Preventing Malfunction

I.CONTROLS

1. Front Panel

< 4 Channel >



< 8 Channel >



< 16 Channel >



1. Mode indicator : 3 LEDs display the status of the Digital Video Recorder.



Power (Blue), Recording (Red) and HDD (Green)

2. Playback / Record Control: These functions are used in Live mode or Playback mode.

1) Direction buttons: In Menu setup mode, are used to move the cursor.

2)  /  [LOG / Playback Stop]

① Log : Press this button to access the log list.



② Stop : This button stops playback

3)  /  [R step or FR / REC]

① Reverse Step : This button is used to move backwards, field by field, during STILL mode



② Fast Rewind : This button is used to fast rewind during PLAYBACK mode.

③ REC : Press to start recording. Press the button again to stop.

4)  /  [Clear / Still or Playback] :

① Clear : This button is used to hide the On-Screen-Display information such as the time, date and channel icons. This button removes alert icons on the corner of the screen (AL, VL and PL). This button is also used to turn off the alarm buzzer.

② Still or Playback: This button is used to still or 1 x playback during playback mode.

5)  /  [Schedule / F step or FF] :

① Schedule : Press this button to make scheduled recording standby. Press the button again to stop.


② Forward step : This button is used to move forward field by field (picture by picture) during STILL mode

③ F.F. : This button is used to Fast Forward during PLAYBACK mode.

3. Menu / ESC Button : 

① Menu : Press this button to display the MAIN MENU screen.

② ESC : Press this button to exit a menu without saving.

4. . Enter : 

: Press this button to save menu settings

5. . QUAD  DISPLAY

: Press this button to display the cameras in multi-screen view.

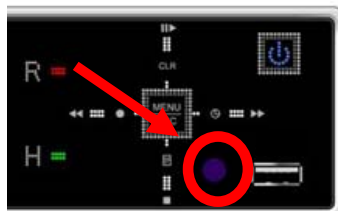
6. . Channel / Numeric Buttons : 

Press the buttons to enter data or make selections. Press “-” or “+” to enter appropriate numbers when prompted for a password, or appropriate dates in schedule option mode.

[-, +] : To decrease settings, To increase settings

7. Remote control signal receiver :

Do not block the receiver port on the unit. Doing so may cause the remote controller to function improperly.

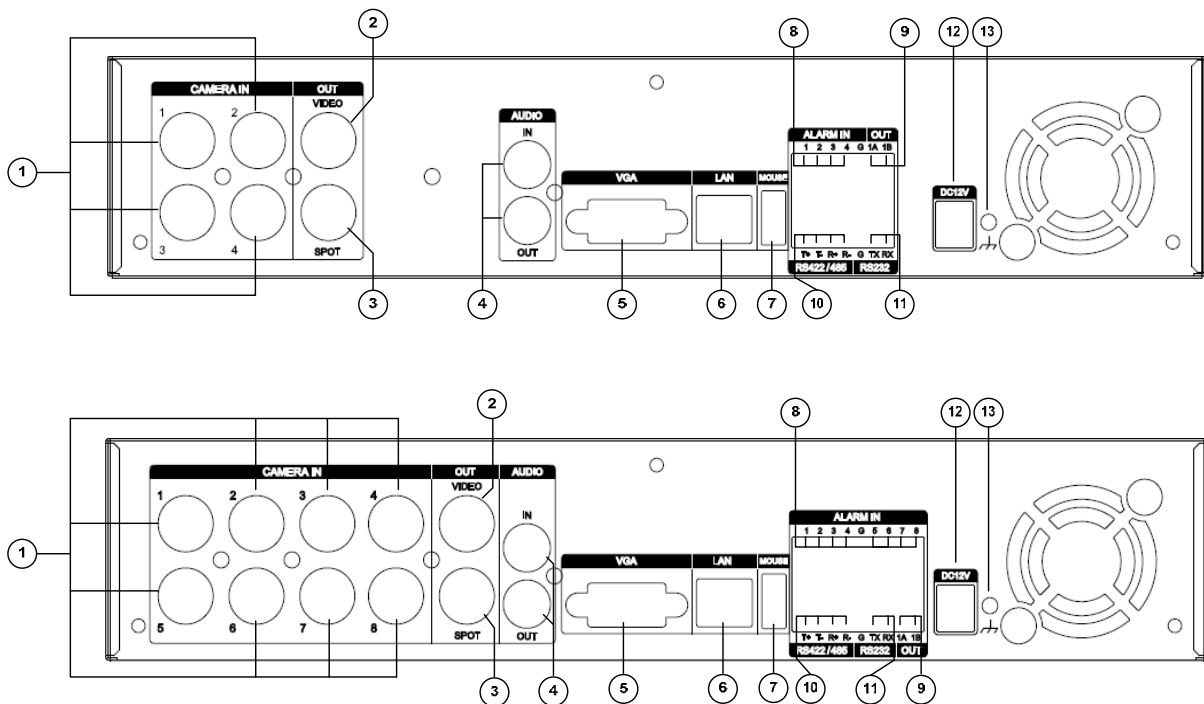


8. POWER button: 

Press this button to turn the power on; press again to turn the power off. The POWER LED indicator is lit when the power is on.

