menu, press **MENU/RETURN** to return to the main menu or stop mode.

Any time, press **MENU/RETURN** to cancel the current OSD or some menus

**Note:** This function is subject to the disc.



### TITLE

During DVD playback, press **TITLE** to display the DVD title menu or play the first title.

**Note:** This function is subject to the disc.



### A-B

During playback, press **A-B** to select point A.

Press it again to select point B. The player will repeat the section from A to B automatically.

Press **A-B** a third time to cancel A-B repeat and clear points A and B.

**Note:** 1. During CD/VCD/SVCD playback, points A and B must be within the same track.

During DVD playback, points A and B can be selected from different chapters.

### EQUALIZER



The **EQUALIZER** allows you to adjust 6 frequency bands independently.

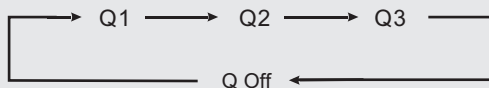

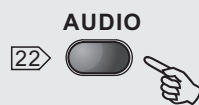

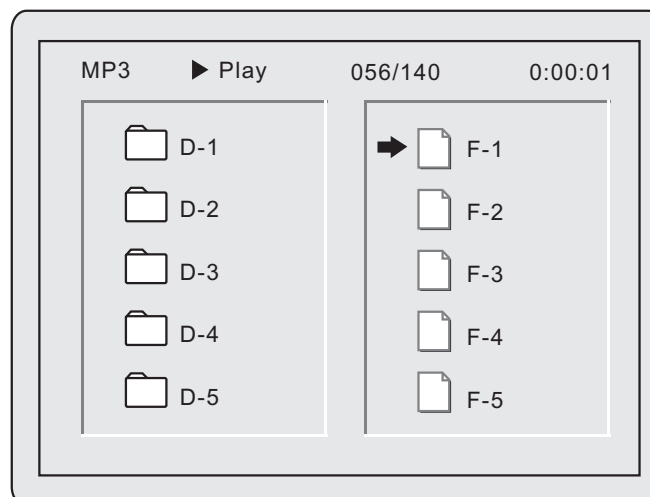
When an MP3 disc is loaded, the screen will display as follows:



Press to select the directory.

Press **PLAY** to play the first file in the directory selected by the cursor in the directory window. The cursor will automatically move to the file playing in the file window.

**Note:** The player supports English directory and file names only. Other languages will display as "Dir-X" for the directory name.



Press to select the file when the cursor appears in the file window.

Press **PLAY** to play the current file selected by the cursor.

Press to switch between the directory window and the file window.

**Note:** During MP3 playback, **Forward Scan** and **Reverse Scan** are not available.

### The introduction of KODAK Picture CD

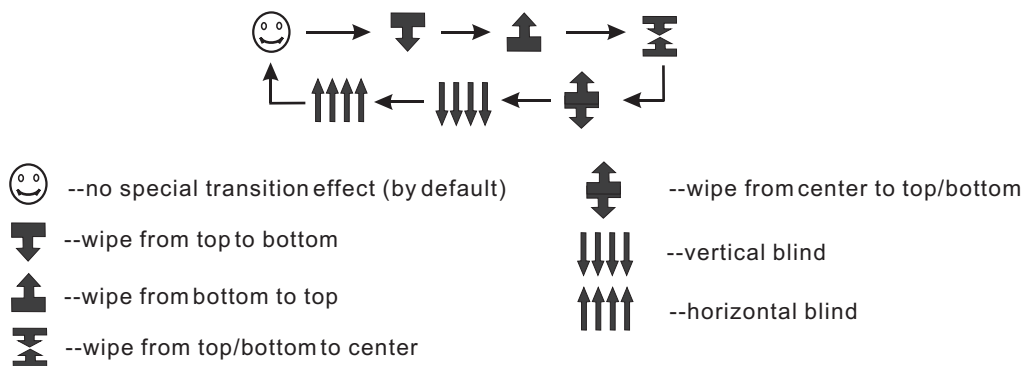
A Kodak Picture CD has the size and shape of a regular CD. You can order a KODAK Picture CD simply by checking the box on the photofinishing envelope when you drop off a roll of film (35 mm or Advanced Photo System (APS) color print film) at the time of processing in Kodak Express store displaying "Kodak Picture CD" sign. When your order is returned, you receive your prints, negatives, and your full roll of pictures safely stored on your KODAK Picture CD. Each KODAK Picture CD brings you the tools to enhance, share and manage your pictures on your computer. You also can record the JPEG picture into CD-R or CD-RW with the CD-Rewriter yourself.

