

13) Unplug this apparatus during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time.

To protect your product from a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the product due to lightning and power-line surges.

- 14) Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel. Servicing is required when the apparatus has been damaged in any way, such as power-supply cord or plug is damaged, liquid has been spilled or objects have fallen into the apparatus, the apparatus has been exposed to rain or moisture does not operate normally, or has been dropped.

17) Overloading


Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

18) Object and liquid entry

Never push objects of any kind into this product through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short out parts that could result in fire or electric shock. Never spill or spray any type of liquid on the product.

19) Outdoor antenna grounding

If an outside antenna is connected to the product, be sure the antenna system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built up static charges. Section 810 of the National Electric Code ANSI/NFPA 70 provides information with respect to proper grounding of the mast and supporting structure, grounding of the lead-in wire to an antenna discharge product, size of grounding conductors, location of antenna-discharge product, connection to grounding electrodes and requirements for grounding electrodes.

20) Service

PRECAUTION:

When Displaying a Still Image.

- A still image may cause permanent damage to the TV screen.
- Do not display a still image on the LCD panel for more than 2 hours as it can cause screen image retention. This image retention is also known as "screen burn". To avoid such image retention, reduce the level of brightness and contrast of the screen when displaying a still image.
- Watching the LCD TV in 4:3 format for a long period of time may leave traces of borders displayed on the left and right side of the screen caused by the difference of light emission on the screen. Playing a DVD or a game console may cause a similar effect to the screen.
- Displaying still images from Video games and PC for longer than a certain period of time may produce partial after-images.
- To prevent this effect, reduce the "brightness" and "contrast" when displaying still images.


Damages caused by the above effect are not covered by the Warranty.

The TFT LCD panel uses sophisticated technology to produce. However, there may be few bright or dark pixels on the screen. These pixels will have no impact on the performance of the product.

POWER SOURCE

- 1. Insert the DC plug on supplied AC/DC adaptor to the DC IN Jack on the Right side of TV.
- 2. Insert the AC/DC adaptor into a conveniently located AC outlet having AC~ 100-240V, 50/60Hz in Vertical or Horizontal directions. (Never insert the AC/DC Adaptor the outlet on ceiling.)








To avoid damaged your TV. Power OFF all the devices before making connections.

CABLE CONNECTIONS

This TV has an extended tuning range and can tune most cable channels without using a Cable TV converter box. Some cable TV companies offer "premium pay channels" in which the signal is scrambled. Descrambling these signals for normal viewing requires the use of a descrambler device which is generally provided by the cable company.


FOR SUBSCRIBERS TO BASIC CABLE TV SERVICE

For basic cable service not requiring a converter/descrambler box, connect the CATV 75 ohm coaxial left side cable to the VHF/UHF jack on the bottom of the TV.



FOR SUBSCRIBERS TO SCRAMBLED CABLE TV SERVICE OR SATELLITE


If you subscribe to a satellite service or a cable TV service which requires the use of a converter/descrambler box, connect the incoming 75 ohm coaxial cable to the converter/descrambler box. Using another 75 ohm cable (not included), connect the output of the converter/descrambler or satellite box to the antenna jack on the TV. Follow the connections shown below. Set the TV/VCR/DVR to the output channel of the converter/descrambler or satellite box (usually 3 or 4) and use the converter/descrambler or satellite box to select channels.



CABLE CONNECTIONS

FOR SUBSCRIBERS TO UNSCRAMBLE BASIC CABLE TV SERVICE WITH SCRAMBLE PREMIUM CHANNELS

If you subscribe to a satellite service or a cable TV service in which basic channels are unscrambled and premium channels require the use of a converter/descrambler box, you may wish to use a signal splitter and an A/B switch box (available from the cable company or an electronic supply store). Follow the connections shown below. With the switch in the "B" position, you can directly tune any nonscrambled channels on your TV. With the switch in the "A" position, tune your TV to the output of the converter/descrambler box (usually channel 3 or 4) and use the converter/descrambler box to tune scrambled channels.


I connected my cable, but why can't I get channels?

Make sure the signal type in setting menu is set to AIR or CABLE. Also, make sure your cable company broadcasts channels in the range you are searching.

CABLE CONNECTIONS


CONNECTION USING HDMI(CABLE NOT INCLUDED):

- 1. Connect the HDMI cable (not included) from the HDMI of the TV to the HDMI of external unit as the figure below.
- 2. Set the SOURCE of the TV to HDMI mode.



CONNECTION USING AUDIO/VIDEO JACKS (CABLES NOT INCLUDED):

Follow the instructions below to connect an external unit such as a VCR/DVR/DVD player to your unit using Audio/Video cables.