9. USB Port: USB port allows light backups of video files to devices.

2. Rear Panel Connectors



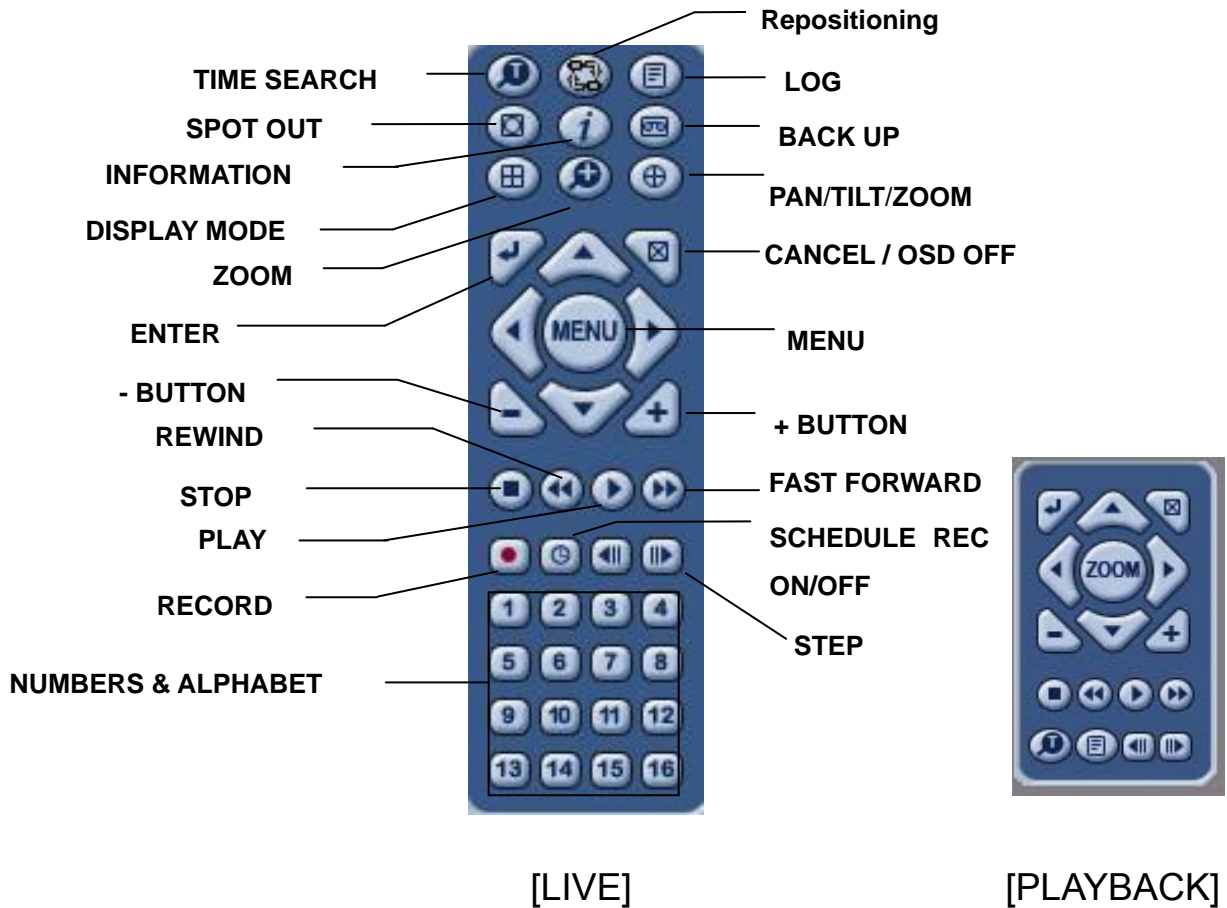
- 1) CAM1~4 or 1~8: BNC input (Camera 1~4 or 1~8) connectors
- 2) MONITOR (Composite Output) : BNC standard composite video output connector.
- 3) SPOT : Spot Out connector
- 4) AUDIO Input / SPEAKER (Output) connectors : RCA
- 5) VGA Out connector
- 6) LAN (RJ-45 Ethernet Port) : For connecting to remote PC via Ethernet network.
- 7) MOUSE connection : Connect PS2 USB mouse to this port. To use USB only mouse, connect it to USB port at rear panel.
- 8) SENSOR (ALARM IN 1~4 or 1~8) : For connecting alarm inputs.
- 9) RELAY (ALARM OUT 1) : For connecting alarm out relays.
- 10) RS-422 : For connecting to PTZ camera.
- 11) RS-232C : Development purposes only.
- 12) POWER : DC power Jack
- 13) FIELD GND : Ground

This DVR can be controlled by Mouse. Connect a mouse via USB port before use. Right clicking on the mouse in Live mode and Playback mode, displays the following Virtual Remote Controller and Virtual Keypad and can be used to enter PASSWORD and Camera Name etc