- Note:**
1. The Max. Size of JPEG Picture can be supported: 3840X3840 pels
  2. JPEG stands for Joint Picture Experts Group. It is the first International Standard on Still Picture Compressing: ISO 10918-1, constituted by the Committee on Still Picture Compressing Standard of ISO. The pictures on KODAK Picture CD are stored in this format (JPEG). This player can decode the JPEG pictures in KODAK Picture CD and playback the pictures in different modes.

Now, you can playback Kodak Picture CDs on this player and view your wonderful pictures on your TV in the comfort of your living room.

When a Kodak Picture CD is inserted on a player an automatic slide show is launched. Each picture in the Kodak Picture CD will be displayed consecutively in a slide-show fashion and will be scaled to fit in the whole TV screen.

This player provides 7 different slideshow transition modes, you can use **PLAY MODE** on Remote Control Unit to select the modes during playing:



### General function:

- You can set slideshow transition modes for any pictures.
- Press the **PAUSE/STEP** to stop playing.
- Press the **REW** or **FF** to see the previous or next picture.
- Press the **PLAY** to continue slideshow transitions.

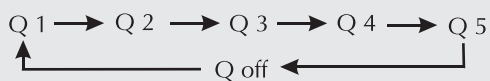
### Image Rotation

There are four modes to rotate a picture: Invert, Mirror, Left, and Right. These operations are allowed only when a picture is being displayed normally and will be cancelled automatically when a new picture is displayed. The arrow keys are used to select the different rotation modes:

- Press --Invert/Normal      OSD display
- Press --Mirror/Normal      OSD display ,press it again to resume normal.
- Press --Turn left      OSD display ,press it again to resume normal.
- Press --Turn right      OSD display ,press it again to resume normal.

### Zoom Function:

This player provides both Zoom in/out and Zoom pan function. Press the **ZOOM** consecutively, the picture will zoom in/out in turn as follows:



**Note:** During the ZOOM function, slideshow transitions and image rotation are disabled.

Q off: close zoom, press **PLAY** again to resume slideshow transition mode.

Q1, Q2, Q3: zoom in; Q4, Q5: zoom out

### Digest function

- Press the **MENU/RETURN** to enable the function. The television screen can display up to 12 pictures at a pro ratio.
- Press Direction key to select any picture displayed on the screen, then press **PLAY**, the selected picture will zoom in and start slideshow transition.

**Note:** the quality of the picture displaying on your screen is mostly subjected to your display equipment.

### Time slot between slides presetting

- In playback mode, press the **SEARCH** to open the function menu.
- Press use the  $\leftarrow$   $\rightarrow$  keys to adjust the time slot, there will display the time slot on the top-right corner of the menu.
- Press the **SEARCH** again to close this function.

- Ensure the volume is turned up in VOL/CH setup.
- Ensure you have set the player's AUDIO settings correctly.
- Ensure you have selected the correct AV input for your TV.
- Ensure the audio is not set to mute.

## SOUND BUT NO PICTURE

- Ensure the video jacks are securely connected.
- Ensure you have selected the correct AV input for your TV.
- Ensure the video connector is not damaged.
- Ensure you have set the player's VIDEO settings correctly.

## POOR PICTURE OR SOUND

- Ensure you have set the player's AUDIO settings correctly.
- Ensure the disc is not scratched or stained.
- Ensure the AV connector or the output terminal is not damaged.

## "BAD DISC" DISPLAYED

- Ensure the disc is not warped, damaged or deformed.
- Ensure the disc is not badly stained or damaged.
- Ensure the disc format is compatible with the player.
- Please check whether you tried to play a software CD. If so, please restart the player.

## REMOTE NOT WORKING

- Ensure the remote batteries are working.
- Point the remote control directly at the player's IR sensor.
- Remove any obstacles between the remote and the IR sensor.

## UNIT NOT WORKING

- Turn off the power, and then turn it on again.

## "NO DISC" DISPLAYED

- Ensure you have put the disc on the tray.
- Ensure the disc is not upside down.
- Ensure the disc is not distorted, stained or scratched.