- 1. Connect the left and right audio connection cable from the external unit's AUDIO OUTPUT jacks to the Audio In jacks of the TV. Connect the video cable from the external unit's VIDEO output jack to the Video In jack of the TV.
- 2. Set the SOURCE of the TV to AV mode.

CABLE CONNECTIONS

CONNECTION USING HEADPHONE: (HEADPHONE NOT INCLUDED)

For private listening, connect headphone (not included) into the PHONES jack of TV. The speakers will be disconnected when headphone are inserted into the jack.


CONNECTION USING VGA CABLE (CABLES NOT INCLUDED):



- 1. Using a VGA 15 pin D-SUB connection cable (not included) to connect the VGA output jack on the PC to the TV's VGA jack.
- Using a 3.5mm stereo mini jack connection cable (not included) to connect the PC AUDIO OUTPUT/PHONE jack on the PC to the TV's PC Audio In jack.
- 3. Set the SOURCE of TV to VGA mode.


CONNECTION USING Y/Pb/Pr CABLE (CABLES NOT INCLUDED):



- 1. Using component video connection cables (not included) to connect the external device's Y/Pb/Pr output jacks to the Y/Pb/Pr jacks on the TV.
- 2. Connect the left and right audio connection cable from the external unit's AUDIO OUTPUT jacks to the Audio In jacks on the TV.
- 3. Set the SOURCE of TV to COMP (Component) mode.


CONNECTION USING S-VIDEO CABLES (CABLES NOT INCLUDED):

Follow the instructions below to connect an external device such as a VCR/DVR/DVD player to your unit using S-Video cables. (not included)



- 1. Using S-Video cable connect the VCR/DVD/DVR's S-VIDEO out jacks to the TV's S-VIDEO input jack.
- 2. Connect the left and right audio connection cable from the external unit's AUDIO OUTPUT jacks to the Audio In jacks of the TV.
- 3. Set the SOURCE of TV to S-Video mode.

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

LOCATION OF CONTROLS

- MUTE: MUTE ON/OFF 1.
- POWER: Press to power ON/OFF 2.

PREPARATION


- 1. Open the battery door by lift up.
- 2. Install two (2) "AAA" size batteries (included) as the polarity diagram inside the battery compartment.
- 3. Replace the battery compartment cover .

BATTERY PRECAUTIONS

Follow these precautions when using batteries in this device:

- 1. Use only the size and type of batteries specified.
- 2. Be sure to the correct polarity when installing the batteries as indicated next to the battery compartment.
- 3. Do not mix different types of batteries together or old batteries with fresh ones.
- 4. If the batteries in the device are WEAK/DEAD or the device is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the batteries to prevent damage or injury from possible battery leakage.
- 5. Do not try to recharge batteries not intended to be recharged; they can overheat and rupture (Follow battery manufactory's directions.)
- 6. Do not dispose of batteries in fire. Batteries may explode or leak.
- Clean the battery contacts and also those of the device prior to battery installation.

EFFECTIVE DISTANCE OF THE REMOTE CONTROL TRANSMITTER





NOTES:

- When there is an obstacle between the TV and the transmitter, the transmitter may not operate.
- When direct sunlight, an incandescent lamp, fluorescent lamp or any other strong light shines on the REMOTE SENSOR of the unit, the remote operation may be unstable.

BASIC OPERATION

Power ON/OFF

Press the POWER button on the top of TV or remote control to power ON the TV (Green LED indicator will light). Press again to power OFF (Standby) the TV (Red LED indicator will light).

CHANNEL SETTING

- Press the CH + or CH buttons to select a preset channel as desired.
- For direct channels access:

Enter the channel number by press the numeric and/or "-" buttons on the remote control, a few seconds later, the selected channel will appear on screen.

VOLUME SETTING

Press the VOL + or VOL - buttons to adjust the volume as desired.

MUTE

Press once the TV's sound will be silenced and MUTE

will appear on the screen. Press again to turn the sound back.

SOURCE SETTING

- 1. Press the SOURCE button on the remote control. The list of sources will appear on the screen.
- 3. Or, press the SOURCE button on the top of TV repeatedly to select the desire input source.