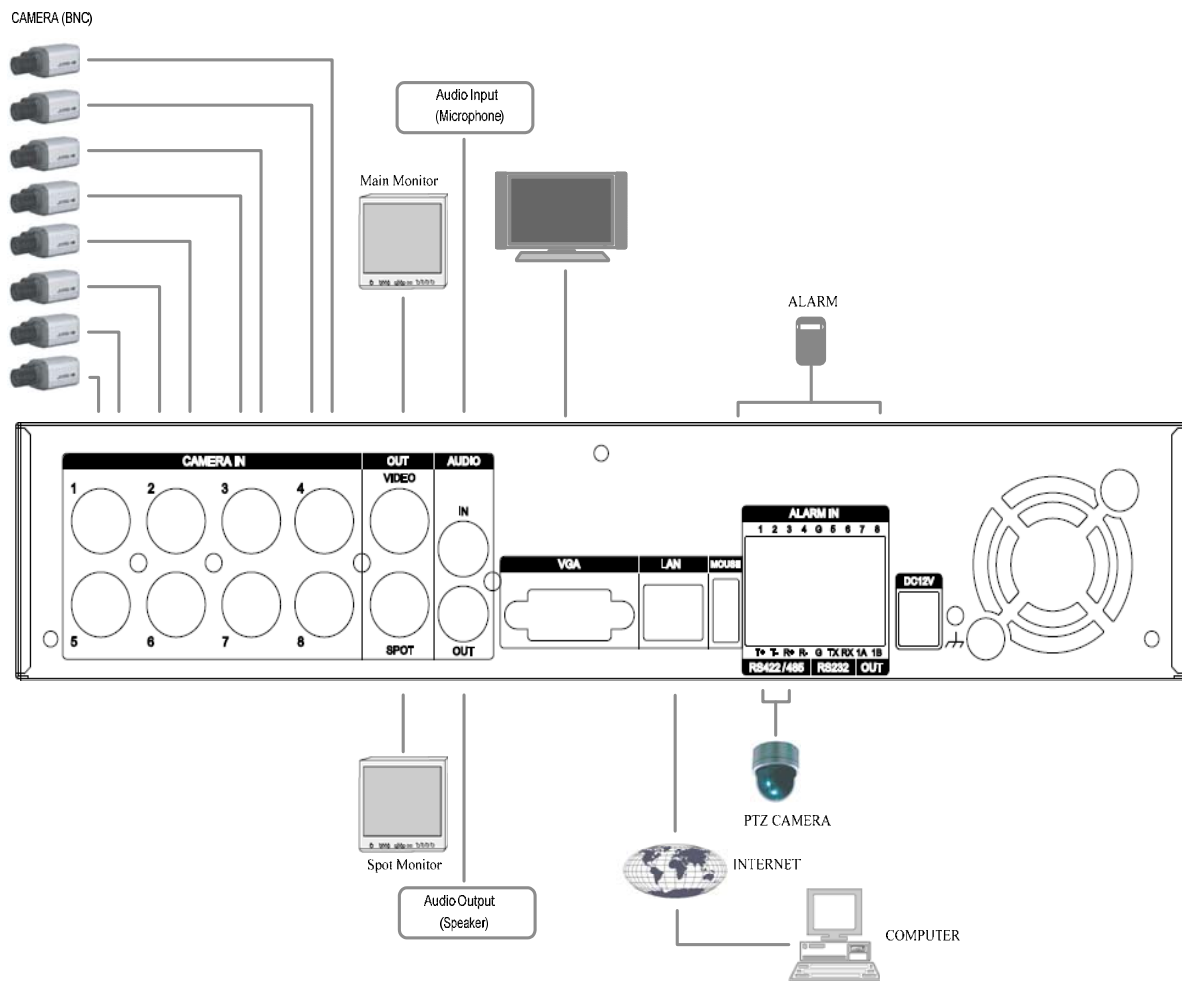


II. INSTALLATION & CONNECTIONS

1. Camera, Monitor, Microphone, Alarm Sensor and Power Cord

1-1. System Configuration Diagram

The following illustration is showing a fully installed system.

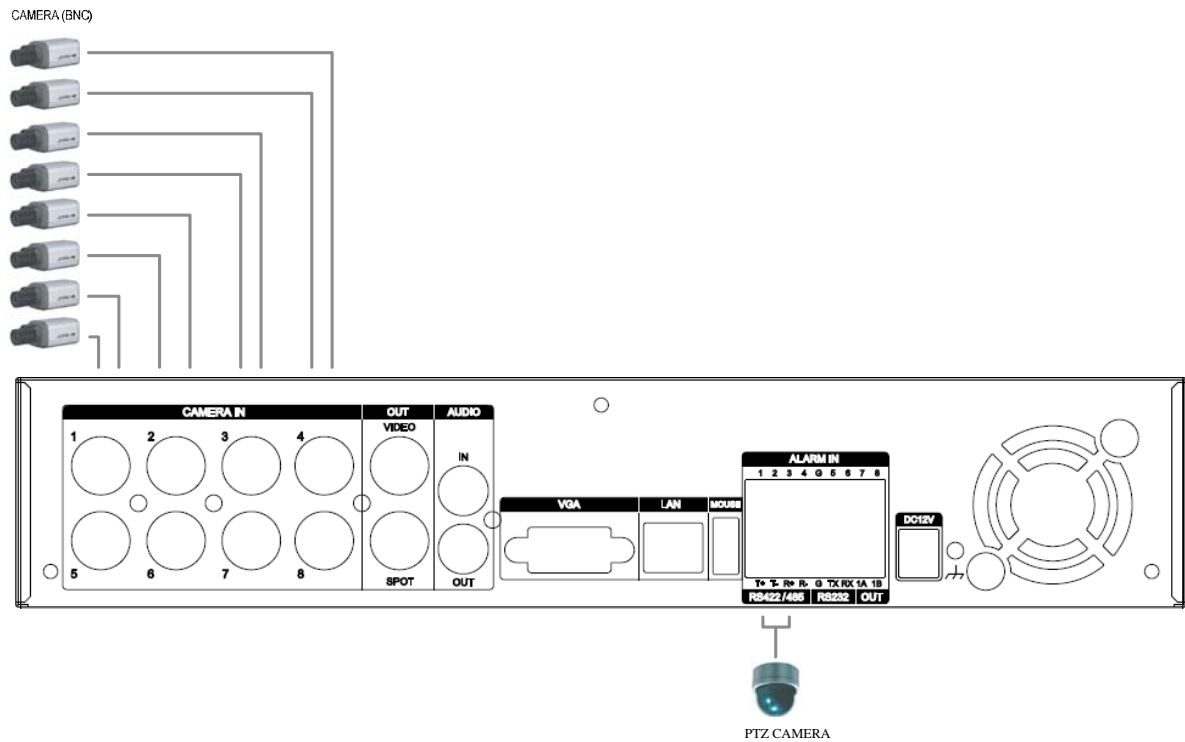


1-2. CAMERA

This product can be installed for 4~16 cameras, dependant on Model number.

