

## PRECAUTIONS

## SPECIAL NOTES ON LCD MONITORS

The following symptoms are normal with LCD monitor and do not indicate a problem.

- Due to the nature of the fluorescent light, the screen may flicker during initial use. Turn off the Power Switch and then turn it on again to make sure the flicker disappears.
- You may find slightly uneven brightness on the screen depending on the desktop pattern you use.
- The LCD screen has effective pixels of 99.99% or more. It may include blemishes of 0.01% or less such as a missing pixel or a pixel lit all of the time.
- Due to the nature of the LCD screen, an afterimage of the previous screen may remain after switching the image, when the same image is displayed for hours. In this case, the screen is recovered slowly by changing the image or turning off the Power Switch for hours.
- If the screen suddenly flashes erratically or the backlighting fails, please contact your dealer or service center for repair. Do not attempt to repair the monitor yourself.

## INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS




Figure 1: Installing and Removing the Base

### INSTALLATION:

1. Align the monitor with the opening in the base.
2. Note that the longer section of the base points forward.
3. Snap the monitor into its base. A clear click sound will affirm that the base is connected correctly.
4. Verify that the monitor is securely attached to the base by looking at the bottom of the base and making sure that the clips are fully engaged in the base.

### REMOVAL:

1. Flip over the monitor so that it is upside down.
2. Press the 2 clips on the base that holds the monitor in place.
3. Gently press and hold the 2 clips while pulling the base from the monitor unit until they are unattached.

## POWER

### POWER SOURCE:

1. Make sure that the power cord is the correct type required in your area.
2. This LCD monitor has an Internal universal power supply that allows operation in either 100/120V AC or 220/240V AC voltage area (No user adjustment is required.)
3. Connect the AC-power cord one end to your LCD monitor's AC-input socket, the other end to wall-outlet.

## MAKING CONNECTIONS

### CONNECTING TO A PC:

Turn off your computer before performing the steps below.

1. Connect one end of the D-Sub cable to the back of the monitor and connect the other end to the computer's D-Sub port.
2. Connect one end of the DVI-D cable (Dual input mode optional) to the back of the monitor and connect the other end to the computer's DVI-D port.
3. Connect the audio cable between the monitor's audio input and the PC's audio output (green port).
4. Plug one end of the AC power cord to the LCD monitor's AC input socket, and the other end to Wall outlet.
5. Turn on your monitor and computer.




Figure 2: Connecting to a PC

## CONNECTING TO A VCR/VCD/DVD/HDVR/SET-TOP BOX

Connect A/V devices via the DVI and Audio Line in connectors at the back of the monitor.

1. Connect the Y (green) connector on the DVI-I to YPbPr adapter cable to the Y output connector on the A/V device.
2. Connect the Pb (blue) connector on the DVI-I to YPbPr adapter cable to the Pb/Cb output connector on the A/V device.
3. Connect the Pr (red) connector on the DVI-I to YPbPr adapter cable to the Pr/Cr output on the A/V device.
4. Connect the other end of the DVI-I to YPbPr adapter cable to the back of the monitor.
5. Connect the 3.5mm mini jack to R/L adapter cable to the audio output connector of the A/V device and the other end to the audio input connector at the back of the monitor.
6. Turn on your monitor and A/V device.




Figure 3: Connecting A/V Devices

## **ADJUSTING THE VIEWING ANGLE**

1. For optimal viewing it is recommended to look at the full face of the monitor, then adjust the monitor's angle to your own preference.
2. Hold the stand so you do not topple the monitor when you change the monitor's angle.
3. You are able to adjust the monitor's angle from 0° to 20°.




Figure 4: Monitor Angle

### **NOTES:**

- Do not touch the LCD screen when you change the angle. It may cause damage or break the LCD screen.
- Be careful not to place fingers or hands near the hinges when tilting the monitor, otherwise pinching can result.

# OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

## GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS




Figure 5: Control Panel Buttons

Press the power button to turn the monitor on or off. The other control buttons are located on the front panel of the monitor (See Figure 5). By changing these settings, the picture can be adjusted to your personal preferences.

- The power cord should be connected.
- Connect the Signal cable from the monitor to the VGA card.
- Press the power button to turn on the monitor. The power indicator will light up.

## CONTROL PANEL BUTTON FUNCTIONS

- **Power Button:**

Press this button to switch ON/OFF of monitor's power.

- **Power Indicator:**

Green — Power On mode.  
Orange — Power Saving mode.

- **MENU / ENTER:**

1. Activates the OSD menu or confirms adjustments to settings.
2. Exit OSD volume display when in volume OSD status.

- **Volume ▲/▼:**

1. Activate the volume control when the OSD is OFF.
2. Navigate through adjustment icons when OSD is ON or adjust a function when function is activated.

- **i Button:**


1. Press this button for less than 1.5 sec. to activate the Auto Adjustment function in Analog mode. (The Auto Adjustment function is used to optimized the H-Position, V-Position, Clock and Phase.)
2. Press this button for more than 1.5 sec. to change input source.  
(Analog->Digital->YPbPr source)

### **NOTES:**

- Do not install the monitor in a location near heat sources such as radiators or air dusts, or in a place subject to direct sunlight, or excessive dust or mechanical vibration or shock.
- Save the original shipping box and packing materials, as they will come in handy if you ever have to ship your monitor.
- For maximum protection, repack your monitor as it was originally packed at the factory.
- To keep the monitor looking new, periodically clean it with a soft cloth. Stubborn stains may be removed with a cloth lightly dampened with a mild detergent solution. Never use strong solvents such as thinner, benzene, or abrasive cleaners, since these will damage the cabinet. As a safety precaution, always unplug the monitor before cleaning it.
- Function Key Lock:  
Press the <「Volume -」, >「Volume +」 and the 「Menu」 buttons simultaneously to enable the Function Key Lock. When the Function Key Lock is enabled, only the Power button is active. Press the <「Volume -」, >「Volume +」 and the 「Menu」 buttons simultaneously again to unlock the function keys.

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## PLUG AND PLAY

### Plug & Play DDC2B Feature

This monitor is equipped with VESA DDC2B capabilities according to the VESA DDC STANDARD. It allows the monitor to inform the host system of its identity and, depending on the level of DDC used, communicate additional information about its display capabilities. The DDC2B is a bidirectional data channel based on the I<sup>2</sup>C protocol. The host can request EDID information over the DDC2B channel.

**THIS MONITOR WILL APPEAR TO BE NON-FUNCTIONAL IF THERE IS NO VIDEO INPUT SIGNAL. IN ORDER FOR THIS MONITOR TO OPERATE PROPERLY, THERE MUST BE A VIDEO INPUT SIGNAL.**

This monitor meets the Green monitor standards as set by the Video Electronics Standards Association (VESA) and/or the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and The Swedish Confederation Employees (NUTEK). This feature is designed to conserve electrical energy by reducing power consumption when there is no video-input signal present. When there is no video input signal this monitor, following a time-out period, will automatically switch to power saving mode. This reduces the monitor's internal power supply consumption. After the video input signal is restored, full power is restored and the display is automatically redrawn. The appearance is similar to a "Screen Saver" feature except the display is completely off. The display is restored by pressing a key on the keyboard, or clicking the mouse.

## ERROR MESSAGE & POSSIBLE SOLUTIONS

- **CABLE NOT CONNECTED :**

1. Check that the signal-cable is properly connected, If the connector is loose, tighten the connector's screws.
2. Check the signal-cable's connection pins for damage.

- **INPUT NOT SUPPORT :**