BASIC OPERATION

AUTO SEARCHING

The method to search and automatically store the available TV (including the traditional Analog NTSC and Digital ATSC TV stations) stations located in your area:

- Press the SOURCE button on the top of TV repeatedly to set the input source to TV. (Or, press the SOURCE button on the remote control, the Source menu will appear on the screen. Press the Navigator ▲ or ▼ button to select and highlight TV then press ((enter) button to enter to TV mode.).
- Press the MENU button on the TV or remote control. The MAIN MENU will appear on the screen.
- Press the Navigator ▲ or ▼ button to select and highlight CHANNEL then press the
 (enter) button to enter. The CHANNEL menu will appear on the screen.
- Press the Navigator ▲ or ▼ button to select and highlight the Signal Type then press the Navigator ◀ or ▶ button to set the input signal type to Air or Cable as the RF connection of the TV.

Notes:


1. Set to Air if you are connecting the TV to the antenna to receive the TV broadcasting over the air.

2. Set to Cable if you are connecting the TV to a Cable TV Converter.

- Press the Navigator ▲ or ▼ button to select and highlight Auto Channel Search then press and hold the (a) (enter) button for about 1 second, the TV will start searching all the available Analogue and Digital TV stations and store them in the Channel List.
- When finished searching, press the MENU button to exit. Press the CH + or button to select the stored TV program as desire.







FAQs:

How many channels will I actually receive?

The actual number of channels that can be received depends on how many channels your cable or satellite company, or local area have provided.

Contact your company to determine the number of channels in your area.

SETTING Menus

- Press the MENU button to enter to the setting menu (press again to exit).
- Press the Navigator ▲ or ▼ button to select and highlight the function within the menu you want to adjust. Press the

 (enter) button to go to the sub-menu to confirm the selection. Press the Navigator ◄ or ▶ button to adjust.



• During setting, press the EXIT button to return to previous menu.

PICTURE MENU-for picture quality setting

- Press the MENU button, the setting menu will appear on the screen and PICTURE will be highlighted.
- Press the (enter) button to enter to the PICTURE menu. The PICTURE setting menu will appear on the screen.
- Press the Navigator ▲ or ▼ button repeatedly until the desired setting is highlighted (Picture Settings, Screen Settings, PC Settings*, Color Temperature or Advanced Picture Settings).
- Press the (enter) button to enter into the sub menu, except for Color Temperature.
- When Color Temperature is highlighted, Press the Navigator ◄ or ► button repeatedly to select NORMAL, WARM or COOL then press the MENU button to save the settings and exit.





THE ON-SCREEN MENU

Picture Settings Menu

- If Picture settings is selected, press
 (enter) button to enter. The PICTURE SETTINGS menu will appear on the screen and the Picture Mode will be highlighted.
- Press the Navigator ◀ or ▶ button to select the picture quality modes to Dynamic, Movie, User or Standard as desire then press the MENU button to save the setting and exit.



 If User is selected, using the Navigator ▲, ▼, ◀, ▶ and (□) (enter) buttons to adjust Brightness, Contrast, Color, TINT or Sharpness as desired. When finished, press the MENU button to save the setting and exit.

SCREEN SETTINGS Menu

- If Screen settings is selected, press
 (enter) button to enter. The SCREEN SETTINGS menu will appear on the screen and Screen Size will be highlighted.
- Press the Navigator ◄ or ▶ button to select the aspect ratio of the screen to Water Glass, Cinema, Full or Normal as desired then press the MENU button to save the setting and exit. Note: The selections in VGA (PC) mode are: Full, Normal.
- Press the Navigator ▲ or ▼ button to select Horizontal Position or Vertical Position then press the (a) (enter) button to enter.
 Press the Navigator ◄ or ► button to set the picture position within the screen. When finished, press the MENU button to save the setting and exit.



NOTE: PC Settings is available only under the VGA source mode.

PC(VGA) SETTINGS Menu(Operation in VGA mode only.)

- · In VGA mode. Enter to the PC settings menu as previously procedures. The PC SETTINGS menu will appear on the screen and Auto Adjust will be highlighted.
- Press and hold the 🕞 (enter) button one second then release the button. The TV will adjust the best picture quality automatically. When finished, press the MENU button to save the settings and exit.
- If the Horizontal Position is selected, press the Navigator <a>or <a>button to adjust the horizontal position of the picture within the screen.
- If Vertical Position is selected, press the Navigator ◀ or ► button to adjust the vertical position of the picture within the screen.
- If clock is selected, press the Navigator button to adjust the sampling frequency as to fine tune the picture quality.
- button to fine tune the overall sharpness of the picture on the screen.

ADVANCED PICTURE SETTINGS Menu

- Enter to the advanced picture settings menu as previously procedures. The ADVANCED PICTURE SETTINGS menu will appear on the screen and Film Mode will be highlighted.
- Press the
 (enter) button to turn it On (Enchanced the contrast level while playback a movie which make by films) or Off.