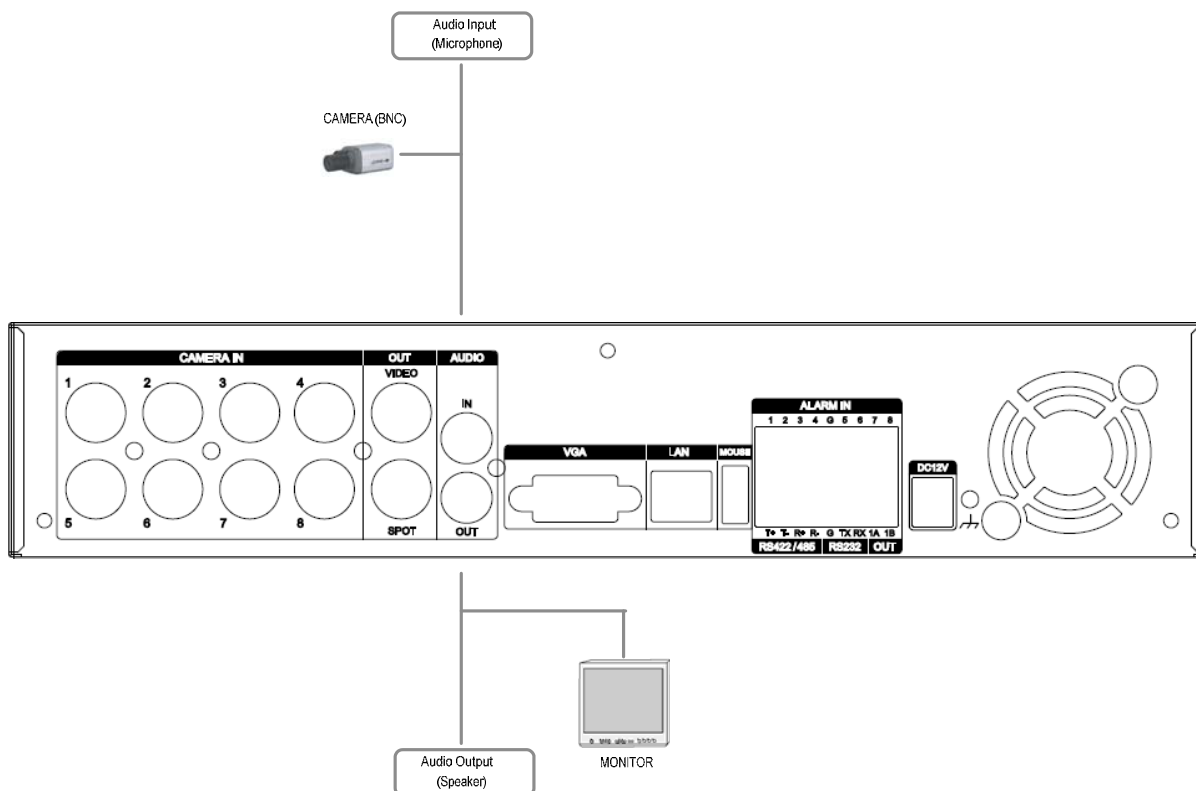
Connect cameras to the VIDEO IN (BNC) on the back panel of the machine.

To connect a PTZ camera, connect the PTZ camera's control line to the RS-422 TX+, RS-422 TX- terminal and connect the video output to one out of VIDEO IN on the back panel of the product.



1.3 AUDIO

The system has one channel audio input and output. To record and playback audio signals, connect an audio device (microphone) to the AUDIO IN (1 Vp-p @600 ohms) and speaker to the AUDIO OUTPUT (see illustration below).



1.4 MONITOR

There are three video outputs (2 x BNC, 1 x VGA) on the rear panel of the system. Connect monitors depending on your application.

1 x BNC for Main composite video output.

1 x BNC for Spot composite video output.

1 x VGA output.

III. QUICK SETUP

To switch on the DVR, press the [POWER] button on the front panel or on the remote controller. When the Digital Video Recorder is powered on, the Live Viewing screen appears after about 30 seconds.

- 1) First, stop recording to enter and set the QUICK SETUP menu. While the DVR is recording, TIME and RECORD menus are not activated.
- 2) When prompted for a password, enter the password using the Numeric buttons.



- 3) The Factory Default password for the unit is "000000"
- 4) Press the [MENU] button to display the QUICK SETUP screen.
- 5) QUICK SETUP menu appears once a password is entered.
- 6) Use Directional buttons to select Menu and press the [ENTER] button to confirm.

1. TIME

When the Digital Video Recorder is powered on, for the very first time, it is important to set the exact date and time.



- 1) Select the "Time" menu tab using the directional buttons.
- 2) Enter the Date and Time by pressing the numeric buttons on the remote controller or "-/+" on the unit.
- 3) Press the [ENTER] button to exit a menu and save the changes. Press the [ESC] to exit a menu without making changes.

Note:

1. *Recording mode*

While recording mode you cannot set the time. Stop recording to change the TIME.