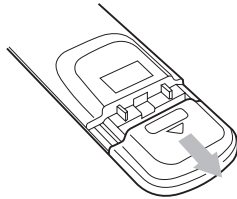

## Insert batteries

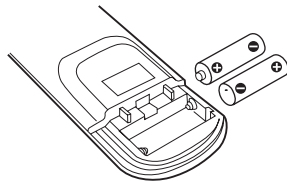

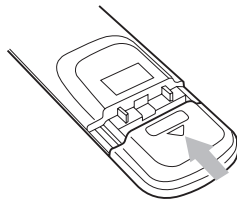

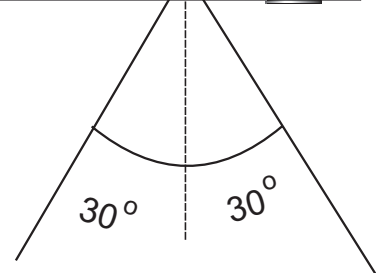
Improper use of batteries may cause battery leakage and corrosion. To operate the remote control correctly, follow the instructions below:

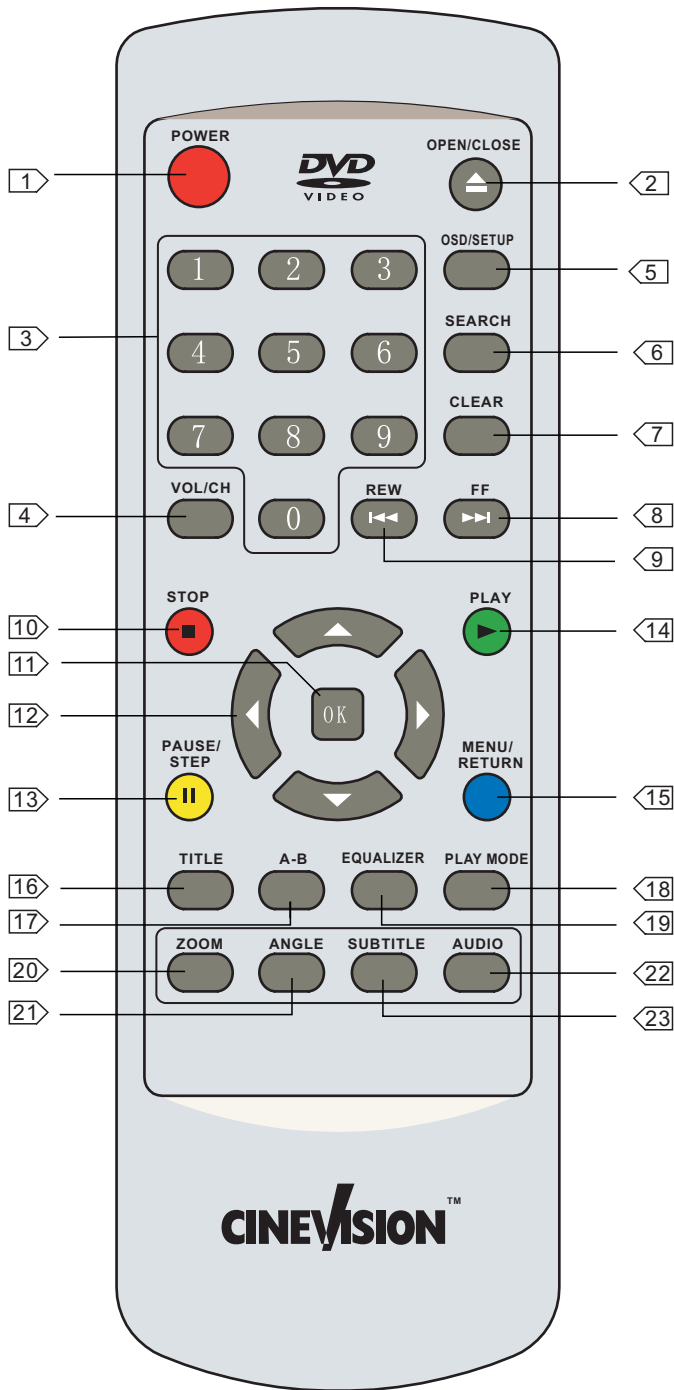