2. *Live mode after time set up*

After the time is set up, press the Record button to continue recording.



2. RECORD

There is an easy setup for recording.



2-1. RECORD MODE

- 1) Select the "RECORD" menu tab using the directional buttons.
- 2) Select MODE by pressing the "-/+ " buttons on the remote controller or the unit.
- 3) Press the [ENTER] button to exit a menu and save the changes. Press the [ESC] to exit a menu without making changes.

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2.2. RECORD DAYS

- 1) Select RECORDING DAYS using the "-/+ " buttons on the remote controller or the unit.
- 2) Press the [ENTER] button to exit a menu and save the changes. Press the [ESC] to exit a menu without making changes.

2.3. PRIORITY

- 1) Select "RATE" or "QAULITY using the "-/+ " buttons on the remote controller or the unit.
- 2) "RATE" : DVR is automatically set up with a high recording speed mode.
- 3) "QUALITY" : DVR is automatically set up with a high picture quality mode.

2.4 RECORD SETUP INFO

This displays the picture quality and recording speed.

Note:

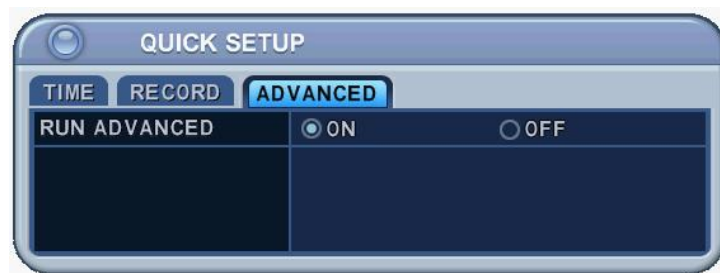
1. START RECORDING

: When setup is finished, press the [REC] button on the front panel or the remote controller to start recording,

2. To set up individual recording for each channel, or a more specified setup, enter into RECORD on the main menu.

Please refer to 3. ADVANCED on how to enter into the main menu.

3. ADVANCED



Select "ON" or "OFF" using the "-/+ " buttons on the remote controller or the unit.

- 1) "ON" : Select this to enter into the main menu and press the [ENTER] button to exit a menu and save the changes.
 - Escape from "QUICK SETUP" menu by pressing "ESC" button.*
 - Press the MENU button again to enter into MAIN MENU.
- 2) "OFF" : Select this to stay in the "QUICK SETUP" menu.
- 3) To return to the Quick SETUP menu from Main Menu, refer to 2-1 DISPLAY SETUP part of this manual

IV.LIVE VIEWING

1. Display Overview



- (1) (2) (3)

1.

(1) Indicates an **Alarm** has been triggered by an alarm sensor. To cancel, press the [CANCEL/ESC] button on the remote controller or the [CLR] button the front panel.

(2) Indicates **Motion** detected. To cancel, press the [CANCEL/ESC] button on remote the controller or the [CLR] button the front panel.

(3) Indicates **Video Loss** during Recording. To cancel, press the [CANCEL/ESC] button on the remote controller or the [CLR] button on the front panel.

2.

(1) Indicates an **USB Device is connected on Front panel**. It changes to a blue colour while doing a backup. If a Mouse is connected cursor appears.

(2) Indicates the DVR is now recording.

(3) Indicates **Schedule Record** mode is on. It changes to a blue colour when Schedule Record starts.

(4) Indicates **Audio** is stored during the selected playback and turns to a blue colour.

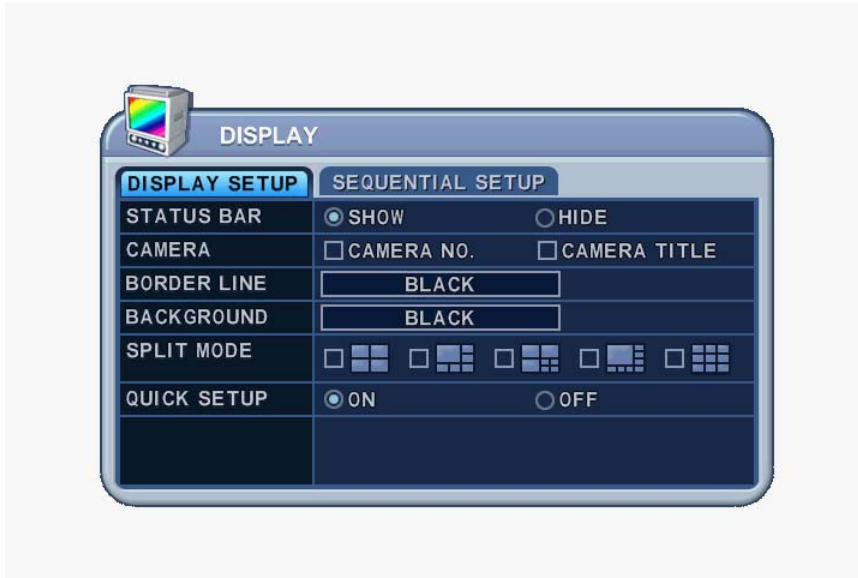
(5) Shows the **Number of Client**, which are connected to the Network (MAX:3).
3. : Displays Year, Month, Day, Time and Date.
4. : Shows the remaining recording time of the DVR. If the remaining HDD capacity is less than 4GB, the blue "Recycling" icon is shown.

2. Multi Screen Display and Sequencing

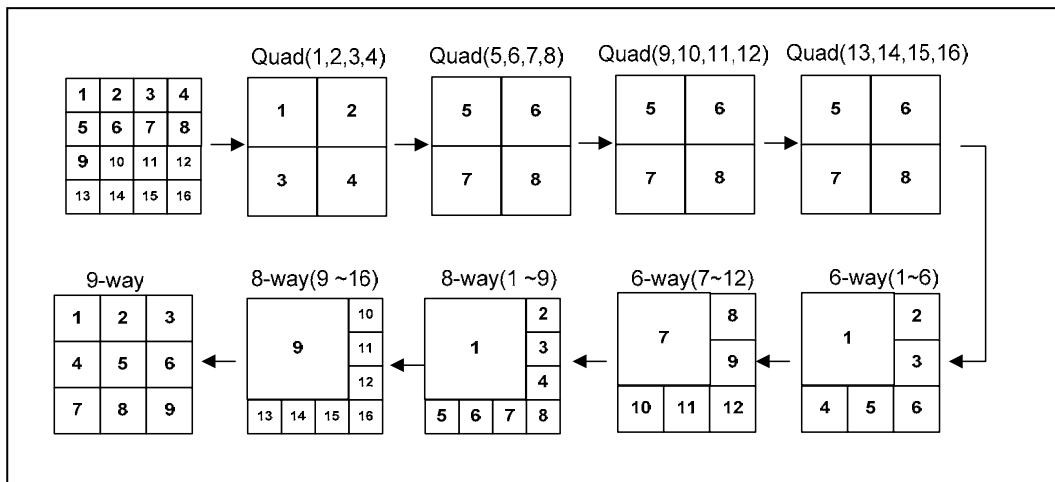
2.1 Full Screen Display

Select any camera for Full Screen display by pressing the Number button of the associated camera.

2.2 Multi Screen Display and Sequencing Display.






Press the **[DISPLAY]** button to activate the multi-screen display. It changes in order, as shown below, from the SPLIT MODE choices. When in a 16-way screen display, press the **[DISPLAY]** button for 1 second to begin full screen sequencing. The sequence mode and dwell times are programmable. For detailed information about configuring these, see “**Sequence Setup**”. If the sequence mode is not activated, it moves to Quad mode instead of Sequencing.

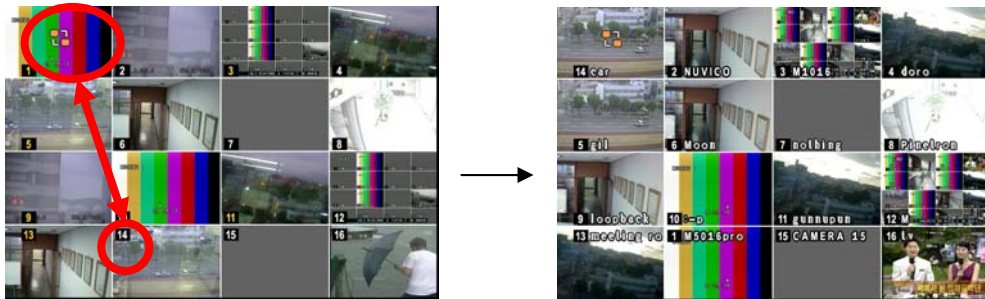


2.3 Repositioning

To reposition a camera view on screen.

2.3.1. Virtual Remote Controller

- ① Press the  button on the Virtual Remote Controller, using the mouse, and the  icon is displayed on the screen. Move the  icon to the desired position by pressing the directional buttons on the remote controller or Virtual Control Pad.
- ② Press a Numeric button to reposition the selected camera. Press the [Enter] button to exit here and save the changes.



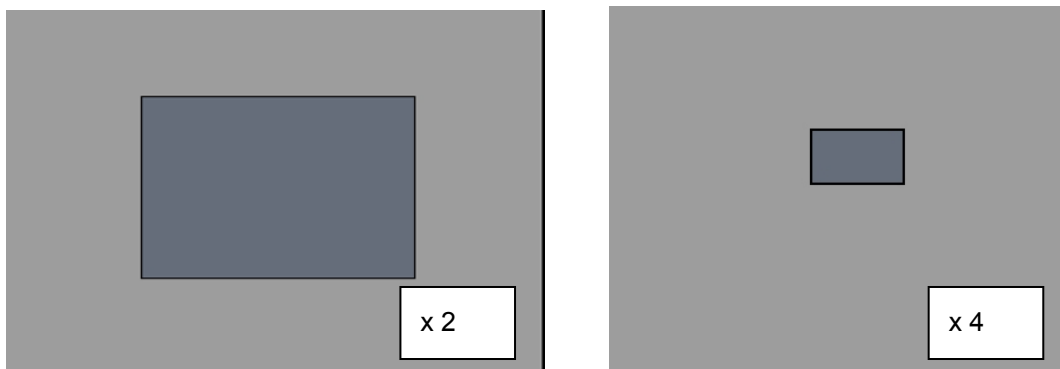
2.3.2. Mouse

Drag the selected camera to the new position using the mouse.

3. Zooming

During Live View mode or Playback, it is possible to zoom into a section of the screen to get a close-up view of the image.

1. To activate the digital zoom, select the full screen display of the camera you wish to zoom.
2. Then press the **[ZOOM]** button on the IR Remote controller. A Zoom area box pops up, as shown below.



3. Move the box to the desired position using the directional [▲▼◀▶] buttons.
4. Press the [+] button to enlarge the image and the [-] button to zoom out the image.
5. Press the [CANCEL] button to return normal mode.

Note:

If the Zoom button is pressed while in a multi-screen display, the zoom operation is not activated. It MUST be a full screen display.

4. Spot Monitor

In addition to the Main Monitor, attaching a Spot Monitor enables a user to monitor specific channels independently from the main monitor.

- Press the **[Spot]** button on the remote controller, then press the number button you wish watch as full screen.
- Press the **[Spot]** button twice to auto switch cameras. The Sequence interval can be set in the Sequential Setup.
- When an alarm has been triggered, that specific channel goes into Full Screen.

V. OPERATION

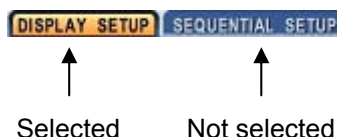
1. Main Menu Overview

When the DVR is powered on, a Live Viewing screen appears after an initialisation period of about 30 seconds. Press the **[MENU]** button to access the main menu. An Admin Password Box appears. Enter the password using the Numeric buttons on the IR Remote Control or CH increase button on the Front Panel. Default password is '000000'. Main Menu is displayed only after a correct password is entered, shown below.



Note: Factory default Admin/User password is 000000. It is recommended that the "PASSWORD" is changed when the DVR is installed. Refer to [System Setup].

1. Use the directional buttons [**▲▼◀▶**] to select the desired menu. Items selected in the menu are highlighted.
2. Press the **[ENTER]** button to select the menu and display Sub-Menus. Use the Left/ Right buttons [**◀▶**] to select tabs on menus. Selected items change to an **[ORANGE]** colour.



*** It is automatically saves changes when you move between menu tabs.**

3. Press the **[ENTER]** button to exit a menu and save the changes.
Press the **[CANCEL]** to exit a menu without changes.

2. Display Option

2.1. Display Setup



1. Use the directional buttons [**▲▼◀▶**] to select “DISPLAY” menu. Then, press the [ENTER] button to display “DISPLAY SETUP”.
2. Use the Left/Right buttons [**◀▶**] to select a menu tab (**DISPLAY SETUP** SEQUENTIAL SETUP). Selected items change to an [ORANGE] colour.
3. Use the Down [**▼**] button to specify an option.
4. Use the [-, +] buttons to change values

5. Save changes and exit the menu, press the [ENTER] button.
Exit the menu without making changes, press the [CANCEL] button.

3. Camera Setup

1. Use the directional buttons [**▲▼◀▶**] to select “CAMERA” menu. Then, press the [ENTER] button to display “CAMERA”.
2. Use the Left/Right buttons [**◀▶**] or Number button to select the Camera you wish to configure.
3. Use the Down [**▼**] button to move to the specified options and use the Left/Right buttons [**◀▶**] to select other items.
4. Use the [**-, +**] buttons to change values.

4. Motion Recording

1. Use the directional buttons [▲▼◀▶] to select "MOTION" menu. Then, press the [ENTER] button to display "MOTION".
2. Use the Left/Right buttons [◀▶] or Number button to select the Camera you wish to configure.
3. Use the Down [▼] button to move specified menu and use the Left/Right buttons [◀▶] to select other items.
4. Use the [-, +] buttons to change values.

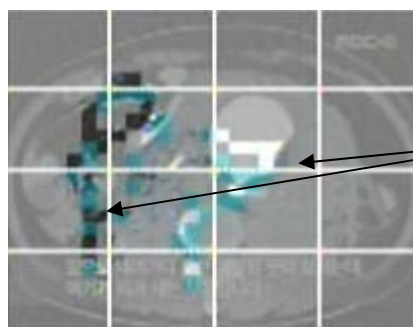

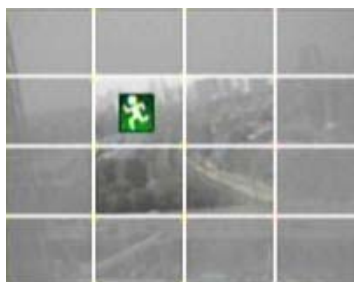
- It is divided into 16 Grid and selectable by the Number button on IR Remote.

-  : Cover All.

- Motion detected zones are changed to a BLUE Colour.



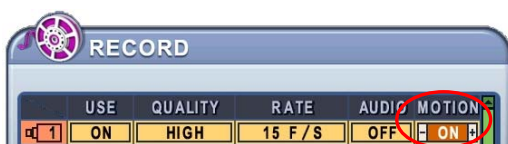
Motion Detected zones

- Use the Numeric button to select Motion Grid. GREY mask is cleared, or use <+> button to select Motion Grid on the Front Panel. A Running Man Icon  is activated. The <+> button is used for selecting and canceling. Use the <-> button to escape from the Grid Menu.



- It is also possible to select smaller motion grids for more precise motion detection using the CMS.

5. Save changes and exit the menu, press **[ENTER]** button. Then go “RECORD” Menu.
6. Select “ON” or “OFF” to Enable or Disable motion detection, on a per camera basis, as shown below.



7. Press the **REC** button, and Recording starts according to configured Recording Quality and Frame Rate when Motion is detected. It reverts back to stand-by mode after motion recording time ends. Camera does not record under normal conditions.

Note: Motion Duration is extended if another motion is detected while in motion recording.

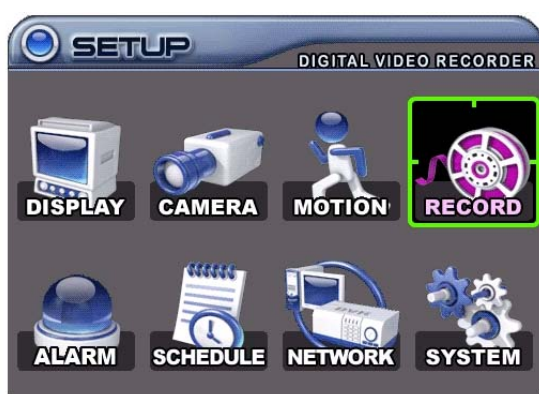

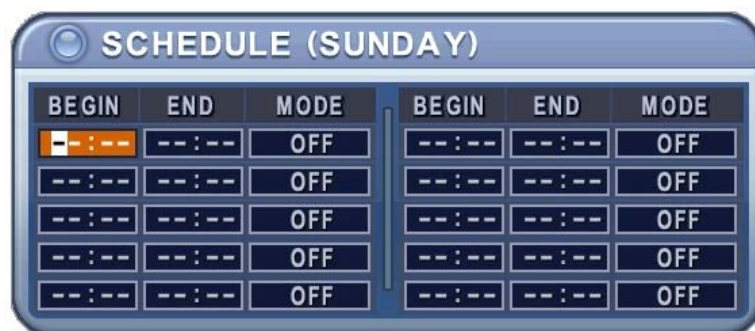

8. Network Setup

A static service has an IP address that remains constant for the duration of the contract with the Internet Service Provider (ISP), whereas a dynamic service consists of an IP address that possibly changes every time a new connection is made through the ISP, or recurrently in a given period of time. Most Internet Service Providers offer both solutions and this manual distinguishes between them, according to commonly available service types, when configuring the DVR for networking purposes.

4. Virtual DVR


4.1. What is Virtual DVR.

Virtual DVR is not an actual DVR but a combination, or group of several DVR's already listed under the DVR window. Under a Virtual DVR set, up to 64 DVR's can be added, pulling one camera from each DVR to be displayed. The Virtual DVR behaves in the same way a DVR would, except for the warning notifications.

4.2. Virtual Set List Manager

Virtual Set List Manager is used to add or delete Virtual DVR set on CMS.



Click  button to start the Set List Manager. Set List Manager Menu pops up, as shown below.



(1) ADD to CMS List

Please follow these steps to make a Virtual DVR.

- Check this option to have the CMS add, prioritise and arrange cameras with any of the events occurring from any cameras.

*** Alarm / Motion / Video Loss:**

- Check these options to have cameras with Alarm/Motion triggers or Video Loss to be prioritised and arranged automatically in either Auto Arrange or Auto Insert & Arrange.

- 2) ADD VIRTUAL DVR: Click "Add Virtual Set" button to make a Virtual DVR. Avoid overlapping similar names for Individual Sets.
- 3) Save changes and exit the menu : Select "OK"
- 4) Exit the menu without change : Click "Cancel"
 - APPLY: Is used for changing the name of selected Virtual DVR.

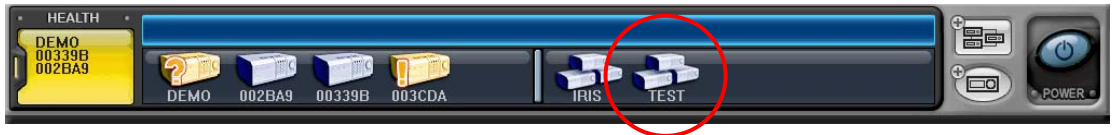
(2) DEL VIRTUAL DVR: Delete the selected virtual DVR from CMS list.

(3) PROPERTY: This menu provides information such as Virtual Set Name, total number of connected DVR's, total number of selected Cameras and IP information of connected DVR's.



4.3. Editing Virtual DVR

- (1) Double click the desired Virtual DVR .



- (2) The selected Virtual DVR is activated and indicated with “ ▷ ”



- (3) Select any of the Multi-Screens to Display.

There are two ways to add cameras: one selects a complete DVR and the other selects an individual camera from a DVR.

- 1) Complete DVR cameras.

- ① Click the desired DVR and directly drag it into the desired channel.
- ② The cameras are added in numeric order from the selected channel to the end; depends on the number of cameras connected on the DVR.

In the following example, an 8-Channel DVR is dragged to channel number 5, and fills 5 through 12.



- 2) Any selected camera on a DVR.

- ① Click on any DVR in the DVR Window while Virtual DVR is activated.

- ② After camera icons are displayed, drag a camera directly to the desired channel.

In the following example, Camera 1 on the 3rd DVR is dragged to Channel 14.



Note: If cameras overlap on the same channel, the new Camera replaces the existing camera.

(5) Delete Camera.

There are two ways of deleting a camera from the CMS.

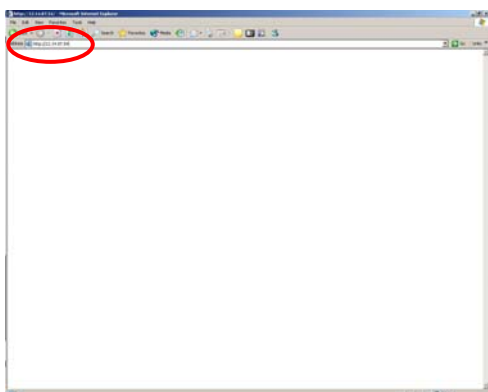
- 1) Select any camera for deletion during live monitoring. Context Menu appears on screen by right clicking. Select " REMOVE"
- 2) Select a camera to delete and drag it directly to DVR Window or Virtual DVR Window.



4.4. Live Viewing on Virtual DVR

Is exactly the same as the viewing on an actual DVR.
